## Thanksgiving Time To Be Thankful

In 1621 the Pilgrims of Plymouth Colony faced far more formidable obstacles than we do today. They were thankful for just surviving their first winter and harvesting their first corn crop. Three days of feasting were declared, with the neighboring Indians invited to share in their rejoicing.

The custom of setting aside a Thanksgiving day spread throughout the colonies and was observed at various times throughout the years.

George Washington proclaimed in 1789 that November 26 would be observed as a day of national Thanksgiving, but observations were sporadic varying from state to state.

In 1863, President Lincoln declared that the last Thursday of that November would be a national Thanksgiving day. Each year for 75 years succeeding presidents formally proclaimed the holiday. In 1939, President Franklin Delano Roosevelt moved the observance up by one week.

It wasn't until 1941 that Congress finally took action to set aside the last Thursday in November as a national, legal holiday.

We urge everyone to enjoy your day of Thanksgiving with your family and friends, and take the time to reflect on all the things you as Americans are blessed with.

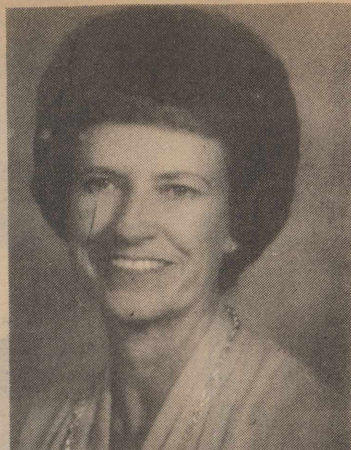
If you are traveling over the holidays drive safely and stay alert. Take frequent rest breaks, the turkey will still be waiting on you however long it takes you to get there.

director were nominated by voting taxing units. According to Kenneth Graeber, executive director of the State Property Tax Board, the governing body of each voting taxing unit had to determine its vote by resolution and submit it to the county clerk before November 15. Each unit was allotted a number of votes based proportionally on its 1982 tax levy. The unit may cast all its votes for one candidate or may distribute the votes among any number of candidates.

The selection process was conducted by the county clerk who must count votes, declare winners and submit results to all candidates and all taxing units in the district by December 1.

An appraisal district board normally consists of five directors but may have as many as 13. The newly elected directors will serve two-year terms starting January 1, 1984. To be eligible to serve on the board of directors, a person must be a resident of the appraisal district and must have resided in the district for at least two years immediately preceding the date he takes office. No more than one employee of a taxing unit may serve on the board, but this limitation does not apply to elected officials also chosen to serve as directors.

**Appraisal Dist. Elects Directors**

This month, for the third time since the establishment of county-wide appraisal districts to consolidate property tax appraisal functions in Texas, new boards of directors are being selected for each appraisal district.

The directors elected to serve on the Coke County Appraisal Board were; Charles Boecking and Brian Richards of Bronte, George Lomas, Wayne McCabe and James Bird Pentecost of Robert Lee.

These directors, elected for two-year terms, appoint the district's appraisal review board members, employ the chief appraiser, set district policies, establish its budget and contract for its major expenditures.

The director selection process followed procedures established by the Texas Property Tax Code. School boards, city councils and county commissioners' courts are entitled to vote, and the code also contains procedures by which an appraisal district may modify the selection process.

She was an early day school teacher in the area and was married to J.J. Perkins in Midland on March 27, 1918. He pre-deceased her on Sept. 15, 1960.

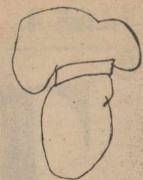
Mrs. Perkins was a well-known philanthropist. Two of her favorite projects were the Theological Seminary at SMU and the Methodist Children's Home in Waco.

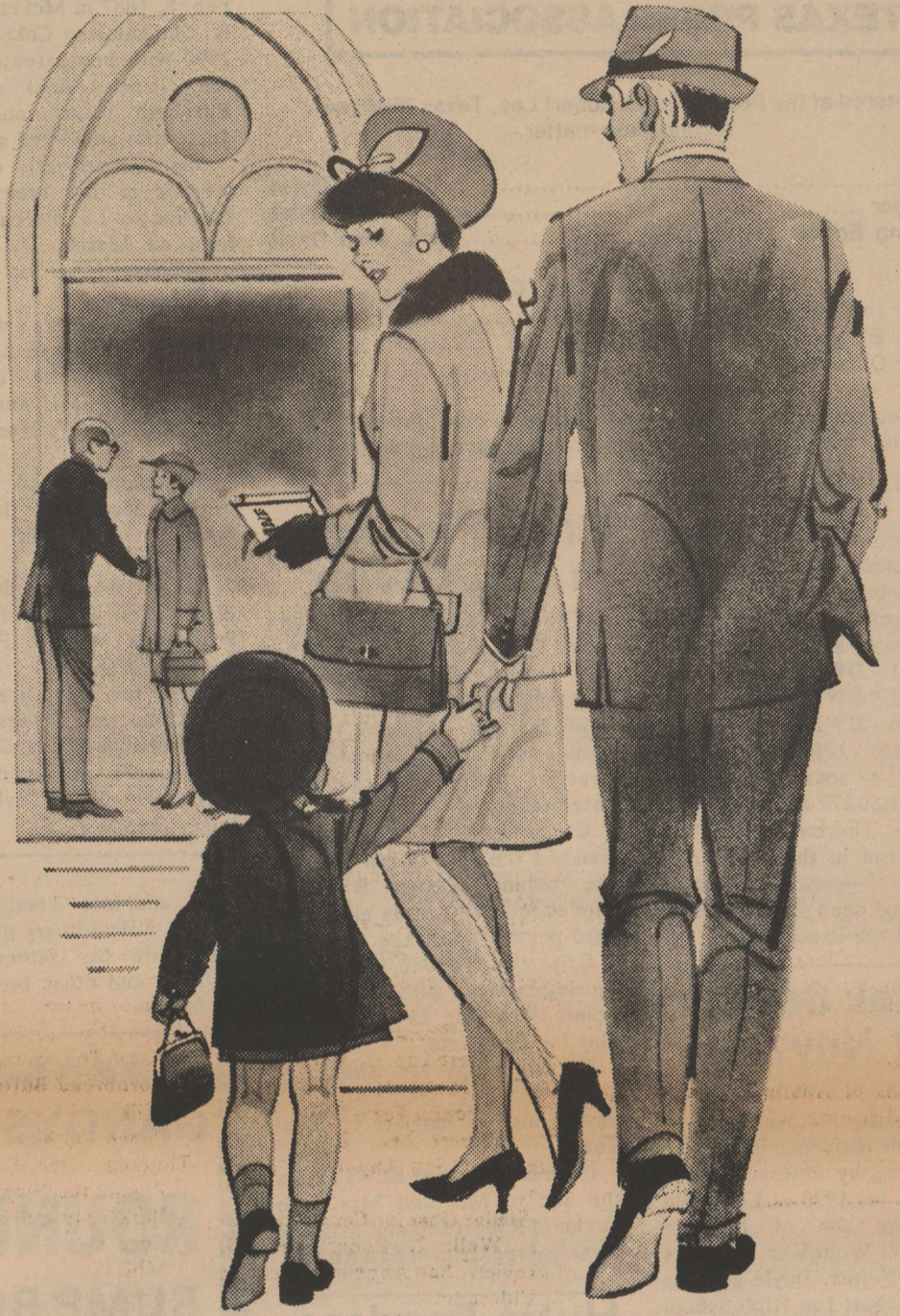

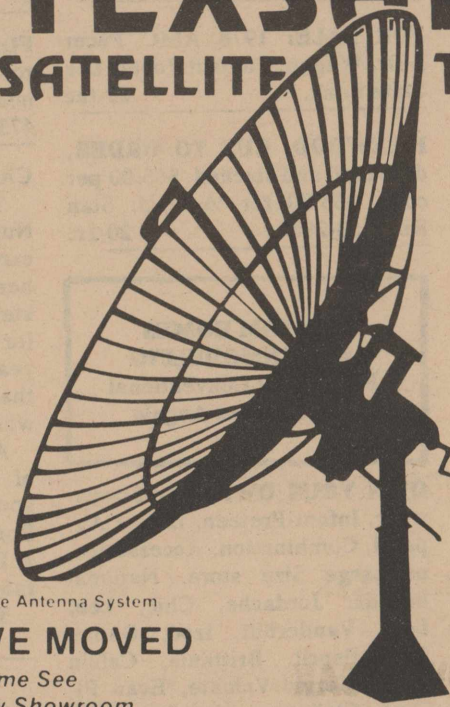

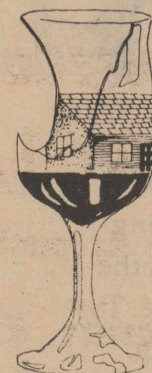
