**Texas Guard**  
**Announces 1-Day**  
**Recruit Campaign**



Lt. Gen. K. L. Parry, adjutant general, today announced that all National Guard units in Texas will conduct a one-day recruiting drive Feb. 22.

"The purpose of the campaign," he said, "is to help enlist 75,000 new volunteer Guardsmen urgently needed to meet the fiscal year goal set by Congress for the United States, Puerto Rico, Alaska and Hawaii."

"We hope through a brief but intensive drive to stimulate a broadly-based community interest in meeting the need for a larger National Guard through the democratic means of voluntary enlistment."

"Present strength of the National Guard in the United States and territories is 430,714," he said. "That is an all-time high but it still falls short of what the military planners in Washington have in mind for us."

Gen. Berry said that present strength of the National Guard in Texas is 20,738 men. "We have a state-wide goal in the one-day campaign of 800 men."

Each Guard unit will be given an individual quota, which will be announced within the next few days by unit commanders.

The basic program of the one-day campaign will consist of a two-hour drill period the morning of drive day, following which all Guard members will engage in house-to-house recruiting.

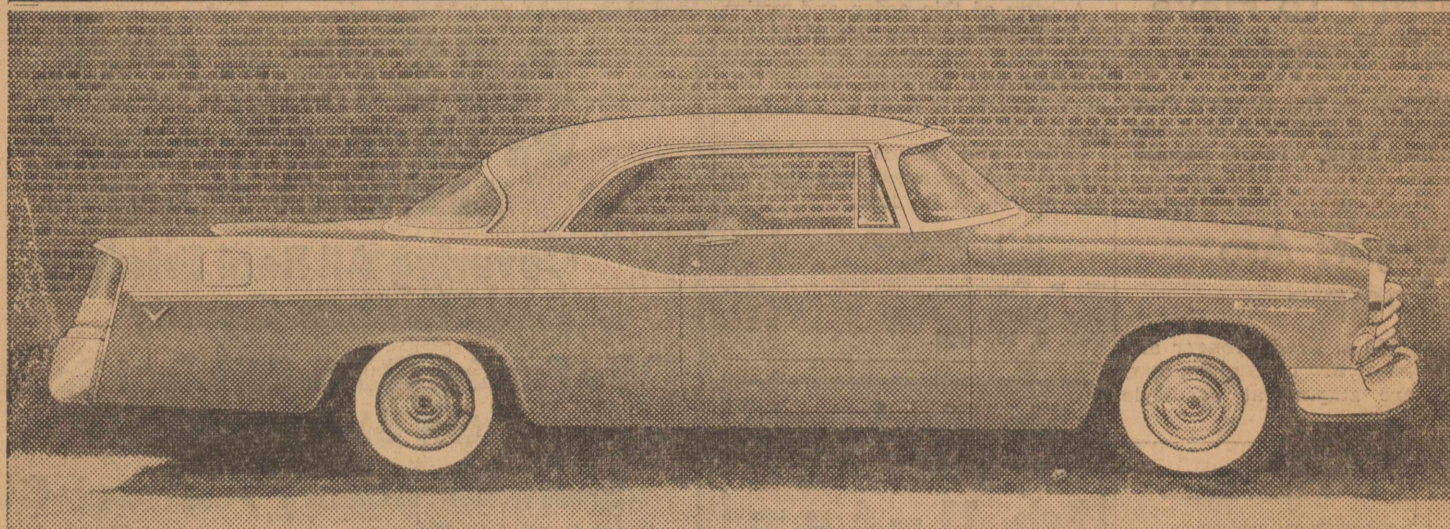

## McCann's Analysis

Britain's Labor party is celebrating its 50th anniversary by engaging in a new fight between its right and left wing factions.

Leftist Aneurin Bevan has declared war on rightist Hugh Gaitskell, who defeated him on Dec. 14 for the party leadership.

Bevan has no chance of winning. All he can do is to weaken the party in its role of official opposition to the Conservatives.

Hence the winner will be Prime Minister Anthony Eden, who only one month ago was under heavy fire by members of his own party.

Bevan, the fiery Welshman who is Labor's chief anti-American, has taken his lumps in the last few months. He seems pretty bitter.

Gaitskell defeated him for the post of party treasurer by a vote of more than four to one at Labor's annual conference last Oct. 11.

### Then More Defeats

Next Gaitskell defeated him for the party leadership by 157 to 70 on Dec. 14 after the retirement of Clement R. Attlee.

Bevan then shot for the deputy leadership. James Griffith, a fellow Welshman and onetime fellow miner, won that post last Thursday by a vote of 141 to 11.

Bevan went into rebellion. In a speech last Saturday, he accused the party leadership of using dictatorial methods. He said party leaders were betraying socialist principles. He denounced Gaitskell and other chiefs who favor a slowing-up of Labor's former sweeping policy of nationalization of industry.

"I know these words are going to get me into trouble," he added. He probably was right. There is speculation that he may be thrown out of what is called the "shadow cabinet" of his party.

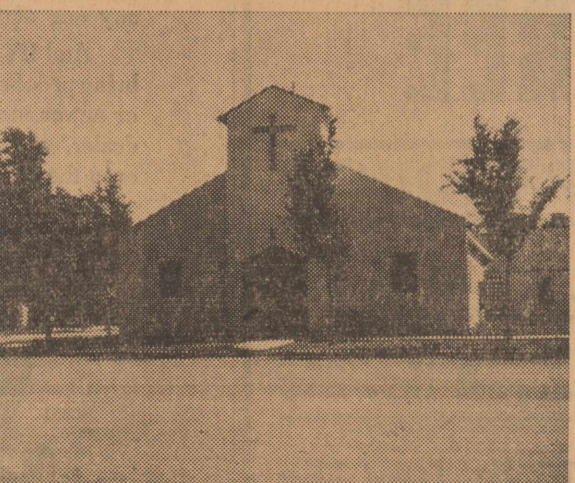
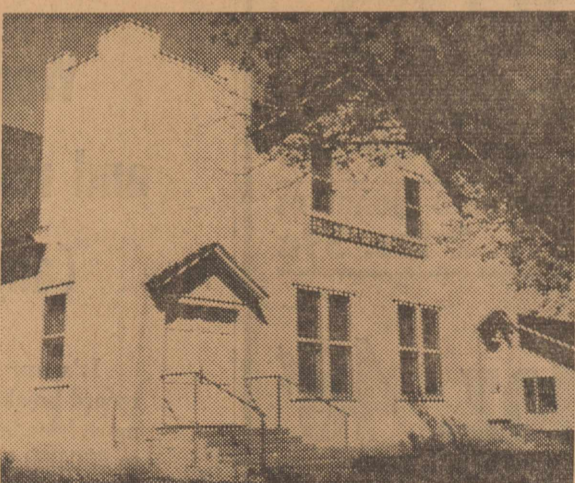
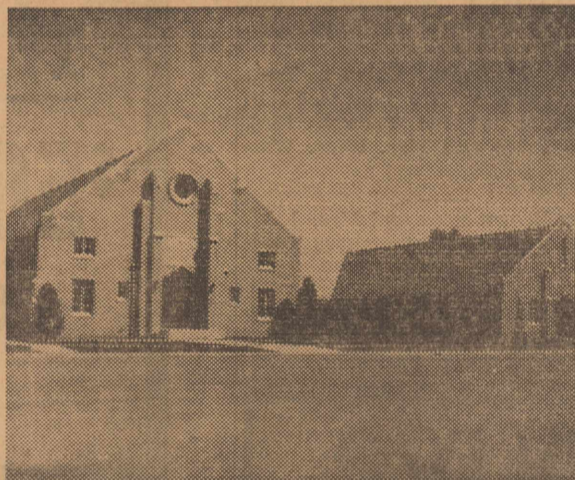
But, whatever the cost, I am opposed to the lowering of the value on the life and soul of man.
