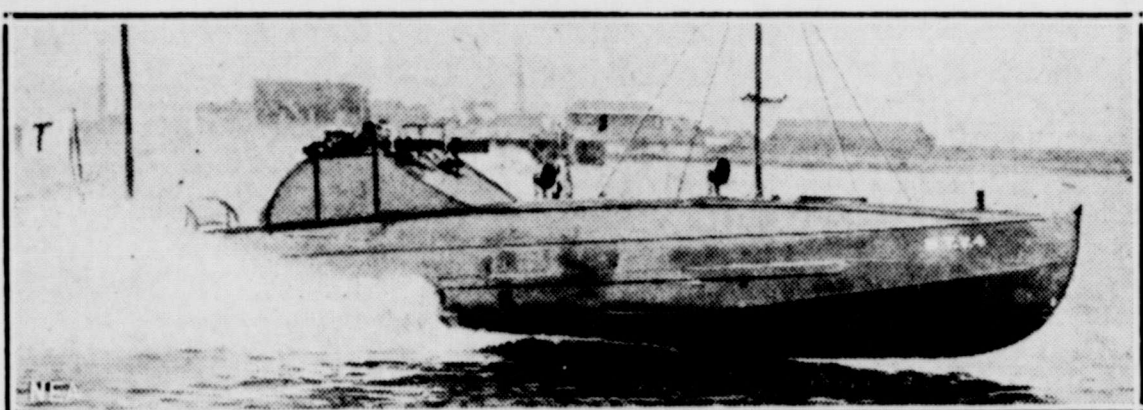

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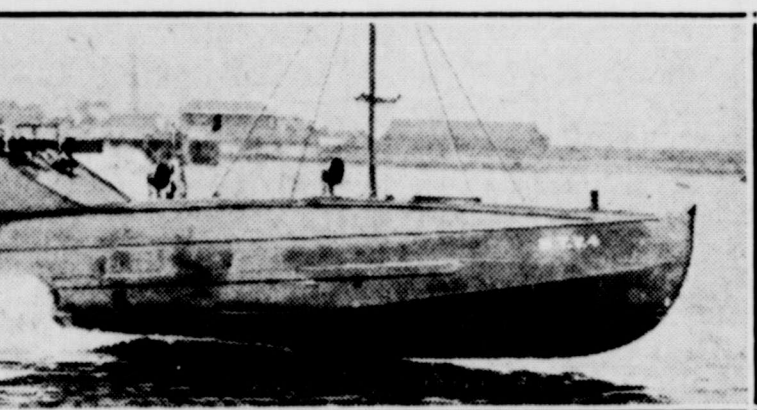

TRUCKS, TEAMS ARE RESTORED TO CWA WORK

EASTLAND, Jan. 23 - Eastland county CWA officials Monday morning received instructions from Austin to put trucks and teams back to work. These had been ordered discontinued the latter part of last week.

Orders were also received at the Eastland county office to limit the work time for each truck team and person to 24 hours per week in the towns and cities and to 15 hours per week in the rural districts.

Beginning Friday of last week and for the balance of the week a total of 1,200 men, women and children will be engaged on local projects throughout the county. An additional 60 men will be engaged on federal projects in the county.

All pending projects have been returned from Austin with instructions that they be re-submitted on new forms that have just been adopted.

The Eastland county CWA office also received notice that a carload each of flour, cheese, butter and meat was in transit to Eastland for distribution in Eastland and seven other surrounding counties through the various relief offices in those counties Eastland county's portion of these shipments were given as follows: pork, 18,500 pounds; cheese, 9,306 pounds; flour, 17,760 pounds; butter, 1,800 pounds.
