In Lubbock, the American Gi Forum s veteran's Outreach Program is at

It is trying to help veterans like Fred Ramire. But for 3 1-year-old Ramire, it has been doubly hard to hold onto a good job since he came home trom Vietnam with a 100 percent disability.
Ramirez's disability is not apparent, and he worked for three years after his discharge from the service.
"But it's really yard; IThen't worked steadily since 1972", the young man
said. As son as they find out you're classified 100 percent disabled, they find
some way to get rid of you.
"It's gotten to the point where I don't want to hassle with it. But, F'll keep on trying...sone day I'd like to own my own business."
Frank Gutierres, veterans outreach specialist, said it is extremely difificult for his office to help people like Ramirez. "The problem is once an employer hear
that a veteean is 100 percent disabied, he beecomes very hesitant to hire him. that a vetean is 100 percent disabieg, he becomes very hesitant to nire him.
"However the employers must make the jobs available. Without their assist-
ance, we cant t do our jobb", he added ance, we cant do our job,", he added.

vietnam witb a 70 percent physical disability, is grateful for assistanice provided by the program.
