#### TO ALL PERSONS INTERESTED IN MULESHOE MEMORIAL PARK:

The Memorial Park has a trust fund which provides income for the on going care of the cemetery. However, the drastic decrease in interest rates over the last few months has caused a drastic decrease in the volume from the trust fund and the amount of money for the maintenance of the cemetery.

The non-profit corporation has had significant expenses in the care and maintenance of the cemetery which includes the killing of the weeds, fertilizing the grass, and high cost of watering the cemetery. It is expensive to maintain the cemetery and the income from the trust fund is now not sufficient to pay these expenses. We receive money from the sales of plots, grave marking fees and monument setting fees which is not enough to help the cemetery.

During our board meeting the members of Muleshoe Memorial Park Cemetery, Inc. in July 2012, decided that the board of directors solicit contributions and memorials to be used in the care and maintenance of the cemetery. We have a new project in the works and desperately need your help in achieving it. The Board of Directors and Bailey County Electric Coop are working together to get pricing on a metal fence to erect around the east and west side of the cemetery to help control most of the sand from blowing into the cemetery and covering monuments and vases. Anyone desiring to make a contribution or memorial gift to Muleshoe Memorial Park Cemetery can do so by sending their contribution or memorial to: P.O. Box 373 or at 104 East Ave C, Muleshoe, Texas 79347.

We just want to give you an update on the cemetery if you have not been out there to see the changes. Bailey County Electric Coop came out and cleared out all the dead trees around the cemetery, cleaned around the monuments in Garden 4 that were covered by the sand that blew into the cemetery earlier this year. The new caretaker has been mowing, weed eating and filling in holes and leveling the graves also raising and leveling the monuments. He has been watering the cemetery and spraying the weeds.

#### Neighbors Making A Difference

Samaritan Hospice is a division of King's Manor Methodist Retirement System and is a faith based, non-profit organization striving to provide exceptional end-of-life care to our neighbors. Hospice is a concept that is often misunderstood. People often assume that Hospice is called when a person s literally on their death bed and needs pain control. In fact Hospice is so much more, according to Shelly Moss, the Executive Director of King's Manor and Samaritan. Hospice comes into play when an individual is faced with a terminal diagnosis, for which traditional medicine can no longer offer relief or hope for a cure. Sometimes the treatment is harder on the person than the disease itself, as is sometimes the case chemotherapy and radiation. Hospice becomes an option that focuses on quality of life, enjoying family and working through life issues.

A common myth is that Hospice hastens death. In truth Hospice is life affirming. Hospice staff works with patients to manage their nutrition, sleep patterns, medication, and general well being. Hospice nurses do have special training and knowledge of pain medication and pain control. They work very closely with family and patients to ensure that there is a balance so that the individual is as alert as they want to be. It is not uncommon for individuals to improve under Hospice care for a period of time and some even "graduate" from Hospice because they have improved so much. Mrs. Moss explains that Hospice empowers patients with a terminal diagnosis to make the most of each day and to live pain-free with dignity.

Another common myth is that Hospice is a specific place. While there are inpatient units, Hospice care can be given at the patients home, in an assisted living or nursing home setting, depending on what works best in each situation. Patients do not have to be homebound. In fact Samaritan has helped individuals plan trips and/or outings with their families. Patients remain as active and involved as their energy level allows. Individuals on Hospice continue going to church, to their coffee shop, and visiting family. Samaritan emphasizes a holistic approach to care and provides physical, emotional and spiritual support for patients and their families. The social workers, chaplains and even the nurses help family members deal with their concerns and fears for their loved one and about the process. Families






