





MAHD Board Approves EMR Software Vendor

By Larry Thornton

The Muleshoe Area Hospital District's board of directors voted to continue contracting with HealthLand as the district's electronic health records vendor during Thursday's regular meeting.

Although the district's Nathan Reyes, and his IT staff — Coordinator Bobby Turner and consultant David Buchanan, addressed the deficiencies with the program offered by Healthland during the hospital district's budget workshop in late July, the hospital board decided that it was still the best option considering the price tag of switching to another company.

During the hospital district's strategic planning sessions, it was noted that MAHD had spent approximately \$750,000 on a federally required electronic medical records system a couple of years ago.

But Turner informed the board of directors that the current system needed to be replaced, adding that representatives from Healthland had notified him the EMR program that had been installed will be neither upgraded nor supported after the third quarter of 2014.

He further explained that Healthland Classic EMR won't function on a computer with a newer operating system than Windows XP, which in turn is no longer supported by Microsoft.

During t h e discussion, computer consultant Dave Buchanan noted that Healthland Classic is based on computer software — D-Base, one of the first database

that is a couple of decades old.

to admit it (Healthland Classic) wouldn't work on Windows 7," he

Turner explained that because Healthland Classic can't be upgraded the hospital won't be able to meet the federal "Meaningful Use Stage 2" requirements, which will be necessary for the hospital to received reimbursement funds.

Turner further said at the planning session that the hospital district will be faced with additional costs of about \$60,000 for new computers at Muleshoe Area Memorial Center.

An additional \$15-30,000 may be needed for peripheral equipment, depending upon the requirements of the new EMR program, he

"This is one of those things," Turner said in July. "We don't have any choice."

Although the federal government won't "force" the hospital district to make the change, Turner indicated it was a numbers game in which the hospital


