President Says Army Is In Need Of Ammunition

Roosevelt States Irish Will Not Get Arms Now Because Of Deficiency

HYDE PARK, N. Y.-President Roosevelt disclosed and organizations also were made. Friday that a shortage in ammunition confronted the nation in its defense efforts.

Mr. Roosevelt said at a press conference he was looking into the question of sending some rifles to the Irish but that no ammunition could be sent because the country is way behind on ammunition even

Although he once had said arms could not be spared for Ireland, Mr. Roosevelt mentioned the possibility of sending over rifles because, he said, the actual processing of them is getting along pretty well.

The Irish wanted all kinds of things in addition to rifles he asserted, but most of these were things this country could not get for it-

He made it plain, moreover, that armament aid for Ireland would have to follow assurance that the Irish would defend themselves against German attack. He said no such assurance has been receiv-

War Chickens Come Home To Roost

The war for whose outbreak Russia flashed the green light by its pact with Germany Aug. 22, 1939, has now come to Russia itself.

This final collapse of the Stalin-Molotov policies of the past 21 months means that the whole world must back off and take a new look at the war.

Hitler's deliberate violation of his 10-year pact with Russia gives new proof—as if any new proof were needed-of his black-hearted perfidy. It now seems clear that he simply sucked the Russians into the pact of 1939 for his own purposes, never intending to keep the pact. Certainly all the objections he now makes to the Russiansthat they are imperialistic, that they are trying to disintegrate the German government, and so forth, were true in 1939, are true now, and have always been and will always be true of Russian policy in Germany and in the United States, for that matter.

The Communists have been calling this an imperialist war. So it is, now, in the sense that both Germany and Russia are imperialist, each having grabbed off all the territory it could grab ever since the war broke out.

We in the United States are naturally more interested in how all this affects us. Directly and immediately, it would seem, very little. We are committed to a policy Rises Against Reds of aid to Britain. We have not yet been able to provide anything like the aid to Britain which she requires.

So any question of aiding Russia is unrealistic. Thanks at least in part to the opposition and obstruction of Communists in America, arms production has not yet reached a point where there is any surplus for Russia. Do we learn anything? Do the stern chastisings of fate really guide us from the less worthy to the more worthy? One may hope they do, in the long run.

"So completely were the governing minds of America under the powerful illusions of materialism during the Babylonian twenties," he has said, "that a president of the United States could say that 'the business of America is-business,' and believe he was uttering a truism. The business of America is civilization."

Business, of course, we must have. It is a necessary part of our civilization. But it is only a part. We owe Justice Frankfurter a debt for reminding us that the task of America is to create a civilization, and create it whole.





In their third annual tournament held not long ago, 96 pairs of men competed against 96 pairs of women. Each pair must select a name, and this year it was task to select the prize-winning name from those submitted.

My selection was "Slam and Sluff," and their prize was two bunnies which I had autographed by the outstanding players of country. W. C. Bozman and J. B. Kenney were the prize winners.

Today's hand proved quite a problem to many of the players in the tournament.

Three no trump by South was the contract at most tables. The opening lead was won by the ace of spades and the second by the king. Now most of the South players tackled the long suit, clubs, giving West the first trick. The queen of spades was forced out. Then declarer found he had to lose another club trick, and so lost contract—two spades, two clubs, and the ace of hearts

Bozman, as South, tried a dif-ferent plan. He decided that even if the adverse clubs were so split that his suit could be cleared with only one loss, he would still have to guess right how to play it.

So he decided to hope simply for a 3-3 diamond break. On getting in with the spade king, he led low toward the jack of hearts. West won and cleared the spades. Mr. Bozman then knocked out the acc of hearts. He lost two spades and two hearts, but that was all, since the diamond break gave him nine






