

**CATTLE TONE STRONG**

MODERATE QUOTA OF STEERS FOUND OUTLET AT GOOD, FIRM PRICES.

**NOTHING CHOICE ON DISPLAY**

Better Grades of Cows and Heifers Sold Strong—Veals Strong—Bulls Steady—No Change in Stockers.

There was not a great deal of change in conditions governing the trade in beef cattle today. Receipts were moderate and the prevailing undertone showed evidence of strength. Estimates called for 1,700 cattle at this point and the percentage of beef steers in the run was comparatively light.

Combined receipts at the five leading markets totaled 15,200 head. Chicago and other outside points wired steady to strong openings and this tended to help the local situation. At the start salesmen attempted to put the market on a higher basis for all classes of steers but were not successful in realizing a clean-cut advance. Packers had good orders for cattle but were inclined to hold prices down to about a steady level and the divergence of views resulted in a "stand-pat" market during the opening stages. When a compromise basis was reached, prices were quoted steady to strong with the previous day and once under way a quick clearance of the offerings was made. Quality of the steer offerings was not of a very high order, short-fed and warmed-up classes making up the supply. Best beefes included sold around \$7.00, with the big bulk of the offerings selling from \$5.25 to \$5.85. Some short-fed Kansas-westerns ranged down to around \$5.50.

The local market this week has been in fairly satisfactory condition, but not to the standard of the selling interests. Prices have gradually firm up under moderate receipts until today the general market was quotable around \$5.25 to \$5.85. Some short-fed Kansas-westerns ranged down to around \$5.50.

Commission men were out to boost prices on all classes, but with the packers on slow bidders the market was a trifle slow to materialize. After the session was fully under way, all cows and heifers of good quality were fairly numerous and were quoted fairly steady with the previous session. Calves were strong with the advance of yesterday.

**HOGS GAIN A POINT**

OPENING SLOW, TRADE RULES GENERALLY STEADY TO 5c HIGHER.

**CHOICE HEAVIES LAID \$6.30**

Quality of Offerings Again Good—Bulk of Sales \$5.80 to \$6.15—Fig Values Show Decline.

Sellers in the hog division were on the offensive side today and after a start, were able to land their holdings in a slightly higher notch than yesterday. Receipts were of fairly liberal volume at all of the important distribution centers, estimates calling for 11,500 here and 82,000 at the five leading markets. Advances from outside markets were fairly encouraging from sellers' viewpoint and salesmen with improved bids and the bulk of the day's supply was accomplished at a comparatively early hour, with prices generally steady with the previous session. Of course buyers favored good quality in every instance, but scarcity of this class of stock kept common stuff on the move. Stock cows and heifers were in good demand at all times and disposal of the few odds and ends of such stuff was active at prices fully steady with yesterday.

Good to choice feeding steers are quotable at \$5.75 to \$5.50; medium to good grades, \$4.80 to \$5.00; good family stock steers, \$4.50 to \$5.00; common to fair stock steers, \$4.25 to \$4.75; stock heifers, fair to good, \$3.50 to \$4.00; stock cows, \$2.85 to \$3.40; stock calves, \$3.75 to \$5.25.

Miss Frances Brown, of the state agricultural college at Manhattan, in a recent lecture here, developed the idea, and it is probable that Allen county will be the first to adopt it.

"It will improve sanitary conditions," said Miss Brown, "and give the farm house a more dignified and less laborious and more congenial work. We are working to bring about the installation of the community laundry to bring to an absolute minimum the trouble, work and worry of wash day on the farm."
