

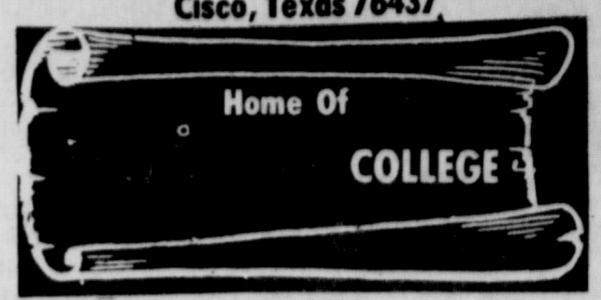

Bouts start at 7:00 p.m. each night.

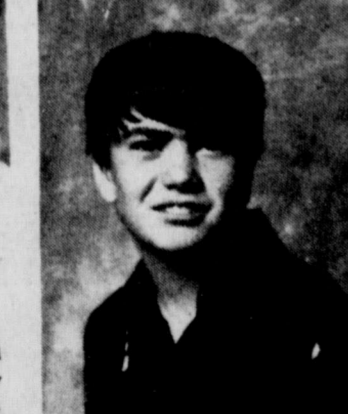

Abilene Christian University has signed its first three football players to add to its 1980 roster.

They are wide receiver Quinton Smith and defensive back Brian Vickers, both from Cisco Junior College, and running back Willie Kerley of Hutto.

Vickers is a former all-District 5-AAAA

player at Odessa Permian.

"We think they are all fine football players," ACU Coach Ted Sitton said. "Smith and Vickers will enroll at mid-term this year, and be juniors in eligibility next fall."

Vickers helped the 1977 Permian team to a 13-1 record with five interceptions and six

touchdown passes while playing defensive back and wide receiver. The 6-2, 185 pounder was also a baseball letterman.

Smith, 5-10, 166, caught 25 passes for 515 yards (20.6 yards per catch) and three touchdowns for Coach Bill Anderson at CJC. He played quarterback and tailback in high school at Lindale with all-district and all-East Texas honors. He also lettered in basketball, tennis and track.

"Kerley has real good speed," Sitton said. "Several other schools, including some in the Southwest Conference, were scouting him."

Kerley, 6-2, 190, twice ran for more than 1,000 yards and also twice has qualified for the state track meet in the sprints and spring relay. He is a three-time all-district performer in both basketball and football with a top time of 9.7 in the 100-yard dash.

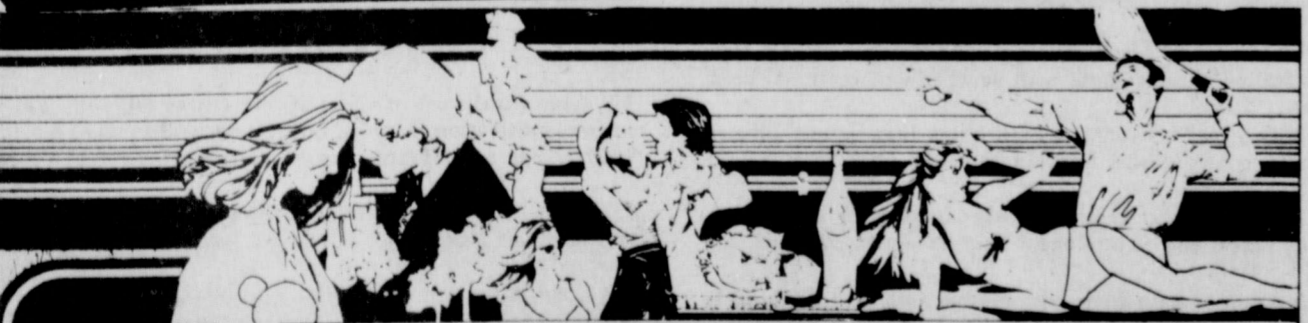

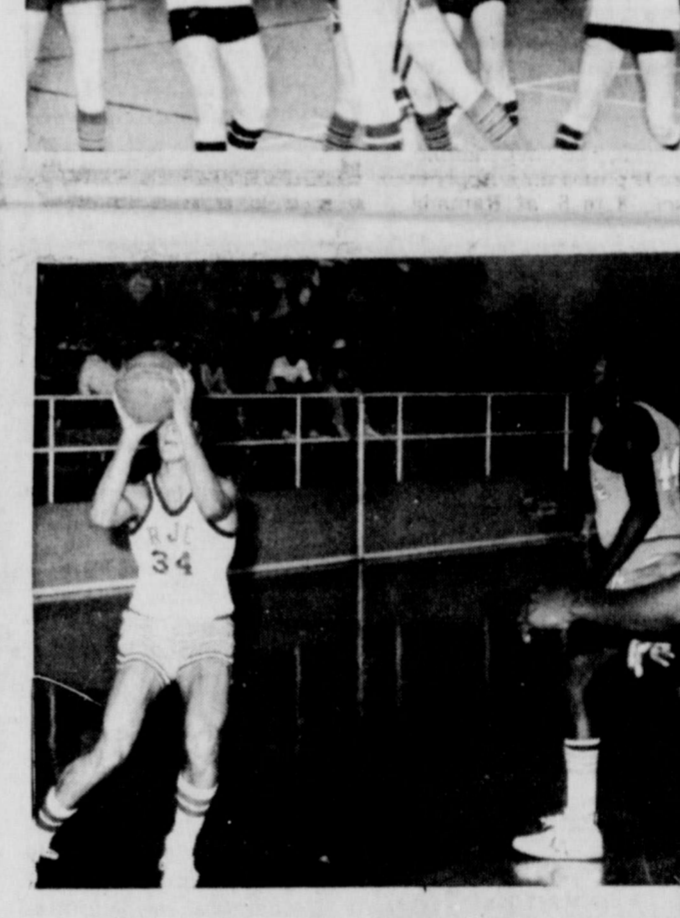
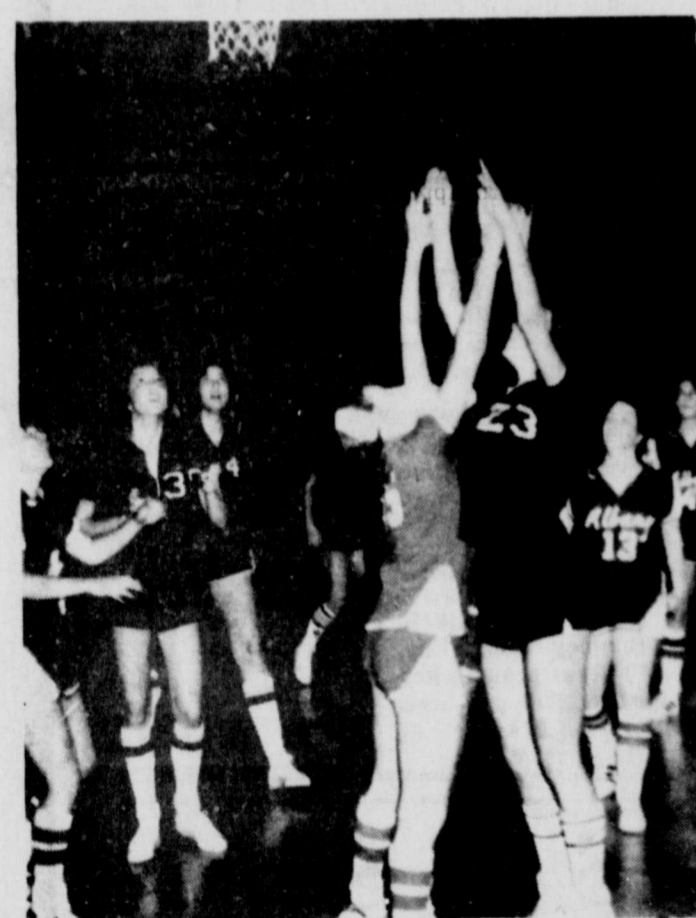

# FmHA Stresses Energy Conservation

Rural homeowners in Eastland County who need to upgrade their homes may be eligible for financing from

the Farmers Home Administration (FmHA).

Jack Phillips, FmHA County Supervisor, said that in addition to financing the purchase of homes, the Agency also has funds available to families who already own homes that need insulation/Weatherization improvements.

FmHA will offer loans for energy conservation improvements to all rural families of low or moderate incomes who cannot obtain adequate commercial credit and are otherwise eligible for FmHA loan assistance.

Mr. Phillips said that this is not a new loan program, but a part of the total loan program FmHA has had for a

number of years. However, the Agency is stressing the need to conserve energy and help families combat today's higher costs of home energy.

Improvements designed to save energy, such as installing additional insulation, storm windows and doors, caulking, and in some cases modifying heating systems will, in many cases, save more than enough to repay the loan funds borrowed for the improvement, according to Mr. Phillips.

In addition to energy conservation, repair loans may also be used to remove health and safety hazards such as repairing roofs, providing sanitary water and waste disposal systems, and

## Billions Of Dollars Ready For College Bound Pupils

Over nine billion dollars were made available last year to help students planning to enter college. Billions more are again available this year!

How does a student planning to enter college receive some of it?

First, seek out the sources of the funds. Many businesses, unions, service clubs and even churches offer money to students desiring to further their education.

Sometimes a visit to the local Chamber of Commerce will provide needed answers.

Ask your parents to check with their unions to determine if scholarships or grants are available and how they are awarded.

Many service organizations and civic clubs provide funds for full or partial scholarships to high school graduates. Consult a guidance counselor for money available in your area.

Don't forget to consider the Veterans' Administration, Social Security, vocational rehabilitation and other programs of a similar nature that provide benefits to qualified students.

Another source of financial aid is from the state and federal government. Guidance counselors should be able to supply pertinent information about these aid programs.

Colleges offer aid in various ways. Some provide

hundreds of full or partial scholarships. These may be based on academic or athletic performance or strictly on a student's need. Usually, colleges also have a work program to help students financially.

Of considerable importance is to write to various college admissions' offices early in the senior year to determine exactly what finances are available. Objective comparisons and choices can then be made.
