## Dry-Damp Monsoon Stalemates Harvest




A month of fog, drizzle, light
shower and even snow showers
has held men and combin has held men and combine crews
helpless for about a month in their attempt to harvest maize their attempt to harvest maize
growing in this area, although
only an average of about two only an average of about two
inches of moisture has fallen Small acreages of dryland
fields was harvested before the fields was harvested before the
damp monsoon season set in. In
many cases the yield was only many cases the yield was only
about 1,000 pounds of grain to
the acre. Little or no work has been reported in irrigated fields,
where the yield if not lessened by stalks going down under the
weight of grain and moisture \$ould be apprxoimately 3,500
pounds to the acre pounds to the acre.
The fall season is
the Panhandle section. Normally tree leaves remain green until
the first freeze or frost and drop within a few days. This
year with the relative humidity varying between 70 and 100 per-
cent, the leaves have remained on the majority of the trees,
some turning yellow and others turning red, to allow the beauty
of autumn colors on the high plains.

Indirect lighting that will put to shame the best of lighting
engineers has often been visible in Stratford. Fog has acted as
a ceiling reflector. On several nights when the football field
has been lighted, the glare fom the floodlights along with street lights and neon signs, has pro-
duced a night light over most of the city in which no shadows
are present. It has given a
peculiar sensation to many who were impressed by the bright
moonlight, and later discovered
neither the moon nor neither the moon nor stars were
visible. A continued monsoon may re-
sult in the adoption of methods
