## Paving Work On Front St. Begins This Week

Paving of Front Street from 9th Street to IH-20, a distance of some 2,500 feet, began Monday by the Pioneer Paving Company of Abilene, and city officials were hopeful that the project would be completed by the time the Cisco Public Schools begin the new year on September 4.

Initially, the Pioneer company will cut some eight inches from the roadway. An eight-inch sub-grade fill then will be spread on the street before it is finished off with hot asphalt mix, City Manager John Boland reported.

The project also calls for the building of concrete curb and gutter in areas not already equipped with it. Where useable curb and gutter is now in place, the new pavement will be poured from curb to curb. Elsewhere, the pavement will be 30 feet wide - also from curb to curb.

Some 1,300 feet of West 11th Street, damaged extensive by flood waters last spring, also will be paved in the project, Mr. Boland said. The area will be on 11th Street from Avenue P to Front.

The school streets were recently given a seal coat and will connect the school area with Front Street.

The project will cost some \$67,000 and it is being financed largely from revenue sharing funds. Property owners will pay for curb and gutter work in front of their homes.

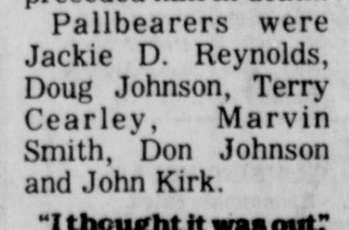
Mr. Johnson died at 9:15 p.m. Sunday at E.L. Graham Memorial Hospital after a long illness.

SUMMER BRINGS PEOPLE DANGEROUS OCEAN ANIMALS TO BEACH

Crowds of visitors to the Texas coast have an unpleasant opportunity to meet poisonous ocean animals that

also show up larger number in the summer.

The Portuguese man-of-war and varieties of jellyfish increase in summer and join stingrays as common causes

of pain and danger in shallow water or on the beach. The stingray carries its poison in its tail but touching many parts of the other two can cause stinging, burning and

red marks on the skin the Texas Medical Association (TMA) says.

Stepping on a stingray in the water or touching a dead one on the beach are the main ways people contact the dangerous tail that can wound as well as poison.

One of the best ways to avoid this shy creature is to shuffle continuously instead of stepping when walking in the water. Another method is to put the heel on the ocean bottom and swish the foot from side to side. These methods give a stingray a chance to scurry out of the way instead of lashing out with its tail if someone steps directly on its flat, almost diamond-shaped body.

Jellyfish and men-of-war are harder to avoid since they float on the water sur-

face and still are poisonous when lying dead on beaches. Even if you avoid the purplish bubble body of the man-of-war or the light-colored dome body of jellyfish, the creatures' thin tentacles floating around and below their bodies can be painful. Some of these animals can reach seven feet in diameter so they may not be easy to avoid. Most measure only a few inches but even some relatively small ones can have tentacles up to 100 feet long, according to a book called *Dangerous Plants, Snakes, Arthropods and Marine Life of Texas*.

If you run into trouble with these animals, one remedy is to use a towel or other hand protection to remove any cl-

inging body parts. Then put lots of rubbing alcohol on the skin.

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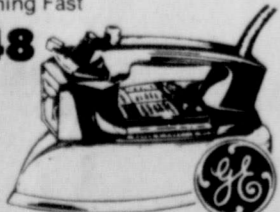

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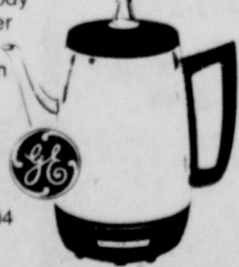

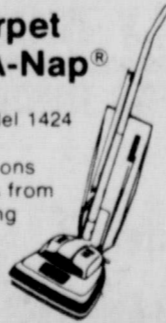

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## Hints For The Aged & Handicapped

By PATRICIA GALBREATH

DEAR PAT—Can you list any places or agencies where money might be obtained to aid a person who has become disabled?—Mrs. H.W., North Carolina.

DEAR Mrs. W.—How you became disabled can often make a difference in the places and agencies that can provide financial aid.

For example, a veteran would normally be entitled to admission to a VA Spinal Cord Injury Center. In addition to medical care, they may pay for training, education, housing and pension. Veterans should get in touch with the VA immediately

and find out what financial help they are entitled to.

If you were injured at work, you are probably eligible for workmen's compensation. To find this agency, contact your state employment office or ask the personnel director of the company where you were working when injured. Your employer may also carry insurance to protect workers who are injured on the job. If you were a member of a union when injured, talk with a union official. A number of unions have funds to help union workers.

If you had an accident in a

public vehicle or in a public building, you may be eligible for insurance benefits. If you have car or health insurance, call your agent. It's his job to help you find out what money you can get from your insurance and the insurance of anyone else involved in your accident. Your state bureau of motor vehicles may also have funds to help you.

Be sure not to sign a settlement with any insurance company until your lawyer agrees that the amount is realistic for your future needs.

If you do not have insurance and were in an accident in which another person was involved, you will need a lawyer. If you cannot afford the services of a lawyer, call Legal Aid. This free or low-cost service will provide a

lawyer to help you check all legal sources of money available to you.

Other agencies that may help include: Social Security: Ask them to check on your eligibility for benefits.

Public Aid: If you or your family receives Public Aid, call your case worker. You are eligible for money and or medical rehabilitation. Your case worker may also assist you in determining other sources of assistance.

State Division of Vocational Rehabilitation: Your

doctor or social worker can put you in touch with the local counselor.

Medical Assistance Program: Contact your local Public Aid Office.

Crippled Children's Service: You doctor or social worker can tell you how to locate the Crippled Children's Service Office.—PAT

**Meaty Cheesy Pizza**  
Yield: 9-inch pizza  
4 strips Sizzlean, cooked and cut into fourths  
8 ounce package refrigerated biscuits  
8 ounce can seasoned tomato sauce  
1/2 teaspoon leaf oregano  
1/2 cup sliced mushrooms  
1 cup shredded Mozzarella cheese

Press biscuit dough onto the bottom and sides of a 9-inch pie pan or oven-proof skillet. Bake at 400°F. for 10 to 12 minutes (or, according to package directions). Spread sauce over crust. Sprinkle with oregano, mushrooms and cheese. Top with pork breakfast strips. Return to oven and bake for about 5 minutes or until cheese is melted.

## Highway Use Tax

(City, State) - August 31, 1979, is the date by which most owners of large trucks, truck-tractors, or buses must file a Federal Highway Use Tax Return, Form 2290, the Internal Revenue Service said today.

The tax year for the Highway Use Tax begins July 1, 1979, and runs through the following June 30, 1980. Vehicles placed in service after July must have Form 2290 filed with the taxpayer's Service Center by the last day of the month following the month a vehicle is used on a highway for the first time.

According to the IRS, the tax generally applies to single unit trucks weighing 13,000 pounds or more, 2-axled truck-tractors weighing 5,500 pounds or more, 3 or more axled truck-tractors regardless of weight, trucks of 9,000 or more pounds equipped for use in combinations, and buses with a gross weight of more than 26,000 pounds.

Revenue from the Highway Use Tax program assists states in financing the Interstate Highway System, but the tax is imposed on those vehicles using any public highways, city streets, state roads and interstate roadways.

Form 2290 and the free IRS Publication 349, "Federal Highway Use Tax on Trucks, Truck-Tractors, and Buses," are available from IRS District Offices.

can be sure the finished product contains no additives, preservatives or artificial food colors. Mixing up a batch of muffins or cookies or a two-layer cake doesn't take that much time or trouble either - many can be prepared from start to finish in about an hour.

So before getting out the flour and eggs, read these tips for better baking.

Start with a recipe from a trusted source and follow it exactly.

Good equipment is as important as fresh ingredients. Use only pans that are clean, smooth and unwarped. A dent or streak of burned-on grease can cause a cake to burn, overbake or tear.

Heavy-weight bakeware which distributes the heat evenly produces the best results. Some of the newest have the benefit of non-stick "SilverStone" surfaces, making them a snap to clean with a soapy sponge and quick rinse.

Use the size pan called for in the recipe - if pan is too large, the batter won't rise and brown on top.

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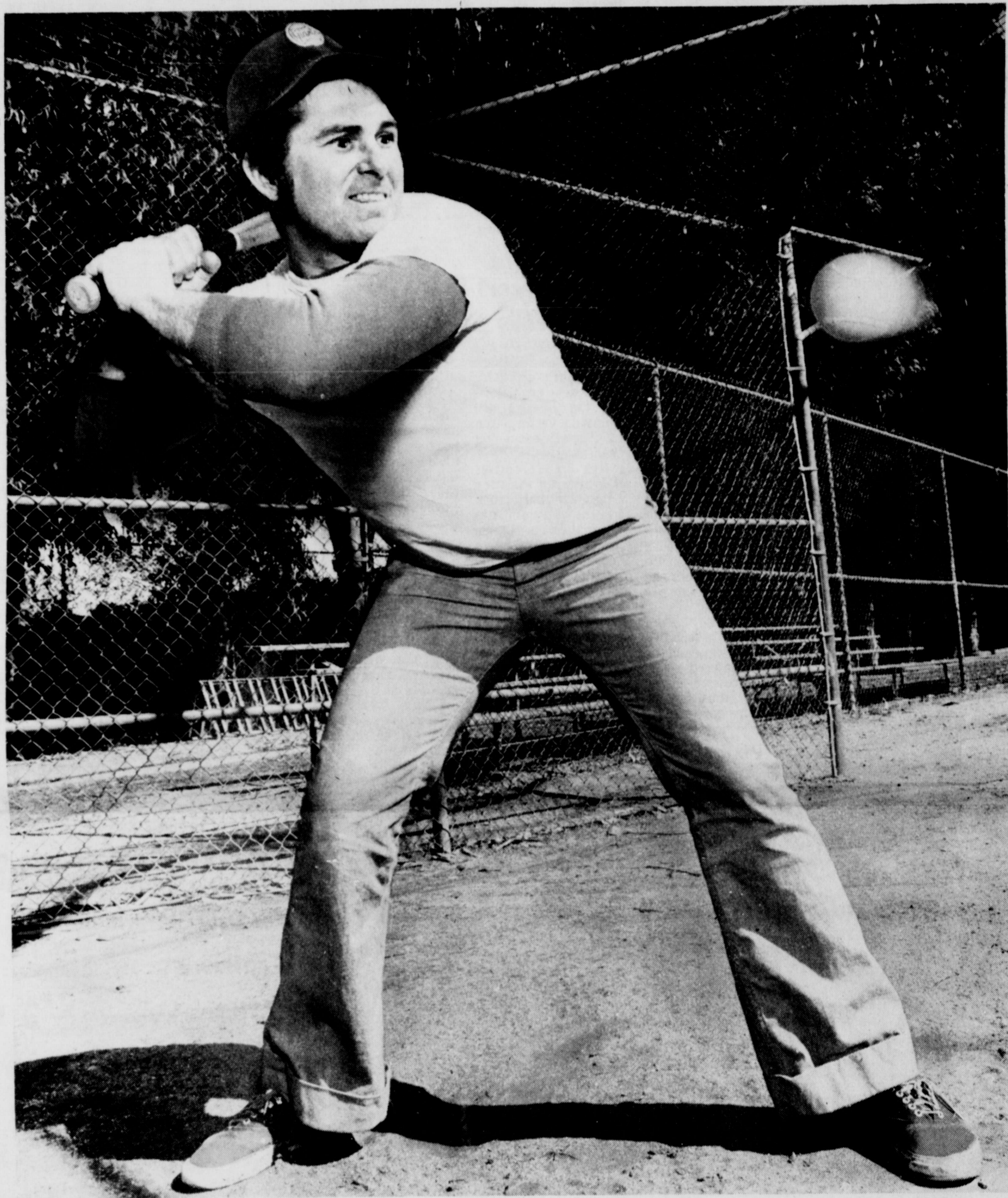
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
