"Accounting for this was the fact that U.S. exports fell while imports increased. Exports for 1949 were at the rate of 325,000 barrels daily, compared with 368,000 last year and 450,000 in 1947. Imports jumped to a 1949 daily average of 638,000 barrels, compared with 513,000 last year,

"This nation's oil wells are permitted an average daily flow of 12.6 barrels as compared with 3,000 to 15,000 barrels daily of foreign wells where no conservation agencies exist. If the current world-wide surplus of oil is permitted to flood the domestic market, the U.S. will become a have-not nation with respect to war-vital oil in a very short time. Approximately three-fourths of the nation's 440,000 flowing wells which will have to be abandoned permanently soon if some curb is not placed on petroleum imports.





A change in the President's mannerisms and attitude was noted. The rather somber humbleness he first showed on taking office has gone. In its place, he shows utter confidence that he is right and his opponents are dead wrong. If, as is expected, Congress

turns or defers most of the President's program, will it be a defeat for the Administration? That brings up a very curious situation. Some of the canniest commentators have been saying that Mr. Truman does not really want actually amount to a severe setback to Administration plans and strategy. The reasoning back of this point of view is simple enough. The Democrats, like the Republicans, are looking to 1952. Recent events certainly indicate that Mr. Truman will run again, though he has not said so. Therefore, the argument goes, Mr. Truman wants the stage set so that he can go to the country, point to Congressional refusal to give him what he wants, and base his campaign on that. His advisers seem to feel that this would be sound politics, and that it would enable the President to paint his opponents as black reactionaries and tools of special interests.

Practically everything that this Congress does and says will be colored by the race for the Presidency that is to be run almost three years hence as well as by the elections of next fall. As has often been noted, Senator Taft's campaign for reelection will command principal national interest in 1950. On domestic policy, he is the unquestioned leader of this party. If he wins, he will have the inside track for the 1952 nomination.



Preliminary reports show that Sherman County farmers carried out the following conservation practices under the 1949 Agricultural Conservation program, according to R. C. Buckles, chairman of the Sherman County Production and Marketing Committee: leaving stalks of sorghum on land, managing crop residues to protect summer fallow acreage, pit cultivation of cropland, drilling wells for livestock water on noncrop pastureland, constructing earthen dams, constructing damless tanks and chiseling cropland not on the contour.

By their accomplishments, the wheat farmers of Sherman County who cooperated in the 1949 Agricultural Conservation Program have helped strengthen the Nation's bulwarks against erosion and deterioration, says chairman Buckles. The conservation practices they have carried out have increased the reserves in the "Bank of Human Nutrition."





#### Did You Get A Poinsettia For Christmas?

When the handsome red leaves of the Christmas poinsetta plant drop many a housewife concludes that the plant is dying and discards it. This may be unfortunate, say plant scientists because the dropping of the leaves after blooming indicates the plant is going into a normal rest period which should last until about the first of May. With a little care the plant may be kept in good condition for blooming next year, says Miss Dorothy Dixon, County Home Demonstration Agent.

After the leaves fall, put the plant in a cool place (40 to 60 degrees F.) and water only sparingly. About the first of May the plant may be cut back to remove excess old wood and make it more shapely. Shake off the old soil and re-pot in a mixture of about 3 parts garden loam, 1 part wellrotted manure and 1 part leafmold. Use a pot just large enough

In setting February 23 as the date for the general election, Prime Minister Clement Attlee must have been acutely aware that this will be far and away the most bitterly contested and momentous election in modern British history.

Britain's 33 million voters will elect a new house of commons, with the party seating the majority of candidates getting the right to form the government.

Speculation was high as to whether defeats within the past two months by the Labor parties in both Australia and New Zealand could be taken as a straw in the wind, insofar as the outcome in England is concerned. 



read of continued misunderstandings because of similar words with different meanings. Russia's constitution established the power of the Soviet government while the American constitution protects the inalienable rights of the individual. The Soviets have elections, electing to office two houses of government. But only the 21/2 million communists cast their ballots while the other 170 million people of the Soviet Union have no voice in the government. The Soviets have a "free press." However the freedom of the press in the Soviet interpetation means the right to own a press and other equipment necessary for publication of a paper. It does not allow the right to print or voice the thoughts one desires. The Soviets have a supreme court, an attorney general, a council of ministers, and a central committee, all elected by secret ballots cast by members of the Communist Party. Stalin is the Secretary General of the Communist Party, a member of all councils and committees, and the commander in chief of all armed forces. Our inability to reach a Russian understanding of any sort is caused by the use of the same words with different definitions, Hogue told the Lions. In their early conferences Roosevelt and Stalin agreed on freedom of speech and of the press.

The controversary with Russia over atomic control continues with our government satisfied that Russia has or will have the atomic bomb. Atomic and rocket experiments are carried out along the Finnish border where projectiles are fired into the sea. Russia uses another spot comparable to the White Sands of New Mexico in a location between the Black and Caspian Seas. Russian industry is located in the interior lake and desolate mountainous areas, making it safe from bombing attacks.

In every major issue Russia has maneuvered for the control to be placed in the hands of the major powers. Here she has the privilege of veto. The United States has stood for control before the entire United Nation Assembly. Russia has agreed to inspections of military and industrial strength to be made only designated times while the United States stands for inspections to be made at any time it may be consider-
