The new law reads in part: "The driver of a vehicle proceeding on an access or feeder road of a controlled access highway shall yield the right of way to a vehicle entering or about to enter or leaving or about to leave the road to enter the highway."

Beginning now, everyone should be extremely careful and watchful when entering or leaving Interstate 20 and also when traveling along its frontage road, because a lot of people may not think about the new law and fail to yield.

# Hunting Prospects Excellent For 1979-80 Seasons

**AUSTIN** - With opening day of dove season less than a month away for the state's North Zone, hunters are beginning to prepare for a fall hunting season which is expected to be one of the best in years for most game species.

Officials of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department believe the 1979-80 hunting season will be especially good for pronghorn antelope, white-tailed deer, turkey, quail and possibly doves.

As always, weather conditions are the key factor in wildlife populations, and 1979 has seen some unusual weather. In general the wet spring and summer over most of the state was a big plus for wildlife.

Prospective hunters are reminded to have a current hunting license and other required items such as federal waterfowl and white-winged dove stamps. Check the department's free Guide to 1979-80 Hunting, Fishing and Trapping Regulations booklet available where hunting licenses are sold to determine regulations in all Texas counties.

**SQUIRREL**  
Prospects are excellent for squirrel hunting in East Texas, where perfect weather during the breeding season produced a good crop of both gray and fox squirrels. Squirrel populations also are expected to be up in many other parts of the state, although they are not hunted as much as those in the East Texas Pineywoods.

In most East Texas counties, the split squirrel season is May 1-31 and Oct. 1 through Jan. 15. The same dates apply to many Panhandle Counties, but across much of the rest of the state there is no closed season and no bag or possession limits.

**PRONGHORN**  
Hunters of pronghorn antelope in West Texas can expect an outstanding season, according to Charles Winkler, big game director. Aerial counts showed antelope populations in both the Trans-Pecos and Permian Basin Regions have been boosted by the best fawn crop in 10 years - an approximate 100 percent reproduction rate. Forage conditions are rated "good to excellent" throughout all the state's antelope range because of plentiful moisture, Winkler said. In addition to the good fawn crop, adult populations are 12 to 15 percent higher in the Trans-Pecos than last year, and in the Permian Basin adult numbers are about 10 percent higher than last year. In the Panhandle, reproductive success was only 20 percent, and adult populations are about the same as last year. Winkler said the low fawn survival in the Panhandle possibly resulted from coyote predation, as twice as many coyotes were observed during the antelope census than the year before. The pronghorn season is Sept. 29-Oct. 7.

**AOUDAD SHEEP**  
There will be a split season on aoudad sheep in the eight counties of the Palo Duro Canyon area, Nov. 3-16 and Jan. 5-20. The animals are hunted by permits only in Armstrong, Briscoe, Donnelly, Floyd, Hall, Motley, Randall and Swisher Counties.

Here is a general wrap-up of hunting prospects and hunting season dates for the more popular game species:

**MOURNING DOVE**  
The North Zone split mourning dove season is Sept. 1-Oct. 21 and Jan. 5-13. The South Zone seasons are Sept. 22-Nov. 4 and Jan. 5-20. However, in counties along the Rio Grande which have white-winged dove hunting, the fall segment of the South Zone will end Oct. 31. The mourning dove situation is somewhat encouraging, with a good carry-over of birds which nested and wintered in Texas during the past year, according to Jim Dunks, dove program leader. Surveys showed the breeding population to be about 10 percent over last year, and reports from states to the north indicate generally good populations. How long the migrating birds remain in Texas during the seasons will depend on the weather and available food, Dunks said.

**WHITE-WINGED DOVE**  
Despite some heavy freeze damage to the Rio Grande Valley's citrus trees during the past winter, there was an approximate 30 percent increase in the number of breeding birds in Texas this spring, Dunks said. Whether the birds will stay in Texas for the hunting season remains to be seen. Dunks said some cropland has been converted from grain to cotton in the Texas valley area, while grain crops across the river in Mexico are extensive. This may cause some of the birds to fly south before the Texas season, which will be Sept. 1-2 and 8-9.

**QUAIL**  
Over most the western half of the state, the quail season in regulatory counties is Oct. 27-Feb. 3. With some exceptions, the rest of the state has

ing the past nesting season, but there should be a good carry-over of birds from a good hatch a year ago, Gore said.

In general the flint turkey seasons coincide with the archery and gun deer seasons. A spring gobbler season also is offered in all or parts of 62 counties. In most of these counties, the season is April 12 for 16 consecutive days.

**PHEASANT**  
There are two populations of pheasants in the state - in the Panhandle and on the coastal prairies. Both areas are showing signs of a good season, Gore believes. On the coastal prairies, populations in portions of Matagorda and Wharton Counties are high enough to justify a 30-day season, Nov. 17-Dec. 16. In Jefferson and Liberty Counties the season is Nov. 3-16. The Panhandle season is Dec. 8 for 30 consecutive days.

**COUNTY TAX ASSESSING**

**Steering Group Organizes**

The next step in the formation of a Eastland County Tax Assessing Office has been taken—and progress is being toward the carefully orchestrated, state-mandated schedule.

Each of the 13 taxing entities responsible for setting up the new system was represented at a special Monday afternoon and one representative from agency served on the steering committee to "get the ball rolling."

John Nevill of the Eastland Independent School District was elected chairman of the steering committee, and Jane Long of the Rising Star ISD was elected recording secretary.

Next meeting will be held at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, Sept. 11, at the Eastland National Bank Conference Room, and each representative was admonished to return with the power from its governing body to act in behalf of that body.

Next step for the steering committee is determining if it will adopt the "three-fourths" rule (which would give the county a flexible board membership) or to stay with the five-man board.

In an un-binding poll, eight voted in favor of the three-fourths rule; two voted for five-man rule; and two abstained.

The program is being set up in compliance with recent state law to establish equal county-wide equity evaluation.

The schools, the cities and the county (by choice) have the responsibility of setting up the program, and will administer it by having representatives on the central board. Other taxing bodies (water districts, hospitals, junior colleges, etc.) will share in the costs, but will not have representation.

Next step will be to arrive at the final county tax assessing board: either the five-man board, or a board of any number under the three-fourths rule. Ideally, an attempt will be made to have the smallest possible board which will fairly represent all parts of the county.

One thought that was presented is that with the three-fourths rule, a seven-man board could be established like this: one representative from the County which 11 per cent of the total tax values; one from Cisco ISD with 19 per cent; one from Eastland ISD with 14.8; one from Ranger ISD with 15.6; one from combined cities of Eastland, Ranger and Cisco, with a total of 15.6 per cent; one from the combination of Carbon and Gorman ISD with 11.5; and one from Rising Star, city and ISD with 15 per cent.

Such a plan would give broad county-wide representation, and the setting-up expenses of the office would be shared by each based on each's per centage of the total tax values.

One established the county assessing board probably would hire professional firm to completely re-evaluate every piece of property in the county. The new valuations would be used by all taxing agencies as their rendered values.

The meeting Monday was well-attended by representatives and active members of taxing agencies from throughout the county.

mobility of the citizens of his own country, I presume our energy situation will remain dim.

So here comes another "mental vacation"--this time to an ice-clear stream called Whitewater Creek, which gurgles from the Gila Wilderness area in Southwestern New Mexico. Whitewater Creek - which actually runs more water than both forks of the Leon River in Eastland County - is a foaming, dancing stream pouring from high cliffs in the Mogollon Mountains, down to the Gila River several miles away. The Gila, in turn, veers southwest into the deserts, and finally ends in Southern Arizona.

Whitewater - four miles northeast of Glenwood, New Mexico - is narrow and boxed off by spectacular granite cliffs. Where it leaves the mountains a picnic area has been established, and the mile walk from this small valley on a walkway above the stream discloses an area of rare beauty. The "catwalk", as the walkway is called, is actually a narrow footbridge with metal railings on each side. Sometimes it plunges high above the creek, sometimes low, where sunlit dances across the crystal water. Children, especially, enjoy tripping up and down the catwalk, pausing to toss a stone into the water, or watch a trout lying motionless in some recess of the stream. The cold waters provide perpetual air-conditioning for the canyon, making it an ecological island where trees and plants from the deserts below mingle with those from the Canadian Zones in the mountains above.

The first group of human beings to visit these waters are now called simply "The Mogollon Culture". Some of these Indians built cliff dwellings in the mountains, and some built an adobe town near the Gila River. Then came the Apache, and finally the Spanish explorers. But when gold was discovered in the Mogollons, the Anglo settlers dug in to stay.

The wide valley to the south of the picnic area is full of oak trees resembling those here in Central Texas. But as the canyon narrows into the mountains, groves of huge sycamore trees are massed beside the stream. Alligator junipers, with their gray scaly bark, cluster just above the sycamores. As the creek leads higher into the mountains, leaping over rockslides and cliffs, red

cedar, pines, and finally spruce and aspen drink from the shining water. All kinds of fern, wild berries, and wildflowers decorate the shady banks. The beauty of the area has been described as "a miniature Grand Canyon, colorful and refreshing". All troubles of the outside world seem to dissolve in the joyful singing of the water.

Whitewater Creek is only one of the many beauty spots in the 2.7 million acres in the Gila National Forest. Part of this huge acreage is reserved as a Primitive Area, which can be entered only on horseback or foot. The preservation of much of this territory can be traced to the

efforts of one man - Aldo Leopold, who worked in the Forest Service in New Mexico from 1909 to 1925. In 1924, he succeeded in getting the huge Gila Wilderness area set aside, envisioning a place where a person could be dropped back into comradeship with nature.

"There are degrees and kinds of solitude", Leopold once wrote. He might also have said that there are degrees and kinds of beauty, and that all of us need a place where we can find rest for the Spirit - whether by the soothing waters of Whitewater Creek, or under a grove of undisturbed oaks in Eastland County.
