# What Is It Like To **Have Chimney Fire?**

burn the house down, it will probably wreck your the chimney will fall apart chimney and scare you half destroying one end of the

Begin with one dirty chimney--let's say a fireplace not cleaned for a couple of years. The soot lining the chimney flue is saturated with flammable stuff called creosote. (More detail on creosote is available in any dictionary.) It doesn't take much to ignite creosote-a newspaper fire sending flames up to the damper is enough.

Once kindled, creosote burns with joyous abandon. In a matter of seconds the fire spreads up through the flue creating a draft that only helps things along. At this point your average chimney fire begins to roar and howl, sending the occupants of the house running for cover.

If you run, you'll be treated to a real fireworks show. As the creosote fire builds and intensifies the heat melts the mortar between the brick. The red-hot mortar actually drips into the flue, only to be caught up in the tremendous updraft, and these little fire balls

It's no fun, If it doesnt' shoot out the chimney and onto the roof. If you're lucky, building-if you're not, this miniature volcano can bring the whole house down.

However, if you stand your ground, a chimney fire can be controlled. Put out the fire in the fireplace with an extinguisher or sand. Cover the opening with a wet blanket, call the fire department, and hope for the best. But it should be pointed out that having your chimney cleaned is a lot easier on the nerves than the sand and wet blanket method.

# **Pecan Pie Time**

Since the Texas Legislature in 1919 designate the pecan as the official state tree of Texas, pecan crops have climbed to new highs. This year, with an estimated harvest of nearly 100 million pounds, the Texas pecan crop will be the highest in the state's history. With a plentiful supply and lower costs for pecans expected in grocery stores, the Texas Department of Agriculture developed a new variation of a traditional favorite, "Texas Pecan Pie."

Share your favorite pecan pie receipt with us.

TASTES DIFFER--and we may be prejudice -- but we think our Mrs. pecan pie is the best. Gay Nell uses what we call the Modified Omar Burleson receipt. [It's from a USDA Cookbook he sent us years ago, and she adapted it to our family's taste. | We'll share it with you, and would like for you to share your favorite pecan pie receipt. Choices vary: for instance, we think chopped nuts make a better pie than do halves. Who can imagine the Christmas season in Texas without fruit cakes, cookies, candy and pecans? And who in Texas could even think of pecans without thinking of pecan pie...truly a Texas tradition.

According to pecan experts, the abundant crop has been caused by favorable moisture conditions, the absence of insects and the general good health of the trees throughout the state.

1979 Crop Largest Ever Not counting the thousands of native pecan trees that shade yards of homes, the 1979 Texas commercial pecan crop is estimated to be enormous. According to figures from the Texas Pecan Growers Association, production of pecans in Texas has increased greatly in the past 50 years. In 1919 the Texas legislature declared the pecan as the official state tree. The next year Texas produced 2 million pounds of pecans. In 1968 pecan production for Texas was 69 million pounds. During the last ten years, pecan production has ranged from a low of 12 million pounds to a high of 75 million pounds. Last year, due to poor growing conditions, the crop was 26 million pounds. The 1979 crop, estimated to exceed 100 million pounds, will be the highest in

the state's history. While the Texas pecan crop is expected to set production records, the situation is not as bright in most of the other top pecan producing states. Crops in Alabama, Mississippi, Florida and Louisiana were damaged severly by Hurricane Frederick. And Georgia, which historically has been the top pecan-growing state in the country, may loose this distinction to Texas this year.

**Pecans are Nutritious** 

The pecan is very nutritious - an excellent source of protein and carbohydrates and the oil of the pecan is one of the most highly saturated known. Like other nuts, pecans contain protein, iron, vitamins A and B, thiamine, riboflavin and niacin. And since the amount of sodium in pecans is too low to measure, they can be used to add flavor and texture to foods in low sodium diets.

Pecan Storage and Usage While pecans are harvested during the fall months, they are easily stored for yearround enjoyment. Pecans maintain freshness longer when unshelled, storing up to one year in the refrigerator, shelled, up to nine months. Pecans may be froze for as long as two years, either shelled or unshelled. For freezing, put pecans in tightly covered freezer containers or plastic bags. After thawing, pecans should be allowed to dry before using. At room temperature, unshelled pecans will stay fresh for four months.

Shelled for two months.

Unless you have lots of time, buying shelled pecans may be more practical because the valuable time required for shelling makes them worth the higher price. If you choose to shell your own, you can usually expect about 1 pound [41/2 cups] of shelled pecans from 2 pounds of unshelled. If you plan to use pecans for cooking, remember that pecan pies usually cost less than halves.

Since it's not always easy to remove perfect halves when shelling pecans you may want to try this method: Soak the unshelled pecans 6 to 8 hours in a salt solution [1/2 cup salt to 3 quarts cold water]. Then drain and crack

**County Pecan Shows** pecan shows, staged by the Texas Agriculture Extension Service of the Texas A&M University System, have played a major

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part in focusing attention on the pan. These shows, which this year will be held in 51 Texas counties from December 2-14, include pecan grading demonstrations, exhibits of pecan crafts, food exhibits and table arrangements. Your county extension agent can tell you if and when a pecan show is scheduled in your county.

Texas Pecan Week In recognition of the state's largest pecan crop ever, the week of December 2 has been declared "Texas Pecan Week" by Texas Department Agriculture Commissioner Reagan Brown. During this week attention will be focused on pecans in schools, by home economics organizations, newspapers and grocery stores where customers will find abundant supplies of pecans costing less than last year.


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#### New 1980-81 Almanac And State Industrial Guide Out

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
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
