# **Four-Word Discovery**

The best discoveries we make in life are not about anything new; we make them when we finally "see" something that has long been much at work but hitherto unexamined and taken for granted in

our lives, sort of like gravity. Unless we're falling in the shower, gravity is the kind of major blessing we take for granted even as we're deriving great benefits from its existence. It was at work a long

time before Sir Isaac Newton got hit on the head with the apple, but he appreciated it a lot more after that apple

bumpling. (Sorry.) Right now I'm thinking of a foundational belief that I've long held but never spent much time looking in the face. What makes me even happier about this discovery is that I think I've also discovered a way to put it into four simple words, no small accomplishment for a wordy wordster.

So here's the four-word discovery that dropped nicely onto my dense head.

Fret sounds are wonderful.

What?! I'll try to explain. When you listen to a great guitarist playing beautiful music, what you rarely notice, unless you listen specifically for them, are what I'm calling "fret sounds." They're the unbidden sounds a guitarist makes as he slides his fingers up and down the strings across the "frets," the "bars," on the instrument's neck.

Poor technique might cause fret sounds of such quantity and volume that they'd become the focus and detract from the beauty of the music. But what they really are is an integral part of the beauty of the music made by the most gifted guitarists this world has ever seen. Their presence makes the music more, not less, beautiful because they show that it's real.

THAT, you muse, is a lifechanging discovery?!

Yes, it is. Pick whatever metaphor you please, but fret sounds are wonderful. Brush strokes are beautiful. In music, art, and life.

That particular giggle. That unique wink or twinkle. That snort when you laugh. That bent ear or crinkled sense of humor. That funny way of seeing lots of things as funny. That bit of healthy irreverence that loves life and lots of it and trusts God enough not to be embarrassed about that. That "flaw" that shows you have blood in your veins and are not perfectly plastic or plastically "perfect."

Some politicians (notice that they all dress alike?), puritans (notice that they don't trust color?), and pharisees (notice that they can't laugh?) who prefer plastic clones to people with blood, might call "fret sounds" flaws.

But the God who made you loves to hear you play and revels in the "fret sounds" that make you, you. His eyes twinkle, and from the Father's heart of deepest joy, he laughs out the very best laugh of all, calls you by name, and announces to Heaven, "Just listen to that child play!'



Thus, the precipitation received this week should help reduce shedding and enhance fruit development.

In world cotton news, Pakistan's upcoming 2007-08 cotton crop is forecast to be its second largest ever at 10.4 million bales, according to a U.S. attaché in Islamabad.

The country's crop is off to a good start due, in part, to normal weather conditions accompanied by a sufficient supply of inputs.

Consumption in Pakistan is forecast at 12.5 million bales, marginally less than the previous year.

With domestic prices increasing, mills in Pakistan are finding the importation of upland cotton increasingly

"Progressive textile mills are focusing on producing better quality products, particularly for the export market," the attaché said. "This is important news as Pakistan is a major cotton

Cotton futures trading week ended May 29, soil immediate forecast, and the importer, especially for U.S.

Meanwhile, drought could slash Australia's cotton production by 33 percent in 2007-08, but industry observers there say longerterm prospects are brighter.

The country's crop is expected to fall to 800,000 bales from an estimated 1.2 million bales in 2006-07 as producers have been hit hard by the worst drought in 100

In 2000-01, before the drought struck, Australia produced a record crop of 3.6 million bales.

"Planting usually starts in mid-October so we've still got four or five months for some rain to fall, get some water into storage, and boost the planting," an Australian analyst

In other news, net export sales of 293,300 bales in the week ended May 24 were 18 percent less than the previous week and 24 percent less than the four-week average. Featured buvers were China. Turkey, Indonesia, and Pakistan.

Export shipments of 308,900 bales slipped 15 percent from the previous week's marketing year high and were one percent below the four-week average. Primary destinations included China, Turkey, Mexico, and Indonesia.

In the spot market, online trading by producers in Texas, Oklahoma, and Kansas totaled 18,223 bales in the four trading days ended May 31 compared to 37,416 bales the previous

Average prices received by producers ranged from 42.93 to 48.15 cents per pound compared to 43.31 to 47.89 cents per pound the previous
