

SAN FRANCISCO. Feb. 10 -The United Airline plane that plunged into San Francisco bay carried all 11 of its occupants to death, authorities found today when the wreckage was raised from the water. More than 14 hours after the accident.

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 10 (U.P.)-A derrick bored along side the wrecked U. S. airline plane half submerged in the bay today attempted to raise the wreckage and deter-mine the fate of the 11 occupants. None believed that any of the eight passengers and three members f the crew had survived.

Salvage operation began at low tide, the barge was moored between two coast guard boats about one and one-half miles off shore. Offi-cials estimated it would require four hours to lift the wreckage high enough to permit authorities to estimate the damage.

Department of commerce inspectors stood by ready to investigate. Cause of the crash may never be known, however. Weather conditions were perfect as A. R. Thompson, veteran pilot eased the big plane into a landing that ended in the worst airport major air tragedy of the winter. Some experts believed Thompson dipped too low encircling to land and the plane struck the




