Old Clock Being Replaced By New

The old clock located in front of the First National Bank in Cisco was being torn down Wednesday to make way for a new digital-display clock. The new clock, which will display both time and temperature, should be in place by the end of this week, or the first part of next week.

Bank president, Dick Woolley, stated the old clock is being removed because it is hard to get maintenance service for the clock and parts are hard to find. He explained the clock is serviced by Clinton Clock Company of Illinois and there are only about 13 such clocks in existence in the south.

He stated, "We regret having to take the old clock down, but due to the circumstances involved, we feel it is the proper thing to do." He went on to say, "We think the new clock will be a nice addition to the downtown area."

Mr. Woolley also said the clock is considered a collector's item and he assures the public that it is not gone forever. Plans call for the clock to be re-erected in a prominent place at a later date, with an announcement to be made at that time. In the meantime, it will be stored for safe-

keeping. The old clock has been looked to as a central time-piece by downtown merchants and local citizens for the opening and closing of local stores, since it was placed in front of the bank

following its purchase in the 1930's. It was purchased by bank president, Charles A. Spears, at that time for the Cisco bank from a bank in Chicago. After being shipped to Cisco from Chicago, the clock was stored for some time in the building now known as Mott's, located at the corner of Avenue D and Eighth Street. The building was an ice cream parlor then owned by Sterling Drumwright. Mr. Drumwright is now president of Sunland Life Insurance Company.

The new digital-display clock will require a hole eight foot deep and will sit atop a cement pedestal above the ground. This clock will be located more to the south of the location of the old clock. Work on the clock will be handled by persons representing the clock company, plus local contractors, according to Mr. Woolley.

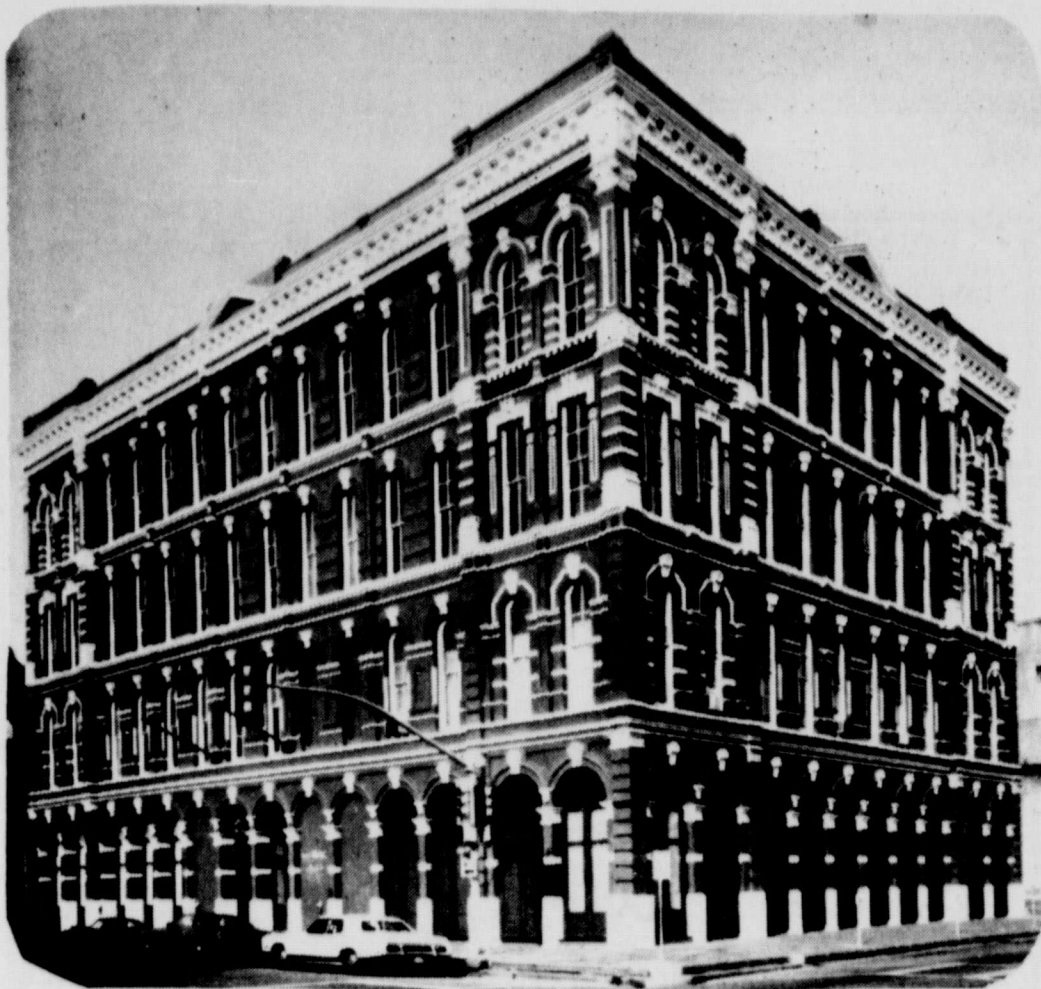

Stewart Title Gets Honor

The Stewart Title Co. of Galveston, today was given national recognition for its restoration of the 1882 Stewart Building in the historic Strand area of Galveston, and buildings in other cities.

The corporation was chosen by the National Trust for its Preservation to receive the Gordon Gray Award for achievement in preservation, James Biddle, president of the Trust, announced today.

The award was to be presented during ceremonies at the Renwick Gallery, the Smithsonian Institution's museum of crafts and decorative arts in Washington, D. C. The national awards ceremony is a highlight of National Historic Preservation Week, which ends Saturday.

The award was given for the authentic exterior restoration and sensitive rehabilitation of the first floor of the four-story building.

Stewart Title was founded in 1896 and bought the former Kaufman-Runge building as its headquarters in 1905. Completed in 1882

according to the design of Texas architect Eugene Heiner in a neo-Renaissance style, it was the tallest building on the island to survive from the 19th century.

Stewart Title has occupied the building continuously since then, even though its home office is now in Houston.

The 1976 restoration included the reconstruction of a missing cornice. The owners have provided for perpetual preservation of the exterior facade.

Stewart Title has aided preservation in many other ways. In 1969 it installed gas lamps in The Strand area, and it has promoted restoration of other Strand buildings and the establishment of The Strand national Historic Landmark District.

The company has set up offices in other buildings it has restored in the past three years. It restored an 1890 row house at 924 Pennsylvania Ave., S. E., in the Capitol Hill

neighborhood of Washington D.C.; an 1870's saloon and later drug store and paint store in Johnson County, Texas; an 1897 Victorian "capreter Gothic" flat in San Francisco; a 150-to 200 year old cottage in Freehold, N. J.; the 1882 house of Mayor James Arthur in Fort Collins, Colo; and a 19th century building in Denton, Texas.

The company carries the preservation message to many audiences. It holds social events, management meetings and seminars at historic houses and other buildings, commissions original art works of historic sites sponsors speakers on preservation topics, collects and shows slides about preservation to employees and invited groups, publishes pictures of historic sites on its annual arts calendar and corporate annual reports and features the role of preservation in the economy in its marketing publications.

The firm's president, Stewart Morris, and his wife, Joella, are committed to preservation and have served as directors of several local preservation groups in Galveston.

The Gordon Gray Award is given annually for outstanding achievement in the preservation, restoration and interpretation of sites, buildings, architecture, districts, and objects of historical or cultural significance by an individual or organization not necessarily professionally engaged in the field of preservation. It is named for the second chairman of the National Trust.

The award consists of a silver-plated goblet, reproduced from the original ordered from London in 1777 by Justice Benjamin Chew.

That original is in the collection at Cliveden, Chew's country house in Philadelphia, now a house museum owned by the National Trust and open to the public daily.

A total of 16 individuals, organizations and corporations were honored at the awards ceremony.

The National Trust presents the awards as part of its mission to promote historic preservation in the United States. It is an educational and charitable organization chartered by Congress to help Americans preserve sites, buildings and objects of national significance or interest.

After the morning tour the group will be in Stephenville for lunch.

After lunch there will be a one hour program on pecan insect and disease control at the Research and Extension Center in Stephenville.

National Transportation Week

The Texas Research League says the Texas Highway Dept. might well be the pattern in planning all state employment and expenditures for the next decade - and the Eastland County division could easily be the pattern to be followed.

The beginning of National Transportation Week, May 13-19, might be the time for such a look.

Three major highway projects are underway in the county - and it would seem that never have "fewer done more."

Resident Engineer R.P. (Buddy) Haun and six staffers move fast to keep up with the projects spread over the county. (L.L. McCullough, Harley Fox, L.C. Brown, Gene Townsend, Norman Owen and Tommy Edwards comprise the engineering staff.)

The biggest project and one that will be a welcome to all will be the completion of the ten mile stretch from Romney to Rising Star - the pet project of Rising Star's Mr. A.D. Jenkins. It's about three-fourths finished, and due to be completed in August--assuming good weather. Abilene Paving Co. has the contract and job will bring the highway up to standards now enjoyed in the strip from Romney north to Cisco.

One of the most unusual projects, and an engineering

marvel, is the raising, yes raising, by about three feet, of two overpasses over Int. 20 east of Ranger. J.H. Strian and Sons has the contract and they're using a hydraulic six-jack system to raise the overpasses at Highway 16 at Tudor Road.

The approaches will have to be rebuilt once the bridges are raised. This segment was one of the early Int. 20 portions, and re-topping and re-coating has raised the road level too close to the clearances and over the years there've been several trailer-truck blows struck to the overpass beams.

The other major project consists of three different jobs: pavement renovation of FM 2461 from Ranger to the Lone Cedar Crossing, and of FM 2214 from FM 571 to Desdemona; and the new paving of 2.3 miles south of Lake Leon to Kokomo, finishing that line-up. Pioneer Construction is handling these jobs on one contract and has cleared right-of-way for the new work. The jobs are due to be completed by early September.

Later this month bids will be let for re-surfacing of State 36 across the southwest part of Eastland County, and additional work on 36 will be let later this year.

A report prepared by the Texas Research League sug-

gests that state policy-makers use the Department of Highways and Public Transportation as a pattern in planning employment and expenditures for the next decade. The report says the number of employees and spending in DHT comes nearer to the level justified by the growth of the state than any other agency.

The report points out that from 1970 to 1978, state employment increased by 60 percent and spending was 2.6 times higher. TRL said both employment and spending have grown faster than increases in population, cost of living, or workload would have justified. In fiscal 1970, the state spent less than \$3 billion and had positions for about 100,000 employees. Spending in 1978 totaled \$8 billion and supported over 160,000 employees slots.

According to TRL's analysis, the state population grew by 16 percent during that period, and the cost of goods and services rose by 68 percent - as measured by the Consumer Price Index. If state spending had grown only enough to cover inflation and population increases, the 1978 total would have been \$2 billion lower; and if state positions had been held to a constant per capita level, there would have been 43,000 fewer state employees.

TRL said the major functions of state government are highways, the Foundation School Program, higher education, and public assistance and custody. All of the functions, except the state highway program, would have had substantially less growth if they had

TRL also compared the growth of programs to the changes in the workload which took place from 1970 to 1978. The workload for each 10,000 residents of the state increased - from 61 to 81 million vehicle miles travelled on the highways - from 201 to 248 students in state senior colleges - from 2 to 5 students in state medical schools - from 12 to 18 in-mates in state prisons - and from 439 to 502 recipients of welfare benefits.

Workloads in other state programs dropped - from 2,165 to 1,984 students attending public schools - and from 21 to 13 clients in state mental institutions.

TRL said a limit based on the workload would also have substantially reduced most programs.

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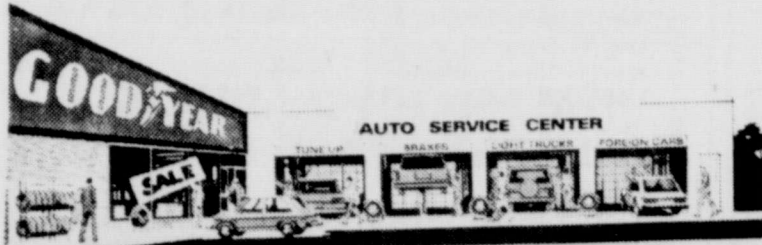

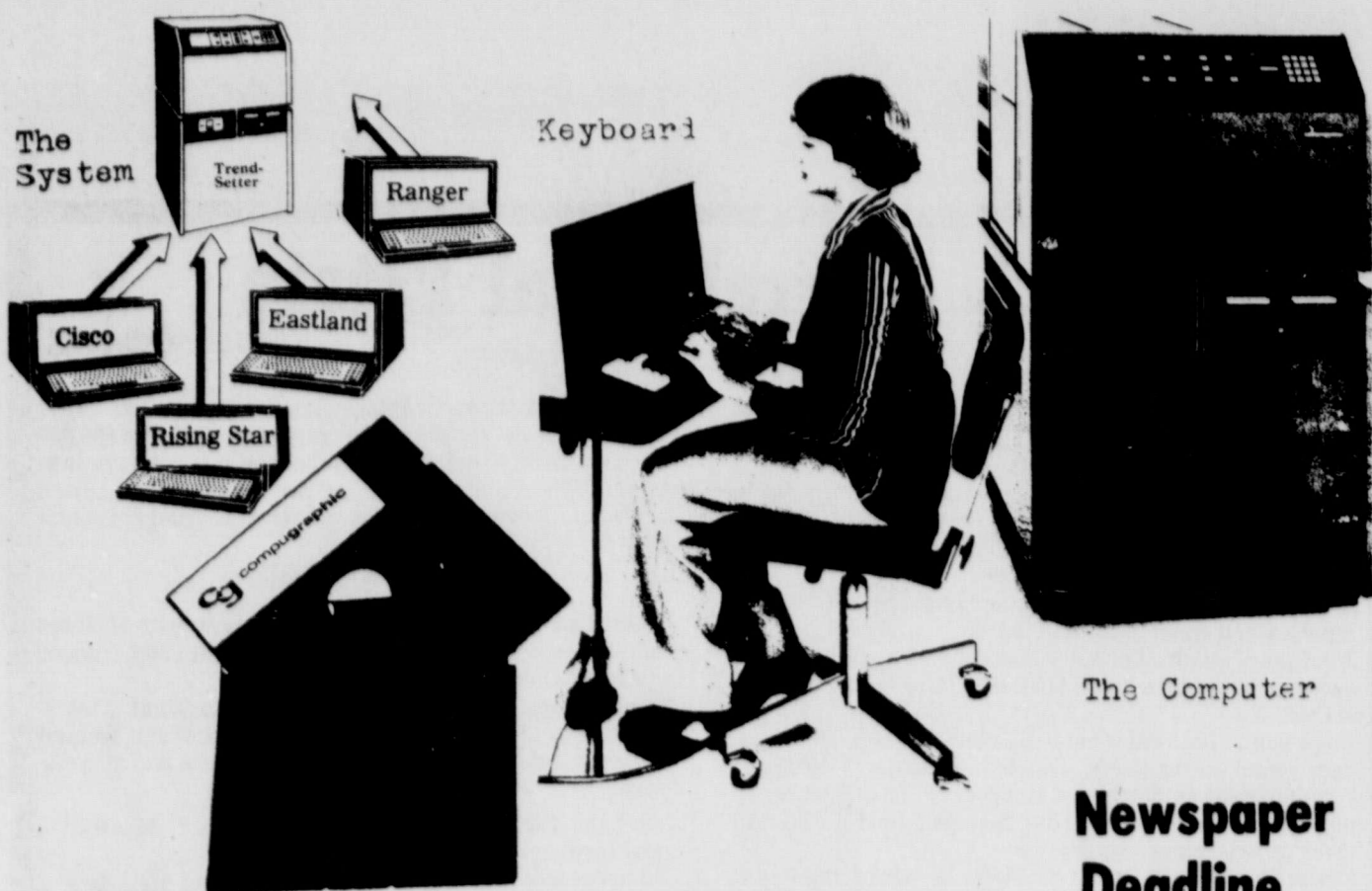

HERE'S HOW YOUR TYPE IS SET NOW: In a continuing effort to provide the latest in newspaper production, a new typesetting system has been adopted by Eastland County Newspapers. A video-screen recorder is now located in the Cisco Press, Ranger Times, Rising Star and Eastland Telegram. The data is entered onto the keyboard which is displayed on the screen, and recorded on magnetic disks (very similar to a small record). On a regular schedule these disks are delivered to the central computer where they are "played back" and the finished type comes out printed on photographic paper and in columns ready to be made up into finished newspaper pages. The system has already speeded up production and resulted in much shorter "turn-around" times for getting the papers to the various towns for delivery. The system offers eight different type faces in any one of eight different sizes. Any of these combinations are "callable" from each keyboard. Each disk contains a vast amount of data storage with 34 files on each disk. Further utilization of the system is now being planned for continued expansion.

Dorothy White And Charlene Lewis To Participate In Fair

Dorothy White of Cisco and Charlene Lewis of Abilene have been selected to participate in the Texas Fine Arts and Crafts Fair in Kerrville May 26, 27 and 28. This year 600 applicants were received and screened by the judges, and only 225 were chosen.

Mrs. White and Mrs. Lewis will display their decorated eggs. The ladies use real egg shells and these are made into beautiful works of art by the application of pearls, beads, rhinestones, gold findings etc. Doors are hinged on some when opened, display beautiful figurines or scenes. Others are colored by natural dyes such as onion skins. Jewel boxes with music make a delightful surprise for the lucky owner of one of these fine pieces. Large goose eggs open up to display another egg which revolves to a tune of your choice. Some contain three different types of eggs, all of which open to sometimes display a tiny miniature bird or duck.

The most famous

decorated eggs were those done by Peter Carl Faberge in Russia. These were intricately fashioned from gold, crystal, enamel, jewels, and other valuable materials. Tsar Alexander III asked Faberge to make the first Imperial Easter Egg as a gift of love for his Tsarina. This first egg was made in 1884, and proved so successful that Alexander put in a standing order for each year thereafter. Most of Faberge's eggs are displayed in the Armory Museum in the Kremlin and in the Virginia Museum in Richmond.

The largest egg used is the Ostrich, the smallest being the Finch. Mrs. White of

Cisco has only been doing this type of art for one year, and already does excellent work. She was prompted to try it by her partner, Charlene Lewis, who had been decorating eggs since viewing one of Carl Faberge's eggs about five years ago. When Lewis gave Mrs. White a beautiful goose egg that opened up to show an Easter bunny with a music box playing Easter Parade, that got her interested in the "art of egergy."

The two ladies displayed and sold their eggs for the first time in Abilene at the Arts and Crafts Show held in the Civic Center last November. They have been making and selling their eggs at various shows ever since. They find it very difficult to make them as fast as they sell them. "Preparing for the Texas Arts and Crafts Fair has been the most difficult thing we've ever attempted," Mrs. White said. "We sold a lot of

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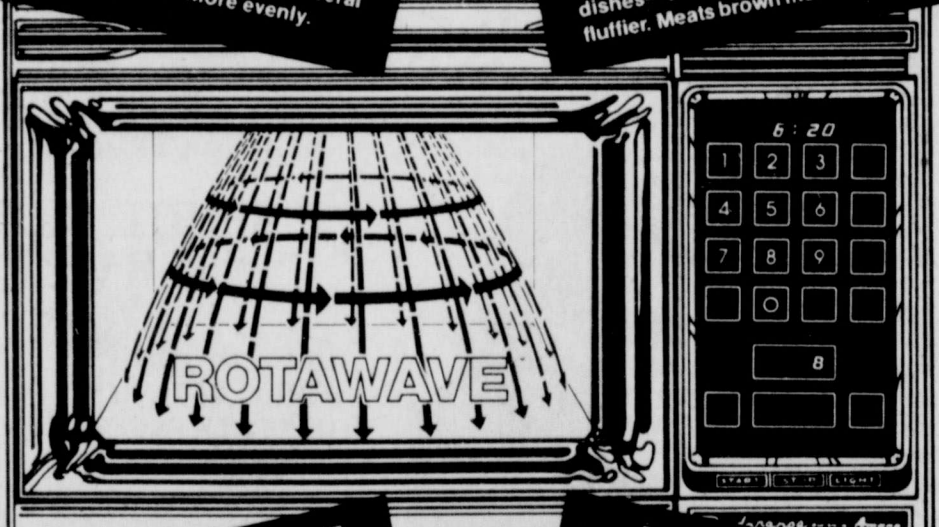
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Obituary Services Pending For Minnie Hill
