Priscilla Club Meets With Mrs. Blanks

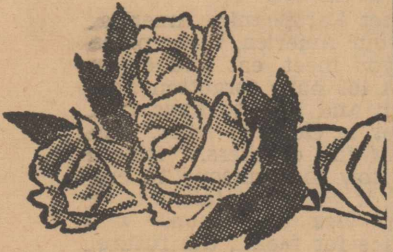
The Priscilla Club met in the home of Mrs. Frank Blanks Thursday of last week.
