in-law, Frank Tuerck and became the 1980 champion.

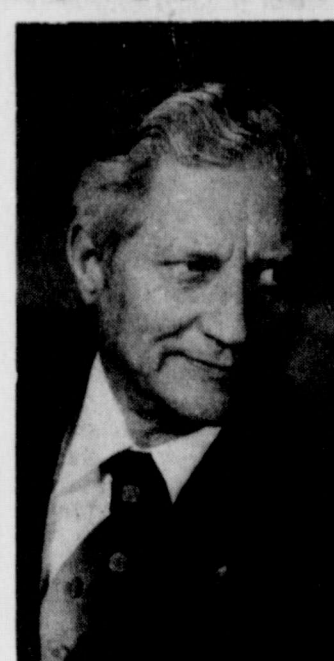

## Architects Busy On Restoration Plan

Four Houston architects on the staff of Dr. Rinaldo Petrini will be in Cisco for two to three weeks to work on plans for a proposed community historical restoration project, according to information here this week.

Dr. Petrini, head of the School of Architecture at the University of Houston, was in Cisco last Thursday and Friday in connection with the project, which he has undertaken with the Cisco Historical Association.

A noted restoration architect, Dr. Petrini also heads the unrelated Mobley Hotel Hilton Restoration project here.

Peter Bourdeaux and Phil Bologna began work on the community project early last week, and Randy Hickey and

Atanassi Vassidakidis were due to join them. They are members of the technical staff and were making photographs and studying the community.

Dr. Petrini said they are making a measured survey of Conrad Hilton Avenue, the city's main street, and this would include the side streets. A measured survey of a typical residential area will also be made.

After the survey work is finished, the architects will return to the Petrini offices to prepare drawings and plans. Catherine Worthy of Cisco, who is a member of the community project staff, was assisting the group.

Dr. Petrini said he hopes to have complete plans and recommendations for presentation to the Cisco association by mid-September.

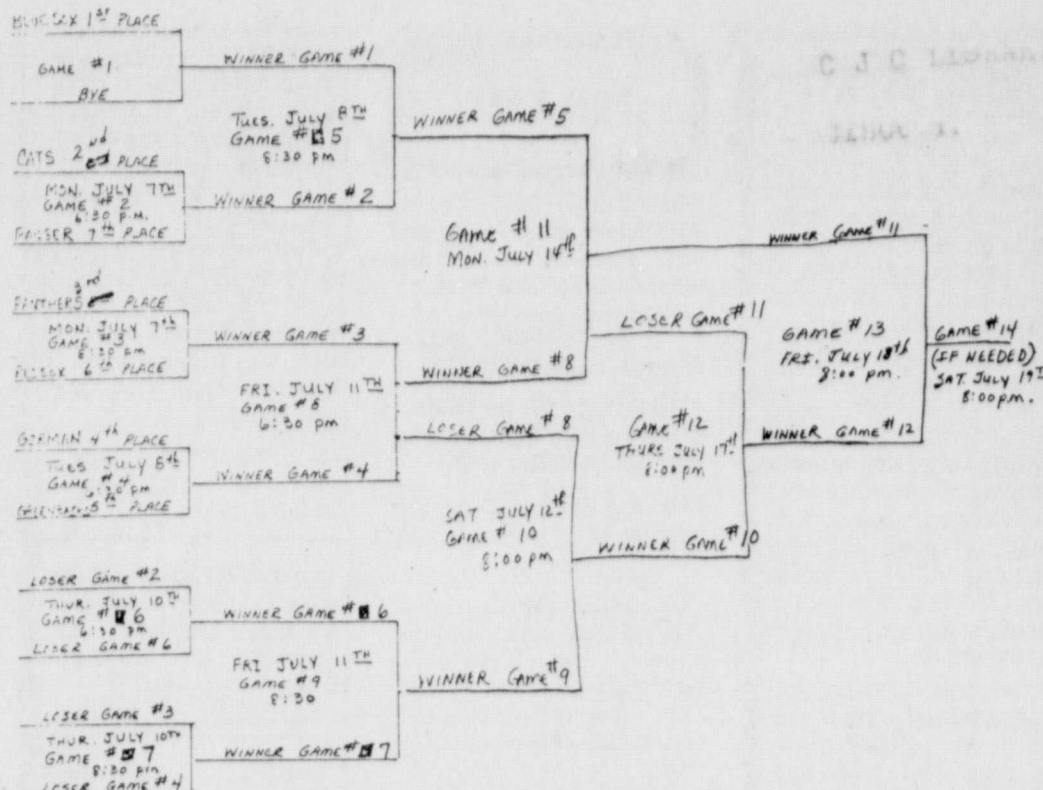

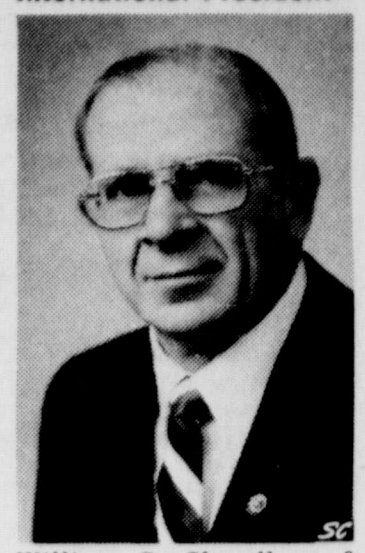

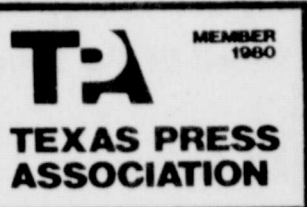

## Homemaking Tips

By Janet Thomas

Jam and jelly don't have to be "forbidden fruit" to people on sugar restricted diets. Just use artificial sweetener instead of sugar when making them, Mrs. Janet Thomas, County Extension Agent, suggests.

Diet jams and jellies must be refrigerated or frozen unless they are made by the long boil method. And storing them in the freezer keeps the natural color and flavor of Texas strawberries, peaches, or dewberries at peak quality. Leave at least one-half inch head space in the container before freezing.

Fresh strawberry jam can be made to suit special dietary requirements. To prepare fruit or jam, sort and wash fully-ripe fruit. Remove any stems or caps. Crush the fruit.

For jams, the method of combining ingredients, varies with the form of pectin used. Powdered pectin is mixed with unheated crushed fruit, and liquid pectin is added to the cooked fruit and sweetener mixture immediately after it is removed from the heat.

Cooking time is one minute at a full boil. Full boil stage is reached when bubbles form over the entire surface of the mixture.

Jams made without added pectin or gelatin require longer cooking than those with added pectin. Cook the mixture to a temperature of 221 degree F.

If making the jam without pectin or gelatin and a thermometer isn't available, just cook the product until it has thickened slightly. Allow for additional thickening as the product cools. Jams made without sugar tend to be thinner than those made with the addition of sugar. Also, when preparing jams, be sure to stir constantly to prevent scorching the fruit.

**STRAWBERRY JAM WITH PECTIN**

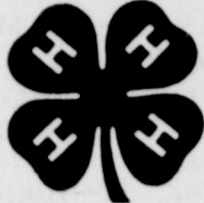
1 quart clean strawberries  
1 3/4 ounce packaged powdered fruit pectin  
red food coloring as desired  
3-4 teaspoons artificial sweetener

1 tablespoon lemon juice  
Crush the strawberries in a one and one-half quart sauce pan. Stir in artificial sweetener, food coloring, powdered pectin and lemon juice. Bring to a boil and boil for one minute. Remove from heat. Continue to stir two minutes. Pour into freezer containers, cover and freeze. Thaw before serving. Store in the refrigerator after opening. One tablespoon provides five calories.

Jams made by the long boil method require another procedure. You may follow tested recipes for jams made by a long boil method without the addition of pectin.

Cook the fruit with liquid sweetener until jam is of desired consistency. Substitute two tablespoons of liquid sweetener for each cup of sugar called for in the original recipe. Pour the boiling hot jam into clean, hot jars and seal each jar as soon as it is filled.

For making strawberry jam by the long boil method, take four cups of crushed strawberries, eight tablespoons of liquid sweetener. Measure crushed strawberries into kettle. Add sweetener and stir well. Boil rapidly, stirring constantly until the mixture thickens. Fill and seal containers. Process in a boiling water bath for five minutes. One tablespoon provides 10 calories.

**EASY PICKLING CHUNKS**  
2 pounds 4-5 inch cucumbers  
1 2/3 cups white vinegar (5 percent)  
1 cup water  
1 cup sugar  
2 tablespoons salt  
2 tablespoons mustard seed  
2 teaspoons celery seed  
1 teaspoon curry powder  
Wash cucumbers; cut 1/8-

inch slice off each end; cut into 3/4-inch chunks. Combine vinegar, water, sugar, salt, mustard seed, celery seed and curry powder in kettle. Bring to boil. Add cucumbers; heat again just to boiling. Immediately ladle into 4 hot sterilized pint jars,

filling to within 1/2 inch from the top. Close. Process in boiling water bath for 10 minutes. Start to count processing time when water returns to boiling. Remove jars. Cool overnight. Check jars for airtight seal. Makes 4 pints.

## Hints For The Aged & Handicapped

By PATRICIA GALBREATH

**DEAR PAT**—In regard to the column several weeks ago on arthritic shoes: I would like the address of the company where these can be purchased.—Ms. S.T.M., Alabama

**DEAR MS. M.**—I received a great many letters similar to yours so I would like to repeat a portion of the column I wrote on comments from the Arthritis Foundation on footwear for the arthritic individual.

"Remember that no shoe or modification corrects any adult foot problems. It merely accommodates, and hopefully, relieves some of the painful areas, while improving the overall ability to function in a more normal manner. Therefore, it is recommended that all arthritics wear the softest, lowest heeled, widest shoe possible, and...preferably an oxford. The thicker the sole, whether it be of some form of crepe rubber or leather, the more shock absorbing it will be. If nothing else is available, one or two foam insoles added to the shoe, if it is large enough to accommodate the addition, will help cushion the overall foot.

"The only other addition commonly available is a matatarsal bar, which is placed on the sole of the shoe. This can be applied by any good shoe repairman.

"It is also recommended that you consult your physician in order that he can help you select the correct shoe for your specific foot pro-

blem."

In other words—there is no place where you can purchase "arthritic" shoes. Talk with your personal physician, if he is unable to relieve your foot pain, ask him to recommend a foot specialist in your area. My very best wishes to all those who wrote seeking a specific address. Please let me hear from you if I can be of further help.—PAT

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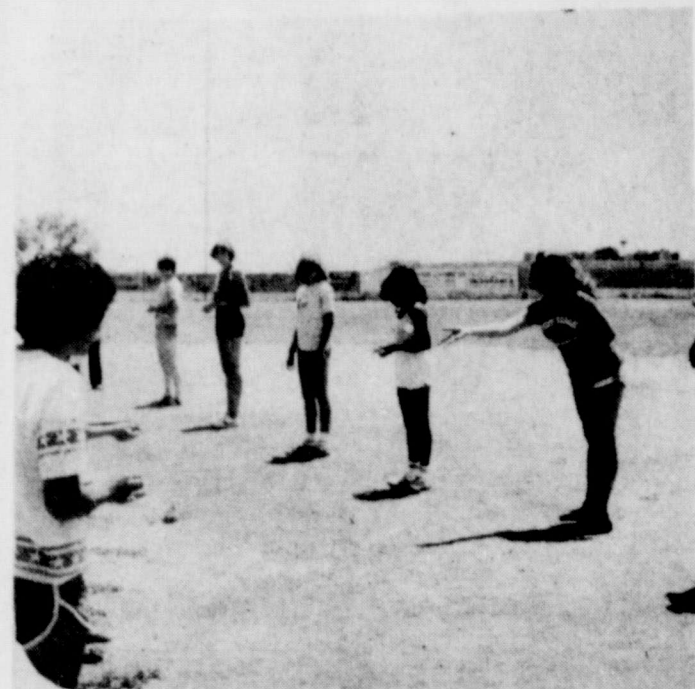
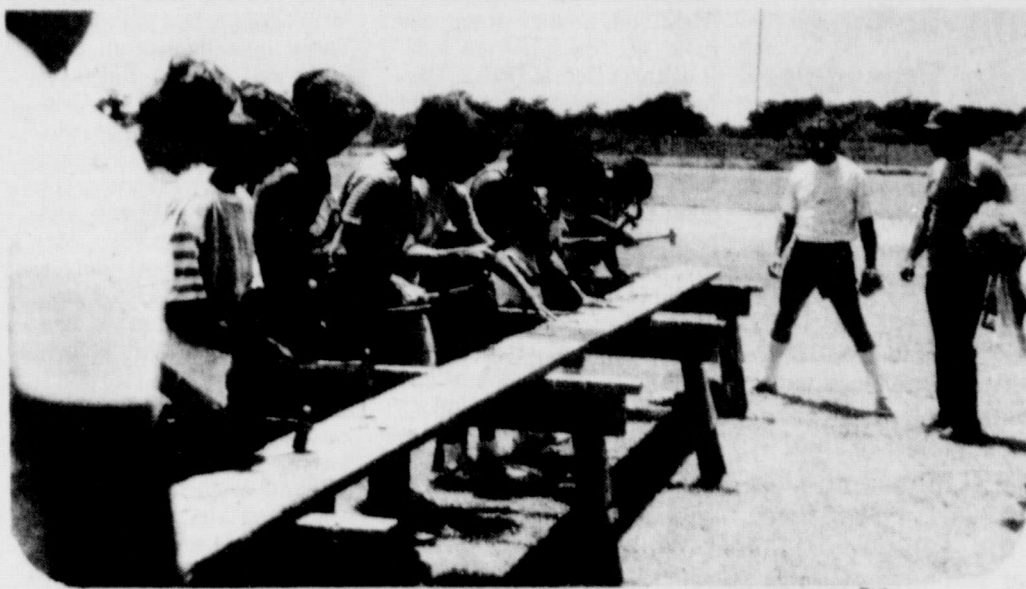
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# July 4th At Cisco City Park

A FEATURE of the restored Mobley Hilton will be the park back of and east of the old hotel, Architect Rinaldo Petri told us in Cisco the other day. In restoring the park, they will follow the original plan and introduce original ideas to have a small botanical garden. And the plants in the garden will be native to the area and many of them will express the late Conrad Hilton's ideas and philosophy.

Principal trees called for in the plans are pecan and fruit bearing figs - two fruits mentioned in the Bible as expressive of hospitality. A statute of the late hotel man will occupy a 13x35 foot platform. Sixty trees will lead to the platform, representing the years Mr. Hilton spent in the hotel business. Mimosa and nutmeg trees will signify Hilton's birthplace, and Italian cypress trees will be emblematic of the spirit of the Roman Catholic Church of which he was a dedicated member.

Behind the Hilton statue will be a 30-foot Calleppo Pine or Christmas Tree. It will be available as Cisco's perpetuate Christmas tree and will be decorated appropriately during the holiday season. This will be in keeping with Conrad Hilton's life motto: "Christmas Is Forever."

White roses will be planted extensively in the garden in memory of Conrad Hilton's instructions in all hotels: every unaccompanied lady staying in Hilton Hotels would be presented a White Rose. Also, every kind of rose that will grow in Texas will be planted in the garden. They'll leave an ancient and huge mesquite tree that is now over 100 years old. Native cactus, yucca and the like will be part of the garden.

An appropriate fence with gates will surround the garden to be locked at night. A full-time gardener will be employed.

Aren't you looking forward to the completion of the Mobley Hilton? Won't it be an asset to our community? Doubtless, a pamphlet in the Mobley Hilton will be

distributed by Hilton Hotels throughout the United States and the world.

And since the City of Cisco has renamed Avenue D as Conrad Hilton Avenue, let's ask the Texas Highway Department to add an exit sign on IH-20 to let folks know they're getting off the interstate on Conrad Hilton Avenue in Cisco.
