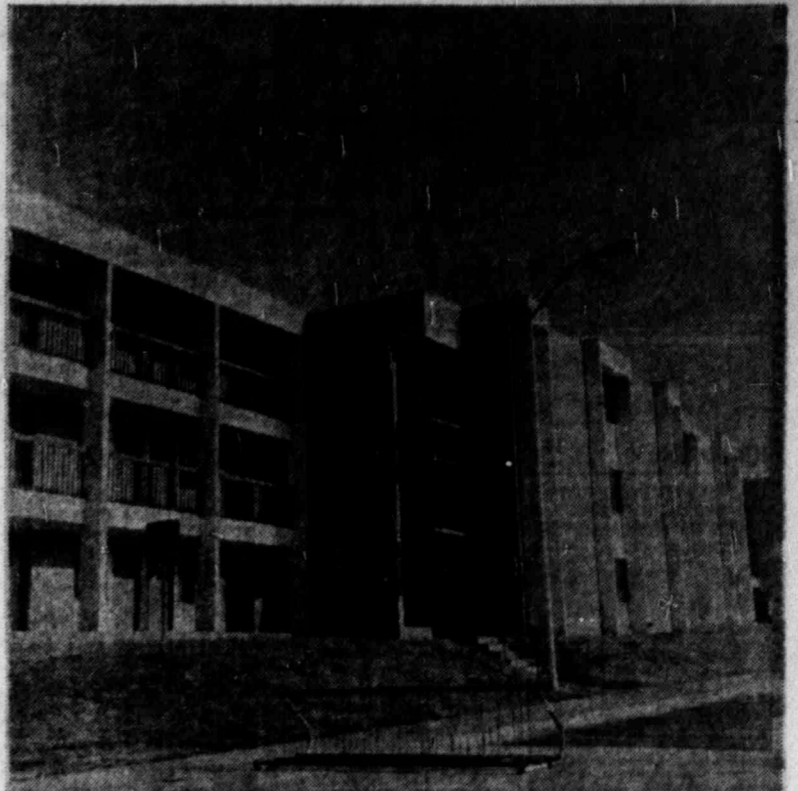

Webb AFB Closing Not Disastrous

Until recent years, an abandoned military installation was gutted, then turned back to local authorities with no thought for its future. It isn't that way today at Big Spring where Webb Air Force Base is in the final phasing down process after being closed as an Air Training Command facility Sept. 30. Because recovery of the area and future compatible use of the buildings was a major consideration in closure, the expected economic disaster was not forthcoming.

Instead, an economic upswing is gathering steam, spurred by townspeople awakened to the area's potential and aided by facilities ready for use. Only items designated "mission essential" or needed by another base are being removed from the base, Lt. Col. Ronald Miller, base closing officer, said. Materials from non-appropriated funds establishments — clubs, exchanges, etc. — were allowed sold as not a part of the facility itself.

Everything else, including a salvage yard bulging at the seams with an estimated \$3 million in materials, is being left to expedite recovery. All sale of surplus cut off with the announcement of base closure. "Not even a salt shaker has been removed from the dining facility," Miller said. "The government certainly considered the economic recovery of the town. Everything is ready to move in."

And, industry has moved in, with more bidding to come aboard the base. Lubbock Manufacturing Co., which moved in first, is overhauling fuel tankers, and is already expanding to manufacture parts for its parent company's use. Energy Efficient Corporation is making storm windows. Cage Corporation is working on an electronics contract for the government. Able Construction is doing high pressure sandblasting and painting of oil field equipment. Halliburton is readying a truck-driving training school and Cotton Machinery Co. is setting up for compactors. The Webb Bowling Lanes just reopened and the NCO Club has been leased to be turned into a disco. Bids are coming in from many churches for the base chapel which will be occupied on the base instead of being moved. Howard County College has been granted early access to the 30-bed hospital for its nurses training, and negotiations are continuing for an extension of the Texas Tech School of Medicine and an outreach cancer therapy and research program from M. D. Anderson Hospital in Houston. Businesses come onto the base with interim leases the city obtains from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers with approval of the General Services Administration. The city is looking at an April 1 lease of the entire facility pending disposition of the base with a deed with restrictions. This would enable Lockheed Aircraft Corporation to move in on that date if it receives the government contract to modify the Air Force's F-4 Phantom jets. Contracts for the project are to be awarded March 31. The 23.11-acre base, valued at \$37,957,828.08, is divided into three segments for disposition purposes: The industrial area; an airport, still under Federal Aviation Administration regulations on industry; and the hospital. Twenty-two of the flight line buildings currently are being saved for Lockheed's proposed operation. The length of time encompassed in announcing and closing Webb helped considerably in the recovery aspect, Col. Miller noted. So, he added, does the interim leasing to allow industrial takeover as the buildings are vacated. Otherwise, the entire empty facility would hit the market at once. Another big plus is the holding of the 460-unit housing area in escrow to keep it from glutting the local market. Houses will be released a block at a time when the market can absorb them, a time when they may come much sooner than expected. Families move into Big Spring at a rate of 12 per week and a shortage of homes has resulted. The Air Force will maintain "care and custody" of the housing area unless an agreement along the same lines can be reached making the city responsible for the release dates along the same guidelines. Other housing possibilities, in a possible apartment vein, are two new dormitories built in 1976 and 1977 with a 252-person capacity each. Phasing down is proceeding rapidly to meet the April 1 takeover date desired by the city. Miller, who was base commander when Webb closed, stepped into the closing of officer routine with a caretaker force of about 400 on Oct. 1. On Jan. 1 he had 81 persons still on base and by Jan. 17 the caretaker group was down to 65. Administrative personnel, firemen manning structure equipment, the civil engineering complex personnel and security police, who are augmented by civilian security, make up the remaining contingent. Miller has found the experience a rare opportunity to observe how many federal agencies operate, all of them concerned with the welfare of the community left behind. "They (base closings today) are not like closings after other wars when the government gutted the facility, left the hulls and gave it back to the town to do with as they pleased." He finds it much better watching building he empties fill with civilian endeavor. The caretaker force operates as a detachment of the 64th Air Base Group commanded by Col. Joseph Brotherton at Reese Air Force Base.

Utility Registers Bonds With Agency

Southwestern Public Service Company announced Friday that it had filed registration statements with the Securities and Exchange Commission covering the proposed offerings of \$45 million first mortgage bonds due March 1, 2006 and 1,729,206 additional common shares. Net proceeds from the additional common shares and the new bonds will be used by the company for the repayment of short term debts and for construction purposes. The sale of the common stock will be made through a rights offering to existing shareholders of record on March 8, or a later day as the registration statement shall declare effective. These shareholders will be able to subscribe to additional shares on the basis of one share for each 14 shares held. The subscription offering will expire at 5 p.m., March 28. Dillon, Read and Company Inc., is the manager of the underwriting group for both the proposed sale of new bonds and the additional common stock.

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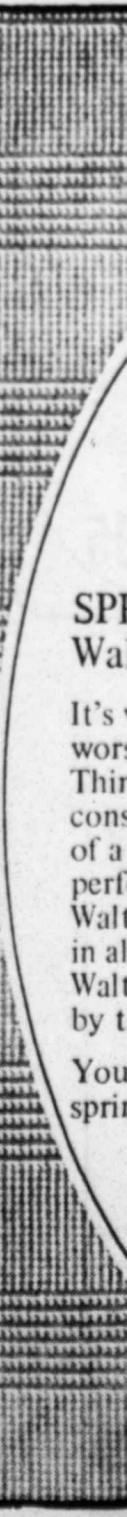
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Frogs Gain Respect From Invading Raiders

FORT WORTH—Respect must be earned, and today, Texas Tech has more respect for TCU than it did a month ago. The exact measure of that respect will be noted tonight.

And they start measuring in TCU's Daniel-Meyer Coliseum tonight at 7:30.

Tech didn't handle the Frogs too easily in Lubbock just under a month ago. And that fact, plus Saturday's night's loss to Arkansas has coach

Gerald Myers seeking a winning effort tonight.

Tech felled the Frogs 69-56 in Lubbock, but the Frogs play one of their better games that night and Tech did not win with the ease which had been expected. Then, last Saturday, Tech dropped a 54-49 decision to Arkansas, a loss which dropped the Techs into a tie for third spot in the standings starting the second half of the Southwest Conference race.

And Myers realizes the various aspects of the game, one of which is

playing the second time around.

"It's usually easier for the losing team the second time around, especially if they played a good game the first time," said the Raider coach. "We had not seen (scouted) them run their man-for-man offense, and they ran it well against us."

"I think we're better prepared for it now. But, also they may have more confidence in it (after the earlier game). But, in our favor, our guys know that TCU can be a good team, so I don't think we're going down there with any attitude of having it made."

TCU that night shot 50 percent, one of its best shooting performances to that time. It took a 51 percent effort and 19 of 27 free shots for the Raiders.

Tech had a 54 percent shooting performance against Arkansas in last Saturday's loss, but it wasn't enough to prevent the Raiders' second straight SWC loss.

However, "I don't think we'll be down against TCU because of that game," commented senior guard Mike Edwards. His guard mate, Geoff Huston echoed the sentiment.

Edwards scored 10 points against

Arkansas, Huston 12. Against TCU earlier, Huston had 10 points, Edwards not seeing action because of a previous curfew violation.

"TCU, you know, played us pretty good before," said Huston, "and then we lost (Saturday) to Arkansas. But, that's all behind now. This is the second half, and it's just like a new season to me."

"We'll just have to start over."

"I think we'll have more respect for TCU now. But, we still have to go out and play our game, what we're capa-

ble of doing."

While Tech was falling to Arkansas Saturday, TCU dropped a 77-53 decision to Baylor. Delonte Taylor, a 6-3 guard, led with 12 points, and 6-6 forward Steve Scales had 10.

Tonight's game starts a three-game week for the Raiders, with Rice and Baylor coming to Lubbock later in the week.

Also tonight, in the league, Baylor plays at A&M, Houston at Texas, and SMU goes to Houston to play Rice.

Havlicek Says That's It

BOSTON (AP) — John Havlicek, the most durable basketball player in the history of the professional game, announced Sunday that he will retire from the Boston Celtics at the end of the current National Basketball Association season.

"Everything a player could accomplish, I've done," said the forward-guard, who will be 38 in April.

"The decision to retire was totally his," said Celtics president and general manager Red Auerbach at a mid-day news conference—the topic of which Auerbach called "the worst kept secret since World War II."

The Celtics had called the Sunday news conference two days earlier and word of Havlicek's retirement leaked out over the weekend.

The 6-foot-5 Havlicek, who earns in excess of \$200,000 a year, came out of Ohio State as a first-round Celtics draft choice in 1962. He played on eight Boston NBA championship teams, but said he made up his mind to quit before he reported for his 16th season.

Havlicek denied that the once-proud Celtics' woeful record, 14-29 at the time of his announcement, pushed him into retirement.

Accompanied by his wife, Beth, and his two children, Havlicek said he timed his announcement "so a lot of people will be able to see me play in their cities one last time."

Havlicek chose basketball over college football—and was once termed by Buckeye coach Woody Hayes, "the best quarterback in the Big Ten not playing football."

Havlicek said he is most proud of having played the most regular season and playoff games in NBA history.

"Scoring points doesn't enter in my mind," he said.

Despite his age, Havlicek has played in all 44 Celtics games this season, averaging 31 minutes and 14.7 points per game. In 15 previous seasons, he averaged 21.1 points during the regular schedule, and 22 points in the playoffs.

Havlicek played in 12 All-Star games—all consecutive from 1966-77—but was left off the squad this season.

Auerbach said the man dubbed "Hondo" will be associated with the Celtics in

a yet-to-be-determined parttime capacity. Havlicek, who lives in Columbus, Ohio, in the off-season, said among his future plans is ownership of a fast-food hamburger franchise in West Chester, N.Y.

"I have no desire to coach," he said.

"I think he could have played at least a couple more years," said Celtics guard Don Chaney, a veteran who played with Havlicek for several seasons and was reu-

nited with him after a trade with Los Angeles.

"I'll sure miss him," said Celtics teammate Jo Jo White. "It was time to go, but I hate to see it. You have to listen to what your body tells you."

As for the Celtics' problems, which included the firing of coach Tom Heinsohn a month ago, Havlicek said, "It's been frustrating, but I still feel we can make the playoffs."

Connors Nabs Philly Title

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — "I was riding the crest from last night (Saturday)," Jimmy Connors said Sunday after stroking through Roscoe Tanner 6-2, 6-4, 6-3 to win the \$225,000 U.S. Pro Indoor Tennis Championship.

Connors was referring to his sensational rally from a two sets to none deficit against Brian Gottfried in Saturday night's semifinals. He rallied to win the next three sets of the best of five match and move into the final against Tanner.

"I didn't really have time to come down," Connors said.

"I didn't sleep that much. I watched a little TV, but even though I wasn't sleeping, my body was resting and that's what counts," said Connors.

Connors said he went to bed about 4 a.m. Sunday, got up six hours later, took a cold shower because there wasn't any hot water, had something to eat and then headed for his 1 p.m. meeting with Tanner.

Connors said he didn't think he did anything spectacular in his straight set win over Tanner.

"He (Tanner) didn't play as well as he had all week. I just kept the ball in play ... tried to keep the pressure on him. Those first two sets could have gone either way," he said.

Tanner said that unlike his last three opponents in the week-long tournament, all of whom hit the ball with a lot of topspin that gave him more time to adjust, Connors hit the ball hard and straight at him.

"As a result I was late on a lot of shots," Tanner explained. "He played well. That's what makes him the toughest guy in the world to beat."

Connors' victory proved you need more than a big serve and an austere training program to win tennis championships.

Public Service Important To Eva Bennett

SEMINOLE — After the dirty welcome Eva Bennett received when she moved here from Bono in East Texas, it was tough to stay on to become one of the county's outstanding citizens.

When Mrs. Bennett and her husband moved into a new home on their 160 acre farm here in 1928, they were met by a blinding sandstorm that lasted seven days.

"It finally cleared off and the dirt had piled up inside the house so I shoveled it out," says Mrs. Bennett.

But the next day the sand started blowing again and she started to cry. Her husband offered to move to New Mexico "where the sand doesn't blow," but Mrs. Bennett said, "I've fixed this place up and I'm not going to fix up another one."

So then he told her they could move back to East Texas "where it rains and gets muddy."

"No," Mrs. Bennett answered quickly. "I've scraped enough mud out of the house."

"Well then," her husband said philosophically. "Let's stay here."

Mrs. Bennett had to agree. "I guess we will," she told him.

And Gaines County is glad she did. Her tireless county and community service since moving here have earned her widespread regard and appreciation.

"Grandma Bennett Day" was declared here Feb. 1, 1976, and she recently was named "Outstanding Citizen" in Seminole by the Chamber of Commerce.

The last two years, the State of Texas has honored her "In appreciation for continuous contributions and unselfish services rendered to the community."

At 84, (her birthday was Monday), she continues that commitment. She presently works as a Pink Lady at a local hospital where she operates a gift shop. She makes gifts for the patients and often visits with every one of them every day.

She also works for a local nursing home, helping with therapy and teaching arts and crafts. She also helps teach arts and crafts at a senior citizen center here. She has been asked to do the same at a senior citizen home in Denver City.

She makes many of her gift shop items at home from refuse brought in by neighbors. "I'm always looking for something different to make," she says. She used to give away the things she made before her husband died. Since then she's had to start charging "just enough to get my money back."

She also oversees her farm which has now grown to 668 acres, and she'll provide free taxi service for anyone that needs the lift. "I take anyone anywhere they need to go," says Mrs. Bennett.

Mrs. Bennett belongs to the Live Long and Like It Club and is in her 61st year of Sunday school teaching. She is in a musical group called the Hot Shots that has played several gigs in the Lamesa and the Midland-Odessa area. In between,

there are parties and games to attend and of course there is Home Demonstration to attend.

She helped bring Home Demonstration to the county. It was an important information link to what at that time was pretty much the lone prairie. "The population around here then 40 or 50," Mrs. Bennett says. The first paved roadway was not to come through until 1933.

There was a county agent but no home agent for Home Demonstration in Gaines County when Mrs. Bennett first arrived. She had worked with Home Demonstration back in Bono since 1925, when it was first started. So she traveled around the county with the county agent, passing along various helpful hints to the county's widely scattered residents.

"The county agent would help neighbors kill beef and show them how to cut it up," explained Mrs. Bennett. However, the county agent didn't know how to can, so Mrs. Bennett and another lady went along to help. "We were the only persons in the county with a cooker."

Eventually, she helped establish nine home agents in the county. She also helped start up Home Demonstration fairs that she says eventually evolved into the fairs we have come to know.

Mrs. Bennett says it has been a blessing to spend her life in public service and that she has learned a lot from it.

However, she notes, "The only thing I haven't learned to do is say no."

Reactor Satellite Use Criticized

WASHINGTON (AP) — Energy Secretary James Schlesinger said Sunday it is inappropriate for satellites containing nuclear reactors to orbit the earth.

However, he said he didn't know whether nuclear-equipped satellites could be banned effectively. Schlesinger was commenting on the Soviet spy satellite which fell from orbit Tuesday with a nuclear reactor aboard.

Meanwhile, U.S. and Canadian search officials said they believe radioactive debris from the Soviet satellite has been pinpointed in Northwest Canada.

Mahlon Gates, a Nevada-based sci-

entist with Schlesinger's department, said that a spectral analysis has tentatively identified a higher-than-normal radioactive reading near Fort Reliance in the Northwest Territories as being from a piece of the satellite.

"There may well be radioactive pieces," Schlesinger said. "I don't know how dangerous yet. There is very little daylight in the North at this time of the year."

Schlesinger made his comments in an appearance on ABC-TV's "Issues and Answers."

He was asked whether the United

States should push for an agreement with the Soviet Union to prohibit nations from sending up nuclear reactors with their earth-orbiting vehicles.

"I would prefer to leave that particular question to the Department of State," he replied. "But there are serious hazards, and I regard it as inappropriate to have nuclear reactors orbiting the earth."

"I think that if all powers were to agree on that, that such events could be avoided in the future, but there's no possibility of that unless the Soviets were to agree to cease using this particular form of satellite."

He said he did not know how a ban could be worked out.

"That is not part of international law," he said.

On Friday, President Carter criticized the Soviet Union for not supplying the United States with more information about the failing nuclear-powered spy satellite. However, he conceded that Soviet officials gave the United States "a-bout what we would have given them under a similar circumstance."

Carter said it was likely that questions raised by the satellite failure would be brought up in diplomatic discussions with the Soviets. But he did not suggest that nuclear reactors be banned from earth-orbiting satellites.

Schlesinger said Sunday that 78 U.S. officials were working with the Canadians to determine whether a radiation hazard exists in the Northwest Territories.

Canadian officials had said earlier that planes detected high levels of radiation in several areas, but later reported the readings were caused by malfunctioning equipment. Scientists said Friday they believed the Soviet satellite — Cosmos 954 — burned up in the high atmosphere and they expected to find no debris on the ground.

Schlesinger, however, said U.S. officials have discovered ground-level radiation. "We have had two firm contacts with radiation," he said.

Bill Nelson, a University of California scientist, said Saturday that scientists still feel radioactivity detected at Dubawnt Lake, 186 miles southwest of Baker Lake, was of non-natural origin. He said another reading that still must be checked was found near Fort Reliance, about 200 miles west of Dubawnt Lake.

Schlesinger noted that the United States conducted "one experiment" in 1965 involving a space vehicle orbiting with nuclear equipment and that the program was halted.

"We do have some radioactive heat sources that we use for our longer-distance planetary probes," he said. "These are carefully shielded so that they can stand re-entry and would not break up."

Cub Saved From Jaws Of Death

OMAHA, Neb. (AP) — An 18-ounce bear cub rescued from the jaws of a 300-pound bear is growing fast on a diet of whipped cream and wheat germ in the Henry Doorly Zoo, a veterinarian says.

"He's making all the right noises and the right actions and he has a good, strong set of lungs," said Dr. Lyndsay Phillips in an interview Saturday. "He cries about an hour before feeding time. It's a real loud, high-pitched little scream that you can even hear outside the nursery."

The cub, whose weight is considered about average for a newborn, has gained 4 ounces since it was born Jan. 19 at the Blair Marina to the lone female among three bears kept there as attractions. Oscar Jensen, an employee at the Marina, found the newborn in the mouth of one of the two male adults. It is not known whether that male was the father.

Jensen, marina manager Bob Wulf, and Bud Fry of a nearby manufacturing firm armed themselves with poles and went into the cage. A beer truck driver who had arrived with a delivery scooped up the cub when the adult dropped it. Then the men fled to safety.

Officials said bears in captivity lose their parental instincts, and it is possible the adult bear might have killed the cub had Jensen not come on the scene.

The cub has been named "Oscar Coors" in honor of Jensen and the brand of beer the truck driver was delivering.

"I thought he (the cub) was dead when we first got him," Wulf said. "It was real cold, so I put him under some heat lamps for about five or six hours. We gave him warm milk mixed with water and a few drops of whiskey. That brought him around."

The cub is being fed whipped cream laced with artificial milk, wheat germ and vitamins, but that diet will change to high-protein dog food, carrots and fruit in a couple of months, Phillips said.

"We're keeping him on a strict diet. If you fed him on demand, he'd eat every two hours and he doesn't need that much. We just have to put up with the screaming," the veterinarian said.

Oscar Coors' roommates at the zoo nursery include a leopard, an antelope, an orangutan and a gorilla, Phillips said.

"Most of them don't pay too much attention to him. But the gorilla knows he's there," he said. "She's right across from him and can hear him screaming."

The bear will live alone when he's returned to the marina after he begins to eat solid food.

"I'll never put him back into the cage with the others," said Wulf.

Inmates Hold Guard

Hostage In Canadian Jail

DORCHESTER, N.B. (UPI) — Prisoners of the Dorchester maximum security penitentiary in Canada seized a guard late Saturday and held him hostage in the jail, authorities said.

Prison spokesman Andre Benoit said authorities were negotiating with the three inmates to have the guard released. Other prisoners had been locked in their cells, he said.

Government Contracts To Private Lawyers Called Illegal By Study

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Justice Department is illegally employing private lawyers to defend federal employees being sued for mail openings and other violations of constitutional rights, a staff report by a Senate subcommittee said Sunday.

"If the report's conclusion is sustained, then government contracts to pay 79 law firms to represent 107 defendants in 27 cases may be invalidated," said Sen. James Abourezk, D-S.D., chairman of the administrative procedures subcommittee of the Judiciary Committee.

The cost of private attorneys hired by the department has risen from \$12,000 in 1974 to last year's appropriation of \$1.86 million. The department did not seek funds for the current fiscal year, but said it may have to do so later.

The department has said it hires private lawyers to prevent conflicts of interest which might otherwise arise — for instance, when the employee who has been sued may also be the subject of a federal criminal indictment.

Such attorneys are free to raise "a legal position or defense not in the interest of the United States to assert" — such as a claim that the employee being sued was justified because he was acting in good faith on the basis of the orders of his superiors.

The staff report, however, says that under federal law the Justice Department may hire private lawyers only when those lawyers are under its supervision and control.

"The government should have no part — direct or indirect — in subsidizing legal arguments that mail openings, surreptitious entries, and other similar conduct are legal," the report said.

A study made for Abourezk by the Congressional Research Service of the Library of Congress also said there is "substantial doubt whether the Department of Justice has the statutory authority to retain private attorneys who are not subject to the supervision, control and direction of the attorney general."

The staff report recommended that no additional funds be appropriated to hire

private lawyers in such cases and that Congress change the law so that the government, instead of an individual, could be sued.

Abourezk said he agreed, as long as disciplinary procedures are strengthened to assure that the employee would still be subject to sanctions.

Abourezk's subcommittee and the Judiciary Committee's subcommittee on citizens' rights are considering such legislation. Attorney General Griffin Bell testified Thursday that he is agreeable to changing the bill to include stronger disciplinary proceedings.

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Senator Attacks Oil Audit Phaseout

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Some petroleum brokers have been running a "daisy chain" of dummy companies that may add as much as \$100 million to oil prices, Sen. Howard Metzenbaum, D-Ohio, said Sunday.

Metzenbaum said the Energy Department is phasing out an auditing program designed to chase such overcharges.

James Phillips, an investigator on Metzenbaum's Senate subcommittee, has been checking enforcement efforts of the department and its predecessor, the Federal Energy Administration. He said Metzenbaum has asked the department to go after violations more vigorously.

"One violation under scrutiny is the 'daisy chain,' in which some oil brokers buy and sell the same amount of refined

oil, multiplying its price before it reaches an ultimate buyer such as a utility.

Metzenbaum said overcharges from this violation could reach \$100 million.

"These daisy chains often employ intermediate dummy companies as 'resellers' to increase the price," Metzenbaum said. "In one pending case, a broker served as an agent both for the utility purchaser and for one of its suppliers."

He contended the audit program for that sort of violation "is being phased out."

Metzenbaum wrote Energy Secretary James Schlesinger and asked, "What was the rationale for disbanding the reseller audit program?" He also asked for details on the audits already performed.

The FEA had been criticized in years past for not going after violations by major refiners, Metzenbaum said.

"Steps you have undertaken to correct this deficiency — such as the near-doubling of the major refiner audit force — should in time produce the results we all hope to see in this particular program," Metzenbaum said.

Metzenbaum said he cautioned against "robbing Peter to pay Paul" by shutting efforts away from the audits of "daisy chain" violations.

During the current fiscal year, 172 jobs were phased out of the reseller audit force, Metzenbaum said.

"I am convinced that continuation of this modest program will save tens of millions, and perhaps even hundreds of millions, of additional dollars for the consumer," Metzenbaum told Schlesinger.

Consumer Safety Chairman Vows To Remain In Office

WASHINGTON (AP) — The embattled chairman of the Consumer Product Safety Commission says his agency is being hurt by criticism of him but that he has no intention of resigning.

Chairman S. John Byington responded in an interview to the criticisms that began even before he was confirmed to his post almost two years ago.

"Unfortunately, damage is done to the overall agency because of efforts to be critical of me," he said. "We have been addressing these criticisms for almost two years and wherever justified we have

made changes because of them."

The commission is responsible for "protecting the public from unreasonable risks of injury associated with consumer products."

The most recent criticism was a Civil Service Commission report on Byington's personnel practices that alleged favoritism, promotion of unqualified persons and other abuses.

Byington called the Civil Service report "an example of how you can take a super-complicated system and try to find technical violations."

"I've been extremely critical of the (Civil Service) system, and what you have here is part of the system biting back at one of its critics. This report is full of unsubstantiated allegations and innuendo," he added.

In one of his attacks on Civil Service regulations, Byington said one-third of government employees "are a disaster and the sooner that they are gone the better off everybody would be." He has called for drastic revision of the system to give managers of government agencies more latitude in personnel matters.

"A lot of people in this agency said that I was conservative in my one-third figure. Others say that it was detrimental to morale. But I think it is true and many people agree with me," he said.

After the report was issued, Sen. Wendell H. Ford, D-Ky., called for Byington's resignation. Ford is chairman of the consumer subcommittee of the Senate Com-

merce, Science and Transportation Committee that has jurisdiction over the consumer agency.

Byington said he plans to continue until the end of his term in October. He said he will not run for a Senate seat from Michigan, as has been rumored.

Referring to two positions held by Ford, Byington said, "some people confuse their role as chairman of the Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee with their role as chairman of our oversight committee."

The commission began operating in May 1973.

Byington said some criticism goes back to its performance before his reorganization had a chance to show results.

In one such criticism last month, the General Accounting Office said taxpayers had spent \$157 million on the Consumer Product Safety Commission in its first four years with only a token effect on reducing the number of dangerous products in the marketplace.

"We agreed with that as far as it went, but said GAO should have looked at more recent events," Byington said. He maintained that his reorganization has resulted in the agency accomplishing as much in each recent quarter-year as it did in the first three or four years.

Byington's troubles began with a struggle for Senate confirmation.

After Byington, a native of Grand Rapids, Mich., was nominated by then President Gerald R. Ford of the same hometown, his confirmation was strongly opposed by consumer groups and by numerous senators.

Ford nominated him for a seven-year term, but a Senate committee killed the nomination. The same day, Ford resubmitted his name for a 2½-year term. The Senate defeated this 37 to 33, but then reconsidered and confirmed him 45 to 29.

"I think there still are some people who are continuing to fight the battle of confirmation that they lost in 1976. Or they are trying to prove that the position they took in that battle was the right position," Byington said.

Senator Ford, who voted against Byington's nomination, has held stormy oversight hearings at which he has charged Byington with putting too much emphasis on public relations and taking too many taxpayer-financed trips.



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Fountain of Youth Discovered By Little Known Civilization Over 2300 Years Ago

(Canton, Ohio) They still exist isolated from the world where they live to be 120 to 140 years old. They have no cancer, heart attacks or other major disorders to speak of. on new hair growth. For women it brings on thick, luxuriant, fast growing hair.

- A mineral and two minute exercise which eliminates prostate problems in men right now and forever.
- An exercise that increases mental alertness and mental abilities.

These people don't know what you are talking about when you speak of cancer, heart disease, arthritis, prostate trouble, female trouble, overweight, baldness, acne, neurosis, nervous tension, rapes, muggings, robbery, murder, etc. How do they die?
