The little ring of politicians at Vichy who now control such "freedom of action" as is left to France have issued some pretty resounding statements about defending the French Empire. Frenchmen in Syria are dying for that.

Is memory so short? Syria is no part of the French Empire, and never was, and never was intended to be. Syria is supposed to be an independent country over which France was given a mandate by the Treaty of Versailles and the League of Nations. The theory of a mandate is that a country or a territory unaccustomed to political freedom, or unable to defend it by force, is given a sort of "big brother" nation to be its political adviser and physical defender until it is able to shift for itself.







Some months ago I wrote a series of articles on the McPherran no trump convention. At the national tournament in Asbury Park in August, the young star, Robert McPherran, will be found playing this convention with one or two favorite partners.

While dangerous for the inexperienced, the convention has a lot of possibilities. McPherran can be expected to make a good showing at Asbury Park.

Today's hand is a "Type 2" hand for the McPherran no trump bid, a hand with little defense but one fair "out" suit. McPherran, sitting South, opened with one no trump. West doubled in order to force North and South to disclose which type of hand the no-trumper was. North redoubled, of course showing real honor trick strength.
Over two clubs McPherran bid his
heart suit anticipating that it might
be necessary to save against an adverse game bid.

This very situation came about. It is interesting to note the effect of the McPherran convention in the At most tables, North doubled four spades. South had no occasion to rescue, since in most cases South passed originally and his entry into the auction later did not guarantee any defensive streng-th. Still, it is only natural for the North player to hope that South will furnish some strength on de-

McPherran's partner, however, knew from the "Type 2" opening bid that it would be folly to count on South for any defensive strength At the same time, the assurance that McPherran had at least six hearts made the save at five hearts seem a safe gamble, as it was. McPherran was set only one trick, whereas four spades was a laydown.







Such a list might be very much enlarged by including varieties which will germinate in a week or ten days. But it would be interesting to see what sort of garden could be made of just a few flower families, seeking interest by using different colors and types.

Take zinnias for example—they could hardly be omitted from a garden of annuals. There are the small-flowered singles, the small lilliput doubles, the intermediate or "pumila" type and the giant flowered varieties. They give an abundance of pink, red, orange and yellow varieties with a few lavenders.
