Safflower Crops Are Growing In County

Approximately 100 acres of Sherman County land has been planted to Safflower and from reports a good yield is expected from the crop. A field along the road on the T. L. Wakefield farm northwest of Stratford is described as being one of the best fields. The plants are in bloom in this field.

Safflower seed produces an oil which is said to exceed the qual-ity of linseed oil for use in paints and is replacing cotton seed meal with a higher protein meal known as Saffmeal.

Safflower is described as a glorified weed and is recommended by the U.S. Department of Agriculture for fields in territories where the annual rainfall is not more than 18 rainfall is not more than 18 inches. 


Texas 1952 Wheat Goal Is 6,400,000 Acres

Texas' 1952 production goals for fall-seeded wheat, barley, oats, and rye were announced this week by B. F. Vance, Chairman, State Agricultural Mobilization Committee.

According to Vance, the State's acreage goals for these fallseeded crops are as follows: wheat, 6,400,000 acres; barley, 200,000 acres; oats, 1,600,000 acres; and rye, 21,000 acres.

These goals apply only to fall-seeded crops. Goals for spring crops will be announced later.

In making this announcement, Vance explained that these acreages are to be considered Texas' share of the National goals for each of these fall-seeded crops. The National goals for wheat of 78,850,000 acres; for barley of 12,865,000 acres; for oats of 6,035,000 acres and for rye at the 1951 harvested acreage, are in line with good land use and for all possible expansion of feed crops including hay and pasture. The national wheat goal calls

Canada's prairies, while home to the continent's waterfowl, has an even larger stake in the democratic nations' economy. The prairies produce much of the world's wheat, rivaled only by that produced in Russia's Ukraine, and to a lesser extent, in our mid-west states. The source of all this economic wealth is inevitably tied to waterfowl, for the same ingredients-water and prairie land-are what produces both. Thus sportsmen of the United States, out to produce waterfowl for hunters, have aided the eco-

nomic recovery of a nation. Ducks Unlimited has been officially recognized and praised for the role it has played in nearly every corner where water conservation is of primary interest. The water stabilization committee of Alberta recently issued a report showing the work it has done since 1947. Recognition of DU importance in the work is illustrated by its membership on the committee, appointed by the provincial government, consisting of engineers from the government and Ducks Unlimited.

The objective of the committee is the conservation of water, the objective of DU is the conservation of waterfowl. With their objectives so closely knit, the two have provided a model of cooperation. When propagation of wild fowl is the main purpose of a project, Ducks Unlimited pays two-thirds of the cost and the Province one-third. When the major benefits accrue to the people of Alberta as a whole then the distribution of cost is reversed. On one lake where thousands of waterfowl nest, the Province provided \$140,000 of the cost as against DU's \$10,000.






