

My employer tells me the vacation is unpaid, until I have worked there for two years. Is this legal?

There is no requirement in the law that employers give their employees any vacation time, paid or unpaid.

I suggest you ask your employer to reconsider. If he does not, you must work on his terms, or look for another job.
