Local Voters To Go To Polls Saturday Estimated 60 To 70 Interested Citizens Attend "Beautify Cisco" Meeting

Open From 7 To 7 At Corral Room

Local voters will go to polls on Saturday, April 7, at the Corral Room, 400 Avenue D, in Cisco to decide the outcome of three local elections. The polls will be open for eligible voters from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., with Doug Fry serving as election judge. In order to be eligible to vote in this election, a voter must have been registered in the county by March 8.

In Saturday's election, two of six people will be elected to the City Council, two of three persons will be elected to the Cisco Hospital District Directors and two of four persons will be elected to the Cisco Independent School District board of trustees.

Tuesday, April 3, was the last day for absentee voting in the elections and by 1:30 in the afternoon of that day, 12 persons had voted absentee in the School District election and 11 had voted in both the City and

Hospital District elections. The City election will be to elect two persons to fill the three-year terms of Council members III and IV. Those places are presently occupied by Dick Ward and LeeRoy Witzsche, neither of which filed for re-election. Candidates for those places are as follows: Place III - Lonnie Grady, Tex Underwood and Willard Lee Johnson; Place IV - Ealy Black, Stephen Wheeler and William J. Eudy.

Two persons will be elected as directors for the Cisco Hospital District from the following candidates: Armo Chambers, Danny Schaefer and incumbent, Jay Richardson. The two places are for two year terms. Incumbent Olin O. Odorn

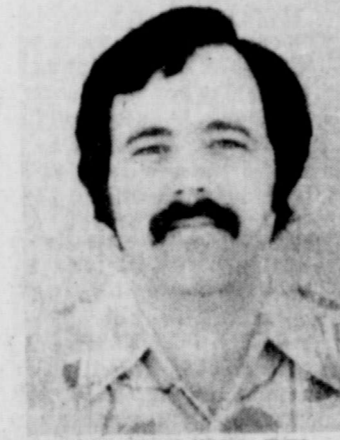

what has been done in their city and awards are presented to those which have the best achievements during the past year.

He also suggested that a number of state and federal grants be looked into for possible monetary aid in such a project. He mentioned that someone should contact the West Central Texas Council of Governments and get some information on a Community Development Grant.

Dick Woolley, president of the Cisco Chamber of Commerce, also spoke to those present on several topics of concern. Among those topics were a better tax equalization program, possible support of the local airport project from the National Guard and, he brought those present up to date on the Hilton project of renovating the Mobley Hotel in Cisco.

He said future dates of interest on the project were: April 23, the city has been promised a set of drawings on the project; May 5, the budget for the project will be presented to the Hilton family for approval; in November, bids will be let; in early December, bids will be awarded; and no later than December 24, the project will be started. He stated the biggest wick of the Hilton family is that the meeting rooms in the finished project will be used by everyone. He encouraged everyone to support the project.

Gene Abbott, Chamber of Commerce manager, added that on May 25, there will be a city-wide meeting of the whole community and Hilton representatives. The meeting will be to show the "whole package and see how (Cisco) likes it."

Betty McGinness, president of the Cisco Civic League and Joyce Schaefer, president of the Cisco Service Club, presided over the meeting. Mrs. McGinness stated that another meeting will be set up next week to form a committee of area club representatives, and any interested citizen, in order to get the project

started. She stated she was glad for such a great turnout at Monday's meeting.
