Trenton, N. J.—A drum that was presented to Jacob Boozie of the First New Jersey Volunteers for fidelity and bravery during the first three years of the Civil war was presented to the state of New Jersey by William R. Boozie of Park Island.

The former drummer boy died three years ago, and the drum, engraved with the record of his many battles, has been for years a valued possession of the family.

J., is made the executor and heir to the residue of the estate, about \$85,000, in addition to \$10,000 and a half interest in the leasehold of the house at 72 Brook street, London, which he is to share with his sister, Eria L. Mrs. Howell says of the large bequest to her son Benjamin that it is made because he "bestowed care on me during my illness while his brother and sister quite neglected me."

INDIANS BURY OLD CHIEF

Columbia River Braves Give Warrior Full Funeral Ceremonies.

White Bluffs, Wash.—With full funeral ceremonies accorded chiefs of their tribes, the Columbia River Indians buried the body of Ake-wata on beautiful Craig Island, a few miles above White Bluffs.

The chief was the oldest of all the Columbia River Indians, his tribesmen declaring him to be more than 100 years of age. While attempting to negotiate the fast water at Locke's landing his canoe was capsize and he drowned in less than two feet of water. He was almost totally blind for age.

All the Indians in this part of the valley and many from distant points attended the funeral.

HURLED INTO WOLVES' CAVE

Meeker (Colo.) Newspaper Man Bruised When Horse's Feet Slip—Saved by Grasping Shelf.

Meeker, Colo.—Julius L. Roberts, Rio Blanco correspondent for several newspapers, was badly bruised when thrown from his horse into an abandoned wolves' cave near here.

Roberts was crossing a fissured gulch when the horse's feet slipped. He was catapulted down a steep declivity and saved himself by grasping a shelf rock about six feet below the surface.
