



The students have been working for this show.


Some of the students began last spring purchasing their animals and working with them to get them ready for this weekend's show.







Have you heard about "climate change"? For many years, scientists have been charting the world's changing temperatures. It is natural for some movement of temperatures to occur, but many people wonder how the changes in climate that result will affect animals and people in their daily lives.


In the coldest northern parts of the world, scientists are studying ice and the way it freezes and melts. Some are also studying the region's polar bears, marine animals that spend most of their time at sea rather than on land. Scientists

have seen that the ice that these bears live and hunt upon is starting to melt earlier in the season than it once did. 
