Cisco School Superintendent Speaks At Kiwanis Club

The regular weekly Kiwanis Club luncheon was held August 18th with Cisco School Superintendent James Couch presenting the program.

Mr. Couch stated that last year's average daily attendance was 823 pupils out of a total enrollment of 1,044. This attendance was up approximately 40 students per day over the preceding year.

The school system operates with 73 full-time employees. The operating budget is made up of 66% state and federal funds with the balance provided by the local school district. The present budget indicates a cost of \$607 for each student.

Homemaking Hints

By Janet Thomas

Microwave ovens are time-savers for many busy Texans. Used at their optimum, they can be both time and energy savers. However, optimum use takes practice. Beginners should allow plenty of time to prepare complete meals. Select dishes that are family favorites and use tested recipes. Learning to adapt recipes for microwave cooking comes later with experience.

Consider these three factors when planning complete microwave meals: holding time, standing time, and reheating.

When considering holding time, remember that some foods retain heat longer than others, depending on the density and size of food.

Cook foods with a long holding time first such as roasts, ham, baked potatoes, casseroles, etc., will remain hot while you microwave the rest of the meal.

Standing time allows food such as meats, eggs, bacon, chicken, fish, baked potatoes and corn to continue cooking after removal from the oven. Cover these foods to prevent heat loss. Standing time is usually indicated in recipes and should be considered when meal planning.

The time needed to reheat precooked foods is another factor to consider when planning complete microwave meals. The instructions provided with your oven are the best guide to reheating. Most foods can be reheated on the high power level, except for meats, refrigerated main dishes, and individual plates of food, which should be reheated at 50% power. A covering prevents loss of moisture. Wax paper, plastic wrap, paper towels and ovenproof lids are all

satisfactory cover.

Follow reheating times carefully. To keep from ruining the food, check it occasionally and then continue heating it for a few seconds or minutes longer.

Try to take full advantage of the speed of microwave cooking. Begin by writing out menus and the order of preparation. Arrange the order so that all foods are served at the proper temperature at one time.

RECIPE FOR THE WEEK
Since my column this week features information on microwave cooking, here is a quick lunch to prepare in your microwave. For greater time saving at lunch prepare the meat mixture at the night before and reheat immediately before serving. Also, lightly butter the tortillas, return them to the original plastic bag and refrigerate overnight.

FOLDOVER TACOS WITH GUACAMOLE TOPPING
1 lb. ground beef
2 teaspoons chili powder
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon garlic salt
pepper to taste
1/4 cup water
1 Cup American process cheese
lettuce
1 package soft flour tortillas
Cooking time: 10 minutes at high power. Crumble ground beef in a 1-quart casserole. Microwave on high for 6 minutes. Cover dish to prevent splattering of fat onto oven walls. Drain thoroughly. Stir in water and seasonings. Microwave an additional 2 minutes or until meat is well done. Stir in cheese and microwave 2 minutes, stirring after 1 minute.

GUACAMOLE TOPPING
1 large avocado
2 green onions, chopped
1 small tomato, chopped
1/2 teaspoon lime or lemon juice
1/4 teaspoon garlic or salt
Remove meat of avocado from shell and mash into a pulp. Add remaining ingredients and mix well. To serve, open one end of tortilla package. Microwave on high in the package for 30 seconds. Spoon mixture onto tortilla and top with guacamole topping lettuce. For ease of serving, let family members prepare their own as desired at the table.

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9 Amendments Due Nov. Vote

INFORMED VOTING

AMENDMENT NO. 2
House Joint Resolution 97, proposing a constitutional amendment to grant the state the right of appeal in criminal cases from certain rulings of the trial court.

The proposed amendment of Article V, Section 26, of the Texas Constitution grants the state and the defendant in a criminal case the right to appeal before the conclusion of the trial from a pretrial ruling of the trial court on certain motions or on the constitutionality of a statute.

The constitution currently denies the state any right of appeal in criminal cases. The main purpose of the amendment is to grant the state a limited right of appeal. The state's appeal will always precede the conclusion of the trial. The defendant's right of appeal is also affected by permitting appeal of those same matters preceding the conclusion of the trial, whereas under existing law the defendant must wait until the conclusion of the trial to appeal.

BACKGROUND
Article V, Section 26, has been construed to deny appeals by the state not only from acquittals but from pretrial rulings as well. Even if the section were repealed, an appeal by the state from an acquittal would be prohibited by the double-jeopardy clauses of the state and federal constitutions. The prohibition of a state appeal in criminal cases developed from the

English common law along with the guarantee against double jeopardy and eliminated the question of what kinds of appeals would be permissible without invoking double jeopardy.

ARGUMENTS

FOR:
1. Granting the state this limited right of appeal provides the only effective way of testing the constitutionality of certain statutes and the legality of certain pretrial practices. The state, like the defendant, should be afforded a fair trial free of error.

Field Day August 27

A field day will be held at the Soil Conservation Plant Materials center at Knox City on August 27, 1980.

Ron Bailey, district conservationist for SCS at Eastland, said the public is being invited to the event. The center serves both Texas and Oklahoma.

Billy Carr, manager of University Lands (surface interests), Midland, will be the principal speaker. Carr will speak at 12:30 p.m.

Guided tours will be conducted through the 90-acre center from 9:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. The center is located on FM 1292, 2 miles north and 2 1/2 miles west of Knox City.

A barbecue lunch will be available on a prepaid basis at \$4 per plate. Payment should be sent to Ms. Doris Crownover, Chamber of Commerce, Box 91, Knox City, Texas 79529 by August 23.

Seed or rootstock from native plants that show potential solving specific soil and water conservation problems are collected, then grown and evaluated at the Knox City Center. The more promising ones are then tested under field conditions. Selections which prove superior to commercial varieties are then released to seed growers. These producers then grow seed and sell it the public.

Several hundred strains of grasses, legumes, forbs, and woody plants are being tested at Knox City.

2. The amendment will provide a criminal defendant with a method of terminating the criminal action at any early age if the defendant's contentions on appeal are meritorious.

3. Granting the state a right of appeal will eliminate to some extent the tendency of some judges to rule in favor of the defense, when in doubt, to avoid appellate review of their rulings.

AGAINST:
1. The duration of a criminal trial will be substantially lengthened when the state makes the appeal. The trauma and expenses incurred by criminal defendants and their families will be increased.

2. The amendment would cause an increased case load for the court of criminal appeals and a greater workload for prosecuting authorities and court-appointed attorneys. It would accordingly increase the cost of the criminal justice system.

3. Granting the defendant a right to appeal before the conclusion of the trial is a mistake because frivolous appeals may be used as a stalling device.



Heat Wave Increases Chance of More Fires

A lighted cigarette tossed out the car window or a pickup parked in dry vegetation could add fires to the other problems of Texas drought-plagued farmers and ranchers.

"The heat wave has made tinderboxes of many fields and rangeland across the state, and it wouldn't take much to start a fire these days," Agriculture Commissioner Reagan V. Brown said today. He urged caution when driving through or camping in rural areas.

"In addition to cigarettes and campfires, we have to worry about catalytic converters on trucks and other vehicles now. After being run for

even a short length of time, the converters can ignite dead vegetation very quickly," Brown said.

Through no documentation is made annually, a Texas Forest Service survey showed that there are about 50,000 fires outside Texas city limits a year. Since the drought set in, several counties have reported increased numbers of grass fires.

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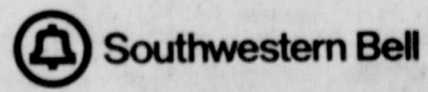
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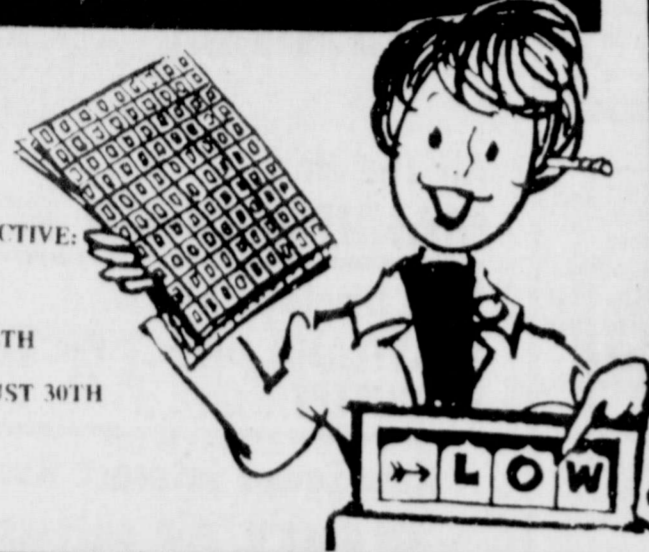

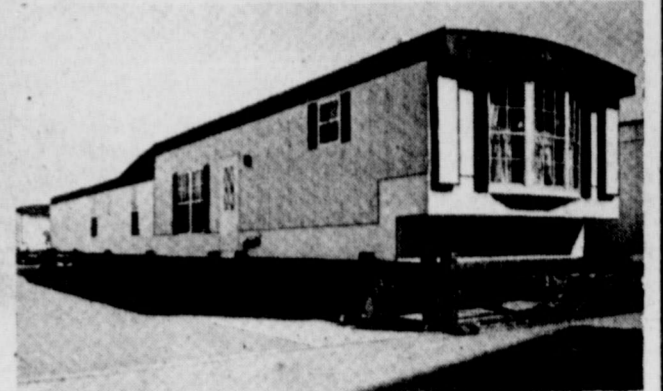

PURCHASE OF the Randy Steffen collection of printed materials may well be considered a real asset to Cisco Junior College.

The value of the collection to CJC was considered by Oleta Shirley, CJC librarian, in a memo to Dr. Norman Wallace, president. She studied the inventory of books, pamphlets and so forth and submitted the following evaluation:

"The Randy Steffen Collection would add valuable resource materials unattainable elsewhere. Assuming that the pamphlets, documents and paperbacks are in good condition, it would broaden our scope of research material for many years, providing, of course, that methods of preparation and filing are provided for easy accessibility.

"Recognition for obtaining this collection would also make scholars aware of the outstanding Texas Collection we already have. This would ultimately lead to CJC's Texas Room becoming a major center for research for a broad spectrum of people doing senior research about Texas and the Southwest."

Mrs. Shirley's study was made from a detailed inventory of the Steffen Collection made by a team from the military library at Fort Sill. The Collection includes such material gathered by the late Mr. Steffen for use in his history of the foot soldier, a work of several volumes. Other historical books on the cavalry with extensive drawings and illustrations of saddles and uniforms were the basis for collecting many books and pamphlets as source material.

The Fort Sill team assigned a value of more than \$10,000 to the Steffen Collection. Some of the books are reprints of first editions, Mrs. Shirley noted, that CJC has in its library available only for use in the library. These reprints could be placed on the shelves for checkout.

Mrs. Shirley found that a limited number of the books in the collection are valuable first editions - some inscribed by the authors for Mr. Steffen.

Mrs. Shirley noted that there is a considerable amount of information about Texas in the Collection. Much of the information would be difficult to impossible to obtain elsewhere.

CJC paid \$7,000 for the Steffen Collection, using funds from the Leon Maner

Endowment. As you know, the late Cisco business man left \$50,000 in a fund for investment with the earnings to be used in acquiring material for the Texas Room at Leon Maner Memorial Library.

Last spring, CJC obtained a bronze bust of Mr. Steffen that is on display in the library. When the Steffen collection is placed on display, you'll want to go out for an inspection.

Dorothy Steffen Spencer, widow of Randy Steffen, gave the college a very substantial discount in the purchase price. She is also loaning a good many items of art that the late artist collected for display at the college.

You probably noticed in The Press the other day that CJC has hired Dorothy's husband, Col. Spencer, to teach in the social science department this fall. They'll be moving here from their home in Dublin very soon.

ON THE SUBJECT of books, let us remind you once again that the Graham Memorial Hospital Auxiliary has plans for a Big Book Fair on Friday, Sept. 5, at the Laguna Hotel lobby. In addition to books, they'll have a bake sale plus coffee and cookies for you to buy and eat while browsing among the books.

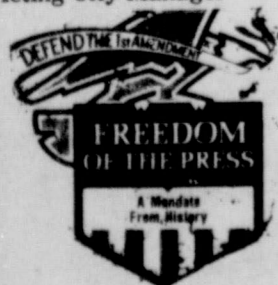
