The Farmers Supply started in 1934 with a general merchandise store - still operating across US Highway 87 from the elevators - and $\$ 1,200$ in assets. In 1937, it leased the larger of the two metal elevators that can be seen at the far end of the "barrels"" and that had been built by J. N. Beasley of

Baled hay, as shown, or any kind of baled forage, with baling wire removed, is moved automatically by a drag-chain into the hay grinding equipment in the pit behind Lyons, and then by
air-suction lifted up and into the main mixing room beyond the wall you see at the far side of the pit.
Because the ground forage is moved by air-suction, instead of air-blast, dust is at a mini-
