
Trustees Approve **New School Building Plans**

So close was the political scene many remained up all night Saturday in hopes of finding out whether there would be a run-off.

Judge Ralph Yarborough was still in the lead at midnight. He left home shortly thereafter for his downtown headquarters in the Littlefield Building. the elevator jammed. When Yarborough was freed nearly an hour later, Governor Shivers had taken a small lead which he never relinquished.

J. J. Holmes and Cyclone Davis, the two other contenders for the Governorship, polled just enough votes to make a runoff necessary.

It will be the first Gubernaorial runoff since the Rainey-Jester campaign of 1946.

A runoff also is in order for a place on the Court of Criminal Appeals. Contenders are Judge Lloyd Davidson of Austin and District Judge Alan Haley of Wichita Falls.

A third runoff race is that between Alfred M. Scott of Austin and Justice Few Brewster who seeks re-election to Supreme Court.

Q-Did all U.S. Presidents vote for themselves for the nation's highest

A-At least one President apparently did not, because there seems to be no evidence that he ever voted. Zachary Taylor, the 12th President who was elected in 1848, never stayed in one place long enough to qualify to vote, according to George Stimpson's "Book About American Politics." Taylor entered the Army as a young man and retired shortly before his election.

Q-I've noticed when amendments to the Constitution are proposed in Congress-such as the Bricker amendment-they always seem to be in the form of a "joint resolution." Do they have to take this

A-According to Senate Parliamentarian Charles L Watkins, a proposed Constitutional amendment has always been introduced in the form of a joint resolution "by custom." He says there is no requirement that the legislation take this form, that such a measure could be in the form of a Senate or House bill.

Q—is Congress bound by law to stay in session a certain length of time? A-If Congress wants to quit earlier than usual, it may do so by passage of a concurrent resolution. The Constitution requires that Congress meet each year, and normally it stays in session at least until July. The Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946 specified that: "Except in time of war or during a national emergency proclaimed by the President, the two Houses shall adjourn" not later than July 31 "unless otherwise provided by Congress." Since the Act became effective, Congress has consistently stayed at work past the July 31 date, except in 1952, when it adjourned July 7.





SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 14 proposing an amendment to Article III of the Constitution of the State of Texas by adding thereto a new section, to be known as Section 52-b, prohibiting the Legislature from ever lending the credit of the State, or granting any public money, or ndebtedness of any individual, person, firm, partnership, association, corporation, public agency or political subdivision of the State, now authorized, or which may hereafter be authorized to construct, maintain, or operate toll roads, or turnpikes within this State; and providing for the submission of the amendment to the voters of this State.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
Section 1. That Article III of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended by adding thereto a new section, to be known as Section 52-b, which shall read as follows:

"Section 52-b. The Legislature shall have no power or authority to in any manner lend the credit of the State or grant any public money to, or assume any indebtedness, present or future, bonded or otherwise, of any individual, person, firm, partnership, association, corporation, public corporation, public agency, or political subdivision of the State, or anyone else, which is now or hereafter authorized to construct, maintain or operate authorized to construct, maintain or operate toll roads and turnpikes within this State."

Section 2. The foregoing amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this State at an election to be held on November 2, 1954, at which all ballots shall have printed thereon, or in counties using voting machines such machines shall provide for the following:
"FOR the Constitutional Amendment prohibiting the Legislature from lending the credit of the State or granting public money to, or assuming any indebtedness of, any one authorized to construct, maintain, or operate toll roads or turnpikes in

or, any one authorized to construct, main tain, or operate toll roads or turnpikes in this State;" and "AGAINST the Constitutional Amendment prohibiting the Legislature from lending the credit of the State or granting public money to, or assuming any indebtedness of, any one authorized to construct, maintain, or operate toll roads or turnpikes, in this State."

Each voter shall mark out one of said clauses on the ballot, leaving the one expressing his vote on the proposed amendment; and if it shall appear from the returns of said election that a majority of the votes cast are in favor of said amendment, the same shall become a part of the Constitution of the State of Texas.

Section 3. The Governor of the State of Texas shall issue the necessary proclamation for said election and have the same published as required by the Constitution and laws of this State.



"I REMEMBER" BY THE OLD TIMERS

From Frank P. McNichol, Cam-

den, New Jersey: I remember some forty odd years ago, when the Victor Talking Machine Company was still an infant industry. I can remember that shares in this, at that time, youngest of Camden, New Jersey, industries were being offered from door to door, for twenty-five cents a share. five shares for one dollar-with, believe it or not, very few takers. Many New Jersey residents of those days, myself included, have lived to lament our lack of foresight in this respect--a lamentation that is all the more tragic for with

the right perspective we could certainly have been in the money today. I remember the first phonograph horns made of wood for the Victor people by the old Excelsion Drum Works of Camden, later discarded in favor of the more resonant Morning Glory type of horn of metallic composition. But we of those days should not

be too critical of our shortcomings in this respect; for our lack of perspection in not discerning or knowing a good thing when we saw it. For our viewpoint at the time was strictly speaking, that of the typical man in the street, on the outside looking in, and the Victor Talking Machine Company from its seemingly unpretentions headquarters in the old Camden City Hall on North Front Street, showed no visible indication as to its ultimate emergence as the mammoth industrial Empire of the Radio Corporation of America.

SENATE IOINT RESOLUTION NO

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 6
Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Texas by adding to Article XVI thereof a new section, to be numbered 63; providing for crediting to members of either the Teacher Retirement System or the Employees Retirement System or the Employees Retirement System of Texas all services rendered, as either a teacher, or person employed in the public schools, colleges, and universities of the State, or as an appointive officer or employee of the State, for retirement benefits under either of said Systems.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
Section 1. That Article XVI of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended by adding thereto a new section, to be numbered 63, which shall read as follows:

"Section 63. Qualified members of the Teacher Retirement System, in addition to the benefits allowed them under the Teacher Retirement System shall be entitled to credit in the Teacher Retirement System for all services, including prior service and membership service, earned or rendered by them as an appointive officer or employee of the State. Likewise, qualified members of the Employees Retirement System of Texas, in addition to the benefits allowed them under the Employees Retirement System of Texas for all services, including prior service and membership service, earned or rendered by them as a teacher or person employed in the public schools, colleges, and universities supported wholly or partly by the State."




