Jam and jelly don't have to be "forbidden fruit" to people on sugar restricted diets. Just use artificial sweetener instead of sugar when making them, Mrs. Janet Thomas, County Extension Agent, suggests.

Diet jams and jellies must be refrigerated or frozen unless they are made by the long boil method. And storing them in the freezer keeps the natural color and flavor of Texas strawberries, peaches, or dewberries at peak quality. Leave at least one-half inch head space in the container before freez-

Fresh strawberry jam can be made to suit special dietary requirements. To prepare fruit or jam, sort and wash fully-ripe fruit. Remove any stems or caps. Crush the

fruit. For jams, the method of ingredients, combining varies with the form of pectin used. Powdered pectin is unheated mixed with crushed fruit, and liquid pectin is added to the cooked fruit and sweetener mixture immediately after it is

removed from the heat. Cooking time is one minute at a full boil. Full boil stage is reached when bubbles form over the entire surface of the

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# Hints For The Aged & Handicapped By PATRICIA GALBREAITH

DEAR PAT-In regard to the column several weeks ago on arthritic shoes: I would like the address of the company where these can be purchased .-- Ms. S.T.M., Alabama

DEAR MS. M.-I received a great many letters similar to yours so I would like to repeat a portion of the column I wrote on comments from the Arthritis Foundation on footwear for the arthritic individual.

"Remember that no shoe or modification corrects any adult foot problems. It merely accomodates, and hopely, relieves some of the painful areas, while improving the overall ability to function in a more normal manner. Therefore, it is recommended that all arthritics wear the softest, lowest heeled, widest shoe possible, and ..preferably an oxford. The thicker the sole, whether it be of some form of crepe rubber or leather, the more shock absorbing it it will be. If nothing else is available one or two for n insoles added to the shoe, if it is large enough to accomodate the addition, will help cushion the overall foot.

'The only other addition commonly available is a matatarsal bar, which is placed on the sole of the shoe. This can be applied by any good shoe repairman.

"It is also recommended that you consult your physician in order that he can help you select the correct shoe for your specific foot pro-

In other words-there is no place where you can purchase "arthritic" shoes. Talk with your personal physician, if he is unable to relieve your foot pain, ask him to recommend a foot specialist in your area. My very best wishes to all those who wrote seeking a specific address. Please let me hear from you if I can be of further help.-PAT
