## Dr. Cermin Moving To New Clinic Bldg.

Dr. Ayres R. Cermin, family practice medical doctor here for 10 years, announced this week the moving of his offices from 813 Avenue D to his new clinic building at 1503 Liggett Street.

The office equipment and facilities were moved Tuesday and plans called for the new clinic to be open Thursday, July 17. There was a possibility of a delay of a few days in moving the Cermin office telephone, in which case patients were asked to call Dr. Cermin's home telephone number.

The new clinic includes 2,000 square feet of floor space with four examining rooms, a larger laboratory, larger business office and waiting room, an x-ray room, rest rooms and so forth. The building has central heat and air conditioning.

In the new clinic, Dr. Cermin has added more versatile x-ray and laboratory equipment. Burl Nash, Abilene contractor, erected the building.

Dr. Cermin and his wife JoAnn and their four children moved to Cisco 10 years ago from Munday where he practiced for about 18 months after completing medical studies and residency. He is a native of San Antonio where he graduated from Jefferson High School.

Dr. Cermin received a bachelor's degree from Texas Lutheran College and graduated in 1967 from the University of Texas

Medical School at Galveston. He then spent two years at Peter Smith Hospital in Fort Worth before beginning his career in family medical practice. Over the past decade he has taken special short courses and has attended medical seminars from time to time.

Mrs. Cermin, who works with her husband, is a native of Boerne. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Alvin Reinhard of 711 West 5th Street in Cisco. She is a graduate of Texas Lutheran College and of the University of Texas School of Nursing.

The Cermins are active in the Redeemer Lutheran Church and in various community organizations.

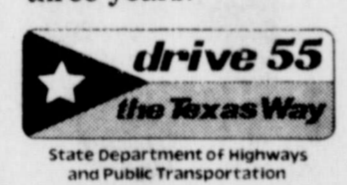

Mrs. Annie Bernice Carlile Croft left early Tuesday for the Texas Penitentiary at Huntsville in company with Deputy Sheriff Gene Milligan and wife Sue. Mrs. Croft, who had remarried since her conviction in January 1978, was to begin serving a 12-year sentence.

Mrs. Croft, accompanied by her husband, Charles Edgar Croft, surrendered to Sheriff Johnny Morren at 10 a.m. Monday. She was logged in and spent the day and Monday night at the county jail. She had been living at Coleman with her husband.

Mrs. Croft, who had been free on bond since January 1978, was charged with murder in the shooting death of her late husband, Dale Carlile, in June 1977 at their home south of Cisco. She will be eligible for parole in about three years.

## Cisco Receives July Check On Sales Tax

State Comptroller Bob Bullock Thursday, July 10, said city sales tax payments to Texas cities for the first seven months of 1980 are running about 20 percent more than payments during the same period in 1979.

He said payments for July to 936 cities total \$25 million compared to \$23.5 million during July of 1979—a 6.6 percent increase.

Sales tax payments are just slightly ahead of the inflation rate for the first six months which the federal government has set at about 13 percent, Bullock said.

Cisco will receive \$8,367.72 this month, compared to \$5,131.52 in July of last year.

The optional one-percent city sales tax is collected with the state sales tax by merchants and businesses and rebated on a monthly basis by the Comptroller's office to the cities where it is collected.
