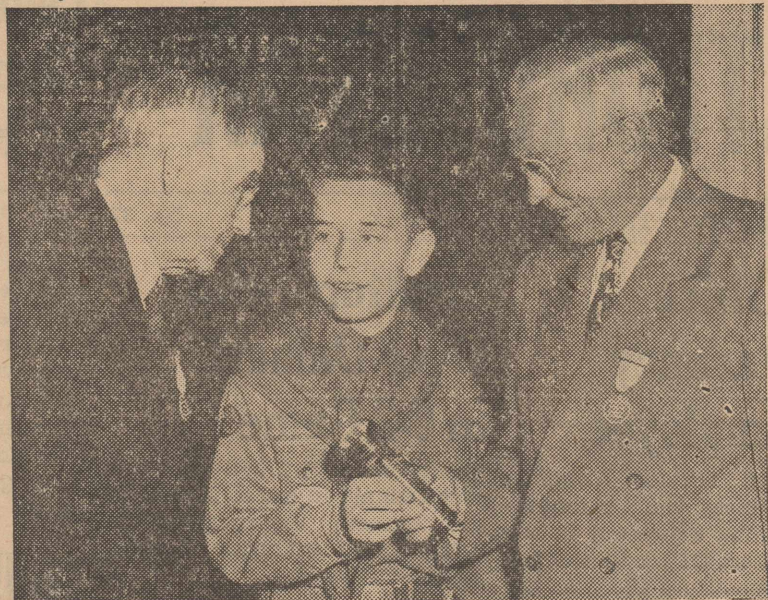

### Boy Scout Gets Gold Flash For Jamboree



MADISON, WIS.— Boy Scout Don Bribery is a lucky lad, for he will take to the International Boy Scout Jamboree at Valley Forge the gold plated Billionaire flashlight being presented to him here by Wisconsin Governor Oscar Rennebohm as Wisconsin Supreme Court Justice Marvin Rosenberry, a member of the National Boy Scout Council, looks on.

The Billionaire was created to commemorate the billionth Ray-O-Vac leakproof battery, produced within the short span of 11 years. Visualizing the magnitude of a billion cells, they would make a single cell that would stand more than a mile high or, if laid end to end, would reach 37,870 miles.

Present also at the commemoration celebration were officials of the Army and Navy, representatives of the National Association of Manufacturers, as well as civic and industrial leaders of the state.

### Ben Guill Reports To The People

If the decision of the Supreme Court on the Texas Tidelands case made the people back home half as angry as it did the Congressmen up here in Washington, then the air must have been blue last Monday all the way from Perryton to Childress and from Farwell to Follett.

The decision stole a billion dollars out of the pockets of our Texas school children. It also broke the solemn word of the United States government, given in 1845 when Texas voluntarily joined the United States.

There is a bill which would overrule the decision of the Supreme Court being considered by the House Judiciary Committee this week. It will undoubtedly be reported out favorably and the House will undoubtedly pass it if it comes to the floor. Unfortunately, it looks as if there will not be time for the Senate to pass it and, even if it did, the President would certainly veto the bill.

The tidelands area embraces 2,608,774 acres of shallow, submerged lands which have been legally within the boundaries of Texas since the first session of the Congress of the Republic of Texas in 1836. The tidelands were specifically given to Texas for all time in the Joint Resolution annexing Texas to the United States in 1845.

In 1933 Mr. Harold Ickes, then the Secretary of the Interior, stated that tidelands generally could not be appropriated except by authority of the sovereign states. But, three years later,

"The Old Curmudgeon" began to have his doubts, and with those doubts the fight for Federal appropriation began.

But even the bureaucrats of 1933 believed that specific permission from Congress would have to be obtained if the tidelands were to be appropriated. They asked the 75th and the 76th Congresses for that permission and were turned down cold. After this, Mr. Ickes again reversed himself, and on April 19, 1943 he told the Truman Committee he disapproved the litigation in regard to submerged lands. In June, 1944, he reversed himself for the third time and tried to move in on the tideland States. At this point the States went to Congress and sought relief. The House passed a resolution on September 20, 1945 favoring the tidelands. States by a vote of 108 to 11. The Senate passed a similar resolution on July 22, 1946 by a 44-34 vote. So President Truman vetoed the Bill, on August 1, 1946. The House failed to override the veto by a mere 17 votes.

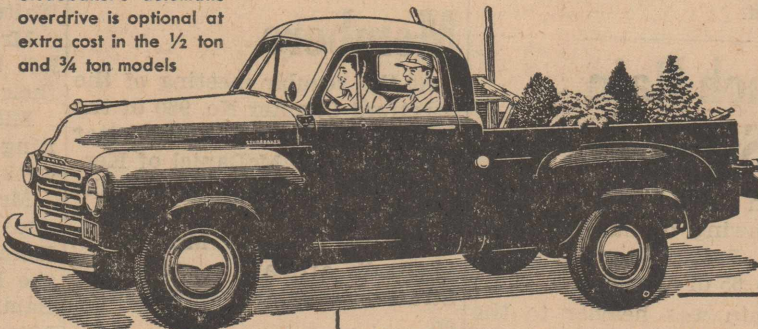
The bureaucrats, suddenly deciding that they didn't need Congressional approval to steal the tidelands after all, especially since that approval wasn't forthcoming, sued the State of California for possession of its underwater lands. The Supreme Court decided against the State of California in June, 1947.

The matter was brought up before the 80th Congress again and this time, on April 30, 1948, the Tideland bill passed by the overwhelming majority of 257 to 29. (Remember, this was the so-called "worst" Republican Congress.) Administration pressure prevented the tidelands bill from getting out of committee in the Senate. The bill died. But, all this was in regard to

the tidelands in general and had little to do with Texas. Texas had been given permanent ownership of her tidelands through a solemn agreement with the United States government, as a condition under which she joined the Union. The United States Attorney General's office chose to consider the solemn word of the United States as unimportant, and sued Texas anyway. The Supreme Court, on Black Monday, June 5, 1950 also decided that solemn word of the United States government isn't worth the paper it's written on.

The decision simply "legalizes" theft. It also leaves all of us Texans with the problem of raising a billion dollars in tax money over the years to support our public schools. That money would have been forthcoming from the revenue from oil-reproducing wells in the tidelands area.

But there are other implications. The decision gives the Federal Government the green light to move in on anything it wants within the sovereign states Mr. Phillip B. Perlman, the United States Solicitor General who is so fond of quoting Communists and fellow-travellers as

authorities in his briefs, was asked recently if the tidelands decision would effect the Great

Lakes. "I don't know," he said. "Let's find out if there's anything (Continued on Page 3)

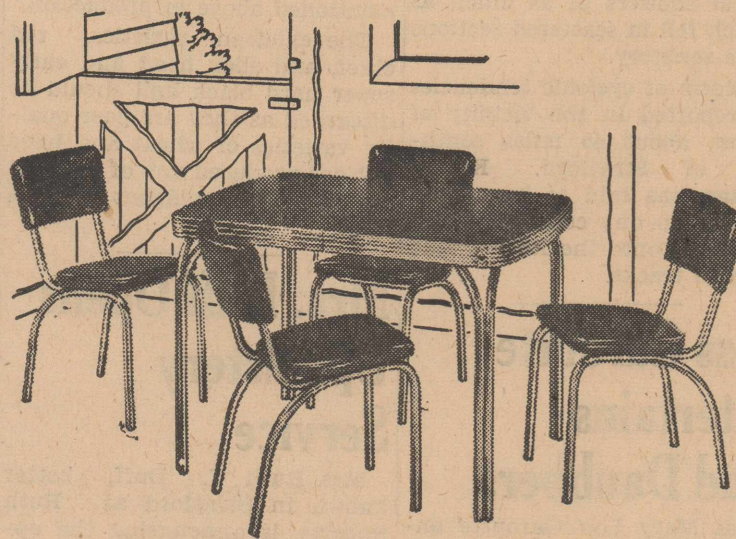

**SECRET BARED**

**Darius Sign Gaps Filled**

ANN ARBOR, MICH.—Ten years ago, a lanky bespectacled professor looked across a mountain gorge in Iran at the famed carvings of the Persian King Darius, chiseled on the face of Mt. Behistun.

He leveled his camera at the 2,400-year-old carvings. Almost at the same time, he snapped a mental shutter of resolve to complete scientific examination of the so-called "Rosetta Stone of Western Asia."

Prof. George Cameron of the University of Michigan says he now is prepared to "fill every major gap" in the famous writings, ending a century of research.

**Many Have Tried**

Others had made resolutions about the ancient work. Sir Henry Rawlinson climbed half way up the 9,700-foot mountain in 1835 to copy the bas-relief of Darius and the 10 kings he vanquished. Columbia university's A. V. W. Jackson rechecked several lines of the inscription in 1903. In 1904, the British museum sent an expedition to add to the findings of Rawlinson and Jackson.

But there were gaps in the story written in three languages in panels below and to the left of the 18-foot relief. And four columns of writing above and to the right of the "exquisitely" carved relief were described as "illegible" in earlier reports.

Cameron laid his plans while a

faculty member at University of Chicago.

The project itself began late last fall, under sponsorship of the American Schools of Oriental Research and the University of Michigan, to which he moved.

Cameron, his wife, Frances, and sons, Douglas and Tom, arrived at the foot of lonely Mt. Behistun on the plains of Kirmanshah early in November and immediately encountered a labor problem.

**Balked at Ladder**

Local workers were agreeable about helping until they were led up the mountain to a narrow ledge, above which towered the inscriptions of Darius the Great. There remained a 30-foot ladder climb, then a finger-and-toe-hold ascent of 15 feet to the ledge upon which earlier expeditions had stood.

Nothing doing. Cameron offered as high as 20 times the wage paid for field labor. Nothing doing. Fortunately, two young Kurds named Hussain and Ali came to the rescue.

"All quit after a short time," Cameron relates. "But Hussain—bless his soul—stuck right through the 21 days we worked on the cliff."

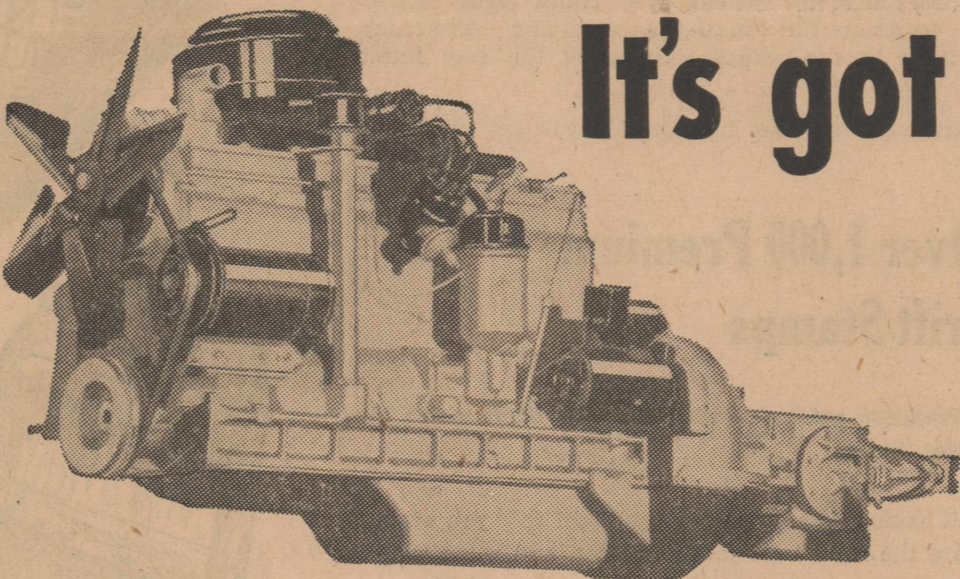

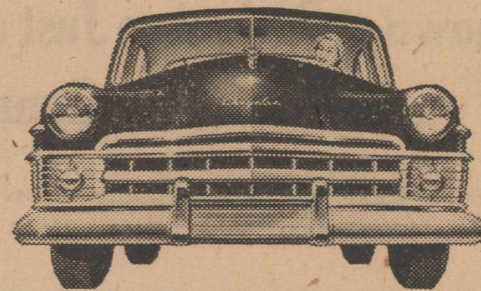

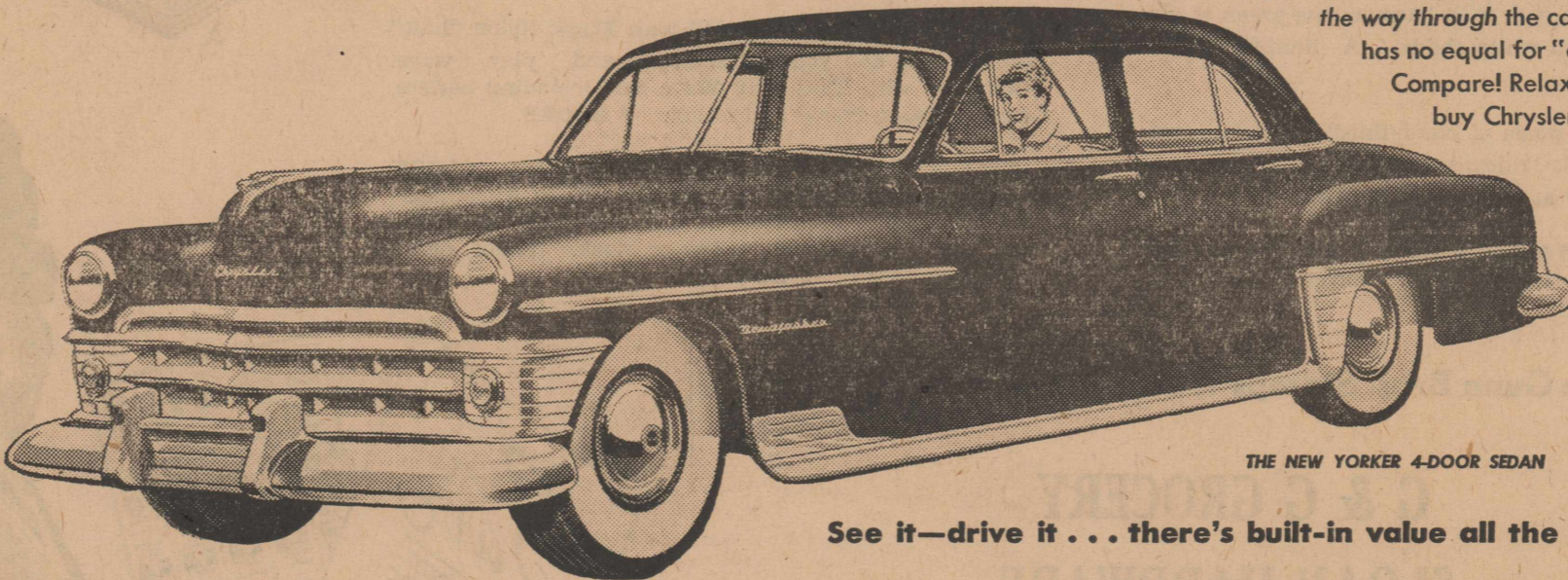

**HEALTH IN EARTH**

**Soil Holds Drug Secrets**

CHICAGO.—The interest of medical scientists all over the world has been stirred in the probable potential of soils in many sections producing powerful drugs which will cure some of the most baffling diseases, the national society for medical research has reported.

As a result, the scientists are gathering samples of soil around the globe so that careful analysis may be made to determine whether they contain microbes and molds which are far more precious than gold or any other metals which have provided the main incentives for such explorations in the past. The hunt was started after Paul R. Burkholder, Eaton professor of botany at Yale university, New Haven, Conn., isolated the mold which makes the drug Chloromycetin from a handful of soil picked up in Venezuela, South America.

**First Effective Drug**

Chloromycetin turned out to be the first drug effective in combating such diseases as typhus and typhoid fever, and therefore immediately joined the select company of antibiotics, such as penicillin and streptomycin which now hold ranking positions in medical science's arsenal against the worst maladies of mankind.

Amazing new techniques for analysis in the laboratory and determination of the properties of drugs are credited with helping man to discover for the first time in the long history of his habitation of this planet some of the greatest health giving properties of "the good earth."

Only a little of any particular soil is needed for analysis. When molds and microbes are discovered, the stage is set for a long series of studies to find what they will do. Finally the drugs are given long tests on experimental animals in the laboratories, and after their properties are labeled and their safety determined for the living organism, they are ready for administering to humans.

One of the most extensive searches for soils to be analyzed has been undertaken by the same Yale university laboratories which were the scene of Dr. Burkholder's great discovery.

**Collecting Samples**

A graduate research student, Richard A. Benedict of Brooklyn, N. Y., has arrived in South America and is collecting 5,000 samples of soil from all sections of the continent.

His trip will cover 15,000 miles and describe an area from Buenos Aires to Mexico City. Its most hazardous portions will be in the jungles of the Amazon areas of Brazil and in the high altitudes of the Andes between Argentina and Peru.

His "harvest" will be thousands of carefully sealed two-inch plastic tubes. The U.S. Department of Agriculture has arranged for expediting the samples through the Customs offices of this country, and in addition to the medical research planned, there will be studies for soil conditions generally.

Since the samples will come from areas which never have been under cultivation and those which have been tilled for hundreds of years by Indians and settlers the first full soil picture of South America may be a by-product of whatever medical discoveries result.

**New York Town Operates 'Republic' for Youngsters**

FREEVILLE, N. Y.—If any citizen of the George Junior Republic doesn't like the rules, he can do something about it.

Any boy or girl may advocate changes and is "free to campaign," says the director, "to amend or abolish any law on the books."

That is the basis on which the Republic, said to be the smallest in the world, operates on its 550-acre tract on the outskirts of this village 10 miles north of Ithaca. The citizens are problem boys and girls.

The Republic was founded in 1895 by William R. (Daddy) George, a New York City businessman, who started salvaging East Side "tough guys" with a pair of boxing gloves in a deserted Bowery warehouse. After a few rounds, George usually convinced the boys that they weren't so tough after all.

George then would invite them to his farm here, and they soon began to see the merits of law and order.

Today, the Republic has 26 buildings. There are grade and high school classrooms, a non-sectarian chapel, a gymnasium, trade shops, dairy buildings and living quarters.

**New Schools Are Brighter**

TOWSON, MD.—Turn some educators and psychologists loose with brick and mortar and a little hard cash, and what do you have?

Green blackboards—yellow chalk—three delicately tinted walls and a fourth of window glass—roofs with glass brick centers—plastic dishes.

That's a condensed description of Baltimore county's new schools. It could happen in most any country,

for except that Baltimore county includes some of the overflow of the city of Baltimore, its rolling farmland and small towns could be placed in any of the more populated states and feel perfectly at home.

Baltimore isn't a part of Baltimore county. In fact, it's not a part of any county. It was laid out as a city without county ties.

**Started After War**

Modernization of the county's schools was begun immediately after the war. Three new buildings already are in use. Three more will be ready in September.

The men behind the program wanted something more than the biggest for the cheapest, so they called in education authorities and psychologists to help design the plants. The results have drawn education officials from all parts of the country to see what the "contemporary" school looks like.

The green boards and yellow chalk? Remember, in the "good old days," how you sometimes had to squint at the wall-slate because of the glare from the window? And how the glare was made more pronounced by the whiteness of the chalk?

Greenboards Sandblasted That's a thing of the past here. The greenboards, made of green glass sheets, are sandblasted to eliminate smoothness and glare. It is well established that yellow chalk is much more restful to your eyes.

Remember the monotony of white or cream walls broken only by the blackboard and small, old-fashioned windows? Here, two walls may be a pale green, and another wall and the sound-deadening ceiling pink. The fourth wall

is mostly broad windows.

The color psychology and the sound-deadening ceilings apparently are quite effective. When the county school physician made his first visit to the new elementary building at Loch Raven—with an enrollment of nearly 700—he turned to the principal and asked: "Is this a holiday? Or have you got mufflers on the children?"

**Summer Rains Can Be Serious Soil Robbers**  
88 Per Cent of Loss Occurs During Season

Summer rains can be "soil robbers" that cause serious erosion losses unless farm land is protected by good conservation safeguards, Ohio State University soils research men point out.

A 10-year study of erosion damage at the Zanesville, Ohio experiment station, showed that more than 88 per cent of the soil loss due to rainfall occurred in the six summer months. Farm soil is most vulnerable in summer be-



causing clean-cultivated row crops during those months provide only a small amount of protection.

High intensity summer rains cause soil losses in two ways, the Ohio research men say. Large-sized drops strike the earth with such force they break the surface soil into small particles that quickly fill all surface pores. This seals the soil surface into a hard crust that water cannot penetrate. Excessive runoff and erosion losses are the result. Also, high intensity rain beats down so fast that even unsealed earth cannot take it as rapidly as it comes.

Thick stands of deep-rooted legumes and grasses will provide a soil-protecting cover that will enable the land to take high intensity rains in stride. To produce dense, leafy stands, the legumes must be well fed. That means liming, where needed.

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**Five-Point Program**

THIS PROGRAM MEANS PROFITABLE PRODUCTION.

- 1-SOIL TESTING
- 2-PLANT FOOD
- 3-ORGANIC MATTER
- 4-SOIL SAVING
- 5-ROTATION

A five-point program to "balance the soil's needs" and obtain maximum crop yields per acre at lowest production costs, was outlined by O. T. Coleman, Missouri university extension soils specialist.

Here are the steps Coleman suggests:

- 1—Provide plenty of plant food in available form for growing crops.
- 2—Have soil tests made to find out whether the plant food supply is in balance. Growing crops need a balanced ration the same as do humans and livestock. A soil test will be a guide in adding the kind and amount of plant nutrients the soil needs.

Get the soil in condition so crops can use the plant foods. This means building up the organic matter supply. Organic matter can be added and soil tilth improved by growing well-fed deep-rooted legumes such as alfalfa or sweet clover in the rotation. When the soil is well stocked with plant nutrients and organic matter, minerals are released so that plant roots can more efficiently use them.

- 4—Keep water, plant nutrients and soil at home by conservation methods. Where needed, these may include terracing and contouring to reduce runoff and erosion losses on upland soils.
- 5—Follow a well-balanced cropping system. Rotate pasture and green manure crops regularly with grains. Livestock is a "must" to properly make use of pasture and roughage crops. Tests have shown that where a crop is pastured off, about 75 per cent of the organic matter is returned to the soil through manure.

**Remodeled Farm Kitchen Saves 45 Miles Yearly**

Mrs. George C. Wheatcroft of Warren county, Kentucky, recently had a farm kitchen remodeled into a u-shape, saving an estimated 45 miles of walking a year.

She says: "I can now prepare three meals and take only 250 to 300 steps where it did take 500 to 500, and that means a saving of 45 miles a year. Besides saving miles it saves time and is much more attractive."
