At various times, from the close of the Civil War on, an Irish gentleman, John George Adair, had crossed the Atlantic. came to claim a charming American wife and other times to hunt buffalo on the Great Plains and to seek investment for idle funds. Sporting instinct brought him West, and sense for business kept his money there. Financial friends in Denver steered him into Goodnight and they formed a partnership. ed to leave the eaten-out valley of the Arkansas, near Pueblo, in 1875, and quest again for virgin grass, he thought of the unsettled Staked Plains, a region he had scouted over as a Texas Ranger during the Civil War. He moved his herd down the Arkansas, trailed through the Two Butte country, wintered on the Canadian between Tucumcari peak and the Texas line, summered at the site of Tascosa, and in November, 1876, moved into the Palo Duro Canyon. Throughout that winter his cowboys herded the buffalo off their range to save the grass for their cattle.

There Goodnight established the first great ranch in the hundreds of miles of grassy range between Fort Bascom, New Mexico, and Fort Sill, Indian Territory, from west to east, and from Dodge City. Kansas, to Fort Concho, Texas, an even greater distance north and

When Charles Goodnight decid-d to leave the eaten-out valley of wide range still covers the lower segment of the Palo Duro, and the brand he gave it is still known wherever good beef is bred.

But even frontier enterprise, if it spreads and flourishes, is dependent on money. Capital, too, is es-sential to cattle. And capital, and its hand-maiden credit, were harder than grass to find on the Western range after the depression of 1873, which helped move Goodnight out of Colorado.

It is no argument in economics but a simple statement of fact to say that three substantial features of Western life brought development to its ranges of grass. The land was being taken by men of imagination and character, business was free to venture and, despite the great risks, there was hope of profit. Credit follows character, and capital, like courageous men, ventures only in an atmo-

Plains as Charles Goodnight, and the lengthening shadow of this great man was the institution known as the JA Ranch. Adair died in 1885 and two years later Goodnight divided the Palo Duro with Adair's widow, but retained the southern division known as the Quitaque. His vision in choosing the Palo Duro as the permanent location for a real ranch is more evident with time. Sheltered and secluded, unplowed and unplowable, it is still there. Its cowboys still look to the clean and shifting location of a chuckwagon on virgin grass as the nearest thing to "home, sweet home". It is still an outfit that counts its cattle in thousands, and measures its acres by the hundreds of thousands.

Substantial and tangible as the JA outfit is, however, it is more powerful still as a matter of mellow memory and stable tradition. That tradition was built on the enduring loyalty of skillful cowhands, of the character and courage of Charles Goodnight, the cultured nature of Cornelia Adair, the easily efficient management of Dick Walsh, and the impeccable trusteeship of the great and genial T. D. Hobart. Strong characters come and go, but their memory— symbolized by the JA brand—lives





Jesus Teaches About God

IN THIS great story we see Jesus. wearied from the day's arduous tasks, sitting on the curb of Jacob's well, resting. The disciples had gone across the valley to the village to buy food. The woman comes to draw water from the historic well. She did not notice Jesus until he spoke to her. He is never too busy, never too weary, to seek to bring all men to a knowledge of God's love.

He asked for a drink of water. That was his way of making contact with her. She drew back, wondering why a Jew would speak to a woman in public. But Jesus got past the immediate wall which she threw up between herself and him, and soon was teaching her the way of everlasting life, to which she responded with gratitude.

How We Worship God

READ John 4:5-26 and see how Jesus led the woman of Sychar to understand true worship. Strangely enough, she knew a good deal about Jewish rites and 'ceremonies,' but she had never known the basic truth that "God is a Spirit; and

they that worship him must worship aim in spirit and in truth." Included in the record of how Jesus taught the woman to worship was the necessity of confessing her sin, having five husbands, and living at the moment with still another man. We cannot worship God if there is unconfessed sin in our hearts. We often miss the joy of true worship because we fail to confess our sins. God looketh upon the heart. If there is sin in our hearts, it must be forgiven.

Dc this as soon as separator is up to normal speed.

Moldy or inferior corn is less likely to cause trouble when fed to cattle than when fed to horses and mules.


Mechanized Hog Farm **Makes Pig Raising Easy** A fully modernized and mechan ized hog farm can be so rigged that one man can handle 100 sows and bring to market each year 1,500 to 2,000 hogs-a half-million pounds of pork on the hoof, according to Dr.

Waldo Semon of the B. F. Goodrich company. This is possible by mechanized

means of conveyor belts, chutes and other devices. Tests show, he said. that rubber-tired tractors and other farm vehicles require only 40 to 50 per cent as much pulling power or plowed ground or sod as do stee. wheels, and can plow a field in 25 per cent less time and with 25 per cent less fuel consumption.

Deep Litter Will Help

Keep Laying House Dry Deep litter will help keep well insulated and well-ventilated laying houses dry this winter, says Iowa State college. Not only will there be more eggs to put in the crate, but also the house need not be cleaned as frequently if the litter and drop pings are kept dry. A deep litter keeps the floor dry because it de velops heat as it slowly decomposes in the laying house, insuring better flock health.

Satan had the woman of Sychar completely in his power until the grace of God lifted her feet upon the Rock of Ages. She could then stand in the midst of the people of Sychar and declare that she had met One who had released her from the bondage of sin. That is what will happen in every heart that comes to God through Jesus Christ.
