Desert Army Of 750,000 Drives Deep Into Libya

Dispatches Report Axis Troops Are Set Back On Heels By Surprise Blow

By The Associated Press Britain's desert armies, 750,000 strong, were reported driving deep into Libya Thursday after advancing more than 50 miles on a 140-mile front in a vast and secretly launched offensive aimed at knocking the Axis

Those who have made a sensible use of that highly useful material, cellophane, may be put out by the new restrictions, but in some cases a little restriction is going to be just a plain relief.







when West opens the spade, East promptly goes up with the ace, leads the queen, which is allowed to hold, and then plays the five of spades. Declarer wins the third spade trick and immediately tack-les the diamonds. On the dia-monds East is forced to discard a couple of hearts to protect his club suit, and declarer is able to develop a second club trick for game.

Now suppose that East breaks the rule never to finesse his partner's lead. Instead of winning the first spade trick with the ace, he plays the queen. You can see the declarer's predicament. He does not know where the ace of spades is, and he is afraid to play low, fearing that East will lead through his king of spades and he won't get a spade trick at all.

If he wins the first spade trick with his king and starts the dia-monds, East wins with the ace cashes the ace of spades and leads the five. West cashes his good spade and can sit back and wait for either a heart or a club trick.


