## First United Methodist Church To Celebrate May Centennial

The First United Methodist Church of Cisco will be celebrating its centennial May 3-4, 1980.

In 1980, a Methodist circuit rider, Rev. Lamb Trimble, organized the church at Red Gap, two miles west of Cisco. Four charter members first met in the home of M.V. Mitchell, a sheep rancher. The church first began in a little log school house located where the cemetery is presently located.

When Cisco was established in 1881 at the junction of the railroads, everyone in Red Gap moved to town, including the schools, post office and churches.

In Cisco some 20 Methodists were located, and as soon as a school house was built, the congregation began meeting there.

Several years later, during the pastorate of Rev. John A. Wallace, a small church that cost around \$700, was erected on the lot where the present church building is now standing.

The church was enlarged during the pastorate of Rev. T.C. Ragsdale, but on April

28, 1893, the church and parsonage were both destroyed by the great cyclone which almost destroyed the town of Cisco. With the loss of the church and parsonage and most of the homes of the membership of the church, everybody was stunned and nothing in the history of the church illustrated more the heroism and hardihood of those pioneer members. On May 20, 1893, just 22 days after the cyclone - at the 3rd Quarterly Conference, appointed E.L. Rogers, J.M. Williamson, M.V. Mitchell, H.G. Eppler, O.H. Lovelady, C.H. Fee, and T.J. Worthington to rebuild and enlarge the church and parsonage.

In 1920 the present structure was built at a cost of more than \$100,000, and in the year 1941, there remained an unpaid debt of \$10,000 on the original cost of the building. A full scale campaign was started to raise money to retire the debt in full. Times were not very good financially at that time, and after an all member solicitation was made, about \$3,000 was raised. This

amount was submitted to the District, Board, and they decided to accept this amount and retire the debt. Bishop Ivan Lee came to Cisco and dedicated the church, at which time the note was burned.

In 1942 World War II was raging and the annual conference did not have a place to meet. The Cisco Church, under the leadership of L.W. Seymour, invited the conference to come to Cisco. The conference accepted. The pastor wanted a pipe organ for the occasion, and succeeded in getting a new member, Samuel Greer, to give money to purchase an organ which was being replaced in the Marvin Street Church in Tyler. Others contributed to the organ fund, and the organ was purchased. Today it is still in use in the church.

In 1947, Samuel Greer, the L.H. McCrea family and the G.P. Mitcham family contributed enough

money, together with the sale of the parsonage, to construct a modern, comfortable parsonage at 806 Avenue H. The parsonage has been updated since its construction and is very modern at present.

In 1949 the church installed its first air conditioning, and in 1972 installed a better system, a modern refrigerated air conditioning unit.

During the 1950s a general improvement was made to the building and furnishings, and in 1961 a memorial plan was developed to keep the beautiful stained glass memorial windows in the church repaired.

Gifts from members have helped to keep the church in a good state of repair. The banquet room was improved and paneled; new ceilings, drapes, and lighting fixtures were purchased from gifts from Mrs. W.B. Wright and Mrs. Bob Parker. A gift from S.G. Tomlinson was accepted to purchase a grand piano for use in the sanctuary; and a substantial gift was left in the will of Mr. and Mrs. Ed Huestis. The Stellar Class was responsible for carpet purchased in 1973 for the auditorium.

A historical marker has been purchased for the church, and will be dedicated following services Sunday, May 4. Former pastors and members have been invited to attend the Centennial Celebration for the church on May 3 and 4. Activities planned include registration on Saturday, an informal social period, and later a snack supper. Special music, speeches, and an informal session will follow the meal. Registration will begin at 3 p.m. and the snack supper will begin around 6. Dr. Bob Evans, a former pastor, will give the sermon on Sunday. Following the services, the historical marker will be dedicated, and a covered dish luncheon will then be served to conclude the activities.

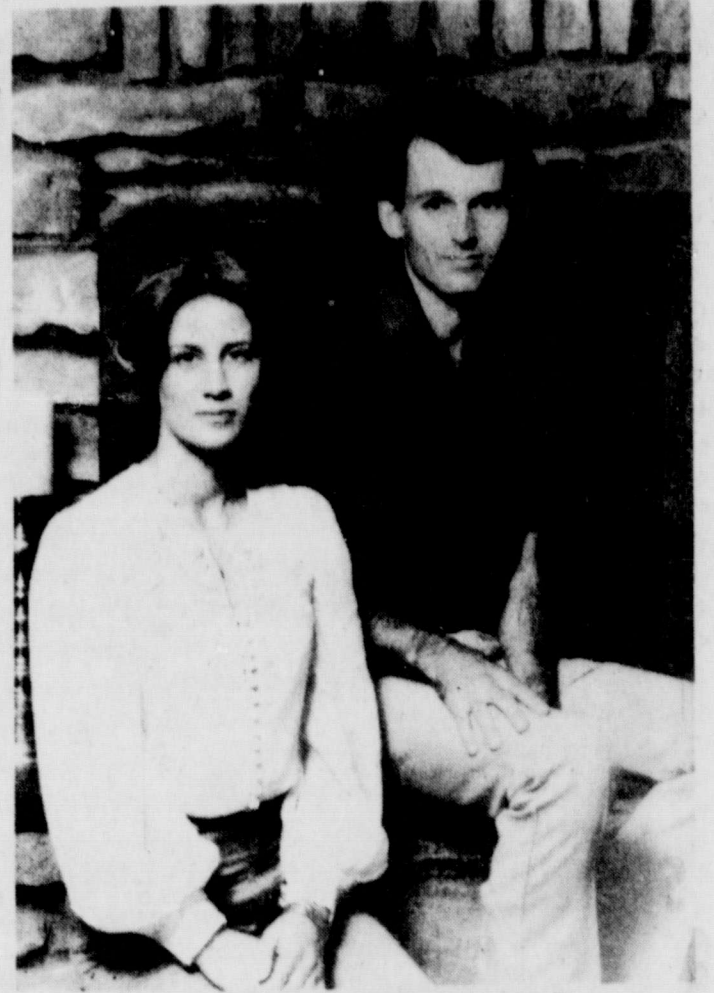

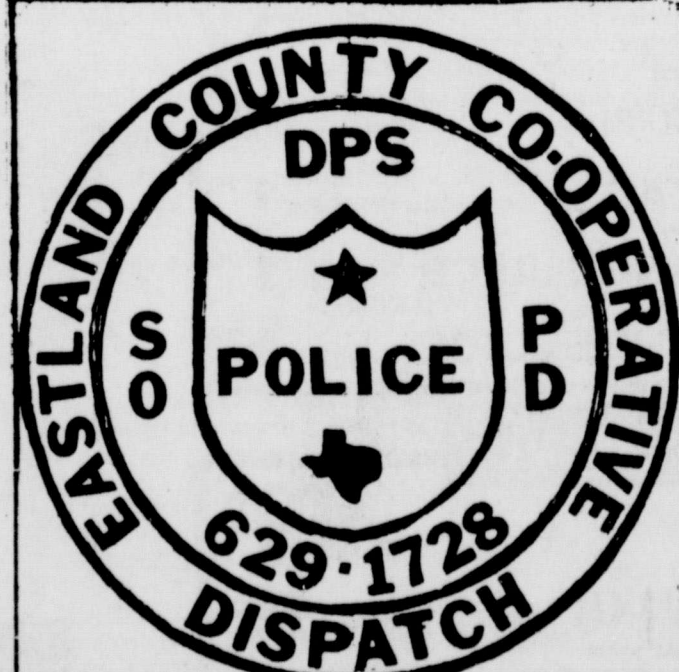

**Who's Minding The Statehouses?**  
The growth of the federal bureaucracy is a popular whipping-boy. It's been blamed by economists for inflation and by business for over-regulation bred of idleness and the provincialism that characterizes company towns like Washington. Pruning back the federal bureaucracy was a major campaign promise of the Republican most likely to oppose him next fall.

While it is arguably true that the number of federal employees and the money they cost are excessive, some recent figures from the census bureau indicate that the real problem may very well lie at the state and local levels.

Between 1972 and 1977, the number of state employees increased 18.1 percent. The number of local government employees increased 15.8 percent. By contrast, the number of federal, non-military employees was up a relatively meager 1.9 percent. Of the 15.6 million civilian government employees in 1977, federal employees numbered less than 20 percent of the total.

While public sector growth at the state and local levels have come a host of new regulations and ordinances with rival those from Washington for their fatuousness. Several weeks ago, for example, we got a call from

Herb Page, president of Mid City Stationers in Rockford, Ill. According to Page, the Illinois Compensation Labor Bureau has arbitrarily reclassified commercial stationers in that state from retailers to wholesalers. The actuarial tables say wholesaler employees run a greater risk of job injury than retail workers, and workman's compensation rates for wholesalers are accordingly higher. For Page, the reclassification meant a jump in his workmen's comp payments of 133 percent.

A unique set of circumstances permitted Page to reverse his reclassification. Other dealers in Illinois won't be as lucky. Both major trade associations have made an honest effort to develop state government relations activities, and, so far, both have achieved little in that area. Unless there's an issue so overwhelmingly unpopular in the industry - competition from the California prison system and Washington State's exclusionary buying practices come immediately to mind - efforts to forge an industry presence in the statehouses have been met with resounding apathy.

It's true that chambers of commerce and other business organizations keep an eye on the state capitals, but their constituency is diverse and their positions on issues are not necessarily in



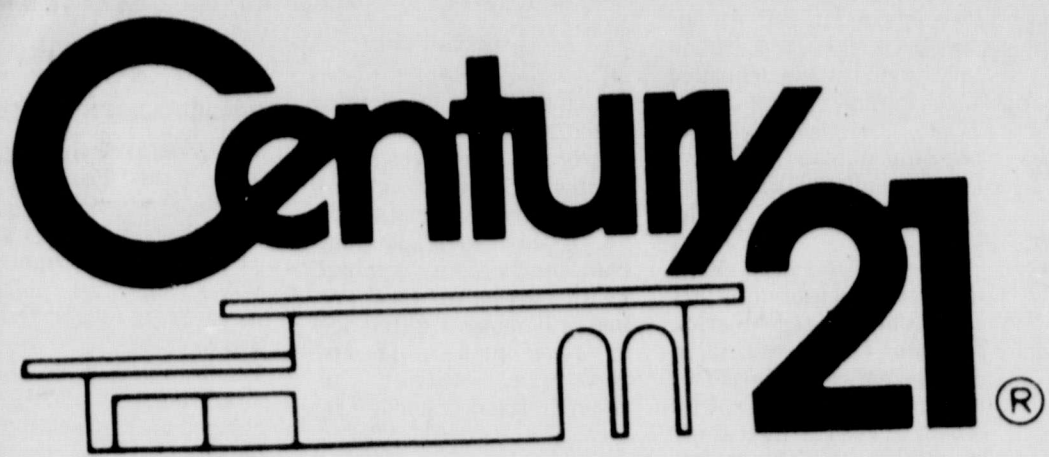

# Youths Observe 'KAB Day' April 26

Statewide efforts are being conducted by the Beautify Texas Council to encourage all youths and youth organizations in Texas to observe the upcoming "Keep

America Beautiful Day" with local cleanup and anti-litter projects of lasting effect for their communities.

"KAB Day," which is be-

ing observed nationally for the tenth consecutive year, is held annually on the fourth Saturday in April. In Texas, Governor William P. Clements, Jr., has proclaimed the fourth Saturday, April 26, as "KAB Day in Texas" and the entire month of April as "Youth Activity Month" in support of the Beautify Texas Council's efforts to involve the youth of our state as a key ingredient in its environmental improvement.

All Mayors in Texas have also been requested by the Council to proclaim April 26 as "KAB Day" in their communities - calling attention to the many cleanup projects being undertaken during April and leading up to their culmination on Saturday, April 26.

"In addition, the Council has designated a special cleanup event in Houston as the OFFICIAL KAB DAY CELEBRATION FOR THE STATE OF TEXAS," stated

George McKinney, BTC president.

The annual "Little People's Litter Party" - a spring event which has grown to involve thousands of pre-school age children in fun, anti-litter activities in Houston's Hermann Park - is being recognized this year by the Council as the state's "Official KAB Day Celebration."

The "Official" celebration will serve to highlight youth-oriented cleanups and anti-litter activities taking place around the state during the month of April and on KAB Day, explained Jack Hillman, Beautify Texas Council vice president and statewide KAB Day chairman.

"A different youth project in a different city in Texas will be chosen each year by the Council as our state's "Official" celebration," he added.

The "Little People's Litter Party" - formerly sponsored by Houston's Operation Sparkle Committee - is being offered this year as an activity of the newly-formed Houston Clean City Commission. Children bring their own decorated litter bags, are entertained with a lively anti-litter skit, and then chase gaily-costumed "little monsters" (high school students) during the two-hour party. Refreshments are provided each year by local soft drink distributors, and local garden clubs donate seedlings given as party favors for each child.

Elsewhere around the state, Girl Scouts and Boy

Scouts as well as youths of the FFA, FHA, 4-H, Junior Gardeners, Camp Fire Girls, Key Clubs and other organizations will be completing cleanup on "KAB Day" for entering in the Council's statewide "YOUTH ACTIVITY AWARDS" competition.

Their projects are wide-ranging: from distributing litter bags with each box of Girl Scout cookies, to a Boy Scout-run aluminum can collection and recycling effort, to several extensive plantings and cleanups in parks and public places.

Entries will be judged according to the lasting quality of the projects, the number of youths involved and how they worked together, and the cooperation received from the community - such as donations from business and industry, in-kind services from the city government, the publicity the project received in the local news media.

"Perhaps the most important benefit to KAB Day will be the growing awareness and caring about the attractiveness and cleaner appearance of our communities," said McKinney. "And having the youth - our leaders of tomorrow - in the forefront of these statewide efforts will bring an even more positive, lasting effect on our state."

Keep America Beautiful Inc. is the national, nonprofit, public service organization which was founded in 1953 to prevent littering and to encourage the individual to accept personal responsibility for a sound en-

vironment.

The Beautify Texas Council - founded in 1967 - is the statewide, nonprofit, voluntary organization dedicated to the similar goal "to make Texas the cleanest, most beautiful state in the nation" through individual initiative and responsibility at the local level.

The first national "KAB Day" was sponsored in 1971 as "Scouting Keep America Beautiful Day" - coinciding with the national celebration of Earth Week. In 1972, Girl Scouts of the U.S.A. teamed up with the Boy Scouts and other organizations on KAB Day, and the results achieved were outstanding: 300,000 tons of glass, steel,

aluminum and paper were reclaimed for recycling, and nearly 1.5 million tons of trash cleaned up.

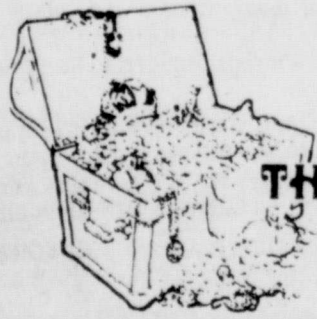

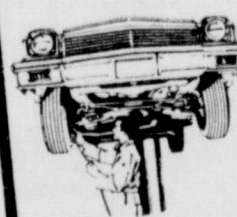

## Citizens Speak Out About Family Success

"Family Night Out" which is planned for April 29 at the Cisco High School Auditorium has everyone thinking "Family."

This unique program which is being sponsored by the Home Economics Department at Cisco High School is to consist of a spaghetti dinner in the high school cafeteria at 5:30 p.m. and a program in the school auditorium which will begin at 7:00 p.m. The program will be presented by Dr. Paul Faulkner and Dr. Tom Milholland. These gentlemen will be speaking on "Family Success" which will cover areas such as self-esteem, communication, discipline, drugs, sex education and positive attitudes.

In connection with this program CHS students have been writing papers and doing interviews on the topic of "Family Success."

The members of the Lobo Howl Staff have interviewed Dr. Norman Wallace, president of Cisco Junior College; Dr. Ayres Cermin, M.D. and Mr. Eris Ritchie of

Southwest Enterprises, Inc. Below are comments from these gentlemen concerning the importance of the family unit and the roles this unit should play in the preparation of the child's entrance into society.

When asked about the family's role in teaching sex education, Dr. Ayres Cermin had these comments to make: "Correct knowledge and understanding of human sexuality is an important part of education. Many parents do not understand or feel comfortable discussing matters pertaining to sex with their children; therefore, schools are left with this responsibility. The school in accepting this role must face the problem of finding educational materials and an instructor who has no trouble dealing with this controversial subject. One problem that the school faces is the conflict between what is taught at home and what is taught at school." Dr. Cermin, also stated, "Sex Education at home is fine if the parents, themselves,

have a good understanding of the matter and are just not teaching their children misconceptions and old-wives tales on an important subject."

Mr. Eris Ritchie made these comments concerning the family's role in teaching children positive attitudes. "Positive attitudes are very important. In order for children to develop positive attitudes, parents must create a positive-attitude environment in the family. They, parents, need to always look on the bright side of things. If parents are busy criticizing each other and others, their children will develop the same attitudes."

When asked if discipline was more important than communication, Dr. Norman Wallace responded, "Discipline is not necessary if proper communication is exercised. However, I do believe in discipline. Society has rules; so should the home."

In Dr. Wallace's opinion the generation gap is very evident today. The younger generation does not have the same set of values as older generations had. College and money aren't as important to the younger generation. Dr. Wallace also feels that families today are not as closely knit as in previous years. Dr. Wallace stated, "Survival used to be a family effort." Dr. Wallace also feels that increased automation has had an effect on the generation gap and that increased mobility causes a lack of togetherness. In previous years everyone had to travel together or be left home. Presently, each family may have two or three cars.

Dr. Wallace, when asked what he thought was the most crippling factor in the home today was, stated: "The inability to see each other's viewpoints, to compromise, and to be concerned with the welfare of others is causing the break-down of the family unit."

April 21 for the annual Texas Aggie Muster, announced chairman Jim Rominger of Breckenridge. The Muster activities will begin at 5:00 p.m. at the Pitcock Camp on Possum Kingdom Lake, according to the chairman. Rominger said the Muster is open to all former students. Texas A&M is in its "Second Century of Greatness." During the last 100 years, Texas A&M has grown from a small Land

Grant college to one of the leading research and educational institutions in the nation, Rominger reports. The Aggie Muster dates back to the mid-1880's and has been held annually since. Every Muster ceremony is the same, Rominger reported. The Texas Aggies pay their respects to all those who are absent, because of death, since the last Muster. When the names of the honored dead are called from the Muster Roll, a friend of the deceased answers, "Here." More than 350 Musters will be held around the world this year, Rominger said, "wherever Texas A&M former students live or work."

During wars, the Aggies mustered in foxholes, on the battlefield, aboard ships, in

airplanes and in medical hospitals. In World War II, a Muster was held on Corregidor shortly before the Japanese captured the island.

## Homemaking Tips

**STOP, LOOK, THINK, AND THEN SPEND** would be a good motto for each one of us during the 1980's. Continuing inflation, the threat of recession, and rising prices have influenced people to make dramatic changes in how they use their income and in their life styles. Cost for shelter, transportation, and medical expenses have increased at a much faster rate than the incomes for the average family.

To learn to cope with these changing times, families are looking for ways to increase their buying skills in the market place, and maintain their level of living, plus provide some type of financial security for the near future as well as for retirement years.

This past week, I attended a Money Matters Seminar which was sponsored by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. This in-service training seminar for County Extension Agents was excellent in that it focused on the impact of changing economic situations on family money management for the 1980's. There are three basic suggestions for families to follow if your buying power has been cut by inflation or

recession. First, change your level of living. This means learn to live with fewer goods and services. To simplify and live with fewer material things does not necessarily mean a decrease in your quality of life, but perhaps in the quantity of goods and services you possess.

Second, expand and extend your material resources by increasing your consumer skills in selecting, buying, storing, maintaining, using, repairing, conserving, and recycling.

Third, increase the resources you need for person and household use. Consider creative human production such as sewing, gardening, simple home repairs, eating your meals at home or taking a brown bag lunch, all of which will save you money. Continuing inflation and rising prices mean that the average family will need to think ahead and plan smarter ways to adjust their income. Garage sales, wholesales, white sales, second hand and hamburger a dozen different ways will become a way of life.

The Money Matters Seminar I attended stressed

having a family budget. If you have never developed a budget, then it will be more important than ever to have a budget in the '80's. Planning, planning, and more planning will be your financial key to success. You never save money if you buy on the spur of the moment. You can only save if you project ahead and anticipate. Those who feel shopping is a challenge get the most of a dollar. Others don't see it that way, and money just slips through their hands.

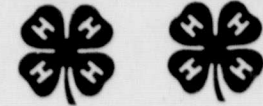
Obviously, there are no simple answers. So make your family motto for the 1980's to be STOP, LOOK, THINK, and then SPEND.

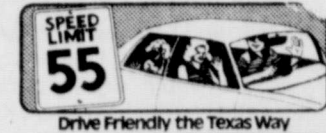

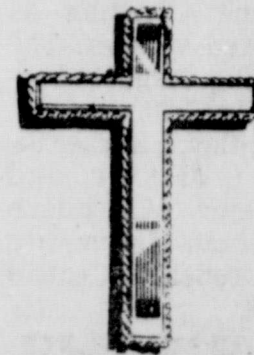
