THIS quarter we study the Cap-tivity and Return of the Jews, using the Books of Ezekiel, Daniel, Ezra, Nehemiah, Esther, Haggai, Zechariah and Ma-

> lachi. Sunday's lesson is found in Ezekiel 1-4 and 33:1-9. It would be well for us to read again the history of this most interesting man Ezekielhow he came to be among the captives by the river Chebar. He is one

Dr. Newton of the most attractive personalities in the Old Testament - a man of surpassing culture and charm—and yet enabled to "sit where they sat."

A MESSENGER OF GOD EZEKIEL could never have adapted himself to the role of ministering to the captive slaves apart from the knowledge that he was the messenger of God - the messenger of God's hope to broken, beaten

God spoke to his people through Ezekiel. He speaks to his people today through chosen messengers -parents, teachers, the Bible, the Holy Spirit. God may be speaking to you today.

HEAR YE THE WORD

EZEKIEL'S approach to the Jews in captivity was by the authority of God's direct message to them through him. Ezekiel was faithful to God's appointment and mission. He knew that what he had to say to the Jews meant their hope of release and return.

He studied their plight. He studied their mood. And then he spoke to them. But not only did he speak to them, telling them what God wanted them to know, but he moved among them. He loved them.

He had God's message, and he went in God's mood of compassion. We cannot help people until we understand them and love them.

GOD'S WATCHMAN

EZEKIEL reminded the people that he had been sent from God as a watchman, and he told them what terrible responsibility was upon him in warning them to repent and return unto God. Read Eze-

If the watchman faithfully warns the people, and they refuse to heed the warning, their blood will not be on his hands: but if he fail to warn the people, their blood will be on his hands. Here is a lesson for every teacher and preacher and parent today.

And in this same 33rd chapter, Ezekiel goes on to declare God's attitude toward all sinners. "Say unto them, As I live, saith the Lord God, I have no pleasure in the death of the wicked; but that the wicked turn from his way and live -turn ye, turn ye from your evil ways; for why will ye die?"

A WATCHMAN UNTO EXILES SON of man, I have made thee a watchman unto the house

of Israel," Ezekiel 3:17. This was the explicit commission of God to Ezekiel. And grandly did Ezekiel accept and execute to the limit of his ability that commission.

The Jews were far from their beloved home. They were driven by hard masters. They could not sing the song of the Lord in a strange land. They had hanged their harps on the willow trees.

With a sensitive soul, Ezekiel comes to them with the word of hope. He reminds them of the goodness and mercy of Jehovah to their fathers, Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. He lifts their drooping spirits with clear and ringing words of promise. He pleads with them to confess their sins and claim the pardoning mercy of a loving God. He used numerous means of gain-

ing their attention - symbols of their former communion with God Patiently he traced the dealings of God with them and their fathers before them. They listened, and all who heed-

ed the pleas of the faithful watchman were saved and restored to faith in the goodness and mercy of God.

We, too, are watchmen among exiles. Let us learn the high art of Ezekiel in our ministry as watchman.

Say You Saw It In The Star

Army Pilots Find Three, Not One, **Magnetic Poles**

Research in Frigid Regions **Explains Mystery of** Apparent 'Shift.'

WASHINGTON.—After more than 12 months of intensive research in the frigid Alaskan polar regions, national winners, both blue and army air forces have solved the mystery raised by the 9,422-mile nonstop flight of the Pacusan Dreamboat from Honolulu to Cairo, Egypt, last year.

The Dreamboat's flight proved feasibility of regular air communications over the top of the world, but it also caused a stir in scientific circles by reporting an apparent 'shift" in the magnetic North Pole.

The navigator of the B-29 reported Solomon was the most famous the magnetic pole more than 200 miles off its previously charted posi-

> Some scientists explained at the time that this was caused by the fact that the magnetic pole was a large oval shaped area.

The air force has revealed that as the result of more than 1,000 variation readings, it has discovered that there are three, and not just one, magnetic North Poles.

Major Pole Located.

Major pole in the elliptical magnetic field was determined to be on Prince of Wales island, with two minor poles on Bathurst island and Boothia peninsula.

It was the minor magnetic pole on the lower tip of the ellipse on Boothia peninsula which had always been given previously as the location of "the pole."

Exploratory work done by the 46th reconnaissance squadron showed that the center of the magnetic field was 1,750 miles northeast of Ladd field, Fairbanks, Alaska.

The squadron flew more than 100 flights over the geographic North Pole and its immediate vicinity and. for the first time, obtained a celestial "fix" over the geographic pole.

This was on a night flight in October, 1946. An air force navigator, by plotting his exact location according to the stars, determined he was directly over the geographic North Pole.

Test Combat Conditions.

In all, the squadron, sent to Alaska in June, 1946, as the pioneer combat-type unit to attempt operations under polar conditions, flew more than 5,000 hours and one million miles to test material and per-

When the 46th arrived in Alaska navigators found their maps marked with large white areas indicating unexplored fields. They were told that conventional means of navigation could not be used in the polar In their first missions, navigation

was difficult. They found many of the landmarks indicated on the map were out of position and that small islands, closely grouped, in some instances were shown as large bodies of land. In the past year, pilots have

worked out a system of referenceheading navigation enabling the planes to fly anywhere and to know their location to within one mile.

To keep the track flown by the aircraft using this grid system, radar operators have learned to estimate wind, drift and ground speed to a fine margin even through an over-

Ground speed can be computed to within five knots.

But, as Justice of the Peace Mercedes Adams will tell you, the thimble-making method solved at least two loot arguments for the notorious Gulf. coast pirate, Jean LaFitte. 'Judge Adams owns one of two

known thimbles salvaged from the LaFitte gang. According to her information, the golden gadget, which doesn't fit any of her fingers, resulted from a division of piratical spoils.

"Each buccaneer had to have his exact share," she explained. "One time, when everything had been divided equally, two golden Spanish doubloons remained. LaFitte settled the matter by hammering the coins into a thimble for the wife of one of his men."
