## Bi-Monthly Blood Drive Is Set For January 30

The third bi-monthly Cisco Blood Drive has been set for January 30, at E.L. Graham Memorial Hospital. A trained team of laboratory technicians from Mary Meek Blood Bank of Abilene will again be present from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

The joint organized project of the Cisco Civic League and the Cisco Service Club has received outstanding response from Cisco citizens and CJC students in the first two Blood Drives. A total of 69 units were donated at the September 12 drive, with another 45 units credited to Cisco from the Cisco Junior College, November 14 Blood Drive.

The January 30 Blood Drive will be the first one of 1980, and even greater participation is anticipated. It cannot be emphasized enough, that in order to maintain Cisco's adequate blood supply and repay our long-time debt, that each Cisco citizen's every effort is mandatory - either by their participation or help in "soliciting" eligible blood donors.

Up until the past two Blood Drives, Cisco has been in debt to Mary Meek Blood Bank, 900 units of blood. And though 114 units have been generously offered in only two drives, everyone must realize that a great part of that blood is used to maintain Cisco's average need of 40 pints every two months. To maintain this blood supply and repay its present debt, the Blood Drive Committee has set its goal to collect 60 pints of blood every two months.

Striving to find the most effective means of conducting a successful Blood Drive, the Blood Drive Committee will be trying several approaches in the drives. Due to some impossibilities of time scheduling every willing donor, appointment times will be made for the January 30 Blood Drive.

A blood insurance policy is available for those interested donors, whereby for a pint of blood given, that donor's immediate family will be insured for having blood available to them for one full year. That donated pint of blood, however, will not count toward credit for Cisco, but for those persons interested in the insurance policy, perhaps at a later date, the donor can donate another pint of blood for credit for Cisco.

All types of blood are needed. There are no longer paid donors, due to FDA regulations, except in the cases of institutions, using only the plasma from a pint of blood, so it therefore depends on voluntary blood donations.

Blood donors should be aware of the following when preparing to give blood:

A. All donors must be age 18 or older; there is no age limit, only that each donor is healthfully able to give blood.

B. Blood donors should eat normally, and are encouraged to do so before giving blood.

C. No medication should be taken 18 hours prior to donating blood.

D. No medication, however, should be deleted without checking with the perspective donor's own doctor.

E. Any person who has been sick or has had a cold within the last seven days prior to donating blood, should not donate blood.

F. Any person who has had their ears pierced within the last six months at any place other than a doctor's office, should not donate blood.

G. Any person who has been in Southeast Asia in the last three

years should not donate blood, due to malaria possibilities.

H. Any woman who has menstruated in the last three to four days prior to donating blood, should not donate.

I. No woman who is pregnant, or suspects she is so, should give blood, and should not do so until six weeks after pregnancy.

J. Persons can donate blood every two to three months, with no foreseen problems, although, it is hopeful to not have to call on the same donors nearly this often.

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## Stock Raisers Need To Know' About 'Beefendum'

Beef cattle producers are urged to participate in the upcoming referendum on the Federal Beef Research and Information Order, according to Roy Johnson of Desdemona, president of the Eastland County Farm Bureau.

Producers who owned cattle anytime in 1979 are eligible to vote in the 1980 "Beefendum," the farm leader said. They can register at the county Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS) office anytime between Jan. 28 and February 6.

They can vote at the ASCS office anytime between Feb. 19-22.

"The best way to determine how the majority of producers feel about this matter is for all producers to participate," Johnson said.

Details on registering and voting and on the Order itself are available at the county Farm Bureau office at Highway 80E in Eastland, he said.

"We want to remind cattlemen that it's their money at stake in the check-off vote," the county farm leader said. "A good turnout should determine whether or not beef producers want a mandatory check-off for beef research and promotion that is run by a quasi-governmental agency," he

added.

For approval of the Order, ballots must be cast by a least 50 percent of the producers registered to vote in the referendum, and a majority of those voting must favor or approve the issuance of the Order, Johnson

said.

In essence, the check-off program provides for a mandatory deduction from each sale of cattle, the farm leader said. The law permits a deduction of up to 1/2 of 1 percent from the sale price.

The deduction would be

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limited to not more than 2/10 of 1 percent for the first two years, and after that can be increased up to 1/2 of 1 percent without a referendum.

The law requires purchasers of cattle to make the deduction. Failure to comply in subject to a \$1,000 fine. The deduction would be made at each point of sale. The buyer would pay the purchase price minus the amount of the check-off to each seller of cattle. The check-off money would be paid to the administering agency at the point of slaughter.

Explaining how much money is involved, the county FB leader used a \$450 calf as an example. For the first two years, the assessment authorization would be limited to 90 cents on such a sale. After that, the assessment could go to \$2.25, he said.

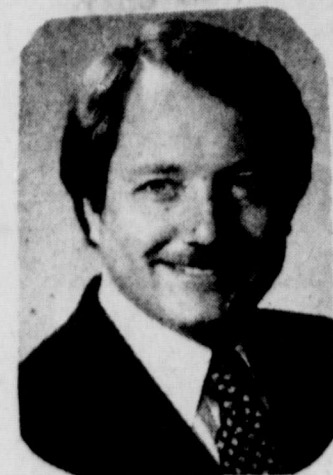
The U.S. Department of Agriculture estimates that initial collections at the 2/10 of 1 percent figure could total about \$40 million annually, and about \$100 million annually at the 1/2 of 1 percent figure.

The proposed order provides for refunds of assessments if demand is "made within 60 days after the end of the month in which the transaction occurred..." Cattle producers desiring refunds would have to keep up with their own fund deadlines and may be required to keep sale records up to eight years or more on heifers purchased and sold later as aged cows, Johnson said.

The USDA Beefendum Order proposes to establish a Beef Board (a quasi-governmental agency) composed of not more than 68 producers to administer the program. It further provides that the Secretary of Agriculture "shall appoint to the Board up to five non-voting consumer advisors deemed to be knowledgeable in nutrition and food." These advisors would be reimbursed from producer assessments, the county FB leader said.

The USDA would also be authorized to employ new employees to monitor the beef research and promotion program, and all expenses incurred by USDA, including salaries, would be paid from the cattlemen's assessment funds.

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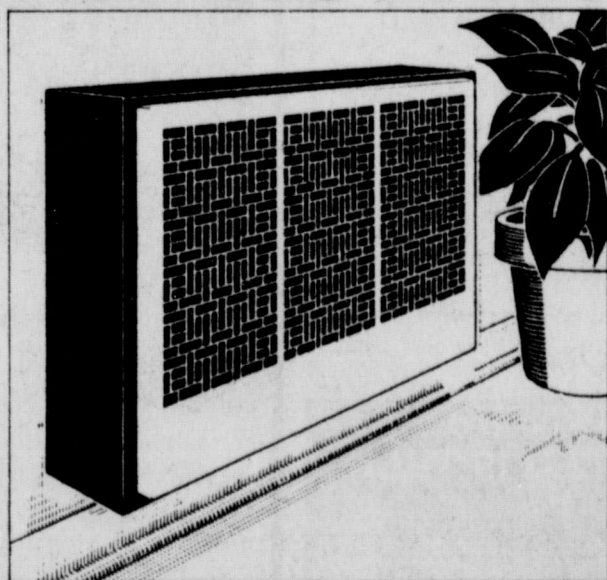
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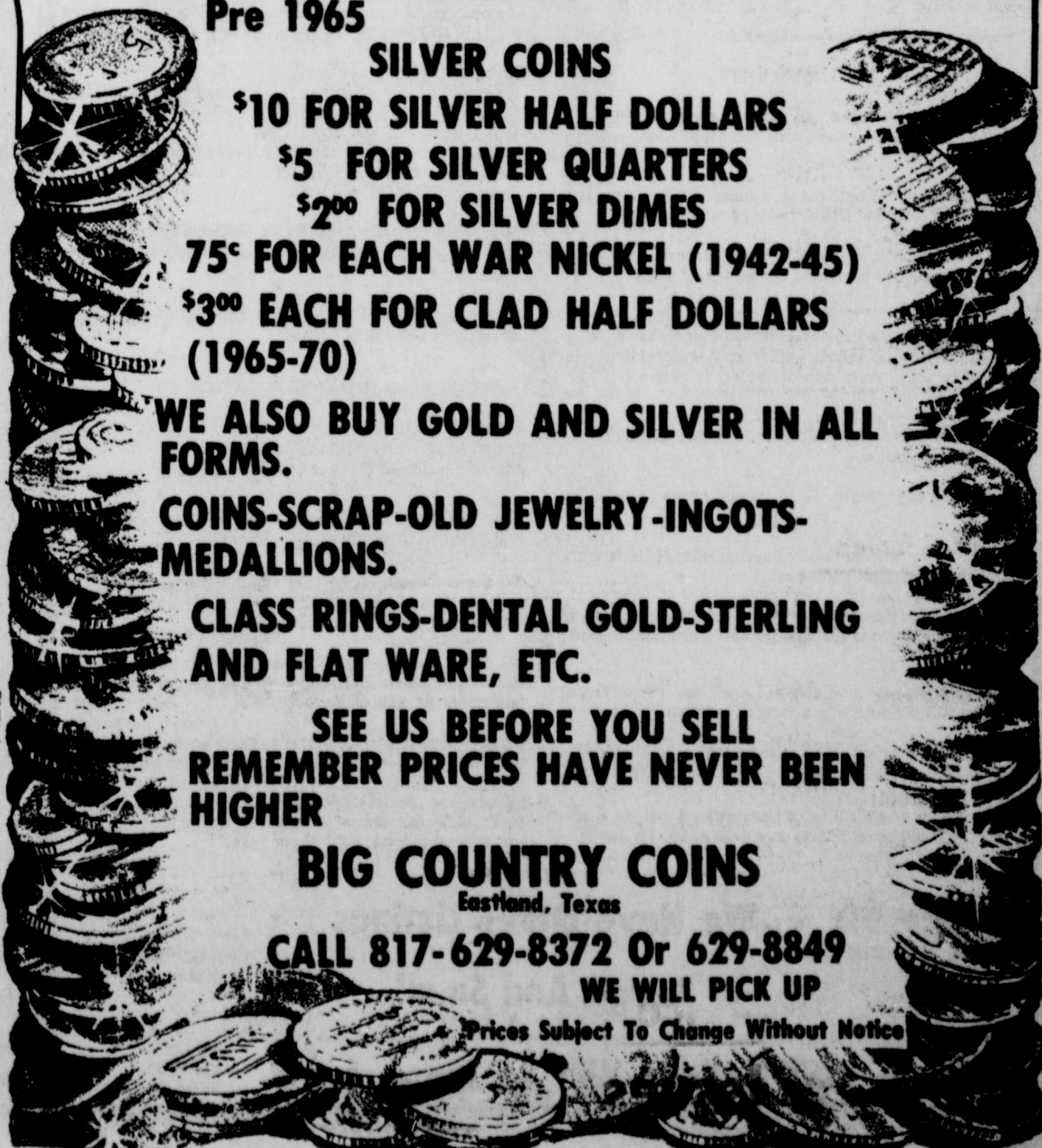
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**Greiff Family Visits From Capetown Republic Of South Africa**

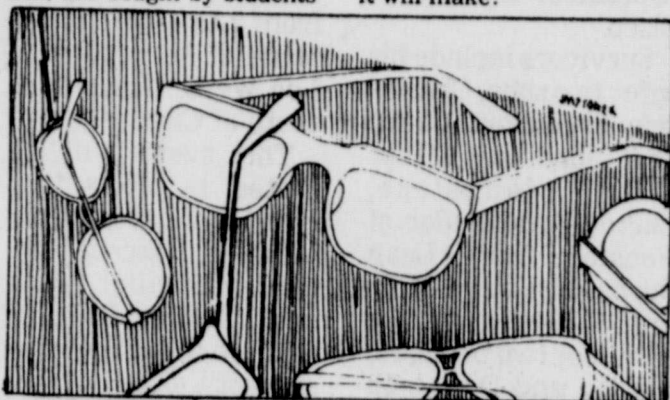

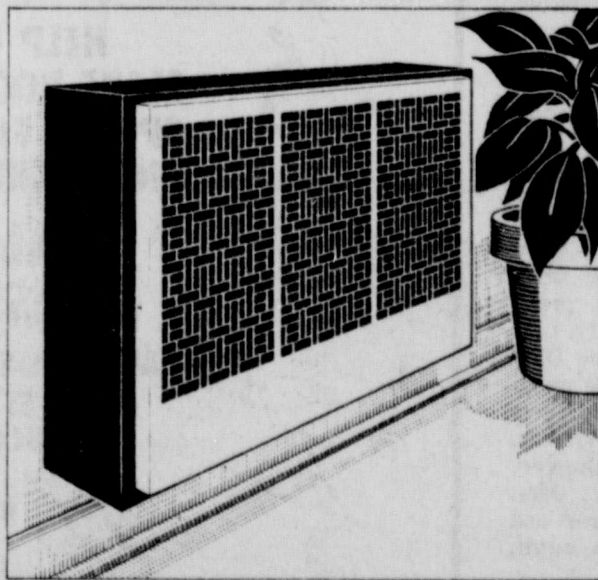
