STOCK YARD COMPANY MAY AWARD CONTRACT FOR CONSTRUCTION WORK SOON.

STEEL BRIDGE OVER ILL. AVE.

First Actual Move Toward Eliminating the Grade Crossing During So Much Discussed in Past Two Years.

Grade crossings, viaducts and subways have been the subject of considerable discussion in the St. Joseph press during the past year or two.

It remained for the St. Joseph Stock Yards company to take the first real step toward viaduct building when yesterday the company asked bids for the construction of a steel foot-viaduct over the railroad crossing Illinois avenue, leading to the Live Stock Exchange building and parking houses of a string of cars and getting across the Illinois avenue tracks daily than any other crossing in St. Joseph.

The dangers to life and limb at this crossing have been recognized for several years but accidents there, however have been rare.

That the Stock Yards company had its viaduct plans well worked out became known only when bids were asked yesterday for the work.

No estimate of the probable expense of the projected viaduct was given out by Col. John Donovan, president of the Stock Yards company.

CONCENTRATED INTEREST. What concentrated interest and industry can accomplish is simply marvelous. A case in point is that of a boy living on the outskirts of Albany, New York, but twelve years of age, who last year raised from one seed potato fourteen bushels of spuds, and thereby attained a world's record.

The state fair board offered a prize for the largest yield from one seed potato. Each contestant was furnished one potato of a special and unusual variety in his part of the state.

Eugene Durand raised and exhibited 886 pounds of potatoes, 12 bushels, of contest and quality size, and left at home about two bushels of non-exhibitable size. So far as known, this is twice the yield ever before known from one potato.

The potato had fourteen eyes. Each of these was planted in a hot bed. When the sprout was about 3 inches high, he cut it off and placed it in sand, where it took root. The sprouts kept on growing, and he kept on rooting them and then transplanting them, and great was the harvest thereof.

UNFORTUNATE MEXICO. The eyes of practically the entire civilized world have been turned upon Mexico during the trouble that has racked that country during the past few years. Unfortunate Mexico seems to have no friends. Political turmoil has involved all classes. Business and industry have been disturbed to an extent that, under the best of conditions, it will take years to overcome the ill effects. Mexico has achieved little that commands respect among the other nations. There is little in its history around which sentiment and sympathy can gather.

Japan, poor on land and poor on the sea, was without respect or consideration 50 years ago. TESTED RECIPES.

Home-Made Yeast—Slice and boil until tender in about one quart of water, four medium sized potatoes, six cakes of yeast foam in warm water. Put one quart of flour into a crock. Scald with potato water, Mash potatoes and add Beat thoroughly. Let stand until lukewarm, then add yeast and let rise in a warm place. Stir down three or four times. Then it is ready to knead with corn meal. Roll out and cut into cakes. Dry as quickly as possible. It will keep any length of time.

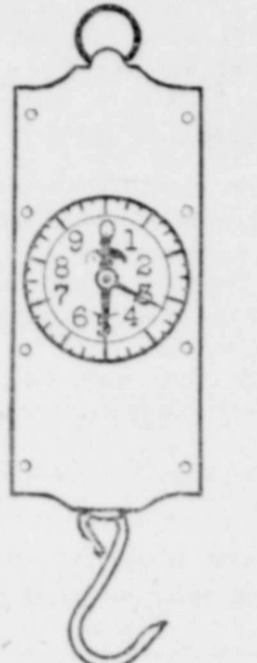

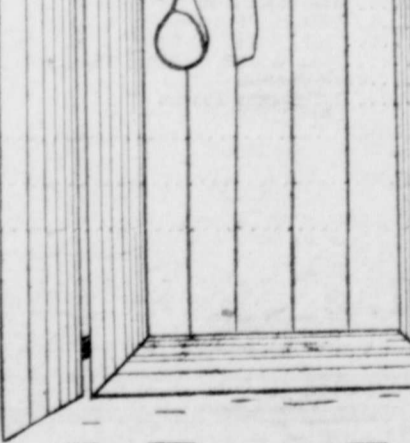
SMOKING MEAT AT HOME

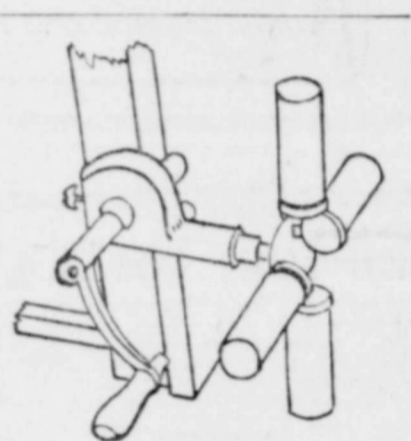
