

### Yard Of The Week Contest Is Cancelled

The Yard of the Week contest, sponsored by the Cisco Garden Club, has been cancelled due to the water situation in Cisco from the lack of rain.

A spokesman for the club stated the contest is being cancelled so persons will not be encouraged to water their lawns since the city is having problems with water supply.

### Citizens Asked Use Less Water By City Council

The City of Cisco's water pumping equipment is still struggling to keep up with the demand as prolonged dry and hot weather conditions prevail over the state and region, it was reported to the City Council at a special meeting last Tuesday night.

Two replacement valves, one 6-inch and one 8-inch, still had not been installed at the pump station, city workers reported. The smaller valve was received from the manufacturer on Thursday but the other, which had been shipped several weeks ago, had not arrived. Leaky valves have been hampering pump station efficiency.

Council members were informed that water customers for the most part were not doing a very good job in volunteering to hold down the volume of water they are using.

The city has asked customers to voluntarily water on odd and even days -- odd number houses on odd number days and so forth -- and from 6 a.m. until noon.

"Anytime the water pressure is unusually low, cut out all outside watering," a city spokesman said. "This will enable the Lake Cisco station to replenish water in the system and cut the likelihood of trouble in the event of fire."

Police Continue Investigation Of Burning Van Case

A police investigation in the case of the abandoned van found blazing at the Cisco city dump last Saturday continued during the past week, Police Chief Kenneth Eaves reported Friday.

Officers John Ferguson and Jim Reynolds, who have been working on the case, went to Fort Worth on Thursday to check on the possibilities that the local case might be related to a case with a stabbing angle, Chief Eaves reported.

The van, a 1978 Dodge owned by a Washington State Navy man, was in police custody here pending completion of the case. The interior was ruined by the fire.

Mr. Eaves said that police have walked over the dump area, including the canyons, seeking a body as nobody connected with the van was seen or found. "We've also been watching for buzzards," he added.

The van owner told officers he had loaned the vehicle for one day three months ago to a man named Norvell Lee Holly, 38, who was listed as a Navy deserter.

### Cisco Junior College Was Created In 39

Cisco Junior College was created in 1939 by an act of the Texas Legislature. The following year the institution began operation as a state supported junior college offering a post secondary course of study.

Three CJC locations: As a comprehensive college, CJC now operates at locations in Cisco, Abilene, and Clyde offering academic, vocational-technical, and adult vocational programs to residents in the Big Country.

Educational Trends: Looking forward to the oncoming trends of the 1980's, Cisco Junior College anticipates that the trends evident today in higher education will continue. Trends that are evident in the Big Country are: a slow but steady growth in population which should result in increased enrollment in higher education; new demands for flexible, short-course adult vocational training; a continuation of older students beginning college programs; a movement back to dormitory residency by recent high school graduates because of the high cost of living off campus; and an increasing emphasis on "back to the basics" in academic education.

Academic Programs: Academic programs are offered at the Cisco and Clyde campuses which are tailor-made for a "return to the basics." In operating with an open-door admissions policy, the college has

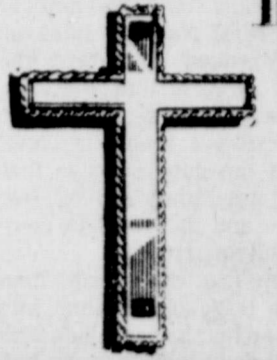

Eastland County and the City of Cisco joined nine other county taxing units in approving a county-wide property reevaluation program at board meetings during the past week.

McMorries & Company of Hereford, a professional property appraisal firm with more than 20 years of experience, signed a contract with the new Eastland County Appraisal District several weeks ago, and each of the county's some 20 separated tax-supported cities and districts were requested to approve the contract.

Cisco city council members voted unanimous approval of the contract at a special meeting last Tuesday night, and Eastland County Commissioners' Court members voted in favor of the contract at a meeting last Monday.

The McMorries company expects to begin work in early August and is scheduled to complete the project by October 1, 1981, according to the contract. The firm will be paid on a per parcel basis, roughly between \$12 and \$15 per parcel, for a total expected to amount to slightly over \$200,000.00.

Each taxing agency's share of the cost will be based on the number of parcels involved. The City of Cisco's share of the cost is expected to run about \$12,500, while the Cisco Independent School District will pay about \$34,500 plus another \$10,500 for the College District.
