Extension Service Hosts Luncheon For Commissioners

Members of the Eastland County Extension Service office hosted the County Commissioners and other guests to a holiday lunch last Monday at Reddy Room of the Texas Electric office in Eastland.

Those present from the Commissioners Court included County Judge Scott Bailey, Secretary Jean White, and County Commissioners Richard Robinson, Norman Christian, L.T. Owen and Billy Bacon. Other

guests were County Auditor Ray Pruitt, County Clerk JoAnn Johnson, and news media personnel Maybelle Trout and Viola Payne. County Agents DeMarquis Gordon, Janet Thomas, Crystal Wilbanks and Extension

Secretary Brenda Dabbs greeted the guests. The room was decorated in red and green, with the buffet table centered with a large candle flanked with poinsettias.

A delicious meal of smoked turkey, beef, a salad, iced cranberry squares and all the other trimmings was served. Each of the ladies from the Extension Service brought special dishes.

After the lunch DeMarquis Gordon expressed the appreciation of the Extension Staff for the interest and co-operation of the County Commissioners and other courthouse personnel during 1987. He said that it was a pleasure to work with the people of this county.

Gordon and County Agent Janet Thomas took turns demonstrating the new office computer and printer, which will be used to compile and dispense many types of records and information.

The Agents said this machine will be a great help in various areas of their work, including such things as budget planning programs and communicating with the large 4-H membership.

Put Together A Good Christmas Party

By taking some practical steps you can put together a holiday party that won't leave your friends regretting what they ate and drank the night before, says a Texas A&M University Extension nutritionist.

"People often try to eat light and avoid the obvious hazards of drinking and driving, but don't want to make an issue of it at a party," says Dr. Alice Hunt.

"Having an appropriate assortment of party foods and beverages allows guests to avoid the hangover or bad feelings about overeating that may follow the next day."

Hunt, who is a specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, offers these suggestions to party-givers:

•Offer plenty of high protein and carbohydrate foods like cheese, meats, raw vegetables and crackers. These foods stay in the stomach longer, which slows the rate at which the body

absorbs alcohol. •Be more concerned about keeping the plates filled than the glasses. When guests nibble on food, it tends to slow the amount of alcohol they consume.

•For friends who are dieting, offer plenty of attractive lower-calorie foods, such as vegetable sticks and dip, fresh fruit cubes and lean meats. Guests who eat little or nothing and drink alcohol are more likely to become intoxicated.

•Serve a variety of appealing non-alcoholic beverages if you also serve alcohol. Don't draw attention to non-alcoholic drinkers by, for example, serving wine and mixed drinks in glasses, while serving soft drinks in cans.

•Use a jigger or a self-measuring one-ounce bottle spout at the bar to mix drinks. You're not doing your guests any favor by mixing doubles, since the average person can only process about one ounce of alcohol per hour.

•If you're serving alcoholic punch, use a non-carbonated base such as fruit juice. When carbonated beverages are used as a base, the alcohol is absorbed faster.

•Close the bar and bring out dessert about two hours before the party is over. Serving coffee is a good idea, but remember that it doesn't do anything to clear alcohol from the body; only time can do that.

•If a guest is not sober by the end of the party, make sure he or she is driven home by someone who is, or arrange for the person to spend the night," advises Hunt.

Public Utility Commission Grants

Brazos Electric Rate Reduction

Public Utility Commission has approved an interim order granting Brazos Electric Power Cooperative a \$10 million temporary rate reduction. Final approval will be considered by the Commission Jan. 20, 1988.


Brazos' wholesale customers will begin receiving the benefits of this reduction with bills for December usage. Consumers generally should see a reduction of about \$7.50 for each 1000 kilowatt hours used during the four-month period. The decreased rates will be in effect through March 1988.

"Passing our savings to our consumers is an important part of the mission of electric cooperatives," stated Richard E. McCaskill, executive vice president and general manager of Brazos. "In fact, we enjoy doing it," he said. In 1977, the cooperative returned more than \$1 million to its consumers through a temporary rate reduction. The Cooperative requested

the reduction in a petition filed Nov. 17. Earlier, it filed a petition to lower its fixed fuel factor. Interim approval of that request is giving consumers an additional reduc-

tion of about \$2.80 for every 1000 kilowatt hours used.

With headquarters in Waco, Brazos Electric Power provides wholesale power to Comanche County Electric Co-Op and 19 other member distribution cooperatives and 7 municipal customers. These wholesale customers serve 229,000 consumers in 66 counties of Texas.

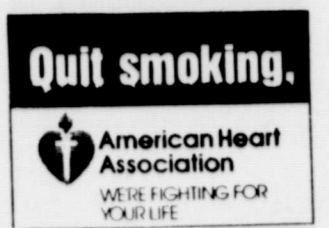
