Randy And Molly McCoy Injured In Boating Accident Last Wednesday, June 24

Randy and Molly Patterson McCoy were injured in a two boat skiing accident on Hubbard Creek Lake near Breckenridge Wednesday, June 13. Mr. McCoy is listed in the intensive care unit at Hendrick Medical Center in Abilene. Mrs. McCoy is reported to undergo surgery at Hendrick Medical Center.

Mr. McCoy, 19, formerly of Cisco, reportedly sustained severe chest injuries and a broken right arm. Mrs. McCoy, 18, reportedly received a two inch laceration under her chin, a severe laceration in the back of her head and a broken left arm.

According to eyewitness Darlene Seber, the McCoy boat was pulling a skier approximately one-half mile off-shore when it was struck broadside by a boat driven by Milton Waldrep of Breckenridge. The Waldrep boat was facing the sun and was near an island that might have restricted his sight when the accident occurred, Mrs. Seber said.

Homeowners In Cisco ISD Have Until July 16 To File For New Exemption

Homeowners in the Cisco ISD have until July 16 to take advantage of new exemptions passed recently by the state legislature. All homeowners, regardless of age, are eligible for an exemption of \$5,000 from the full market value of their home.

In addition, all persons who are 65 years old or older, or under a disability for purposes of payment of disability

benefits under Federal Old Age, Survivors and Disability Insurance are also entitled to an additional exemption of \$10,000 from the market value of their residence homesteads for the purpose of school taxes.

To qualify for these exemptions for 1979, an application must be filed with the school district tax office on or before July 16, 1979. The exemptions cannot be granted for 1979 if filed after this date. The school tax office is located at 610 Avenue D. If you have any questions about the exemptions contact this office before deadline.

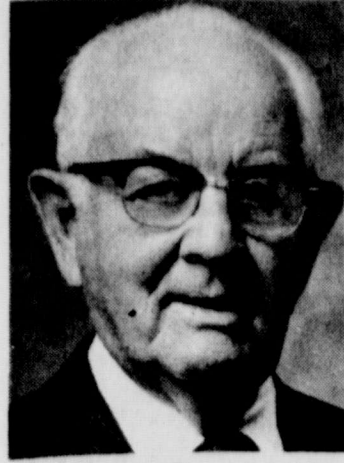

Conference In Houston



President Spencer W. Kimball of the Church of Christ of Latter-day Saints, will come to Houston June 23-24 to preside over a gathering of an anticipated 7,000 members of the Church from all over Texas.

This Area Conference, The first of its kind in the continental United States, will be held in the Summit sports arena at Greenway Plaza. It will be the first of eleven such conferences to be held throughout the world during 1979. Other conferences are scheduled for Madison, Wisconsin; Washington, D.C.; Atlanta, Georgia; Ann Arbor, Michigan; Toronto, Ontario; Auckland and Wellington, New Zealand; and Melbourne, Adelaide and Sydney Australia.

General Conferences of the Church are held twice each year in Salt Lake City but Area Conferences have been instituted in recent years to enable the general Church leaders to meet with the local membership of the rapidly growing Church without expecting them to travel to Salt Lake City. The first such Area Conference was held in Manchester, England in 1971 and the first in the United States was conducted in Honolulu, Hawaii in the summer of 1978.

Others have been held in Argentina, Brazil, Uruguay and South Africa.

President Kimball who has led the 4.2 million member Church since December 1973, will be accompanied by his counselors, President N. Eldon Tanner and President Marion G. Romney. Other general authorities of the Church who will attend are: Ezra Taft Benson, President of the Quorum of Twelve Apostles and a former Secretary of agriculture in the Eisenhower administration, Elders Dean L. Larson and Burton Howard of the First Quorum of the Seventy and Barbara B. Smith, President of the women's Relief Society.

The two day conference will be conducted in four sessions. The first, Saturday at 4 p.m. will be for all women 12 years of age or older. The second session, scheduled for 7 p.m. Saturday, will be for all members of the priesthood groups. On Sunday there will be general sessions for everyone at 10 a.m. and at 2 p.m.

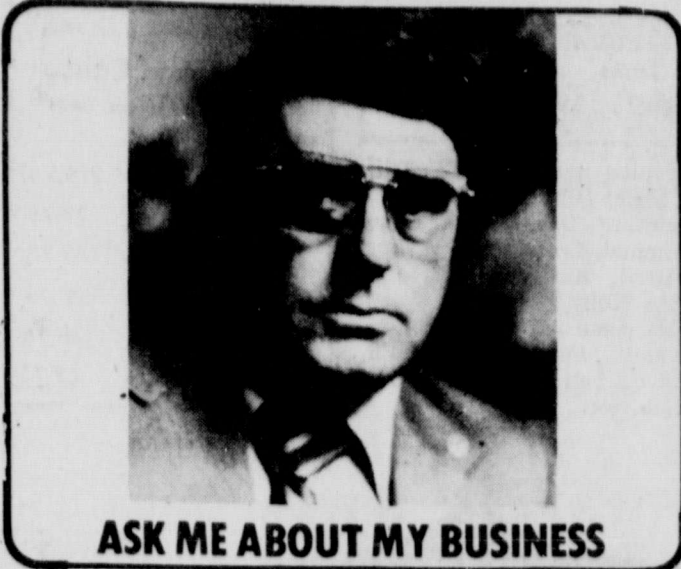

Congressional Comment

Washington, D.C. — A considerable amount of attention is being given these days to the growing dissatisfaction many citizens are having over high taxes and excessive government spending. People in Washington are finally beginning to reassess the will of the American people. Are the people most concerned about high taxes, excessive government spending, or waste? I believe they are telling us that they are not getting their money's worth for the taxes they pay. When workers get their paychecks every month and see the large income and Social Security tax withheld, they are wondering where and why it all goes — Good question.

One of the areas of greatest concern to the taxpayer is our growing social services programs. Next year the government will spend over \$300 billion on these projects. Much of this money goes for worthwhile services such as health

care for those truly in need, income maintenance for the disabled, and services for the needy elderly. But a considerable portion of this money goes for programs that do not in any way increase the assets of America or provide gainful employment for those out of work. Often money is given to people who can and are supporting themselves. And one of the most costly side effects is the almost complete destruction of the work incentive for some of the poor on welfare. Why should anyone work if his or her income is already provided for? Government handouts too often stifle a worker's motivation to produce.

Last week the Agriculture Committee proposed to lift the spending cap on the Food Stamp Program and thus increase costs by over \$1 billion. In 1964 when the Food Stamp Act was adopted there appeared little question that the intent was to assist the legitimately needy of America

in meeting their nutritional needs, particularly the children. This goal has grown out of proportion and the working taxpayer is now being asked to support too many people who are either voluntarily unemployed or who can and should be supporting themselves. In 1967 there were 1.5 million recipients, but 18.5 million people are currently enrolled in the program. The food stamp program is now out of control with one out of every four persons eligible for assistance and it is growing by leaps and bounds. The answer is not to spend more money, but to reform the system. We need to eliminate food stamps for strikers and college students. The eligible income levels should be lowered to make sure food stamps go only to those who are truly in need.

Certainly I realize that the government has to provide for those people who are physically unable to care for themselves — we are our brother's keeper. But the state has no obligation to support those individuals who can work, but don't. It is time to

put people back to productive labor earning a living and not permit the government to rob a person of his dignity by giving him a handout. Only then will we control inflation and help all of the people.

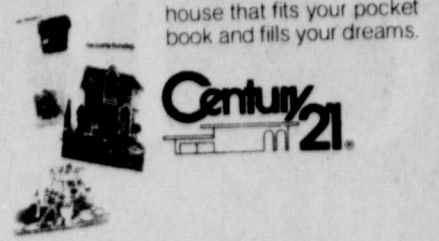

AUSTIN—How do you go about selecting a new appliance? If you're like most Texas consumers, you may never even have thought about it. You're likely to make a hurried decision in such cases if a major item like a kitchen stove or a refrigerator goes out.

You may even buy the first brand you see, at the first store you visit, under these circumstances. Of course, you will be least likely to get the

best product at the best price for your needs in such a case.

The best way to select an appliance is to think about what you need and want from it and write those attributes down. Are you most concerned about reliability and lack of service problems? Or is it more important to you to have an appliance with very low operating costs? Maybe you are worried about size, perhaps needing one to fit an existing space. And then,

perhaps you're on a tight budget and must consider price first.

After you've analyzed your needs, you will be better able to select the style, features, size, energy requirements, and price that should be considered in making a buying decision.

Our Consumer Protection and Antitrust Division attorneys say you then should gather manufacturers' pamphlets, read ads, visit the library, or talk with several knowledgeable sales persons about the type of product you're considering.

After such study, you will be able to eliminate all but a few brands. At this point, you should do some comparison shopping at several stores to see features demonstrated, to read warranties, to compare prices.

Our lawyers urge you to ask yourself the following questions before making that

final decision, in order to save yourself possible consumer problems afterwards:

-Have you totalled the cost, and delivery, installation, and service charges before deciding whether you can

afford the appliance?

-Are you sure it will fit your space?

-Are you sure you need all the features you're buying?

-Does the appliance have a reputation for being well-

built?

-Did you choose a dealer with a good service record, one who is well-known in your community as being reliable?

-Have you read the use and care manual and warranty

Apply By July 15
For Tax Relief

The Eastland County Farm Bureau has asked taxing jurisdictions in this county to help at the new tax relief law into effect in 1979.

In a letter to elected officials of all taxing units, Roy Johnson of Desdemona, president of the local county farm organization, reminded them that this law provides for limiting tax valuation on agricultural land if the owner applies by July 15, 1979.

Mr. Johnson reminded the tax officials that the Act states: "The Legislature believes that implementation of Articles 1 and 2 of this Act is both feasible and desirable and hereby expresses its intent that all taxing units in this state implement those articles for taxes imposed for the 1979 tax year unless it is impossible to do so."

The Farm Bureau officer told each of the tax officials: "We believe that your tax office has the competence to follow this new law in 1979."

"The letter added: "If there is to be a proposed resolution or ordinance to deny this tax treatment in 1979, please let us know so that we can attend the hearing and present our views."

School district authorities were also reminded that any school districts which deny this valuation in 1979 will receive less state money.

A tax manual will be furnished by the School Tax Assessment Practices Board in late June. A training session will be offered in Austin at the University of Texas Special Events Center on June 25.

The local farm leader said that his organization was helping notify farmers and ranchers that they should apply with all their local tax offices between July 1-15. The county Farm Bureau office will have a supply of sample application forms for use in preparing the information for the official form.

Helicopter Ambulance
To Begin In Sept.

Plans for CareFlite, a new helicopter emergency ambulance program to serve a 150-mile radius of Fort Worth-Dallas, were announced at a press conference Tuesday, June 19, at D/FW Airport. The program, expected to serve approximately 100 counties in northern Texas and southern Oklahoma, is scheduled to begin operation in September.

Harris Hospital - Methodist and Methodist Hospitals of Dallas are supporting the program by offering home-base facilities and by assisting in the provision of medical personnel for the flight crews. The program will be operated by North Central Texas Services, a non-profit corporation formed to provide the service.

In many types of medical emergencies, the time spent transporting patients to appropriate medical facilities can mean the difference between life and death. The experience of helicopter ambulance services in other parts of the country indicates CareFlite will prove to be a true life saving program. CareFlite patients will be transported to the hospital of their choice, or the most appropriate medical facility offering an approved landing site and the needed specialized medical personnel.

Communications facilities for dispatching CareFlite will be located at Harris Hospital - Methodist and Methodist Hospitals of Dallas, with a central dispatching capability. The new program will also have a direct communications link to the Fort Worth and Dallas emergency ambulance services. CareFlite crews will consist of a pilot, flight nurse and in many instances a physician.

Sheriff Ronnie White Resigns

Eastland County Sheriff Ronnie White has resigned his post, citing a "lack of cooperation from the commissioners court."

White said, "All officers in the sheriff's office have worked far too many hours for far too little money." His grievance suit, filed against the commissioners for lack of personnel and funding, has "reached a stalemate" and he can no longer afford to continue it, he said.

White, who has been sheriff for 1 1/2 years, also said that after deliberating for some time, he feels his resignation is in the best interest for himself and his family. He said he wants to work at a job with regular hours so he will be able to spend more time with his family.

White's resignation, which is effective July 9, was accepted by the court without comment. White said he will make a formal statement on the matter at a later date.

Jennings Escapes Jail

James Howard Jennings, 25, of Cisco, charged with aggravated robbery, escaped from Eastland County Jail early Monday morning.

Eastland County Sheriff Ronnie White said Jennings cut through the mesh at the top of his third-floor cell, climbed through a vent to the roof of the jail, and then climbed down a drain pipe to the ground.

The vent and a board were torn out leaving a 10" by 13" hole. He also pushed a hole in a tin ceiling between the mesh and the roof with his feet.

Investigators sent out an all-points bulletin on Jennings, who was last seen about midnight Sunday. However, he was discovered missing about 4 p.m. Monday.

Jennings is 5'-7", weighs 140 lbs., has brown hair and hazel eyes, and wears glasses.

The white jail coveralls he wore were found in the vent along with a piece of his shirt.

When last seen, Jennings was wearing a ripped flowered shirt, jeans and off-white boots.

The sheriff said Jennings got the clothes "by some deception. A trustee or someone had to provide his clothes," he said.

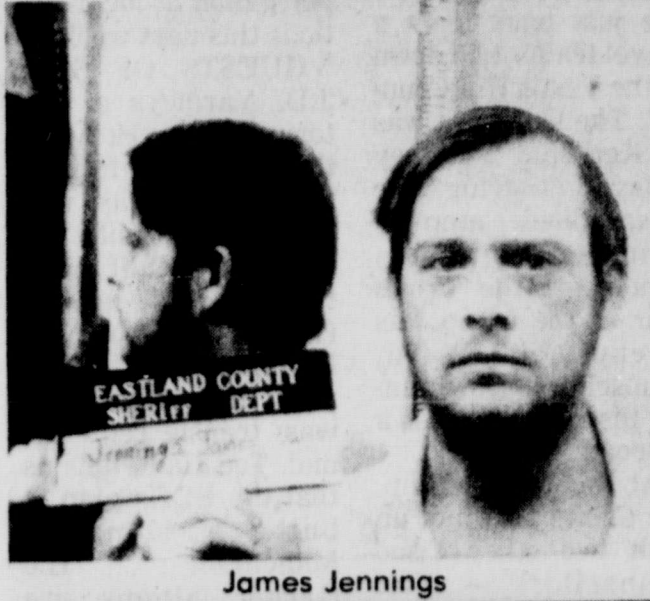
Two other prisoners in the cell, who reportedly covered for Jennings, are being questioned by investigators. Jennings and Charles Paul Sellers, also of Cisco, were both charged with the April 2 robbery of the Farrington Fina Station in Cisco. Both were in jail on \$25,000 bond.

Now also charged with felony escape, Jennings who has attempted to escape at various times, may try to reach relatives in other states.

Eight prisoners could have escaped if they had wanted to, the sheriff said.

Sheriff White pointed out that every dangerous criminal is first kept in a county jail and that it takes a number of officers to make head counts in the present jail. The new jail now under construction should solve that problem.

Other prisoners in the jail were charged with offenses including aggravated robbery, auto theft, and incest against a 10 year old daughter.
