The church here had formed a corporate board to collect payments from land-buyers and in turn to pay off the obligation.

MOST MENNONITE families were buying five- and 10-acre tracks, though some, such as Peter Bergen, had paid \$70,000 toward a section - 640 acres. Bergen's land was dryland without irrigation - and pecame a farming gamble.

Those who did cross the two U.S. borders managed to pay \$575,000 on the note but forfeited the land when they were unable to meet a \$225,000 payment due

in February.

Land and equipment was auctioned off for \$1,151,000 last Tuesday and has returned to Nix.

WACO, Texas (AP) -Texas cattlemen are beefing about a limited boycott of their product proposed by New York City and state consumer advocates.

The New York proposal would have consumers refusing to eat beef on Wednesdays. It came after U.S. Department of Agriculture predictions that beef prices would rise 20 percent by the end of the year.

Carrol Chaloupka, president of the Texas Farm Bureau, said the New York suggestion 'shows a total lack of understanding of what it takes to put beef on the table.'

Chaloupka said a successful boycott would break the cattle market and "would be a signal for cattlemen to reduce herds again."

Chaloupka said cattlemen reduced total cattle population by 21 million head in the five years following what he called the price collapse of 1974.

"The facts of life are that we have 8 million fewer cows than we had five years ago," he said. "It takes cows to produce the calves that we fatten for beefsteaks and hamburgers. All we ask is that the boycotters and government leave us alone to build back our herds and provide an





on my guitar and sang, I was feeling happy. The arthritis even affects her ability to read - it's painful to hold the book, she said.

She expressed frustration at the enforced inactivity: "When I was a little girl, I did everything, jumping rope, driving a car, riding the horses...Now this time, I can just ride this (wheel)chair...But I remember...'

But just about the time she was being interviewed, she had started on some new medicine, which she and the home's nursing supervisor have hopes will ease her pain.

The 79-year-old woman, unlike some elderly persons, likes being with people of her own age. Yet she's lonely without her husband and the family and friends she has lost through the years.

"We had a lot of good friends when I was a girl, a lot of family, all dead now.

Before she came to the nursing home, she lived with her grandson and his children in a three-room house in Midland.

She moved from her own larger house after her husband's death

"Since my husband died, I can't stay there no more becuase I don't want to sit all day (alone)," she explained.

Nonetheless, Mrs. Hinijos finds her days full, with her friends and with nursing home activities like bingo and dominoes.

'All the time I'm busy and all the time I've got company in my room. If I didn't have friends, I would not be happy.

She seems to have retained her sense of humor and spirit.

All that combines to make her a clear favorite with the nursing home staff.

"I wish they were all like her," the nursing supervisor said. Mrs. Hinijos is an example of nursing home residency at its best.

Though she has to have help dressing and getting to the bathroom -

he's afraid of falling - she still can move around at will within the home by foot or by wheelchair.

She seems to dwell on the past at times, but is fully aware of what's happening around her.

Perhaps most importantly, she has her friends - and not just those in the nursing home. Former neighbors, people from her church and family are in town and keep in touch, if sometimes infrequently.

Mrs. Hinojos even knows the family of the aide who takes care of her during the day shift.

So that, although she may be resigned to spending the rest of her life. in the home, she successfully fights despair.



Nuclear push anticipated

WASHINGTON - As the radioactive dust settles over the Pennsylvania countryside and assessment of the nation's worst nuclear accident begins, one thing is certain: The nuclear power industry and its apologists will be mounting a high-powered propaganda campaign to persuade the American public that nuclear energy development is too vital to our national interest to be sidetracked by Nervous Nellies alarmed by the Harrisburg nightmare.

And if past performance is any

Regulatory Commission shut down five nuclear plants because of questions raised about their resistance to possible earthquake damage.

Echoing Henny Penny's "the-skyis-falling" routine, DOE officials announced sadly that the nuclear plant shutdowns would cost an extra 200,000 barrels of oil a day to replace the curtailed atomic energy source. This supposed threat to the Carter.

administration's goal of energy independence was challenged by an expert our associate Howard Rosenberg consulted, Charles Komanoff. After studying the five caused by the so-called neutron bomb plants' own records, he concluded that the shutdown for the installations of proper safeguards would cost only 65,000 barrels of oil a day - less than a third of the DOE's scare figure. Assistant Energy Secretary Hazel Rollins told us, "We have no quarrel with Mr. Komanoff's figures." Yet other DOE officials and oil company advertisements still insist that the shutdown of the nuclear plants is costing millions of barrels of oil and countless dollars.

CHARLEY REESE 'Group hard at work to make sure you stay poor'

ORLANDO, Fla. - If you aren't rich, if you are black or a working class guy, or a kid whose parents can't buy you a Mercedes Benz for a graduation present, you'd better wise up fast because there is a group of people hard at work to make sure you stay poor.

Most members of this mob are pretty well off in the pocketbook if not in the head. They are a diverse group, probably a majority of them are wellintentioned, but the effect of what they are up to is keep the little guy down.

They are the people who want to turn our collective backs on technology and economic growth. They are anti-nuclear power, anti-business, and anti-free enterprise. Most of them are victims of the surplus wealth syndrome.

You see, on a personal basis, a person can only effectively use so much income. Whether you are a king or a janitor, you can only sleep on one bed at a time; you can only eat so much food each day; you can only wear so many clothes; and you can

only spend so much time on a recreation since both the rich and the poor share the same 24-hour day and the same (more or less) lifespan.

So when by luck or whatever, a guy acquires a lot of money in great excess of what he can personally consume, there is a real danger of his losing his perspective.

For example, if your income is high enough, it really doesn't matter how much a gallon of gasoline costs. It doesn't matter what the prices are for food or clothes or cars. For the rich, the consumption of these kinds of items constitute such a small portion of their spendable income that they are hardly even conscious of the prices.

For such people, it's very easy to say, "Yes, clean up the river even if you have to shut down those nasty factories. Yes, take umpteen million acres of land and preserve it as a wilderness and keep those dirty miners and oil drillers out of there. And, yes, put the pollution control devices on everything. It's certainly worth a few extra pennies."

On the other hand, if you are making a little over the minimum wage, a \$1 a gallon gasoline and \$3 a pound hamburger add up to disaster. Like me, you'd probably rather take a chance on the possible longterm ill effects of pollution than the certain, short-term ill effects of your chilren not having enough to eat.

And, if you are not fortunate eough to be able to live off interest, you're probably more interested in a job than you are in knowing that the grizzly bear population is on the increase

It's a fact, folks, that for most of us, our economic welfare depends on a growing economy and exploitation of natural resources. We need to develop oil and gas; we need to mine minerals and metals; we need to create an environment in which businesses flourish; we need to develop atomic energy. The no-growth purists, however, are getting the upper hand. They are on the television shows and in the federal government and on the campuses and they are all talking against growth. They can afford to. We can't. So Robert Redford wants to keep his mountain clean. Fine. Most of us. however, can't afford to buy a mountain; we can't even afford to drive out to the Rockies and look at Redford's, assuming he would condescend to let We are way down here worrying about such mundane things as meeting the mortgage payments, keeping food on the table, and buying enough gas to get us to work. It's very nice that Redford is concerned about pollution; we are concerned about paying this month's electric bill. It's very nice that Barry Commoner is worried about future generations; we're worried about this one. This issue of growth versus no growth is crucial but it has not been clearly defined. We need to do that and those of us at the lower end of the economic spectrum - workers, small and medium business owners, blacks and immigrants - had better get our act together before these rich idealists beguile us back to the 18th Century. The 18th Century was splendid for the rich; it was hell for the poor.

They are stressing the enormous cost that will be passed onto consumers if nuclear power development is curtailed and the nation's energy needs must be put at the mercy of foreign oil producers.

Nuclear energy is supported by a formidable lobby, composed of the utilities that are eager to produce energy they can sell and the government officials who made the multibillion-dollar decisions to develop nuclear power in the first place. Many of these officials have gravitated into the upper levels of the Department of Energy. They have a tremendous commitment to make nuclear energy look good.

Both the utilities and the DOE cried "foul," therefore, when the Nuclear

The obvious effect intended is to convince the public that insistence on "zero-risk" safety standards at atomic power plants may not be worth the price.

Sen. Gary Hart, D-Colo., spotted the danger in this line of reasoning and sent a private letter to Energy Secretary James Schlesinger. "Seriously inflated cost data," he wrote, "could lead to public demand for unwarranted and dangerous

relaxation of nuclear safety standards." 
As long ago as the 1950s, the Atomic Energy Commission assured the people of Utah and Nevada that Abomb tests there posed no threat to residents. Yet today, a quarter of a century later, soaring cancer and leukemia rates linked to the tests have proven those confident pronouncements false.

The AEC's successor agency, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, promised the American public there was no danger of a serious accident at any of the nation's nuclear power plants. But an accident has occurred, and the true scope of its seriousness won't be known for decades to come.

In February 1978, when we reported reputable scientists' findings that no level of radiation was without risk, we were denounced. But an interagency task force assigned by President Carter to investigate the hazards of low-level radiation has since concluded: "The results of recent studies of populations exposed to very low levels of radiation raise serious questions ... and suggest that risks may be higher than earlier predictions.

When we reported that a govern-ment-funded scientist, Prof. Thomas F. Mancuso of the University of Pittsburgh, had his federal contract cut off because his 12-year operators of a nuclear plant in Virginia had to install extra protective shields against neutron radiation.

The record of contradictory and mendacious statements by the government and nuclear-power industry in the Three Mile River fiasco is too recent and too blatant to need repeating here. It's no satisfaction to be able to say, "we told you so," but perhaps the Harrisburg nightmare will at last force the industry and the government - and those in the media who too easily accept their word - to tell the public the truth about nuclear oower and its dangers.







Whether in 'shambles' or not, Texas Democratic Party has problems

AUSTIN - When John C. White was picked to head the National Democratic Party, there was some feeling at the state level that Texas Democrats would be heading towards a renaissance of influence and power at the federal level, after slipping back from the years of the Lyndon B. Johnson presidency.

Not that the Texas party has ever been completely out of the picture, with the influence of such folks as House Majority Leader Jim Wright and Dallas fundraiser and special trade envoy Bob Strauss. But events haven't been particular-

ly kind to the state party.

Many of the long-time veterans of the Texas congressional delegation have retired in recent years. Goldberg has indicated he thinks White is trying to lay the groundwork for Carter to ignore the Texas party in his 1980 campaign.

Carter's popularity in Texas hasn't been anything to boast about, at least lately

In fact, it's appeared Carter may be the least popular - or second least popular - president Texas has known, depending on whether Santa Anna is counted.

Goldberg seems to feel Carter may be prepared to write off Texas - al though Land Commissioner Bob Armstrong and former party chairman Calvin Guest are expected to head the Carter effort again next year, as they did in 1976. Carter, for what it's worth, could be

premature in writing Texas off - if that's what he's done.

Texas went for Richard Nixon in his 1972 landslide re-election victory, and went for Dwight Eisenhower in 1952 and 1956. Before that, Texas had gone for the GOP candidate only in 1928 supporting Herbert Hoover over Al Smith.

Still, some members of the Democratic National Committee indicate that unless Carter can turn things around, the Republicans likely could beat him in Texas, regardless of

whom they nominate - and especially if they nominate John Connally. Carter did meet with some top

party and elected officials during his recent visit to the state, and at least went through the motions of hearing their views - especially regarding energy policy matters.

Some officials still insist Carter can and will carry Texas in 1980, regardless of who opposes him. But that is becoming more and more a minority view.

There is general agreement, however, that victory for Carter will entail considerable effort on his behalf and will require considerable fund-

raising as well. Goldberg contends that all the talk about the Texas party being disorganized and disheartened isn't likely to contribute anything to Carter's

chances - and isn't calculated to encourage anyone to contribute funds to his campaign, either.

Whether or not it's in "shambles," the Texas Democratic Party has its problems - and those problems aren't likely to be eased with the present division developing between state and national leaders.



WASHINGTON - First of all, Arlene Crane is frank. Amazingly so for a politician's wife.

She'll talk openly, quickly, about almost anything. Her dark eyes flashing, she'll burst into laughter at times and pepper her words with 'don't print that" or "but you can't say that."

She talks about occasional in-law problems, a dislike of psychiatry people have to help themselves." she says, and sometimes friction between herself and her husband's staff.

But as far as becoming Washington's next Martha Mitchell. as one reporter suggested, Crane positively brushes that suggestion aside.

"I am candid," she says in a serious tone, "but there is a BIG difference (and she stresses the big) between being candid and stupid."

Arlene Crane has too much at stake. Her husband is running for president. Philip Crane, a conservative Republican congressman from Illinois, last August became the first of a host of Republican 1980 presidential contenders to announce his candidacy.

But don't expect his up-front wife to be an up-front campaigner on her own

She has hardly been involved in politics at all during the ten years her husband has been in the House of Representatives. She couldn't. The Cranes have eight children - the five

oldest, all teen-agers, the youngest just 6. Seven girls and a boy.

Except for one brief period in her husband's congressional race when she was pregnant with child number seven, Arlene Crane has never had household help. She's done it all alone. "I want to be a helpmate in the

campaign," she says, a slight Midwestern twang in her voice. "If he wants me here, I'll be here. If he wants me there, I'll be there. Wherever he wants me, I will be." It is clear Phil Crane wants her by

his side. "Her role in the campaign will be to

be with me as much as possible," he said in a telephone interview from the campaign trail. "But campaigning independently, I don't see her role love her.'

Taiwan stands at the crossroads

HONG KONG - It will be an important, perhaps crucial, year to the government and people of Taiwan.

For the first time in years this isolated island of 17 million has been given the clear choice of whether it wants to continue with the delicate status quo, respond to Chinese feelers about reunification, or cling to the 30year dream of driving the Communist government off the mainland.

The decision could have serious ramifications not only for the future of China but for all Asia and the world.

The shock of the normalization of relations between the United States and China on Jan. 1 had hardly been registered when Chinese Vice Premier Teng Hsiao-ping began to make tantalizingly generous offers to begin the reunification process. Taiwan authorities have thus far

emphasized that there is no U.S.-Chinese normalization, most - stuggle."

But, he said, for America to stay great, the influence and number of people who believe the country should change its ways must be increased.

After touching on his experiences as a prisoner of war of the Vietnamese for seven years, Risner recounted a list of ways he believes America is slipping in military strength.

Contending the United States is No. 2 in the world militarily now, he said the Russians were widening the gap

Moreover, he claimed, the U.S. is providing the technology the Russians need to develop new capabilities and the money to improve their economy

The U.S., meanwhile, is not progressing militarily, he said.

"There are no new bombers coming down the pike," he said, "and the B-52s are older than the pilots who fly them. The American attitude that a nuclear war is unthinkable is not shared by the Russians, he contended. Noting Russian emphasis on civil defense, he said the USSR has dis-

persed its industry throughout the country to minimize the damage that could be done in an all-out nuclear war and practiced evacuating its cities annually.

'The United States has no civil defense program," Risner noted.

The Russians project they could survive an all-out thermonuclear war with only 4 percent casualties, he said, while the U.S. projects 60 percent casualties in a similar conflict.

Communism, Risner warned, "will not change its spots.'

He recounted being told by his Vietnamese captors in 1971 that they would win the war by signing a peace treaty

"Within two years," he said he was told, "all U.S. troops will be withdrawn and we will possess Vietnam. Then we will liberate Laos, Cambodia and the others.

"Their only mistake so far," Risner noted, "is that they are ahead of schedule."

The course of America can be changed, Risner told the appreciative bankers, but people who believe in





Hoveida execution deplored

WASHINGTON (AP) - The State Department said Saturday it deplored on the "grounds of human rights and justice" the execution of former Iranian Prime Minister Amir Abbas Hoveida.

In a prepared statement, department spokeswo-man Anita Stockman said Hoveida's secret trial apparently did not allow him a "proper defense or the normal elements of due process and justice."

She said, "We do not comment on the guilt or innocence of the persons accused in the revolutionary trials, but in this case as in others, we have made plain to the Iranian government our firm conviction that internationally accepted standards for open and fair trials should be observed."

Islamic guerrillas claim wins

ISLAMABAD, Pakistan (AP) - Islamic guerrillas fighting President Nur Mohammed Taraki's pro-Soviet regime in Afghanistan claimed Saturday to have killed, wounded or captured more than 1,600 government troops since March 20.

The Islamic anti-government Afghan National Liberation Front said in a statement released here that government losses in a dozen or so battles included more than 500 killed, 200 wounded and 937 captured.

A small number of "Mujahedeen," or Islamic fighters, were killed together with a number of women and children "victimized by indiscriminate bombing by the government air force," it said.



'Capitalist' rights rapped

PEKING (AP) - The Peking People's Daily said Saturday it is possible for China to guarantee democratic rights, but not the "capitalist" kind of the West and only after new laws are developed.

"The democracy we are talking about is a democracy which served socialist economy," the editorial said. "The proletarian democracy is enjoyed by the majority. It is definitely not the democracy which serves capitalist economy, which is for the minority.'

The Peking editorial was an apparent reply to critics of the Peking city government's decision last week to curb wall posters criticizing the Communist Party's leadership of China.

Jurists condemn Bhutto trial

LONDON (AP) - An international convention of lawyers and jurists Saturday declared that the trial of former Pakistani Prime Minister Zulfikar, Ali Bhutto "clearly failed to meet minimum standards of justice and of Islamic law."

Bhutto, prime minister from 1971-77, was hanged Wednesday in Pakistan on charges that he ordered the murder of a political opponent.

UTPB donates right of way

ODESSA - The North Route between Midland and Odessa got a little help recently as The University of Texas of the Permian Basin donated 5.5 acres of university land to the city of Odessa as a right of way for the new highway.

UTPB President V.R. Cardozier, who recommended the land be given to the city despite Odessa's offer to purchase the property, said UT System regents approved the gift at a recent meeting in Austin.

"We see the construction of this northern route between the two cities as an important step in helping the university serve the city of Midland better," Cardozier said.

Gacy heart attack not shown

CHICAGO (AP) - Medical tests have failed to show that John Gacy Jr., charged with the murders of seven young men, suffered a heart attack, a cardiologist at Cook County Hospital said Saturday.

Gacy, 37, is in satisfactory condition in the hospital's intensive care unit. He has had a history of heart trouble and complained of chest pains Friday evening before he was rushed to the hospital. Isaac Wilson, head nursing administrator, said Gacy was admitted in a semi-conscious state.

Freighter said 'stable

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) - A converted 510-foot Philippine freighter carrying 211,000 gallons of oil was "stable" Saturday after it began taking on water off the coast south of picturesque Big Sur, the Coast Guard said.

Coast Guard spokesman Ed Conlon said two pumps were installed and two others were en route by helicopter to the Galleon Coral. The vessel was taking on water through a damaged hold. He said the ship was carrying a grade of heavy, black oil known as "bunker oil."

Ship under tow

CLEVELAND, Ohio (AP) - The 315-foot freighter CLEVELAND, Onio (AP) — The 315-foot freighter Labradoc, which had seemed on the verge of sinking in Lake Erie, was under tow and headed for Ohio, the U.S. Coast Guard reported Saturday. Petty Officer Edward Brichard, a Coast Guard spokesman, said the Canadian tugboat Atomic was towing the Labradoc toward Pelee Island, north of Sandusky

Sandusky.

The Labradoc began sending distress signals Fri-day after part of its cargo of 160,000 bushels of corn shifted during a vicious storm that sent 15-foot waves washing over the port deck in winds of up to 50 knots

ing that members of the Seminole Mennonite community be granted permanent U.S. residency.

While the bill is pending, the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service is barred from carrying out deportation proceedings. **BEGINNING EARLY** in 1977, the

Mennonites came to the Seminole area, purchased land and settled down.

The problem is that, contrary to what they assumed, they came as "visitors" - not immigrants - on 60-day visas which, ironically, prohibited the Mennonites from working. "Members of the church maintain they were led to believe that if they purchased land, they would be al-

lowed to stay in this country," noted Bentsen, who described the Mennonites as a "peaceable, hardworking" people Several hundred Mennonites from

Mexico came here from the Chihuahuan Valley, in part because they feared the Mexican government would take over then land holdings there. Others left Canada for Texas, where they could purchase land for about a third of what it costs in Canada.

Mennonites from Canada apparently were led to believe that if they invested \$40,000 in land in this country, they would be granted an "investor's visa" under an agreement between the United States and Canada.

THAT IS the case, said Clark, but the "investor's visa" is limited only to native-born Canadians. It does not, for example, apply to Mexi-co-born Mennonites who are Canadian citizens


Clark said the Mennonites could not be viewed as "wetbacks," for they moved to the Seminole area with initial assurances from an immigration officer and from a congressman that they were legal residents.

'They came on good faith," Clark said, "and brought (with them) work capabilities in the trades. The Mennonites practice the

worth ethic," they are not on welfare, and they are not involved in politics, Clark said. Outcome of the Bentsen bill will

determine if the Mennonites can stay in this country.

Should they be allowed to stay, members of the religious sect say they may reorganize and regroup Once again, the Mennonites may try to realize their dream of an independent community.

Pipe dream came true

Marvin Martin has been making pipes since 1949. The Midland man - having turned a printing business over to his son, Wesley - has carved a career from his hobby of cutting up pieces of wood.

"I was smoking a pipe back in 1949, and I was too damned poor to buy one that smoked good," said the 52-year-old former U.S. Bureau of Indian Affairs employee.

'I'd been carving wood nearly all my life, so I just decided to make my own pipe," he said. "I looked at what I was smoking and I got some briar wood and I

carved an Indian head."

He said once the finished product was done he "fired it up. But it didn't bite my tongue. It smoked good.

Ever since Martin was a knee high to a pipe stem, he said, he's been carving wood. Born in McKinney, the longtime Midland businessman also has lived in Colorado, Arizona and New Mexico.

When Martin carved his first pipe, he was in Santa Fe, N.M.

"I was working for the Bureau of Indian Affairs as a vocational teacher. I taught carpentry and cabinet work.

"One day I just quit and decided to come to Midland because in New Mexico I'd seen all these oil workers with lots of cash. I thought I'd get me a little piece of that gold, which I thought the streets were paved with," he said.

Although Martin never saw streets paved with gold, "Midland has been good to me. It's been real good.

Martin is dedicated to craftsmanship.



Arab neighbors' sanctions

Egypt takes action against

CAIRO, Egypt (AP) - Egypt recalled ambassadors Saturday from seven more Arab countries, retaliating for the political and economic sanctions imposed for its peace treaty with Israel, the Foreign Ministry said

The move, coupled with the withdrawal from Cairo of envoys from many Arab League nations, further isolated Egypt, the most populous Arab nation, from its 20 brethren.

"In fact one can say that Egypt is almost isolated from most of the Arab world," a ministry official conceded, hastily adding, "decisions are not forever and it is not the first time Egypt has been at odds with its sister Arab states."

The announcement said Egypt was recalling its ambassadors from its rich supporter Saudi Arabia and from Qatar, the United Arab Emirates, Bahrein, Tunisia, Kuwait and Morocco. Egypt's ambassador to Jordan was recalled a few days after the treaty was signed.

It earlier broke relations with the Palestine Liberation Organization. the mover and shaker of the Arab League's boycott of Egypt, and severed ties with the hardline Arab states, Syria, Iraq, Libya, Algeria and South Yemen.

It now has ambassadors only in Sudan, Oman, Mauritania, Somalia, North Yemen, Lebanon and Djibouti. "It is a sad affair, it is true," said a Foreign Ministry official, who de-clined to be identified, "but we consider it only a tempest. It will pass when they are able to adapt their policies and ideas to actual peace

with Israel." Egyptian diplomats maintain the recall is not a severance of relations nor a step toward it, but in the words of one official "it is a blow for a blow."

Egypt insists that the treaty is only a step toward the solution of the Mideast conflict and that the Palestinians should first start with an autonomous state and eventually seek independence.

As for East Jerusalem, Egypt says it is part of the West Bank of the Jordan River that will be returned to the Arabs during negotiations over autonomy for the Palestinians. Israel says it will never relinquish control of East Jerusalem, annexed following the 1967 Arab-Israeli war.







The speech came two days after Carter announced plan to gradually phase out federal controls on domestic crude oil prices by Sept. 30, 1981. He coupled the Thursday announcement with a plea for congressional enactment of a 50 percent "windfall" ax on excess profits that would result from the ifting of controls

Carter noted that some critics already have pronounced the tax and a special energy fund dead because "the oil lobby has more influence in Congress than the American people.' The president said he would not permit "this

painful but necessary step to become an excuse for a ripoff. That is why I will fight for a windfall profits tax on the unearned, excess profits of the oil companies."

However, Carter zeroed in on what he predicted would be oil industry lobbying efforts against the proposed Energy Security Fund - a special reserve that would funnel an estimated \$5.6 billion from revenues produced by the tax for such things as aid crats' Jefferson-Jackson fund-raising dinner. Geologist praises, criticizes Carter

WICHITA FALLS, Texas (AP) - The president of the American Association of Petroleum Geologists issued a statement Saturday praising President Carter's energy speech, but criticized him for "oil company baiting.

"President Carter showed rare political courage and wisdom in his energy speech Thursday night,' said Robert Gunn, a Wichita Falls geologist.

"It is difficult for any leader in a democracy to suggest that unpopular actions are needed, especially when those actions will result in higher prices," Gunn said.

"However, if we're going to solve a very real crisis - in energy supplies and in the foreign dominance of our economy - then we have to take initially unpleasant new steps. Decontrol of oil and gas prices is the only way we can solve our immediate and medium-term energy problems.'

Gunn predicted that decontrol America's oil production will be increased within 10 years by two million barrels a day. Present production is 8.5 million barrels a day, he said.

But Gunn said Carter's speech contained some danger signs.

"Oil company baiting, while attractive politically, is destructive to any effort to solve the present problem. The fact is that the oil companies need every dime they can get for exploration and produc-' Gunn said. tion.

The suggested windfall profits tax policies would only put new controls on the oil companies as soon as the present ones are lifted, he said. 'Whether we like it or not, it is only the largest oil companies that have the financial resources to explore and produce oil and gas from technically difficult and hostile environments where there are the largest undeveloped supplies."

'They are going to be all over Capitol Hill like a chicken on a June bug. Some are already telling us we should just turn all the money over to them every last dime.

"I don't question their sincerity. But I think they are wrong. The American people think they are wrong ...," the president said, adding: 'I am not looking for a fight; I have enough to keep

me busy, but I'll promise you this. I am prepared for a fight if that's what it takes - and with your help, I do not intend to lose.' Carter's speech brought an enthusiastic response from the crowd which interrupted the president

more than a dozen times for applause, particularly when he criticized the oil industry Departing from his text, Carter said of the oil companies: "I don't question their enormous politi-

cal influence. They blocked the energy legislation for more than two years.' The president also made a reference to the nuclear power plant accident at Three Mile Island in Penn-

sylvania, saying one result "of that fright will be to remind every American how vastly more destructive, to 100 million American people" would be a nuclear exchange between the United States and the Soviet Union



Jerome Deal steals **Texas Relays thunder**

AUSTIN, Texas (AP) - Sophomore Jerome Deal of Texas-El Paso, a virtual unknown in sprint circles, shocked favored Curtis Dickey of Texas A&M Saturday to capture the rain-splattered collegiate 100-meter dash in the 52nd annual Texas Relays.

Deal ran an impressive 10.25 seconds in the unfavorable conditions thanks to an explosive start.

Dickey, the powerful Aggie footballer who won the open 100-meter race Friday night here in a duel with Olympian Johnny "Lam" Jones, was left in the blocks at the start and couldn't make up the distance.

Dickey finished third in 10.46 seconds, behind George Enchill of Southeastern Louisiana, who also had a time of 10.46.

The six-foot, 170-pound Deal, who is from Aberdeen, Md., is the Western Athletic Conference 100-meter champion. He defeated Houston McTear, Jones and Dickey in a 60-yard indoor dash at Albuquerque in February.

However, Deal was fourth to the winning Dickey in the NCAA indoor 60-yard dash in Detroit.

Texas-El Paso, well on its way to winning the most outstanding team balloting, posted its second meet record as Tanzanian Suleiman Nyambui ran an excellent anchor on the medalwinning 4x1,600-meter relay team.

UTEP, which won the distance medley relay Friday night in meet record time, clocked 16:23.70 to eclipse the old standard of 16:28.06 by Arkansas in 1978.

Nyambui, who ran a 3:57.59 mile Friday night, ran the distance in four minutes flast Saturday

Texas-El Paso, led by 25-year-old freshman sensation Suleiman Nyambui of Tanzania in the distance events, set two records Saturday in the rain-splattered Texas Relays and scored a surprising victory in the sprints

While Nyambui was the individual star in record-breaking efforts in the 6,400-meter and 3,200-meter relays, homore Jerome Deal pulled a sur prise, beating favored Curtis Dickey of Texas A&M in the collegiate 100meter dash. UTEP, which has a team with 17 foreigners from eight countries, was clearly the outstanding school in the meet.

Louis Cardinals, did it last April 16, beating the Philadelphia Phillies 5-0.

Ken, at 32, three years older than Bob, missed perfection by only two Atlanta batters. He walked leadoff hitter Jeff Burroughs in the second inning on a 3-1 pitch and Barry Bonnell with two out in the eighth, also on a 3-1 pitch.

Ken's no hitter was the earliest ever pitched in major league history. Bob Feller of the Cleveland Indians pitched one on opening day in 1940 - but the date was April 16, the same as Bob Forsch's date.

The previous earliest no-hitter was pitched on April 14, 1917, by Ed Cicotte of the Chicago White Sox, who beat the St. Louis Browns 11-0 in St. Louis.

The previous earliest National League no-hitter was pitched on April 15 twice.

First, Leon Ames of the New York Giants did it for nine innings against the Brooklyn Dodgers in 1909 but gave up a hit in the 10th and wound up losing 3-0 in 13 innings. Then in 1915, Rube Marquard of the Giants beat the Dodgers 2-0.

Ken Forsch, a 6-foot-4, 215pound right-hander and a 10year major leaguer, all with the Astros, struck out three Atlanta batters and allowed seven balls to be hit to the outfield; six to center field.

He was in command throughout. Not one batter came close to getting a hit. Every out was routine. The closest thing to a hit came in the fourth inning when Glenn Hubbard hit a sharp grounder that Houston third baseman Enos Cabell fielded on one hop.



As talk of more strigent governmental control over the consumption of gasoline goes on, I have to worry a little about the plight of the Permian **Basin outdoorsman**

Midland residents are a long way from any type of outdoor recreational area. Whether one is interested in camping, hiking or fishing, there just aren't any readily available facilities within 100 miles of Midland.

Moss Creek Lake in Big Spring is way too small to handle a significant number of campers or fishermen and the Monahans State Park is not exactly a place where you would like to spend a vacation. After the 100-mile barrier, there are numerous camping and fishing spots, but this barrier is the problem.

Two proposals that are being mentioned with alarming regularity are the closing of gas stations on the weekend and the rationing of gasoline. Either of these proposals would place a great hardship on Permian Basin outdoorsmen and a combination of both would just about eliminate any weekend fishing and camp-

For residents of Tyler, Brady or even Colorado City, rationing of gas or the weekend of closing of gas stations would be a big inconvenience, but these folks could still enjoy the great out-of-doors. Folks in Midland, Odessa and Big Lake would just have to sit back and say, "Gee, I wish I could go somewhere."

I'm afraid that any rationing plan just wouldn't provide for a round trip, of say, 500 miles to Amistad. An R. V. pulling a boat from Midland to Amistad might make it to Ozona at 5 miles per gallon and then the die hard fisherman could wait until Monday morning to gas up and head back to Midland

I am hoping that rationing or the closing of gas stations on the weekend will never become a reality, but if they do, I feel that there should be some geographical as well as proffessional consideration given to those affected. For residents of cities such as Midland, I feel that access to recreational areas should be allowed under a rationing plan and gas made available on the weekends, even if it is a plan where destination and departure points had to be proven

tice and real hardship to the residents of the Permian Basin.

There have been countless studies made that have proved the need for recreational activity, and I for one can't imagine being denied access to my greatest enjoyment - the greatout-of-doors.

Before rationing or closure of stations become a reality, it would behoove all outdoorsmen to write their congressmen and let their feelings be known along these lines. Chambers of Commerce and Departments of Tourism all over the United States are lobbying to try and prevent the inequities that always come with governmental controls. The voice of the outdoorsman would become a loud one if combined with that of his brothers all over the United States. The National Rifle Association is a good example of what can be accomplished through organized protest by American sportsmen.

The crappie fishing has been red hot on Brady Lake for the last two weeks with thousands of fish being caught on jugs and minnows in two or three-feet of water.

Lake Spence fishermen have been cleaning up on the crappie in shallow brush and a few good stripers have been caught. The black bass fishing has been slow at Spence, but the rod and reel fishermen are catching a lot of channel cat in the one to threepound range on shrimp and bass min-



Aggie gets loan for new car

FORT WORTH, Texas (AP) - A recent Texas A&M football recruit received an extraordinary loan to buy a 1979 automobile one month after he enrolled, the Fort Worth Star-Telegram has reported in a copyright story

The story by Jim Dent in the newspaper's Sunday editions said defensive tackle Mack Moore of Ferriday, La., received an automobile loan normally reserved for "preferred" or 'exceptional" customers from a Dallas bank whose chairman of the board is also a director of the A&M Athletic **Booster Club.**

Moore, who transferred from San Francisco City Colleege in January, received a special commercial loan from the Bank of Dallas that requires only summer payments on his 1979 Pontiac Trans Am. He purchased the car Feb. 22 at Huffines Chevrolet-Pontiac-Buick in Commerce, Texas. Chairman of the board at the Bank of Dallas is J.L. Huffines Jr.

Huffines, a 1944 graduate of Texas A&M, also owns Huffines Chevrolet-Pontiac-Buick. He is on the board of directors of the Aggie Club and is listed as a donor to the organization. According to National Collegiate Athletic Association regulations, Huffines is considered a representative of Texas A&M's athletic interests since he is a prominent member of the Aggie Club. The definition of a representative was broadened to include booster club members at the NCAA's annual conference in January.

Moore, a 6-4, 250-pound defensive tackle, was labeled the best junior college prospect in California by former UCLA coach Billy Matthews, who tried to sign him for the Bruins.

He was recruited by several major universities, including nine schools in the Pacific 10 Conference. He made verbal commitments to UCLA and Michigan State and gave serious consideration to signing with Oklahoma

Commercial loans usually are extended for commercial purposes and

said State Banking Commissioner **Robert Stewart** Given the details of the Moore loan;-

Stewart said: "Something like this is out of the

ordinary. This type of loan you would extend to a preferred or exceptional customer, one who is substantially wealthy and not somebody from out of town.'

Moore does not have an account at the bank

An employee at the Bank of Dallas told the Star-Telegram early last week that Moore purchased the automobile for the original price of \$7,-855.43 with no down payment.

However, after a Star-Telegram reporter talked with Huffines Thursday about the Moore loan, a bank vice president, Riley Couch III, called the newspaper and said the football player had made a "small" down payment.

After hearing the details of the Moore loan, an NCAA enforcement officil said, "If the automobile was in fact obtained without a down payment, or if the down payment was not in line with what the general student body at A&M could receive, it would be a matter which the enforcement department would seriously consider investigating."

According to Rule 3-1-(g)-(5) of the NCAA bylaws, an intercollegiate athlete cannot receive any service (including car financing) not made available to the general student body

Asked if commercial loans, such as the one Moore received, are made available to any student at Texas A&M, Huffines said, "I don't know. It would depend on the down payment.

release information on Moore's down payment, calling it "legally privvy information.

"It wasn't very big," said Couch. "It was small." Moore's father, Mack Moore Sr.,

also declined to say how much of a down payment was made

According to the terms of the loan, Moore will make his first payment Aug. 8, six months after the financing was arranged. Normally, commercial loans are paid in full on an assigned date. But Moore, said Couch, will make a small payment at that time, possibly no more than the interest, and the loan will be renewed.

The next payment will then be due exactly one year later, Couch said. Couch said Moore will pay for the

car with money he earns from a two-month summer job. When he received the loan, Moore told Couch he had not yet arranged for a summer job. Moore told the Star-Telegram last week he is still looking for a job. Scholarship athletes are not allowed to work while attending classes during the regular school year.

Couch said no co-signer was required on the Moore loan, nor was there a recommendation.

"Mack doesn't need anybody to back him up," said Couch. "Another bank might require it, but I didn't. He just seems like the kind of guy who would pay it back. You have to interview these guys, and I just thought Mack seems like the kind of guy who would take care of his business.

Huffines originally told the Star-Telegram he was unaware of the Moore loan and the circumstances surrounding it. But Moore's father said he discussed the loan with Huffines.

Later Huffines said, "I can't say that I didn't tal to him because I can't remember. I might have, so I can't say that I didn't.'

Moore refused to say why he chose to purchase the automobile in Commerce, which is 250 miles from Bryan-College Station and about 325 miles from his hometown.

"All I'm going to say is that my daddy's paying for the car," he said. Said Mack Moore Sr., "He needed a close place to get it serviced. Everytime something went wrong with the car I could not afford for him to come all the way home to get it fixed."



Villeneuve gains pole position

LONG BEACH, Calif., (AP) -Gilles Villeneuve of Canada, driving the new 1979 Ferrari T4, won the pole position for today's \$600,000 Long Beach Grand Prix with a record lap time of 92.255 miles per hour.

Villeneuve moved ahead of Carlos Reutemann of Argentina in the last 10 minutes of qualifying for the world championship Formula One race, as nine drivers broke the old record for a single 2.02-mile lap.

"It may have looked stable from the outside," Villeneuve said of his ride, "but not from where I sat. I went through a lot of qualifying tires, but we got a good lap in the last set."

Defending champion Reutemann clocked 92.184 mph in joining Villeneuve on the front row for the start of the 161.6-mile race Sunday through downtown city streets.

Reutemann drove a Ferrari last year but has switched to Lotus this season. After his car stopped at the end of Saturday's qualifying session, he said, "I don't know what the trouble was.'

Friday, Villeneuve had crashed his car into a wall but was not hurt.

On the second row for the start of the 12-turn per lap race will be Jody Scheckter of South Africa in his Ferrari at 92.154 and Patrick DePailler of France in a Ligier at 92.022.

In the third row will be Jacques Laffite of France, currently leading the Grand Prix international stand ings, in a Ligier at 92.013 and Mario Andretti, the reigning Formula One champion from Nazareth, Pa., in the second Lotus at 91.525.

The other single lap record breakers were Jean-Pierre Jarier of France in a Tyrrell at 91.380; former world champion James Hunt of England in a Wolf, 91.307, and Ricardo Patrese of Italy in an Arrow at 91.211.

Villeneuve, 27, exercised his prerogative as pole sitter and selected the right side of the grid to start. This puts him on the inside going into the difficult right-hand turn No.1, where there has been an accident in all three previous Formula One races here.





New Rams' owner doesn't qualify as spoiled Rich kid

LOS ANGELES - If someone told you the man who is expected to run the Rams, now that Carroll Rosenbloom is gone, likes to drive the team bus, prepare submarine sandwiches for the players and prefers blue jeans and Jeeps to three-piece suits and Cadillacs, and that he likes animals so much that a dog sleeps in his bed and one of his college roommates was a real, live pig (no kidding), you might wonder if he's a little, er, weird.


But, Steve Rosenbloom, the late Rams owner's 34-year-old son and heir apparent, is just different. He's rich, all right, yet you'd never know at. He has common tastes and an earthy, open approach to life.

"The best insight I can give you," says Harold Guiver, the Rams' vice president in charge of operations, "is that after home games, Steve doesn't go to some swank, posh place in Beverly Hills with his Hollywood friends...because he doesn't have

"He goes to Grunyon's, this little bar in Manhattan Beach, where some of his old Baltimore cronies hang out. They shoot the breeze and throw beer on each other if they feel like it.

"That's Steve. No phony airs. No pretenses. No flaunting his position. Treats everyone the same, from Pat Haden to one of our secretaries."

THERE ARE numerous other examples that Steve Rosenbloom is a beer-and-pizza, rather than a Beverly Hills guy. For instance:



Steve has such, a passion for trucks and buses that he has subscribed to Owner-Operator, a magazine on heavy trucking, and has taken the wheel of the Rams' team bus several times. Once when it was stuck in mud in Philadelphia, he bailed out the driver with a nifty reverse maneuver. Appropriately, Steve will answer to "Hey, bussy." He has a chauffeur's license.

After his father traded franchises and moved from Baltimore to Los Angeles, Steve stayed behind to work at a dog kennel run by his wife, Renee. "She was the brains and I was the hired help," Steve once said. The Rosenblooms remain enamored with animals; dogs, cats and birds have the run of the place at their home in Palos Verdes, south of Los Angeles. The snoring of the four dogs who slept on the bedroom floor once became so loud that Steve bought a noisy, electric fan to muffle it.

- Steve's favorite football player was always Gene (Big Daddy) Lipscomb, a gigantic defensive tackle who played for Baltimore. Reason: Lipscomb knew all the Jewish holidays and could sing, in Hebrew, on Rosh Hashana.

THERE ARE other stories, too: Steve bailing a Rams' player out of jail instead of sending an underling to do it; Steve carefully selecting the meats and cheeses and then preparing those submarine sandwiches himself on the team plane; Steve - fun-loving, a laugher - taking his pet pig, Suey, to basketball games on a leash while in college at Georgetown.

Lest you get the idea that Steve Rosenbloom is the Rams' answer to Billy Carter, he is, by all accounts, a knowledgeable, dedicated, hardworking football man who started at the bottom as an 11-year-old equipment boy before learning, first-hand, every phase of operations and rising to president of the Colts and, later, assistant to the president of the Rams

He may not like three-piece suits, but he can put one on and, like his father, impress and even charm an imposing audience.

It's apparently Steve's lifestyle that sets him apart from many of the power brokers who control National Football League clubs. He manages to command respect while not only appearing to be one of the guys, but by actually being one.

'Steve is not into appearances," says Guiver, one of Ro

Rams' officials and personnel make it pretty clear that Steve Rosenbloom is probably the club's MPP: Most Popular Person.

Says Jack Teele, the Rams' vice president, administration: "Steve started in 1973 as Carroll's assistant and gradually assumed more responsibility and authority until he actually was running the team on a day-to-day basis. It wasn't so much that C.R. abdicated. It was just that Steve did more and more.

"One thing everyone notices about Steve is how kind he is. He's the type of man who can't stand to hurt anyone. He might not be as outwardly chummy with the players as C.R. always was, but Steve has been, and always will be, sympathetic to players problems. He's a real listener. And that's not an employee endorsement but merely an observation.

"Steve is so much in his father's image. Like C.R., he never forgets a birthday, wedding or meaningful anniversary. He's very family-oriented.

If this story seems to lack balance, it's because it's hard to find people, in or out of the organization, with any reason to rap Steve Rosenbloom.

Some in football say that while he may be a sound young businessman - Steve graduated from Georgetown with a degree in business management and is experienced in operational areas as diverse as income, outgo, tickets, TV-radio, travel, scheduling, payroll and public relations - he is not, by NFL standards a particularly smart football man.

But Teele, for one, said it's a popular misconception that Steve is onedimensional. "He signed players in Baltimore," he said. Teele said it was his guess that Steve could rattle off the names of many of the best players available in the upcoming college draft if someone were to put him on the spot.

IT'S NO secret that Steve more recently has taken a keener interest in the football end of the busness in scouting, the draft, player personnel decisions and the like, areas currently seen by general manager Don Klosterman.

Klosterman's name has been bandied about every time a general manager's job somewhere else comes open, and no one seems very sure what his future holds should Steve take full control of the Rams, as everyone assumes he will.

Sources say they believe Rosenbloom left the club to his wife, Georgia, in trust, and Steve will take over as president.

"We're all going on the assumption...I mean, it's sort of a foregone conclusion that Steve's the boss now. a club official said.

ENDORSEMENTS from other looks may be deceiving. In his manner and bearing, in the way he deals with football and with people, Steve Rosenbloom isn't disheveled at all.

'Before Steve flew to Florida (where his father drowned Monday in a swimming accident), Steve sat in this office and looked at the picture of

his father on that wall," Guiver said. "He didn't cry, evey though he probably needs to. There were things to be done - notifying family, helping Georgia with funeral arrangements - and he wanted to stay in control of his emotions, to handle things, to be strong, like his father."

It doesn't sound like a long time, especially when it's in a sunny winter resort area, but after the initial enthusiasm, it soon settles into a daily waiting game that keeps the player on edge.

Almost daily players are shuffled from one roster to another in the Chicago Cubs' four-team minor league system as 120 to 130 players seek some 80 roster spots. A fifth team, composed primarily of players drafted in June, will play at Sarasota, Fla., in the Rookie League and a few players will be kept until that team is organized.

WHEN YOU come right down to it, three weeks really isn't a long time for a player to convince a C.V. Davis (Cubs' farm director), a Jack Hiatt, Randy Hundley, Ken Rudolph or Jim Napier (managers of Cub farms) of his future potential and it's especially tough on the young. untried, unproven player just coming into the organization. For the older player, last year's statistics might overrule a dismal spring performance.

And with each roster juggling come the inevitable pink slips, that dreaded day in the life of every player from fuzzy-cheeked rookie to the veteran with a little too much-mileage and not enough progress.

But that phase is over, the rosters have been pruned and players are eager to escape the

spring drudgery for their regular season homes

Hundley and his Cubs arrive on Continental flight 54 and will work out from 6 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. at Cubs Stadium Tuesday in preparation for Wednesday's 7:30 p.m. season's opener against El Paso's defending West Division champion Diablos.


Although a change or two is probable today or Monday, Hundley, beginning his first year as Midland manager, succeeding Jim Saul, now a coach at Oakland, has had his roster since last Wednesday.

RETURNEES from last year include firstbaseman Jim Tracy, thirdbaseman Javier Fierro. outfielders Brian Rosinski and Eric Grandy and pitchers Herman Segelke, Lee Smith, Darrell Turner, Jeff Albert and Mike Allen, most of whom spent the spring on the Wichita roster until Chicago began making its final cuts. In fact, Segelke started the spring with Chicago and pitched in some exhibition games for the big Cubs.


Tracy, a graduate of Marietta, Ohio, College, played half a season at Pompano Beach before jumping to Midland where he hit .259 in 54 games, knocking in 29 runs and hitting eight homers. The other infield veteran, Fierro, was with the Cubs all year and hit .245 in an even 100 games. Born in El Paso, "Harvey" calls La Puente, Calif., home now and will be in his third season with the Chicago organization.

Baltimore's gift to the Cubs, Grandy had a dandy first-year Texas League season with a .311 batting average, stole 26 bases (behind only Jimmy Buckner and Kurt Seibert) and knocked in 74 runs. Opposing pitchers must have feared him because they hit him seven times, a club high, Rosinski, Evanston, Ill., was torn between baseball scouts and football recruiters (Notre Dame wooed him), but decided on baseball. And in order to get Vic Harris from the Texas Rangers, the Cubs gave up Jenkins in 1973 and wound up with two-time NL batting champion Bill Madlock as **Billy Williams in the outfield?**

Well, that's kind of the way Chicago hopes Henry Mack will turn out, although he seems to be little more than an after-thought at this stage in the trade that was essentially, for 1979 purposes, Manny Trillo for catcher Barry Foote, outfielder Jerry Martin and infielder Ted Sizemore, all of whom, it might be added, looked good in spring training.

Mack, as it turned out, was the snag that held up the trade several months. "We could have made the deal at the Winter meetings," says Chicago GM Bob Kennedy, "but they didn't want to give up Henry."

A BEAR'S lifespan is not long - less than 20 years, usually - probably because he starves in hibernation and awakes every spring so weak he can hardly stand up. Tuffy counters that the bear is as happy in his truss as he is foraging for berries in the forest with a throbbing wisdom tooth. The bear, of course, has no comment. But the fact he works for soda pop and salad indicates he is happier at what he's doing than Pete Rose. At least he's not playing out his options - or jumping to the Chicago Bears.

Jocko Conlan says he wouldn't feel any guilt

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) - Jocko Conlan, one of four former umpires in the Baseball Hall of Fame, says if he was a minor league umpire today he would bave no qualms about filling the void left by striking major league arbiters. "You're down there for one purpose, and that's to

get to the big leagues," the 79-year-old Conlan said during a visit to Kansas City. "The umpires in the big leagues are not going to do anything for those kids in the minors.

"They don't have any union, the umpires: It's an association. So there's no question about breaking a strike.

Despite an impasse in contract negotiations between umpires and the American and National leagues, the baseball season opened Wednesday in Cincinnati as one major league umpire and three amateur umpires worked the game between the Reds and the San Francisco Giants.

Conlan, who received \$20,000 a year plus \$25 a day for expenses by the time he retired in 1965, says he is in favor of higher salaries for umpires but he believes they are handling their demands badly.

HERE ARE the facts, Mr. Arbitrator.

Horner was baseball's No. 1 summer draft choice McLaghin W.1-0 last year and signed a major league contract with the Braves. As is the custom these days, Atlanta welcomed him with a signing bonus of about \$150,000 and a first year salary of about \$25,000.

Sufficiently inspired by that income, which was considerably more than any of his classmates earned after graduation from Arizona State, Horner responded with 23 home runs, 63 runs batted in and a 266 batting average in 89 games. Nineteen of his homers were hit in Atlanta, where the stadium is called The Launching Pad because of the way balls zoom out of there. The other four came in Chicago's cozy Wrigley Field.

Those credentials earned him the Rookie of the Year award and convinced the rebuilding Braves that they had solved their third base problem for the next decade or so.

Not so fast, Atlanta.

ON THE surface, you'd have to say that \$146,000 for a player with 89 big league games under his belt is slightly inflated. But by Horner's reckoning, \$146, 000 represents a 20 percent cut - the maximum baseball law allows - from the \$175,000 he earned last year.

The Braves say sure, they paid Horner \$175,000, but most of that was a onetime signing bonus, not salary. The Players Association says all the money a player receives for playing baseball is his baseball compensation and since Horner received \$175,000 from Atlanta for playing baseball last year, the Braves must pay him at least four-fifths of that figure — or \$146,000 — for 1979.

'The terminology is irrelevent," says Marvin Miller, executive director or the Players Association. "It's all money for playing baseball.

ATLANTA OWNER Ted Turner, on the other hand, argues that the bulk of Horner's 1978 income was a onetime signing bonus, unaffected by the maximum salary cut rules.

"Does that mean that \$150,000 was not for playing baseball?" wonders Miller. "If it was a signing bonus, does that mean Horner could sign, take that money and then go off to law school? Turner was paying for a player to play baseball."





Intensive secondary recovery job to pump new life in field


BIG SPRING - One of the most intensive secondary oil recovery programs ever attempted will pump new life into an aging oil field on West Texas leases held by Amoco Production Co., according to John W. Phenicie, Amoco regional vice president.

The \$14 million program in the 42year-old Iatan East Howard Field near Coahoma should result in a substantial increase in oil production by 1981. Phenicie said an estimated seven million barrels of otherwise unobtainable oil will be recovered bythe project which involves the drilling of 115 new wells.

The field - referred to as the Texas Land and Mortgage Co. complex -

through the primary recovery phase, he said, about 29 percent of the 68.3 million barrels estimated to have been in the reservoir originally will have been recovered

The first well on Amoco leases in the field - the No. 1-A TL&M - was drilled on the field's eastern edge in 1937 by Shasta Oil Co. The geologic producing horizons are the San Andres, San Angelo and the Clear Fork at depths from 2,400 to 2,800 feet.



Phenicie said the program reflects Amoco's efforts to enhance the recovery of hydrocarbons from established reservoirs while continuing to explore for oil and gas in frontier areas.

Amoco, the domestic exploration and production subsidiary of Standard Oil Co. (Indiana), is the second largest producer of oil in Texas. In 1977, Amoco's 8,791 net wells in Texas daily produced 309,364 barrels of oil and natural gas liquids and 706 million cubic feet of natural gas.



Nation's drilling activity drops by 19 percent

By MAX B. SKELTON

HOUSTON (AP) - Domestic oil and gas drilling operations have declined nearly 19 percent since reaching a 20-year high in late October.

Ed McGhee, executive vice president of the International Association. of Drilling Contractors, says most contractors, however, are still optimistic about 1979 prospects. McGhee said drilling contractors

with idle units naturally feel disappointed but that most contractors express optimism for enough improvement the rest of the year to allow achievement of earlier predictions of 1979 increases in both rig counts and well completions.

The rate of drilling activity has declined in 19 of the 22 weeks since the 20-year high of 2,385 rotary drilling rigs were in use the week ending Oct.

Ten consecutive weeks of decline dropped the latest count to 1,933, the lowest since a 1,906 total was recorded on April 18, 1977.

McGhee said the weekly count of active rotary rigs is being elevated to new levels of importance in that producer organizations are using it as the best available indicator of incentives for new well drilling

"The Independent Petroleum Association of America and others seem to be saying that if incentives are adequate more drilling will occur and rig count will rise," he said.

"Conversely, if inflation and government controls erode the incentives, rig count will drop. The producer groups are citing the first quarter 1979 slump in rig count as evidence that crude oil prices should be decontrolled."

McGhee said that, historically, producers have ignored the rig figures. "This was particularly true during the long era when U.S. production was severely prorated in important oil states," he said.

"Proration, producers said, masked the cause-effect relationship between oil and gas prices on the one hand and new well drilling on the other. Now that production allowables are maintained at 100 percent, price incentives can be expected to be reflected almost immediately in righ count.'

capital goods are said to be lagging badly and cancellations have cut into some previously existing backlogs." McGhee said producer groups, in making their case for decontrol, have stressed that domestic rig figures reached a plateau last August and September and then began the steady decline.

"Winter weather, say producers, can be blamed for only part of the slide," he said.

"Likewise, the seasonal cycle of money availability can explain only a part. And since plenty of rigs are available in most areas, only one explanation is left - wildcatters and developers find too little incentive at current prices."

Purchase finalized

Ray Butler, the Alice, Texas, president of the drilling contractors association, endorsed price decontrols last month in a letter to President Carter and said the industry is capable of significantly expanded activity.

Butler blamed part of the current slide on the natural gas gas pricing legislation approved by Congress last year.

"Clearly, the uncertainty created by the multiple categories of gas pricing and the attendant penalties for misclassifying one's products have inhibited, not stimulated, the drilling of new prospects by many indepen-dent producers," Butler said, adding that independents have accounted for about 90 percent of domestic wells in recent years.

It involves the injection of water into the reservoir below the oil level. The water displaces the oil, sweeping it toward producing wells.

Texas American Oil Corp. announced major increases in its oil and gas proved reserves of 32 to 67 percent, respectively, according to an independent engineering report prepared for the company by DeGolyer and MacNaughton, Dallas.

As of Jan. 1 the report placed proved oil reserves at 5,0971,020 barrels and proved gas reserves at 38 billion cubic feet.

The report indicated that of the proved reserves there were 3,113,110 barrels of proved developed oil reserves and 2,857,910 barrels of proved undeveloped reserves. Gas reserves were classified proved developed of 22.4 billion cubic feet, with proved undeveloped equal to 15.9 billion cubic feet, or a total of 38 billion cubic feet of reserves.

William F. Judd, Texas American Oil Corp. president, noted that Oklahoma accounted for the largest increase in gas reserves basically in the Sooner Trend, with the Somerset Waterflood in Texas responsible for a significant portion of the increases in oil reserves.

The drilling budget for 1979 has been set at \$11,000,000 which equals the amount actually spent in 1978. Continuation of an active program is assured for the current year.





# Short course upcoming

LUBBOCK-The 26th annual Southwestern Petroleum Short Course at Texas Tech University will take place April 19-20.

The West Texas petroleum industry sponsors the event in cooperation with the Department of Petroleum Engineering at Texas Tech.

While the newest and most successful production techniques are primary topics among the 28 presentations listed, two of the 1978 papers deal with more generalized subjects.

Donald P. Mykytiuk and Thomas M. LaVelle of the Atlantic Richfield Co. will discuss that company's Black Thunder (coal) Mine near Gillette, Wyo. Dr. Harry W. Parker of the **Texas Tech Department of Chemical** Engineering will discuss "Petroleum - Its Future among Alternative Energy Sources."

'Petroleum and natural gas will supply our nation's needs for petrochemical feedstocks, personal transportation and fuel for space heating and light industry into the distant future," Parker said, "since this is a potentially price elastic market and considerable oil and gas production can be obtained with increased prices.

Between 400 and 450 representatives of production and refining industries in the Southwest are expected to attend the short course, according to Professor Duane A. Crawford, chairman of the event's Board of Directors. Crawford is a member of the Texas Tech faculty in petroleum engineering.

He said the program will cover information on drilling and well completion, well stimulation and workover, reservoir operations, artificial lift and production handling.



for support in their efforts to ease a shortage of unleaded gasoline that is expected to intensify as the summer driving season nears. At a meeting in O'Leary's office the delegation asked the duputy secre-

tary to intercede with the Enviornmental Protection Agency in an attempt to obtain a five-month relaxation of the EPA ban against the use of MMT; a manganese-based fuel additive commonly used until last autumn to increase the octane rating of unleaded gasoline.

The temporary use of 1/32 of a gram of MMT per gallon of unleaded gasoline at constant crude runs to stills will result in about 338,000 barrels per day of additional production, O'Leary was told. The previously approved level of MMT blended into a gallon of unleaded gasoline was 1/16 of a gram.

In mid-March the nation's refinery output of unleaded gasoline was about 400,000 barrels per day below estimated daily demand of nearly 3.3 million barrels.

O'Leary was also asked to urge the EPA to ease its lead phasedown requirements for leaded fuel, as a further means of increasing this country's supplies.

The delegation consisted of repre-

sentatives of Tenneco Oil Co., Vickers Petroleum Corp., Coastal States Gas Corp., Ashland Oil, Inc., and Energy Cooperative, Inc., as well as the Independent Refiners Association of America, the American Petroleum **Refiners Association and the National** 

Council of Farmer Cooperatives. Dewey Mark, senior vice president of Tenneco Oil Co., described the problem as refinery yield. "Many refiners have high-severity reformers under construction," he said, "but completion dates of these high-octane-producing plants are too late to help this summer." Without MMT, he added, a refiner needs greater volumes of crude oil to produce the same amount of unleaded gasoline at the same octane rating.

Gasoline demand is traditionally lower in the autumn and winter, Mark said, and by late this year refiners will be using MTBE, recently approved by the EPA, to attain minimum octane rating of unleaded gasoline. Plants are now under construction to produce MTBE. Hence only a temporary relaxation of the manganese ban is being sought.

"The imporatant environmental concern at this time is to ease the impending shortage of unleaded gasoline," Mark said. "There is too much danger that some motorists unable to buy unleaded fuel will switch to leaded.'





# Aminoil says plenty of crude in 'backyard'

HOUSTON - The search for crude oil and natural gas is taking energy companies ever further into offshore waters and to distant onshore locations.

Companies, such as Aminoil USA, however, are finding that there are still commercial hydrocarbon deposits to be found in the industry's own backyard.

Aminoil is the operator for a group of companies that recently discovered what could be as much as 50 billion cubic feet of natural gas reserves in a portion of the Wilcox Trend that runs through Live Oak County.

"Since the early 1900's, thousands of wells have been drilled in the Wilcox Trend," Aminoil Geologist Verne Rude notes, "and hundreds of them have led to commercial discoveries. Our Live Oak County discovery is just one indication that additional potential remains."

Rude and Roy Beckelhymer, the Aminoil explorationists who handled evaluation of the Live Oak prospect from the time it was submitted to the company, are confident that the discovery is only one of a number of successes that Aminoil will have onshore.


Submitted last October by an independent exploration company, the Live Oak prospect stood up to all of the tests Rude, Beckelhymer and Aminoil's other exploration experts could apply to it.

"My approach on a submittal is to try to bust it apart," says Rude. "I use all of the seismic data and drilling information available to try to prove that it is not a good prospect." Other experts on Aminoil's exploration team involved in evaluating the prospect were landmen, electric log analysts, economic analysts and production engineers.

Located about five miles from the west or midway between Cor-us Christi and San Antonio, the discovery well was spudded on October 20, 1978, and reached it projected depth of 10,500 feet on December 15.

# Grain stockpile could disappear

WASHINGTON (AP) - Persuasive arguments are being made that the current U.S. grain stockpile, the largest since the glut of the early 1960s, is not a true surplus and could easily disappear if the world demand suddenly increases.

This is a favorite theme, for instance, of Agriculture Secretary Bob Bergland who looks upon the huge U.S. supply of wheat and corn as a hedge against future needs occurring because of bad weather or other natural causes somewhere in the world.

Bergland's view is not shared by all, however. Some farm groups and members of Congress insist that he administration should boost federal price support benefits so that more farmers are attracted into acreage set-aside programs which are aimed at reducing crop production this year.

An important question seems to be whether the huge grain supply including about 1.3 billion bushels of wheat and corn stored by farmers under the government's reserve program - is some sort of burden hanging over the market.

Or is it a valuable asset stored away so farmers can take advantage of demands that are not now foreseen? The National Association of Wheat Growers recently called the administration's grain policy "an insidious plan" that will lead to governmentowned reserves and keep prices low

at the expense of farmers. Reference was made to Bergland's refusal to modify existing crop programs for 1979, his decision not to allow further 1978 grain into the three-year reserve held by farmers and other policy goals the association said were hatched by administration inflation fighters to gain "ill-conceived, short-range objectives.

A new analysis by Resources for the Future, a nonprofit research and education group that began in 1952 in cooperation with the Ford Foundation, says that the recent buildup of world grain stocks is misleading.

Progress has been made by many poorer developing countries to boost their own agricultural production, but this could lead to even greater markets for U.S. grain for animal feed as they boost livestock output to meet rising consumer demands, the report said.

The report — "Agriculture: Return of the Surplus?" — was written by one of the organization's staff members, Pierre R. Crosson.

Also, the rebuilding of U.S. livestock herds - notably cattle - will mean larger domestic demand for grain.

"In addition, it can be anticipated that from time to time bad weather, in the United States or elsewhere, will growth of world food production," Crosson said. serve.

When this occurs, he said, a "strong underlying growth in demand will result in sharply rising food prices" and lead to rapidly diminished reserve supplies.

"The recent return of the surplus would then be seen as quite temporary, and we would be reminded once again that the world food problem still is far from solution."

Crosson said the growth of grain stocks and a sag in prices since 1975 "did not primarily reflect exceptionally good production performance, either in the United States or in the rest of the world.

Rather, he said, the buildup in global grain stocks resulted mainly from "the demand side of the market, not the supply side.'

Grain consumption declined in the United States after 1973 — a period of rising prices — and reflected a fall in the use of grains as feed for livestock, he said.

"While consumption has risen gradually in the last few years, in 1978 it was still below the earlier peak," Crosson said. "In the rest of the world, consumption of grain rose at an average of only 2.6 percent from 1972 to 1978, compared with 3.3 per-

cent in the decade prior to 1972." The drop in U.S. grain consumption occurred primarily because of higher. grain prices in 1973-75 and "the diminished profitability of livestock production," he said.

Thus, with profitibility returning to livestock production the past year, demand for grain in the United States will continue to increase in 1979 and probably beyond, providing "increasing strength" to grain prices.

This kind of scenario is seen in a varying degree by others, including some in the U.S. grain trade itself. Bernard Steinweg, executive vice president of Continental Grain Co. one of the world's largest - said in Chicago March 27 that the existing surplus of corn from the record 1978 U.S. crop "could cloud the fact" that demand over the next year could exceed production from the 1979 harvest, a crop that will be planted this spring.

Last year's corn crop was a record of 7.1 billion bushels. However, total use in the 1978-79 season also is expected to set a record of about 6.6 billion bushels, Steinweg said.

The 1979 corn harvest, he said, could be in the range of 6.5 billion to 6.6 billion bushels and be "below utilization" expected in the following year.

"We are presently forecasting a 1979-80 demand of about 6.9 billion bushels," Steinweg said. "Any reduction in supply could affect market availabilities and necessitate the release of corn held in the grain re-

# Salary disclosure rules bring new questions

NEW YORK (AP) - Is the chairman earning his keep?

As the traditional season of corporate annual meetings moves into high gear this month, that promises to be a more frequently asked question by activist stockholders, who in past years have peppered company executives with scores of questions on political, social and policy questions.

The reason is partly new Security and Exchange Commission rules requiring more detailed disclosure on executive salaries, bonuses, incentive pay plans and the value of perquisites - or perks - like club memberships or a chauffeured limousine.

While some practices have been common for some time, detailing executive compensation - particularly at a time when the administration is stressing wage restraint - may prove uncomfortable at many annual meetings.

'There's no question that investors will be looking at this with a fish eye," said one investment advisor, who asked not to be named.

The new SEC regulations were adopted last fall as part of a broader program requiring more information to be made public on corporate governance, directors, committee functions and other things.

For shareholders accustomed to thinking that the top boss is getting inthe neighborhood of \$150,000, the proxy statement may yield some surprises.

Chrysler Corp.'s proxy statement mailed out this past week revealed for instance that Lee A. Iacocca, who became chairman last November after being forced out of Ford, was being paid a \$1.5 million cash bonus for making the move as well as an annual salary of \$360,000 and some stock option benefits. The bonus represented money Iacocca forfeited by breaking a separation agreement with Ford, which would have paid nearly \$2 million if it didn't go to work for a competitor.

Thomas D. Barrow, who switched from Exxon to become Kennecott Copper Corp.'s chairman last December, negotiated a pay plan based on corporate performance. That deal could at least double his base salary of \$365,000 annually if the price of stock rises substantially and earning per share improve over the year. According to Kennecott's proxy, Barrow will receive an extra \$1,000 for each one-cent increase in net-earnings per share above the previous year, up to \$1 a share. Above an increase of \$1 a share, he will receive \$500 for Traffic hits each additional penny. And he stands to earn another bonus of \$250,000 for each one-dollar per share increase in the price of Kennecott stock above the \$22.94 mean price it traded on the New

York Stock Exchange on the day he took his new position.

Studies have shown that bonuses or incentive plans that tie an executive's performance to what he earns form a larger share of a top executive's pay.

The American Management Associations' Executive Compensation survey, based on data from nearly 2,700 companies last year, found that 17.3 percent of the \$1.6 billion the companies paid bosses was for bonuses. But when it counted only those. executives receiving bonuses, such payments represented 35.7 percent of their salaries.

Compensation, naturally, varies with the size and type of company. The Conference Board, a business research group, says that in 1977 the latest year for which information is available - the average in bonuses and salaries for the chief executive of a manufacturing firm was \$241,000; heads of retail firms made \$184,000; gas and electric utility chiefs, \$125,000 and construction company executives, \$120,000.

> The proposal which has attracted the most attention - allowing savings and loan associations to increase interest rates on home loans from 10 to 12 percent maximum - has yet to come up for a vote in either House of Senate.

SB 246, by Sen. Ray Farabee, Wichita Falls, has been approved by the Senate, while HB 616, by Rep. Bob McFarland, Arlington, has been passed by the House.

Farbee's bill deals with the use of "points" interest rate calcualtions, while McFarland's measure addresses penalties.

While dealing with seperate issues, both mesures are tied to the way in which interest is calculated - and taken together, the proposals are likely to provide some addition protection and relief for lenders.

The need for the measures results in part from the 10 percent constitutional usury ceiling in the Texas Constitution - which means that with a high prime rate, the calculation of interest becomes of increasing importance, since there is less of a margin for error.

Critics of the measures have argued that they could have the effect of preventing some borrowers from proceeding against lenders for usury penalties, by making the bills applicable to existing loans not in litigation. That, it was argued during consideration of McFarland's bill, amounts to an "ex post facto" law for protection of illegal loans.

McFarland and his supporters argued that interpretations about the calculation of interest rates have varied - and that there needs to be standardization in that area, and that lenders also need to be protected from unintentional errors.

The Senate also has approved legislation by Sen. Ike Harris, Dallas, allowing 18 percent interest charges on real estate loans of \$175,000 or more - despite opposition from long-

Patman announced early in the session his continued opposition to interest rate increases, contending such an approach simply fuels inflation and hurts consumers.

Patman also attacked - in no uncertain terms - San Antonio Rep. Don Cartwright's HB 451, to create a new consumer loan category for loans of \$100 to \$300.

Those loans would have interest rates in between the rates on loans made under the two existing chapters of the consumer credit statutes, and Cartwright argues that there needs to be a change to allow lenders to make such loans

At present, he told the House Financial Institutions Committee, loans in that range aren't being made, although there are consumers who want such loans.

Some committee members indicated they're not anxious to vote for a bill which allows interest rates which would amount to over 75 percent annually in some instances, although Cartwright notes that the dollaramount differences are little different from the charges currently authorized.

On a \$200 loan, he reported, the current payment would be \$37 permonth - while the payment under his bill would be \$41 per month.

But, he stressed, under the current provisions, those loans aren't being made - so that the extra \$4 per month is to assure that credit is available for a consumer.

He also reported that the Office of the Consumer Credit Commissioner reports such small loans have a default rate of 14 percent - and that, he said, needs to be considered when decisions are made on what lenders should be allowed to charge.

No one testified for or against Cartwright's bill at the hearing - and Cartwright has said he's not sure that the small loan industry favors his bill, since the rates proposed in it are an attempt to reach a middle ground between the rates in the current statutes.

One unknown factor in the interest rate picture is what Gov. Bill Clements will do on legislation reaching his desk.

Clements has indicated he'll make a decision soon on the question of increasing mortgage rates - saying he's got an open mind on that subject.



polling place allowed 30 voters from outside the city limits to vote in the City Council races, when those voters should have been permitted to cast ballots only in the school board and hospital district elections.

However, said the city secretary Saturday night, since the irregular ballots could not change any outcomes, no action will be taken. At the 7 p.m. close of voting, the line

of persons waiting to cast ballots at Fire Station No. 3 on North Edwards Street stretched from the building into the street, delaying a total from that box by about an hour after all other results were in. For Place 1, Mrs. Howbert ran first

in absentee balloting and in four of the six polling places. Hampton ran second in the same boxes.

But Bailey had strong leads at Fire Station No. 3 and South Elementary School, which together cover most of Midland's predominantly minority areas.

In balloting for Place 3, Bill Thomas carried both Fire Station No. 3 and South Elementary, but placed third at all the other locations and in absentee voting.

Carroll Thompson led at the other locations and in absentee voting, which was at a record level for a local election in Midland. Balloting for Place 3, the one to

which Carroll M. Thomas was reelected, was complicated by a similarity in names. Bill Thomas used his full name; Bill Carol Thomas, on the ballot.

Carroll M. Thomas said Saturday night he did not know before the campaign what his opponent's middle name is, since in 1976, when the funeral director (Bill Carol Thomas) ran against Thane Akins, he used only "Bill C. Thomas.

The name similarity caused some confusion, said the re-elected councilman

."I don't know that it cost me any (votes). I just know the potential was there," he added.

Thomas expressed appreciation for Midlanders' returning him to the council for a third term, and said he hadn't known what to expect by way of a vote margin.

Mrs. Howbert also said she was pleased with the vote, which she said 'shows a lot of people think I've done a good job.

This will be Mrs. Howbert's second term on the council.

She simply said Saturday night that she's "glad it's (the election is) over.

# My father...

# the Indian fighter

"You don't like to think of your daddy as killing, but mine did," said Midlander Margie Taylor. "He hung and he killed."

Yet her father, William Carson "Uncle Billy" McGough, must be considered in the most unusual of contexts.

Indian fighter from Eastland County, who died in 1927 at the age of 91. In the words of one admirer, he was a "heavy-duty

guy. Easily the type legends are made of, McGough was father of 23 children. At the time of his death the oldest was 65 and the youngest was 10, meaning that he was fathering children up into his 80s. He outlived three wives and married his fourth

when he was 61 and she was 19. Four sets of McGough children made up his immediate family. While there were approximately 100 grandchildren at the time of his death, no one has managed yet to get a recent count of his grandchildren, great-grandchildren, and so on.

"I DIDN'T REALLY HAVE a daddy since he was old and was always busy," said Mrs. Taylor, who belonged to the last set of children consisting of 3 girls and 3 boys. "My teachers thought he was my grandfather or even my mother's grandfather."


McGough was a rough and ready "Minute Man" in the days immediately following the Civil War. After serving in the Confederate army he and two sisters were among the first set-tlers in Eastland County. There, among the marauding bands of bad whites and angry Indians, he raised cattle. Wounded in one hand by an arrow, he also survived being pinned by a arrow to his saddle when one pierced his leg. He and his family had to leave their home on several occasions to join other families in a fort they built near the present-day town of Desdemona.


It was during this period of his early life that he became a Texas Ranger, a law enforcement group organized for protection of the settlements. These men had to do scouting duty for 10 days and nights out of each month.

Currently, aided by Mrs. Taylor and her son, Robert L. Taylor of Odessa, some of his belongings are being placed in the Texas Ranger Hall of Fame in Waco, part of the Texas Ranger Museum there. Along with a picture which will soon be installed in the museum will go his Winchester riffle, with 27 notches on its side.

# To donate blood is to 'give the gift of life'

The giving of blood has been called the gift of life.

Here are some facts about blood that you may not know:

-The average adult has from 10 to 12 pints of blood in his body.

-Every few seconds someone in the U.S. needs a transfusion, many without warning, and it could happen to you.

-There is no substitute for blood, and when transfusions are necessary blood must come from another person who is willing to share.

-Blood has a shelf life of only 21 days and a blood bank's supply must constantly be replen-

-The Midland Memorial Hospital is waging a blood drive in its hopes to make Midland self sufficient. According to David Webb, director of Blood Donor Development at the hospital, Midland should not have to count on blood being shipped from a blood supply in another city. Time is always crucial when emergencies strike and Midland should have enough blood on hand to handle its own needs, he says.

**WEBB SPEAKS OF three** kinds of blood donors. First, there is the walk-in donor, who gives altruistically; then there is the replacement donor, who donates for a family member or a friend who has used a pint of blood from the blood bank. It requires two replacement donors to defray the cost of one pint of blood used. Finally, there is the blood donor club member, and Webb is in the process of building up the number of blood clubs throughout the city. Replacement for the blood donor club member is on a one to one basis.

Blood donor clubs are being established in local businesses and organizations in which club members deposite blood in the Midland County Hospital Dis-trict Blood Bank for "credit." Blood is given twice a year by the club members and for each pint given the group receives one credit, good for one year. When blood is needed by one of the club members he draws from the group account.

If 25 percent or more of the members of an organized group donate blood, then all members of the group are eligible to use blood from the group's account. If less than 25 percent donate, then only the donors and their families are eligible to receive credit from the account.

The hospital sends a mobile unit with the necessary equip-ment and personel to the local businesses. Donors give blood at scheduled times.

"THE HOSPITAL USES an average of 125 to 150 pints of blood a month," says Webb. "We need to have on hand from 200 to 225 pints a month, realizing that the expiration dates on the pints varies. Right now we are averaging 180 pints on a monthly basis.

Webb says there are two times of the year for which the blood

bank has to brace itself. One is the holiday season from November to January, when ulcer pa-tients over indulge and are hospitalized for bleeding and when automobile accidents are frequent since people are out on the roads traveling and shopping, many times after drinking. "It's difficult getting blood during this time of the year," says Webb. "Many donors go on vacations and are not accessible. In cases of extreme emergency, however, we've had very good response.'


The other problem time of year is in the summer when people are on vacations and again there is a decrease in accessibility of donors. "We always gear up for the fourth of July weekend," says Webb. Au-tomobile accidents are at a peak and with that comes an increase of head injuries, usually requiring 4 to 8 pints of blood.

THE GOAL FOR THE blood drive is to establish 26 blood clubs, each with two blood drives a year. This will mean blood is donated 52 weeks a year and the hospital will be guaranteed an adequate blood supply. Right now there are only 13 established. They include Mid-land Memorial Hopital, Continental Oil Co., First Christian Church, Atlantic Richfield Oil Co., Mobil Oil Co., Coquina Oil Co., Gulf Oil Co., Texaco Oil Co., HNG Oil Co., Texas Instru-ments, Union Texas Petroleum, Drilco and Sohio Oil Co.

## Mulches produce greater yields

Mulches generally help produce greater average yields and size of vegetables and reduce the number of aphids infesting plants, according to the U.S. Agriculture Department Research Center at Beltsville, Md.

On the basis of two-year tests, the researchers have also reported that since all the mulches tested were opaque, they prevented weed growth around the vegetables. The mulches are available for small gardens. They have been used commercially on large acreages for several years. In 1977, the scientists tested one mulch, aluminum bonded to brown

wetproof paper, on lettuce, cabbage, squash and cucumbers. Mulched plots produced iceberg lettuce weighing three times more than

bare-soil plants and cabbage weight was 49 percent more. Yields of acorn squash were 26 percent higher in mulched plots and their average weight was up nine percent. Twice as many cucumbers were harvested early (by July 13) from mulched

areas, helping early marketing. In 1978, muskmelon was grown with four synthetic mulches, black polyethylene, white polyethylene bonded to black polyethylene, aluminum embossed on black polyethylene, and the

aluminum-brown paper. The most muskmelons (117) were harvested from the black polyethylene plots with aluminum-brown paper second (99). Unmulched plots produced 92.

Earliest crops (before Aug. 15) came from black polyethylene and aluminum-black polyethylene, with white polyethylene-black polyethylene second. The white-black provided the heaviest fruit, 4.7 pounds, but no more melons than unmulched plots. Aluminum-brown paper muskmelons averaged 4.6 pounds, and black polyethylene the smallest, 4.1 pounds.

Soil temperature was highest under black polyethylene on both cloudy and sunny days and was considered the "best all-around conventional mulch" because it absorbs heat, causing seeds to germinate earlier and grow faster, which brings earlier and bigger harvests.

Entomologist Floyd F. Smith said he'd use aluminum if he had serious disease problems because reflective mulches repel sucking insects that transmit virus diseases from plant to plant. He found that in muskmelon plots, aluminum-paper and aluminum-polyethylene mulches reduced aphids by 96 and 90 per cent respectively. They were considered lower in number on other mulched plots than

on unmulched areas. The mulches also repel leafhoppers, thrips and Mexican bean beetles, Smith reported.

## Budget guides important

NEW YORK - If you're in your mid-30's, head a househod of four and earn about \$11,800 a year, there's a good chance you need finan-cial help. According to the New York Consumer Credit Counseling Service in an article on getting out of debt in the April issue of Family Circle, this profile fits most of the people they are helping balance their budgets. Many of those being counseled, notes the magazine, owe about \$7,800 and have spending habits that average about \$400 a month more than they earn.

One way to avoid debt or to help get out if you're already burdened, suggests the counseling service, is to set up a strict budget. Also, they advise:

To get an idea of your family's spending habits, keep a record of every penny you spend for at least a two week period. Add up your take home pay and any other income you may have for a four week period. Use that as the basis of your budget.

Determine your fixed expenses (rent, mortgage, etc.) and subtract these from income to figure out what is left for credit payments and cash expenses.

## Tortillas easy to make

It's easy to make your own corn tortillas in the United States as long as you can buy instant masa.

However, you'll find some unusual recipes for corn tortillas in cookbooks aimed at audiences unfamiliar with Mexican cooking.

The most common mock tortilla recipe calls for cornmeal and flour. The latest to appear, produced by the Kellogg Co., suggests using cornflake crumbs combined with flour, salt, shortening and warm water.

This tortilla is proposed as a substitute for corn tortillas to be used in enchiladas and other dishes. In actuality, it is exactly what it sounds like - a flour tortilla dotted with golden corn flake crumbs.

A test of the recipe produced tortil-las that puffed and blistered as flour tortillas do when baked. The tortillas were quite tasty when spread with butter and eaten warm.

For the best results, bake and serve the tortillas immediately. If they are leftover and dry out, cut them into triangles and deep-fry to make tostaditas to garnish refried beans, use as dippers with guacamole and so forth. Or cut them into squares and deep-fry the squares to make croutons for soup

When preparing the tortillas, bake them just until the edges begin to dryout before turning. Do not allow them to become crisp. Here is the recipe:

**CORN FLAKE TORTILLAS** 

1-2 cup corn flake crumbs 3 cups flour 2 teaspoons salt 1-3 cup shortening 1 1-4 cups warm water

Mix corn flake crumbs, flour and salt. Cut in shortening until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Make a well in center and add water all at one time. Stir with a fork just until dough holds together. On a lightly floured surface, knead dough gently 10 to 15 strokes. Divide dough into 16 pieces. Form each into a ball. Cover and let stand for 20 minutes.

Roll out balls of dough on a lightly floured surface into circles 1-16 inch thick and 6 to 7 inches in diameter. Heat a very lightly greased skillet over medium heat. Cook each tortilla 45 seconds on one side. Turn and cook on other side 1 minute. Turn over

again, cooking 45 seconds longer. Pile cooked tortillas on a plate, cover with a towel and keep warm until serving time. Makes 16 tortillas.

### TOSTADITAS

Allow tortillas to stand uncovered until dry but pliable. Cut each into 6 triangles. Heat 1-2 to 1 inch oil in large skillet. Add a few tortilla triangles at a time and fry for 30 seconds, or until crisp and golden brown. Keep turning triangles so they will fry evenly. Drain well. Sprinkle with salt, if desired.

## **Runaways national problem**

### By CAROL DEEGAN

WASHINGTON (AP) - Joan M., 14, ran away from home because she didn't get along with her mother. Eric, 17, left because there wasn't enough room for him at home

Both needed help. And they found it at a runaway house in Washington, D.C., one of the many facilities in the country that provide short-term aid to such youngsters.



The Department of Health, Education and Welfare estimates that 773,000 teen-agers run away from home each year. One survey has found that most runaways are between 15 and 17 years of age, and slightly more are male than fenale.

Teen runaways come from all ethnic and social levels. Many travel only a short distance from home and return in less than a week. But it is estimated that three out of 10 stay away for longer periods. And some never return.

Cynthia Myers, executive director of the National Runaway Switchboard in Chicago, says teens usually run away from home because of problems with family, friends or school

However, Larry Dye, director of HEW's Youth Development Bureau, says there is a growing number of teen-agers called "throwaways," who are pushed out of their homes.

"We're finding in programs that we're serving an increase in the number of kids that are being pushed out of their homes, or they leave their homes at 15, 16 years of age by some kind of mutual agreement between the parent and the young person," Dye said.

When the young are forced out of the homes, we're talking about adolescent abuse, sexual abuse, we're talking about the destruction of the family unit being such that the young people are just told to goout and make it on their own," he said.

nother kind of "throwaway" - the teen-ager who is forced out of his home for economic reasons. With inflation in general and the housing market

in particular, people are living in smaller and smaller units with less and less space, sort of like, just how many little birds can fit in a nest?

"Well, somebody gets pushed out, and you see this particularly in large cities with minority young people where they just don't fit in the apartment any more; that seems to be an increasing factor of a lot of homeless youth," Treanor said.

In addition, Ms. Myers said, more and more runaway teens are suffering from a feeling of tremendous lack of self-worth.

'Teens are asking, 'What am I gonna do with my life? My father can't get a job, he has trouble getting a job, what am I gonna do?"' she said.

Dye said many of today's runaways tended to come from families which had moved around a lot, or where one parent was not a natural parent, or where there was a single-parent family.

Some 38,000 teens receive temporary residential care and counseling at 166 federally funded runaway programs in the United States each year. But Dye said about 20 percent of the teens who came to these facilities needed more long-term residential care.

In some instances, a teen can go to live with another relative, or a friend, or is placed in a boarding school or foster home. Eric was old enough to find an after-school job and live in a foster home. Joan chose to live with an aunt. However, this is not possible for many runaway teens.

"In fact," Ms. Myers said, "there are more situa-tions where young people cannot go back into the home, but they are in no way ready to go out and get an apartment and get a job and live on their own, so they need somebody to help them out." Various laws prohibit teens, at certain ages, from

Various laws prohibit teens, at certain ages, from borrowing money, renting an apartment, or getting a job — "all of the things that help you sustain yourself in a community by yourself," Dye said. And, Treanor said, "All the social services, the juvenile system and the foster homes, and group homes, all these kinds of things, they stop at 18 and after 18, unless you're in the correctional system in jail - there really isn't any program for you.'







"I feel very deeply about the role of women's colleges," she says. "We are in the midst of a revolution of change in women's role in society. It is our obligation to respond to that,



## Credit information given

**COLLEGE STATION-Young adults** may face credit seeking for the first time this spring when they graduate from high school or college.

However, many young people may experience problems with obtaining credit, Claudia Kerbel, a consumer information specialist, points out.

They can't establish a credit record because no one will grant them credit--no one will grant them credit because they have no credit record, the specialist explains.

Kerbel is with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, The Texas A&M University System.

The Equal Credit Opportunity Act, a federal regulation, prohibits discrimination in granting credit. However, no law requires that stores and lenders give charge accounts, credit cards or loans to anyone who fills out an application.

The regulations do require that young adults applying for credit must be judged by the same standards used for other people. Credit lenders say the most impor-

tant factors for judging someone's credit worthiness are: Record of financial responsibility including checking and savings ac-

count practices. Financial resources including equity in a home, household goods, auto-

mobile and life insurance. Present and future earning power.

Current financial commitments. A young person's first loan may need a cosigner.

# Ancient 'comic-book characters' re-discovered

PHILADELPHIA (AP) - Centuries before Spiderman and the Incredible Hulk, anonymous artists in medieval Japan were turning out colorfully illustrated scrolls about other larger-than-life characters - some with magical powers.

The ancient art of Nara Ehon is being rediscovered largely through the efforts of a University of Pennsylvania professor of oriental studies, Dr. Barbara Ruch.

"I was an English Lit major in undergraduate school when I discovered this," she recalled in a recent

interview. "I just couldn't believe there could be such a magnificent wealth of literature that we are not aware of." So she began a 10-year search for

examples of Nara Ehon that was "like a detective story." The ancient "comics" were distri-

buted between the 13th and 17th cen-turies, she said. They were handdrawn, decorated with bright colors and gold leaf, rolled into scrolls and collected into books.

Ms. Ruch said the works had long been ignored by both Western and **Japanese** scholars

Their value was nominal in Japan because they were anonymous, she said. Owners ignored them, stored them or gave them away. The scrolls are written in medieval Japanese as foreign to modern Japanese as the old English used in Beowulf is to modern English-speaking peoples.

Ms. Ruch began her quest with letters to major museums, some of which turned up examples in their storerooms. She also followed up leads from fellow scholars, turning up the vegetable-fiber scrolls in unlikely

An American she met at a restaurant in Japan tipped her to a Dublin cache of 50 or 60 scrolls gathered by an Irish collector years ago. Another 25 turned up in England, a dozen in Germany and France and 150 in the United States — two at the Free Li-brary of Philadelphia.

"It's been difficult because there's not a lot of interest in the field," she said of her search. "I've had to beg people (mostly Japanese businessmen) for money to continue, but it's been worth it."

Ms. Ruch is composing a four-vol-

Among them will be her favorite, "The Tale of the Chrysanthemum," about a young woman who meets a man among the chrysanthemums in her garden and falls in love. When her lover goes away, he leaves a packet containing a lock of his hair.

## a self-portrait

The Black Experience-A self-portrait of Barbara Jordan-Over the years. Barbara Jordan in recent years, has received many offers of various kinds. particularly after her keynote speech at the 1976 Democratic Convention in New York, when political observers were predicting a bright future for her as Speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives, United States senator, attorney general or a Supreme Court justice.

In fact, anything appeared possible for the second term U.S. legislator who was the first black member of the Texas Senate since the Reconstruction Era and the first black woman elected to Congress from the South.

At what seemed to be the crest of her popularity. Ms. Jordan decided she would not seek a third term in Congress. Some Capitol Hill critics said she had become withdrawn, although others said she still was an effective worker behind the scenes. Jordan said she was changing directions to follow her "internal compass.'

THESE DAYS, JORDAN states she is content to use her abilities as a professor at the Lyndon Baines Johnson School of Public Affairs at The University of Texas. She teaches seminars in intergovernmental relations and ethics to second-year students in the graduate school. "I'm loving it," she says.

As a freshman at Boston University Law School in 1956, she was keenly aware of the cultural differences between her and her white classmates, and of the shortcomings of her education in the segregated public schools in her hometown Houston and at predominantly black Texas State University. where she was a champion debater and magna cum laude graduate.

"Barbara Jordan-A Self-Portrait" recently was published by Doubleday. She collaborates with Shelby Hearon, a novelist who teaches writing at The University of Texas in Austin, where Professor B. Jordan lives.

## Minorities anxious in new Iran

TEHRAN, Iran (AP) - The new Islamic republic, proclaimed by an overwhelming vote in a referendum last week, is beset with challenges from ethnic minorities, women's activists, left-wing guerrillas and a restive middle class. But more than two months after the ouster of the shah, Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini's revolutionary power is firm.

With force on some occasions and flexibility on others, Khomeini and his provisional revolutionary government have put down the most serious threats. Although far from being out of the woods yet, the regime is becoming more confident by the day.

The most serious opposition to the new authorities in recent weeks has come from the ethnic minorities account for 14 million of Iran's 34 million people.

In Kurdistan in the northwest and Turkoman tribal areas in the northeast, the regime has put down armed insurrections in fighting that claimed about 600 lives.

The government's problems with ethnic minorities come mainly from rising expectations. After years of alleged repression by the regime of Shah Mohammad Reza Pahlavi, the minorities want immediate satisfaction of their grievances. They fear the new leaders — most of them members of the Persian majority - will continue to overlook their problems.

"The Turkomans believe in the Iranian revolution and, naturally, when Ayatollah Khomeini said the revolutionary government is going to be in the service of the mistreated people of Iran, Turkomans believed better days were ahead for them," a Turkoman militant, Khaleq Verdi, said.

Minority members are demanding such longsought concessions as equality for their national languages, redistribution of land, recognition of their governing councils and stepped-up economic development to make up for what they regard as past inequities.

Some also seek equal treatment for their Sunni Moslem faith in a nation made up predominately of







Professor Rene Germanier of the Swiss Serum Institute said he expects Egypt and several Latin American countries can use the live vaccine in compulsory vaccinations of school children, who face the greatest danger from the



wide scourge, has been largely controlled in the developed world by improved sanitary controls and injections of killedvirus vaccines. However, the oral vaccine offers new hope for developing nations where vaccination programs are difficult to administer.

The disease is still a problem in some Asian countries, the Middle East, Mexico and on the West Coast of South America. The death rate was lowered sharply by the introduction of antibiotic treatment after World War II, but it still runs 10 percent or more in some epidemics.

Germanier, the institute's chief bacteriologist, said 52,000 Egyptian first graders took part in the field trials last year in areas of Egypt where the disease is prevalent. He said none of the 15,-

000 children who received the vaccine contracted typhoid, while the incidence rate in the untreated control group was "within the normal range." He did not elaborate.

Germanier said the Egyptian tests showed the vaccine to be effective against the disease for at least one year and tests were continuing to determine how long it would remain effective.

The new vaccine is a live mutant of a typhoid bacillus obtained through genetic modification in years of testing. It was first tried on volunteers at a Maryland jail under a study spon-sored by the U.S. Army. Oral vaccines in use up to now were made from killed bacteria and offered relatively little protection, the scientist

wide scourge, has been largely controlled in the developed world by improved sanitary controls and injections of killedvirus vaccines. However, the oral vaccine offers new hope for developing nations where vaccination programs are difficult to administer.

The disease is still a problem in some Asian countries, the Middle East, Mexico and on the West Coast of South America. The death rate was lowered sharply by the introduction of antibiotic treatment after World War II, but it still runs 10 percent or more in some epidemics.

Germanier, the institute's chief bacteriologist, said 52,000 Egyptian first graders took part in the field trials last year in areas of Egypt where the disease is prevalent.

He said none of the 15,-000 children who received the vaccine contracted typhoid, while the incidence rate in the untreated control group was "within the normal range." He did not elaborate.

Germanier said the Egyptian tests showed the vaccine to be effective against the disease for at least one year and tests were continuing to determine how long it would remain effective. The hew vaccine is a

live mutant of a typhoid bacillus obtained through genetic modification in years of testing. It was first tried on volunteers at a Maryland jail under a study sponsored by the U.S. Army.

Oral vaccines in use up to now were made from killed bacteria and offered relatively little protection, the scientist said.



DIRT, SQUIRT & QUIRT **Cotton seminar** slated Tuesday at Valley View

### By CHARLES W. GREEN Midland County Extension Agent-Agriculture

Little change occurred in the agricultural situation in the West Texas area last week. The weather remained cool and still no significant moisture developed.

Much of the area not too far east from Midland has received good rains during the past several weeks and is in excellent condition. Sub-moisture is in good supply locally but a couple of inches of moisture would really put cropland and native pastures in prime condition for the coming season.

**COTTON PRODUCERS** are invited to attend a cotton production seminar at Valley View Community Center at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday. A team of specialists with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service will cover topics timely and pertinent to cotton production in Midland County.

The program is as follows: Dr. Kenneth Lindsey, area extention agronomist: "The Role of Quick Maturing Cotton Varieties in the Future" and "Consideration of Zinc in a Cotton Fertility Program in Midland County;'

Dr. Harold Kaufman, area plant pathologist: "The Use of Systemic Pesticide for Nematode Control in Cotton-Results of 2-Years' Trials in Midland County;

Charles Neeb, area extension entomologist: "Biological and Cultural Considerations in Holding Insect Damage to a Minimum in Cotton;" and,

Gary Condra, area extension economist: "What Does It Really Cost to Grow Cotton in Midland Coun-

It has been several years since we have had a cotton production seminar for Midland producers and I believe the program will be helpful to cotton growers in planning and managing a cotton production program for greatest efficiency and profit.

THE 1978 COUNTY Result Demonstration Handbok is just off the press. Cotton producers attending the Cotton Production Seminar will be among the first to receive a copy. It contains detailed results of cotton variety, fertility and disease (nematode) control trials carried out as a part of the Extension program in Midland county last year. Other trials were conducted in the areas of livestock production and horticulture.

THE GREEN MONTHS are approaching and spring lawn preparations have begun. An important step to a healthy lawn is correct restoration practices following winter. The first step in bringing a lawn back to life after dormancy is the removal of thatch.

The accumulation of leaves, grass clippings and various organic materials known as thatch has an undesirable effect. Moisture and nutrient penetration are decreased and root development is of a shallow nature in lawns with thatch layers. Removal of this layer can be accomplished by dethatching machines built for this purpose and available at many rental businesses.

## more than children (AP) - Don Schablein will tell you he has a bird

Dear Dr. Solomon: My nephew has measles. His mother is all upset that he wasn't immunized and is new worried that it is very serious. I'm sure that's not true and I'd like to bring her mind to rest. What can you tell me about measles?-Mrs. A...

Dear Mrs. A.L.: Measles, also called rubeola, red measles, hard measles and 9 or 10-day measles, is the most serious of the common childhood diseases. Measles (not to be confused with rubella, or German measles) can cause pneumonia, blindmess and encephalitis (inflammation of the brain), which often leads to permanent brain damage and deafness.

Measles is most likely to occur in the late winter and spring. Although it usually strikes young children above the age of six months, medical experts report that measles, and the other so-called childhood diseases, as well, are occurring progressively later in life, with outbreaks in high schools and even in colleges.

Usually, measles lasts about two weeks. It begins with symptoms like those of a bad cold and a temperature that may rise as high as 104 degrees. A few days after the beginning of symptoms, a blotchy, red rash appears on various parts of the body. This rash fades away, gradually over a period of seven to 10 days.

The complications of measles are another matter. As many as three out of every 10 cases of measles result in pneumonia. Encephalitis occurs once in every 1,000 reported cases. And, year after year, there is one death for every 1,000 cases of measles reported to the Public Health Service.

People catch measles by breathing

in particles of the measles virus that an infected person has expelled while coughing, sneezing, or simply talking. So highly contagious is this disease that in the early 1960s, before a vaccine was available, measles struck hundreds of thousands of children each year and caused a great many death.

In 1964, there were 485,083 reported cases in, the Umited States and at least 421 deaths. During the following decade, the introduction and widespread use of the new measles vaccine brought about a tremendous reduction in measles cases in all parts of the country. In 1974, only 22,094 cases and 20 deaths were reported to the Public Health Service.

Unfortunately, there has not been a continuing decline in the imcidence of measles. Following a slight increase in 1975, measles incidence jumped a startling 62 percent in 1976, from the 24,374 cases reported in 1975 to a 1976 total of 41,126 cases. And communicable disease experts, who tracked outbreaks in several parts of the nation this past spring, predict that as many as 60,000 cases will be reported in 1978.

Why is measles threatening again? Because millions of American youngsters have not been immunized against it. At present, more than 13 million children, or 30 percent of all children under the age of 14, have not been vaccinated. These children can catch measles and suffer its disabling complications. They can spread the disease to others who have never been immumized.



Another step, that of aeration, is not required but may help in areas of soil compaction. Aeration increases the exchange of carbon dioxide and other toxic gases between the soil and atmosphere. Coring or grooving type aeration machines will usually aid compacted soil.

If your lawn doubled as a football field this winter, you might consider aeration in your lawn restoration plans.

A third and very important part of this procedure is fertilization. A complete fertilizer should be applied in the spring to encourage good growth of roots and foliage.

Research has shown that most turf grasses grow best when fertilized in a ratio for N-P-K (nitrogen-phosphorous-potassium) of 3-1-2 for St. Augustine grass and 4-1-2 for Bermuda grass.

Use 12 to 15 pounds of these formulas per 1,000 square feet of lawn area. In addition to this spring application, a lawn will require top-dressing with straight nitrogen carriers (such as ammonium nitrate or ammonium sulfate) every 4 to 6 weeks during the growing season. Use only small amounts each time; about 5 to 6 pounds per 1,000 square feet.

The next requirement is proper watering. Generally, about one inch of water per week will be adequate through April, stepped up to 1.5 inches in May, and two irrigations per week in June, July and August of 1 inch each. Extremely shallow soils may require even closing interval watering, especially in hot, dry conditions.

Another factor in lawn care may be grub control. If your lawn was heavily damaged last summer and fall by grubs, don't panic if you find large, larvae present now. They are fully matured overwintered larvae and will soon pupate and emerge as adult June bugs in May and June.

Best control of grubs is achieved by treating the next hatch usually in late June or early July. Pesticides mixed with fertilizers and used now will give very little grub control and will be largely inef-fective in about 3 weeks.

## 'Living Planet' big

WASHINGTON (AP) — It was just about 13 years ago, when man got his first look at earth as seen from outer space, that documentary movie makers Francis Thompson got the idea for his latest film, "Living Planet."

"It happened in 1966 when, from the barren surface of the moon, photo satellite Lunar Orbiter I took the first picture of the earth as a celestial body," Thompson recalls.


"That was the day I began to think of doing a film that would give us a new perspective on our planet, the only celestial body in our part of the cosmos with life," he adds.

Thompson's new film recently rplaced his aerial thriller, "To Fly," at the Smithsonian Institution's National Air and Space Museum here. That documentary, directed by Jim Freeman and Greg Mac-Gillvray, had been seen by 4 million people since it went on view in July 1976.

An earlier Thompson film, "To Be Alive," was a popular attraction seen by millions at the 1964-65 New York World's Fair and was honored as the best documentary short subject of 1965. "Living Planet" opens with a shot of earth as seen from outer space, plunges viewers into a tempest, and takes them on a breathtaking aerial odyssey

over four continents on the museum's giant Imax screen, five stories high.

"Living Planet," made especially for the Smith-sonian and presented as a public service by Johnson Wax, will be shown in other Imax theaters around the country in the summer of 1980.

# Morocco peacefully invading Spanish outposts

CEUTA, North Africa (AP) — Led by its poor, Morocco is pushing toward a quiet takeover of the last remmants of the Spanish empire the tiny enclaves of Ceuta and Melilla opposite Spain in North Africa on the Mediterranean.

"I don't say it will happen tomorrow, but it is coming eventually and then we will all go back to Spain," says Jose Luis Perez, one of the 50,000 Spaniards hanging on in Ceuta.

Cueta lies opposite Gibraltar. Melilla is about 140 miles to the east, across the Mediterranean from Almeria on Spain's southern coast.

Each sunrise a wave of Moroccan workers crosses the border into Ceuta. By nightfall, most of them in their djellabahs — the crudely woven robes that protect against wind and rain and often provide concealment for smuggled goods — will be back across the border. But some will remain, sleeping in the hills outside the city or among the 8,000 inhabitants of the shantytown ghetto of Principe Alfonso on Ceuta's outskirts.

"IT IS A PEACEFUL invasion." says the newly elected national senator, Antonio Dominguez, adding that one of the Spanish Parliament's first duties should be to control the steady seepage of Moroccans into the enclave.

But lured by the prospect of work and welcomed by Ceuta's employers who want to avoid social security contributions, the unskilled and unemployed Moroccans keep coming. Time seems on Morocco's side, despite continuing declarations from Spain, including some by King Juan Carlos, that the last two outposts will remain forever Spanish.

All of Spain's 36 million people, however, may not agree. Without Gen. Francisco Franco around to remind them of his Moroccan military victories, many Spaniards see the Mediterranean enclaves as relics that gobble up tax revenues while Ceuta's and Melilla's civil servants draw double pay in duty-free ports for serving in supposed hardship areas.

ble pay in duty-free ports for serving in supposed hardship areas. The official position of the Spanish government, however, is that all is going well and neither Ceuta nor Melilla is in danger of being lost to autonomists, independence advocates or Morocco. Ceuta's highest civilian authority, Undersecretary Ramon Ferrer Pena, contends Spanish and certainly Ceutan public opinion is for remaining with Spain.

"THIS IS NOT a colonial situation," he says. "Ceuta always has been Spanish and is going to remain so. Our image abroad has been distorted."

Ferrer Pena insists the number of Spaniards in Ceuta is growing and that the Moroccan population of 15,000 is decreasing, a view that runs counter to that of the man on the street.

"The Moros are everywhere," says an Indian shopkeeper, using the Ceutan word to describe Moors who ruled Ceuta and most of Spain for seven centuries until the 1490s.

"All you have to do is look in the streets or in the market to see the increase in Moroccans," says Sen. Dominguez, a member of Premier Adolfo Suarez's Center Party that keeps Ferrer Pena in his job.

The population gap between Spaniards and Moroccans is reported shrinking even faster in Melilla, according to a citizens organization called the Pro-Melilla Association.

In a letter to King Juan Carlos, the association said official figures showed the number of Spaniards dropped from 69,000 to 45,000, while the number of Moroccans rose from 7,000 to 14,000. The four-year-old figures do not cover Moroccans illegally in the enclave, the association added.

"IF THIS IS not a colony, then we should take away some of the things that make it look like one," says Ceuta newspaper editor Antonio Ferrer, no relation to the undersecretary.

One of his newspaper's principal objections has been that Gen. Luis Polanco wears the hats of both military commander and civil governor. The newspaper also has called for an investigation of work permits, questioned the propriety of a judge, who owns land in Morocco, to hear cases involving Moroccans and assailed alleged racial discrimination against Moroccans. These positions that have brought more than \$100,000 in damage suits against the newspaper. Ferrer says radical changes are needed in Ceuta and Melilla or Morocco's quiet invasion will succeed, perhaps by the 1983 elections, "but certainly before 10 more years."

In a recent editorial, however, the newspaper seemed to be saying that battle to reform Ceuta and block a Moroccan takeover already might be lost. "The people of Ceuta apparently will accept anything," it said.

What the Ceutans do not accept, however, is giving resident Moroccans equal status in education, politics, health, or social life.

**CEUTA'S ONLY** restaurant serving Moroccan food gets little patronage. Moroccans vanish after dark, leaving the bars and movies to the Spaniards. The pupil load in the ghetto schools averages 100, more than three times that of Spanish schoolrooms. Abbas Lachmi Dris, the only Moroccan brave enough to run for mayor, tempers his campaign by declaring, "Ceuta's only solution is to remain Spanish."

Morocco is tied down with an Algerian-backed guerrilla war over control of the former Spanish Sahara far to the south. It seems unlikely to observers here that the Moroccans will make any military moves against the two enclaves.

Yet Ceuta's streets are filled with Spanish soldiers — part of a local force of 10,000 men, including two regiments of regulars, one regiment of the Spanish Foreign Legion and thousands of draftees.

King Hassan II of Morocco has made no formal demands for Spain to give up the enclaves, which would leave the Spaniards with only a miniscule island fortress in the Mediterranean called the Rock of Alhucemas. But Hassan has turned his Cabinet loose on several occasions to denounce Spain as being colonists because of the enclaves.

Morocco's pressure is not always peaceful. Since Franco's death three years ago, a little-known organization called the Moroccan Patriotic Front has set off bombs in Ceuta, including a recent blast in a downtown hotel that wounded 17 persons and forced Spain to close the border for 24 hours.
