
Thanksgiving **Time To Be** Thankful

director were nominated by voting taxing units. According to Kenneth Graeber, executive director of the State Property Tax Board, the governing body of each voting taxing unit had to determine its vote by resolution and submit it to the county clerk before November 15. Each unit was alloted a number of votes based proportionally on its 1982 tax levy. The unit may cast all its votes for one candidate or may distribute the votes among any number of candidates.

The selection process was conducted by the county clerk who must count votes, declare winners and submit results to all candidates and all taxing units in the district by December 1.

An appraisal district board normally consists of five directors but may have as many as 13. The newly elected directors will serve two-year terms starting January 1, 1984. To be eligible to serve on the board of directors, a person must be a resident of the appraisal district and must have resided in the district for at least two years immediately preceding the date he takes office. No more than one employee of a taxing unit may serve on the board, but this limitation does not apply to elected officials also chosen to serve as directors.

Appraisal Dist. Elects Directors This month, for the third time since the establishment of coun-

tywide appraisal districts to consolidate property tax appraisal functions in Texas, new boards of directors are being selected for each appraisal district.

The directors elected to serve on the Coke County Appraisal Board were; Charles Boecking and Brian Richards of Bronte, George Lomas, Wayne McCabe and James Bird Pentecost of **Robert Lee.**

These directors, elected for two-year terms, appoint the district's appraisal review board members, employ the chief appraiser, set district policies, establish its budget and contract for its major expenditures.

The director selection process followed procedures established by the Texas Property Tax Code. School boards, city councils and county commissioners' courts are entitled to vote, and the code also contains procedures by which an appraisal district may modify the selection process.



She was an early day school teacher in the area and was married to J.J. Perkins in Midland on March 27, 1918. He pre-deceased her on Sept. 15, 1960


Mrs. Perkins was a well-known philthropist. Two of her favorite projects were the Theological Seminary at SMU and the Methodist Children's Home in Waco.






