Edna Earl Linebery Wins Second Place in Odessa Bathing Revue

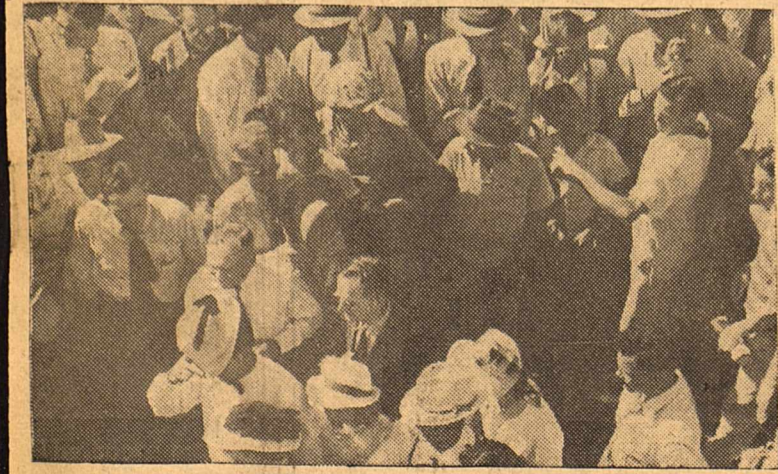

NEW ONSLAUGHTS ARE LAUNCHED BY NAZIS

German forces attacked on the Somme river—the allies' line guarding Paris—as allied troops were snatched from their trap in Flanders and reached safety in England Saturday. The French said they had held against a Nazi onslaught on the south bank of the lower Somme in a battle launched by the Germans Friday, resumed at dawn Saturday and still going on.

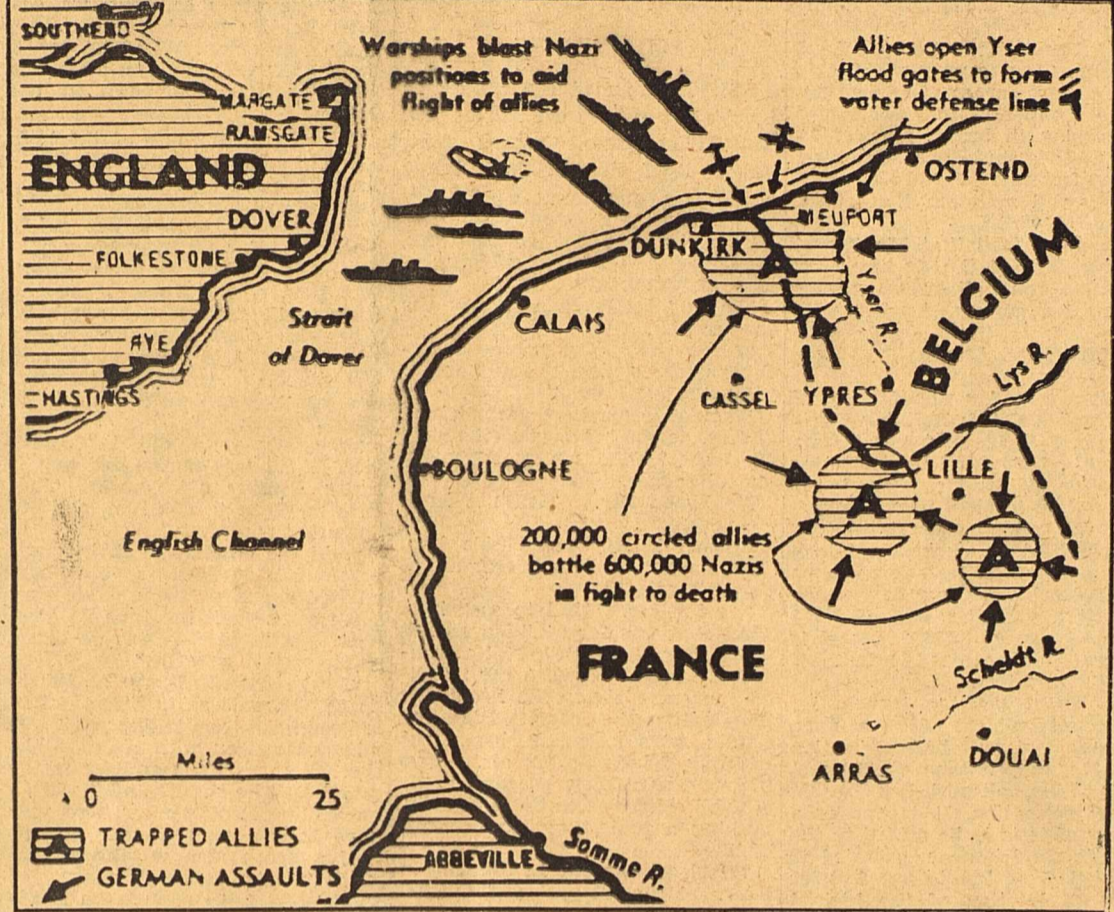

PARIS, June 1 (AP).—The full German force, backed by heavy artillery and dive bombers, smashed against the last of the Allies barricaded on the wreckage of Dunkerque tonight as other Nazi armies to the south strengthened their drive along the Somme.

Local Dentist Gives Answer to Rumors of "German Sympathy"

Statement is made in a paid advertisement in this paper today by Dr. V. P. Neissl, Midland dentist, answering rumors alleged to have been made that he is a German sympathizer.

Born in the United States, of German-Austrian parentage, Dr. Neissl denounces as false the alleged rumors. Many of his friends here expressed Saturday a desire that he make public denunciation of the rumors and that he demand such rumors to be "brought out in the open."

In a signed statement, the dentist said: "It has come to my ears that a rumor is being circulated in Midland that I am a German sympathizer. It has even been said that I am a Nazi spy and that I have been imprisoned in a Midland county jail.

"It is very embarrassing to me to have to take this means of informing the public that I denounce these reports as false, untrue and certainly unfair to me. I am an American, born in the United States, of German-Austrian parentage, but I allow no man to excel me in loyalty to my country, the United States of America.

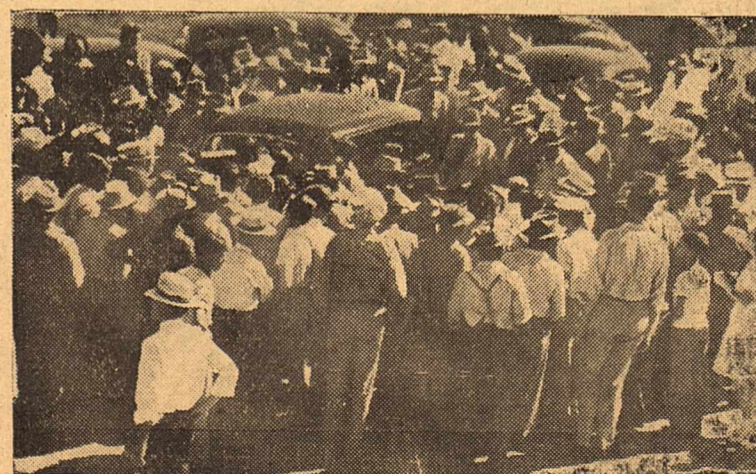

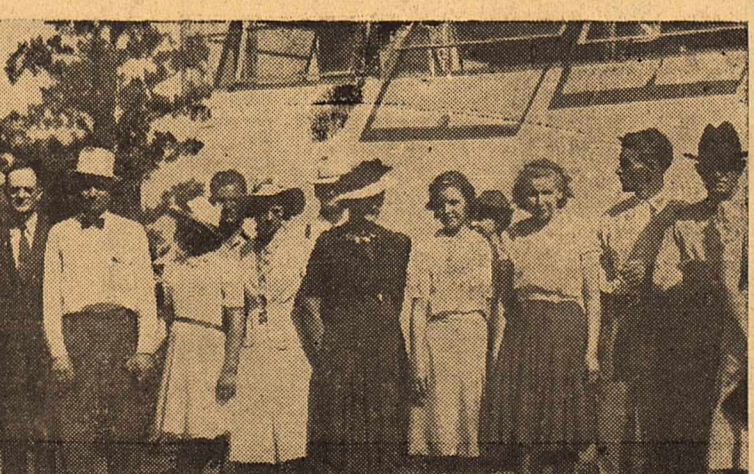

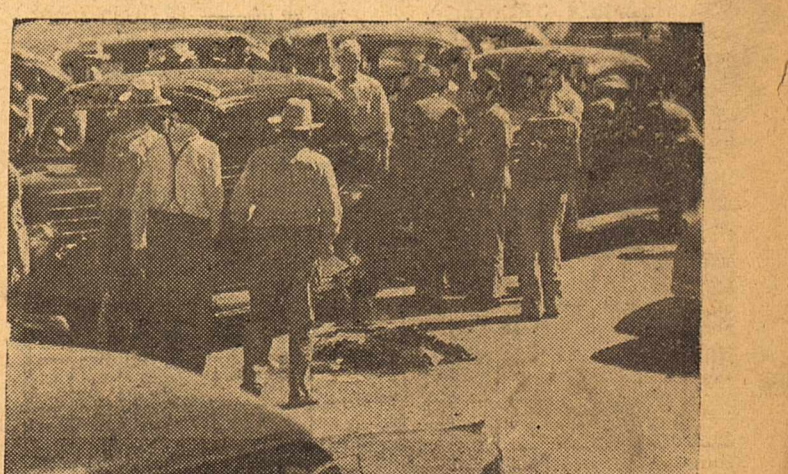

The crowd yesterday afternoon demanded the religious workers salute an American flag, which was produced. A spokesman for the sect said they could not salute anything man-made. Ten men and ten women were placed in jail. No charges were filed. Officers escorted the others to the edge of town. The group then went to the ranch house, where last night's threatened trouble occurred.

vey, yesterday morning had drilled to 3,693 feet in hard lime and chert. Gulf Oil Corporation No. 5 Wristen Brothers, southeastern Ward county deep wildcat on the southeast flank of the Shipley shallow Permian pool, is drilling below 7,450 feet in lime.

Producing from the regular Shipley pay horizon, Mrs. E. S. Briant No. 6 Jones pumped 116.03 barrels of 35.6-gravity oil in 24 hours, with gas in the ratio of 850-1. It was neither shot nor acidized. The well topped pay at 2,462 feet and reached a total depth of 2,589.

Opening a new spot in eastern Crane county between the Dunes and Waddell pools, Gulf No. 31 W. N. Waddell et al is drilling unchanged at 3,560 feet in lime, with 3,000 feet of oil in the hole.

Sam Weiner of Wink No. 3 B. F. Jenkins, in the Colby sand area of the Keystone pool in Winkler county, gauged 24-hour flow of 258 barrels of 37-gravity oil, with gas in the ratio of 1,800-1, following shot with 120 quarts in pay zone from

3,270 to 3,400 feet, total depth.

Ector Extender

Sinclair-Prairie Oil Company No. 1 J. Lee Johnson, lease No. 64, extending the Johnson pool of Ector three-fourths of a mile north, is drilling at 4,225 feet in brown lime with 1,500 feet of oil in the hole. First pay was logged at 4,169 feet. The well had 800 feet of oil in the hole from increase at 4,199 to 4,204, and another pay gain came in at 4,208, with resultant rise of oil to 1,500 feet.

In the North Cowden pool of northern Ector, Sinclair-Prairie No. 1 O. B. Holt pumped 144.60 barrels net oil, plus 20 per cent water, in 24 hours upon completion at 4,266 feet. Oil is 34-gravity, and gas-oil ratio figures 315-1. The well was shot with 470 quarts in pay horizon topped at 4,135 feet.

In the southeast extension to the North Cowden, Ray R. Rhodes and Joe D. Tompkins, both of Midland No. 1-C TXL is drilling past 3,000 feet in anhydrite. Oil Well Drilling Company No. 1 Paul Moss, in the south extension to Ector's Foster pool, topped lime at 3,890 feet and drilled ahead below 3,900 feet in that formation. Lime top is said to be 70 feet lower than a comparable marker in Forest Development Corporation No. 1 Moss, original extension producer

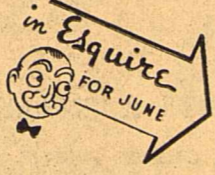

In the Goldsmith pool of northwestern Ector, Gulf No. 282 C. A. Goldsmith et al rated daily potential of 1,034 barrels after acidizing with 4,000 gallons in pay lime from 4,181 to 4,231 feet, bottom of the hole. Oil is 35.8-gravity, gas-oil ratio 1,076-1.

Gulf Pipe Line Company is laying carrier to two producers in the area northwest of the Goldsmith pool, for which new field designation has been requested.

The wells are Grisham and Hunter and Delaney No. 1 R. B. Cowden of Midland, old well recently shot with 880 quarts, and M. A. Grisham No. 1 R. B. Cowden, new producer a half-mile to the south which flowed 284 barrels on 24-hour test taken this week.

Tops Brown Lime.

Richmond Drilling Company, Mascho Oil Company and W. F. Hangan, all of Midland, No. 1 G. R. Brumley et al, southwestern Gaines county wildcat, topped brown lime at 3,750 feet, datum of minus 230, and is drilling ahead below 3,788 feet in broken lime. On the marker, it is running 34 feet low to Eastland Oil Company No. 1 Dunbar, plugged well a mile and a half south by west, which topped brown lime at 3,740, datum of minus 198. No. 1 Brumley was 94 feet low to No. 1 Dunbar on first marker, the anhydrite, and has shown marked thinning of section. It was 44 feet low to the Eastland well on Yates sand top.

Atlantic Refining Company-Helmreich & Payne, Inc., indicating opening of a new pool in southwestern Andrews county, was washing hole with 1,000 gallons of acid through 2-inch tubing and was scheduled to follow-up with a 3,000-gallon pressure treatment. Total depth is 4,425 feet in lime, where the well had swabbed casing at a rate of two to four barrels of fluid hourly, 80 per cent oil and the rest drilling fluid.

A north offset, Atlantic No. 1-2 University, is rigging up rotary, while the firm's No. 1-23 University, wildcat two miles to the south, is building derrick.
