# AROUND THE HOUSE

Brown shoes can be dyed black temporarily if you just polish them twice with a good grade of black polish.

It's a cinch to get rid of the stuff that blue serge picks up. Take a large piece of adhesive tape and rub the sticky side of it over the serge.

If a pair of new shoes feel as though they're going to rub blisters on your heels, beat them to the punch by putting strips of adhesive tape on your heels before the blisters arise, instead of after. That should keep them from arising at all.

To dye white shoes black, try using quick-drying black enamel paint. It often wears better than liquid or paste dyes and doesn't rub off so easily.

You can brush out the cuffs on men's trousers easily if you take out the stitches holding the cuff and replace them with metal snaps. From then on, unsnap the snaps, brush, then snap the snaps.

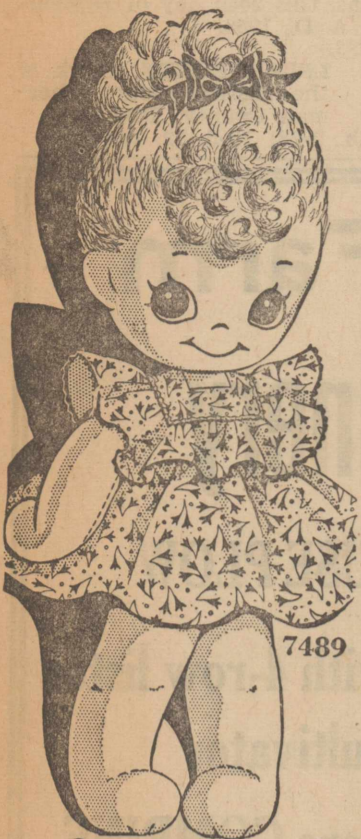

Ratio of Elders Doubles in Century

The ratio of elders to those at the main working years of life has doubled in the United States during the past century, and has increased by nearly two thirds since 1900.

One hundred years ago there were only about six persons at age 65 or older for each 100 of the population at 20 to 64.

Although the segment of the population at 65 or over has been increasing, the relative importance of the dependent population as a whole has declined, due to a rapid drop in the ratio of children to the population at the main productive ages.

In very recent years, however, due to the war and postwar spurt in the birth rate, this trend has been reversed and the child population has increased at a more rapid rate than people at ages 20-64.

As a result, we are entering a period when the country will have to provide for the expanding social and economic needs of both its large child and aged populations, each growing at a faster rate than the population at the main working ages.

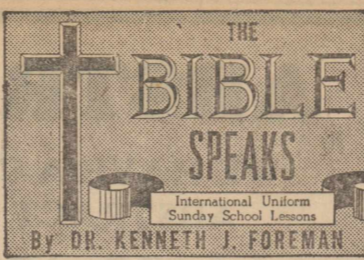

Growing in Prayer Lesson for October 22, 1950

LIFE MAGAZINE, which does not set up as an authority on religion some years ago carried a story about a little girl who was going to be confirmed in the Episcopal church.

Most Christian ministers, including those of the denomination in which she was confirmed, would agree that (1) if that is as far as she had "graduated," she still had a very long way to go in learning about prayer.

The Lord's Prayer THIS is not meant to say anything against the Lord's Prayer, or to imply that we are wrong every time we use it.

It is his suggestion as to the lines along which, and the spirit in which, we ought to pray.

One truth suggested by the Lord's Prayer is that we are not alone in the world. Every verb, every pronoun referring to the one who prays, is in the plural—OUR Father...

Prayer at its lowest level is nothing much more than "Gimme." The untaught prayerer may even talk to God as if he were a personal servant, a kind of celestial bell-boy on call whenever we ring for him.

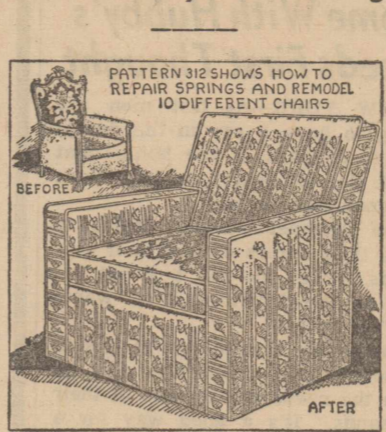
The growing Christian will grow in prayer as in all things; he will grow to the point where, even when he prays as an individual, he will be remembering how many ties bind him to other individuals; he will pray less and less for his own necessities and more and more for what he may share with others.

Learning God's Will A GOOD deal of worrisome argument has gone on over the question: Can prayer change the will of God? We shall be less bothered by that question when we discover two truths.

If we know that God's will is against something, then, if we have any sense, we know there is no use in praying for that thing. If we know God's will desires something, then we can be confident that our prayers in that direction will be heard with favor.

A study of the Lord's prayer, from this angle, will teach a Christian how to pray in accordance with God's will. Paul knew this. When he prayed that his Philippian friends' love may abound more and more, he knew very well that this was precisely in line with the will of the Father who is eternal Love.

NEW YORK—At last men are going to have a say in the design and furnishings of the home—that is, if Harriet Sherry, a New York designer, has her say.

The designer advises brides to build their homes around their husbands. "Let the old boy put his feet on the furniture if he wants too," she says.

Too many women try to design homes to suit themselves and ignore the needs and desires of their husbands. It's a good way for a newly married woman to get off on the wrong foot, she observed.

There are no two men alike when it comes to the way they want their homes, Miss Sherry warned. Every bride, before designing and decorating her home, should try to learn just what her husband's needs would be.

"Her objective is to please her man, not to try to arouse the envy of her friends, or to keep up with the current vogue."

First it must be decided just what functions the home furnishings are to perform. The bride must ask herself whether—in addition to living—the home is to be used for entertaining or business.

"Many men, especially attorneys, must bring work home after office hours," she said. "In that case, there must be a place for them to work in. It should be a place furnished practically and one that is decorated in such a way as to cause the least amount of distraction."

Other men have hobbies. They, too, must have room to practice their hobby. It does no good for a wife to laugh them off or to try and suppress them.

Here's a warning about a man with a hobby," she said, "don't try to stick him in the basement or in the garage, where the lighting and heating probably are poor. Give him a room he'll be proud of."

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### Life Expectancy Gains Half a Year in U.S.

NEW YORK—A national life insurance company reports American wage earners and their families gained half a year of life expectancy in 1949.

The company said a survey among millions of industrial policy holders showed that life expectancy in that group rose to a new high of 67.7 years.

That was five years more than the 1949 figure, the company reported. The average length of life now is about double that of the period from 1879 to 1899.

### 15-Year-Old Girl World's Youngest Big Game Hunter

DAYTON, O.—Elaine Monesmith, 15-year-old Dayton bobby soxer, is the world's youngest big game hunter. She has made three expeditions into Africa with her father, James, a machinery dealer turned explorer. Another trip will begin in November.

The first hunting trip for the father-daughter combination was in 1946 to the Belgian Congo. Since then the two have traveled through nearly every part of Africa.

They usually hunt as a team, with her father lassoing the animals and Elaine standing guard with a gun, in case.

Her first jungle kill was to save her father's life. He was shooting pictures of a herd of elephants when one charged. Elaine's deadly aim with an "elephant gun" stopped the animal in time.

She weighed 105 pounds when she started her last trip. She came home weighing 88. "The life is rugged, she says. "Sometimes our party will cover 25 miles a day. Often we are gone for two weeks from our headquarters. That means camping out every night in the jungle."

Her ambition is to lead her own expedition.

### 'Rocking' Rocking Chair Finally Taking It Easy

MUSCATINE, Iowa—The old rocking chair has stopped rocking. Remember the chair of Mr. and Mrs. Floyd Holladay that got all the publicity because of what seemed a self-propelled marathon?

It rocked for four months, but lost its restlessness when Mr. and Mrs. Holladay moved and took the chair with them.

The Holladays said there evidently are fewer vibrations in their new home, for the chair is now at ease most of the time. "Once in a while it takes off on a temporary rocking spree."

### Authority on Termites Catalogs 1,932 Species

A complete catalog and revision of the termites world has been issued by the Smithsonian Institution.

It lists a grand total of 1,932 species of these wood-eating insects, known chiefly to the general public as pests but to students of insect behavior as among the most remarkable examples of social evolution. The work is by Dr. Thomas E. Snyder of the department of agriculture's bureau of entomology and plant quarantine. Dr. Snyder is among the world's foremost authorities on termites. He not only has made extensive collections but has studied the habits and control of the insects through most of the western hemisphere.

The catalog gives the "white ants"—a bad misnomer—a new family tree, and several hitherto unknown and living and fossil genera and species are listed. The wood eaters are most closely related to the cockroaches and thus can trace their lineage to the earliest known insects that swarmed in the ancient forests at least 25,000,000 years ago. The termite order itself is at least 30,000,000 years old and has undergone extensive evolution, although some of the most primitive forms still are in existence.

Superficially the termites resemble ants—their most devastating enemies. They seem to have followed parallel lines of evolution, both in body form and in their remarkable social organization.
