By mutual agreement, 20 of these unions-comprising about $1,200,000$ men, or, more than $90 \%$-are working under wages and rules agreed to by them and the railroads. But leaders of three unions-with only about 130,000 men, or less than $10 \%$-still refuse, after more than a year of negotiations, to accept similar wage and rules agreements. These are even more favorable than the terms recommended by the Emergency Board appointed by the President.
