Bill Wright Buried In Monday Services

Final tribute was paid to William Butts (Bill) Wright, Sr. 54, lifelong Cisco attorney, in funeral services at 2 p.m. Monday at the First United Methodist Church. Mr. Wright died at 4:30 p.m. Saturday at the E. L. Graham Memorial Hospital after an illness of some 18 months.

The services were directed by the Rev. Jerden Davis, minister of the church. Special music was the singing of The Lord's Prayer by Lloyd London, neighbor and long-time friend.

Burial followed in the family lot at Oakwood Cemetery with Holly-Rhine Funeral Home in charge of arrangements. A capacity crowd attended the service, bespeaking the esteem of the community.

Mr. Wright was the son of the late Forrest D. Wright and the late Elizabeth Butts Wright, and he was born Nov. 2, 1924, in Cisco. He attended the public schools in Cisco. He attended Texas A&M University and was graduated from Southern Methodist University with bachelor's and law degrees.

Mr. Wright served in the U.S. Army during WWII, including a tour of duty in the European theater. He was a member and past commander of the John William Butts Post 123 of the American Legion. The Cisco post was named for an uncle who lost his life in WWI.

A third generation Cisco attorney, following his father and his late grandfather, Judge J.J. Butts, Bill Wright had served for some 28 years as Cisco city attorney. His son, W. B. Wright, Jr., joined the law firm in 1975 and is carrying on as the fourth generation in the offices.

Mr. Wright was married to Polly McDaniel on Feb. 8, 1947, in Cisco. He was active in church and community affairs since beginning his business life. He was a member of the First United Methodist Church and was past chairman of the administrative board. At the time of his death, he was serving as chairman of the board of trustees.

He had been a member of the Cisco Rotary Club for some 28 years and was a past president. He was a past president of the Cisco Chamber of Commerce, was a long time member of the Cisco Country Club and of county and state bar associations. He served as a member of the first Graham Hospital board.

Honors and awards accorded Mr. Wright included a plaque presented for unselfish service in 1972 by the Texas Council of Soil Conservation Services. In 1973, the regional Upper Leon Soil Conservation

Service presented Mr. Wright a similar award. He was honored for participating in the Great Plains Soil Conservation program for 10 years.

Mr. Wright owned a cattle ranch and devoted considerable time and energy to soil and range conservation practices. In 1974, he was presented the Community Service Award by the Chamber of Commerce.

The City Hall was closed during Mr. Wright's funeral Monday afternoon and the city hall flag was to fly at half mast all week in his honor.

Surviving Mr. Wright are his wife, Polly, of Cisco; his son and family, William B. Jr., Sherry Wright and their daughters, Ann Marie and Rebecca Lea; his daughter and family, Ann and Gary Meyer and son Kevin Lee, Dallas; an aunt, Mary Jane Butts, Cisco.

City Council Orders Election To Be April 7th

The Cisco City Council, at the regular meeting of February 13th, ordered an election to be held April 7th at the Corral Room for the election of Councilmember Places II and III both for three year terms. Doug Fry was appointed by the Council to serve as election judge.

Deadline for candidates to file applications for the election is March 7th at City Hall.

March 8th is the last day of registration by voters not registered in the County. March 19th is the first day for absentee voting by personal appearance and April 3rd the last day.

Cisco City Council Hears Audit Report Tuesday Night

The Cisco City Council heard the 1977-78 Audit Report by Certified Public Accountant Charles Clark at Tuesday night's regular council meeting. He discussed the audit report and made a number of recommendations for the city to use in the future.

One of the most interesting parts of the audit concerned the combined statement of revenue and expenditures. In this section, the excess revenues over expenditures total was \$157,215.38 (According to City Manager John Boland, last year this figure showed a deficit.) This year's total was broken down into its separate funds as follows: general fund -- \$32,603.96; water and sewer fund -- \$75,527.49; revenue sharing fund--\$46,080.61; and industrial building fund --\$3,003.32.

City Engineer Billy Jacobs was present to give the council two estimates to pave, curb and gutter Front Street from Bullard Street to the Interstate 20 access road. The first estimate for a "hot-mix" surface was \$102,545 while the other

estimate was \$97,148 for a "double course penetration" surface. Council member Louise Allison made a motion that the city proceed with the paving of Front Street in accordance with the City Engineer's recommendations. Council member Lucy Collier seconded the motion with council member Raymond Whitley and Mayor Hugh (Chief) Brown voting in its favor. Council members Dick Ward, LeeRoy Witzsche and Morgan Fleming were absent from the meeting.

City Manager Boland gave his report for the month of January which included the following items: the 1979 Youth Conservation Corp program has been applied for; a work-session is to be held in the future between council members and a representative of the Texas Aeronautics Commission (TAC) concerning the airport development project; he has received complaints of unequalization of taxes and thinks tax rolls should be checked to make taxes as equal as possible; and some of the recommendations by CPA Clark concerning the audit, are now being implemented.

A lengthy discussion by council members was held concerning whether the city should purchase a new sanitation truck or a used one. The general consensus of those present seemed to be that a back-up truck is needed as soon as possible and, since a new truck was not budgeted for this year, a good used truck might be purchased with plans for a new truck next year.

Council member Allison made a motion that the city advertise for bids for an used sanitation truck. Council member Whitley seconded the motion with all members voting in its favor.

Council member Allison made a motion that the city pursue the 1979 HUD Block Grant Program for the filtration plant. Council member Whitley seconded the motion and the members present voted in its favor.

The council unanimously voted for a motion made by council member Collier to accept the 1979 Municipal Election Order, appoint

Stenholm Praises Child Care Center

The Cisco Child Care Center was described as a real credit to local initiative by Congressman Charles Stenholm in a talk at the new facility's formal opening here last Sunday afternoon. Several hundred area residents called during the open house hours.

Mr. Stenholm noted that the new center was built and financed entirely by Cisco area citizens without the help of state or federal financing. This, he added, "is a real example of Americanism at its very best."

"The people of this community have every right to be very proud of this center," Mr. Stenholm said. "It's value to the community cannot be measured in dollars and cents. It is a

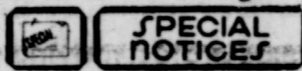
service institution." The Child Care Center plant has a book value of some \$41,000 and only about \$4,000 remains to be raised before it is fully paid for. It is fully licensed by the state and complies with all regulations set by both state and federal governments.

The child care program began here in 1969 when the First Baptist Church built a facility. As the operation grew, the community began helping with finances. When the facility could no longer meet the demand for its services, the former church building was obtained and extensively remodeled through bank financing.

Various churches and civic organizations, working under a committee headed by E.A. Sherwood, retired First Christian Church minister, directed a campaign to finance and build the new facility. A total of 68 children can be cared for in the center. The maximum number to date has been 50. The facility is centrally heated and cooled and is modern in all respects.

The center organization includes Lee Roy Witzsche, president; Jay Maples, vice president; Louise Cooper, secretary; and Pat Isbell, treasurer. Gertrude Besselaar is the center director and her staff includes Fay Clak, Revis Gregg, Francis Hitt, Marie Ivie, Faye Jett, Georgia McEachern, Shirley Ritchie and Lorene Sublett.

The center's board of directors represents local churches and civic organizations, including the following Lions Club, C.B. Dill and Jack Kennedy; Cisco Service Club, Pennie Fields and Joy Worley; First Baptist Church, John and Ann Boland; First Christian Church, Jay Maples and Hattie Weathers; First Presbyterian Church, Joyce Ferguson; First United Methodist Church, Louise Cooper and Pat Isbell; Redeemer Lutheran Church, Murl Stroebel and Lee Roy Witzsche; and E.A. Sherwood, director at large.
