and the insurance company agree that should the policy holder incur hospital expenses that the insurance company will make payment to
policy holder of stated sums, as policy holder of stated sums,
set out in the policy of insurance. The insurance poricy itself must
state the complete contract between state the complete contran
the parties. The oral statements of agents not in harmony with the policy are not binding on the com-
pany. The company is bound to pay pany. The company is bound of pay
only such sums as are specifically
