

### Stenholm To Visit R-Lee

Congressman Charles Stenholm will be in Robert Lee in the County Courtroom on Wednesday, September 7, for a public meeting at 10:00 a.m.

"I am anxious to get better acquainted in the Robert Lee area", Congressman Stenholm said. "Coke County was added to the 17th Congressional District effective January 1, 1983, and I want to meet as many people as possible."

The Congressman is taking advantage of the Congressional recess to visit over the District and will be in Sterling City and Bronte also on Wednesday. He also has plans to visit Eden, Paint Rock, Ballinger and Wingate in this vicinity.

Congressman Stenholm was first elected to Congress in 1979 and serves on the Agriculture Committee and the small Business Committee. Both of these are very important to Coke County and everyone is urged to take advantage of the opportunity to visit with Charlie.

### Commissioners Court Has Called Meeting

Our county officials were busy again this week with two called sessions Monday and three called sessions Tuesday.

Monday, Aug. 29, there was a public hearing on the grants from the Texas Community Development Program.

At 11:00 a.m. Monday, there was a special meeting to set the policy for insurance coverage on retirees. A resolution was passed that a retiree who meets the qualifications of twelve years of service to the county is eligible to continue with the insurance plan if they pay their own premium.

Aug. 30 at 10:00 a.m. a second public hearing was held on the grants from the Texas Community Development Program. No oral or written comments were made.

At 10:30 a.m. on Aug. 30, a special emergency session was held to grant permission for the County Judge to sign the application for the grant.

At 11:00 a.m. another special session was held. An order was passed to advertise for bids on a paving contract for paving and seal coat in Precinct 3.

The Steers, under head Coach Nelson Coulter, have been working out for several weeks in preparation for tonight's encounter with Miles. Six offensive and seven defensive starters are back from last year. Coach Coulter has been optimistic in his comments about this year's team. Robert Lee was picked for the #4 spot in this year's Coaches Poll made by the San Angelo Standard Times and published in their football section last Sunday. Eden was picked as the preseason favorite, but they are expecting a four-team dog fight for the zone Crown between Garden City, Eden, Greenwood and Robert Lee.

The Steers will open their '83 home schedule Friday, September 9, when the Loraine Bulldogs come to town. The first district 7-A game will be September 23, when the Steers will host Garden City. Homecoming has been set for October 14 when the Steers host Water Valley for a 7:30 game.

Local fans are urged to travel to Miles tonight and support the Steers.

### TOMMY ANTILLEY IS NAMED NEW COKE COUNTY AGENT

Tommy Antilley has assumed the position of Coke County Extension Agent with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, effective September 1, according to County Judge, Aubrey Denman and Ken Cook, District 7 Extension Director.

Antilley will be headquartered in the Extension offices located on the first floor of the Coke County Courthouse in Robert Lee. He will be responsible for all Extension agricultural activities in the county.

A native of Taylor County, Antilley attended grade school in Wingate and high school in Winters. He was an active 4-H member for ten years in Rannels County. He brings to Coke County a varied background in beef cattle production, sheep and goat production and range management. In 1967, he was a State FFA Livestock Judging Team winner. Antilley graduated from Texas A&M in 1973 with a B.S. in Animal Science. His Extension Career includes a two-year stint as assistant County Extension Agent of Wilbarger County followed by three and a half years as County Extension Agent in Knox


### Businesses To Close For Labor Day
