## Cisco Service Club Taking Applications For Scholarship

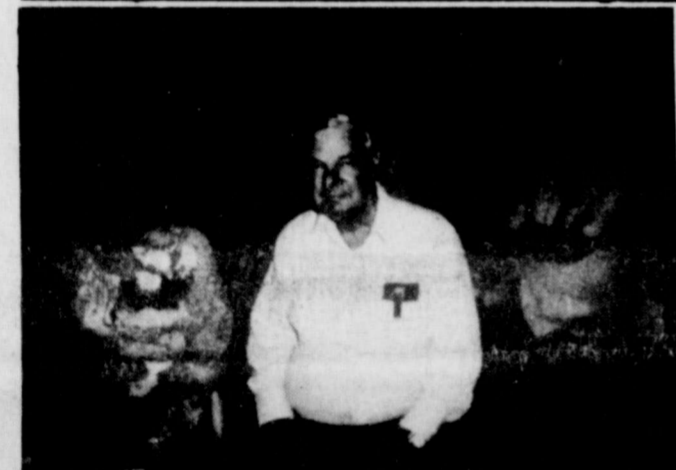

## Senior Citizens Nutrition Menu

Often this column discusses the true meaning of nutrition, and how it may be applied to the home. This week we will discuss calories, fats and carbohydrates.

Calories are like energy-producing fuels, and the real decrease or increase of calories determines weight increase or reduction.

Fats is an effective way to store energy and in consuming it raises the cholesterol level of blood and increase the likelihood of a heart attack.

Carbohydrates provide energy. They are the most efficient fuel sources for the body because they burn clean, without harmful waste products, becoming energy as carbon dioxide (which is exhaled) and water (which is excreted).

Next week we will discuss proteins. You are encouraged to examine your nutritional requirements. Your ideal diet should contain the amount of fat necessary to store required energy and protect vital organs, the amount of carbohydrates required to maintain the mind's equanimity and support the body's level of activity, and the amount of protein needed to build and replenish cells.

# Numerous Businesses To Close For Labor Day Here

Numerous Cisco businesses will be closed Monday, September 7, in observance of Labor Day. Among those being closed will be the First National Bank, United Savings, utility companies and the Post Office.

The Public Schools students will also enjoy a three day weekend with classes to resume Tuesday at regular time.

The director of the Texas Department of Public Safety has warned that as many as 48 persons may die in traffic accidents this Labor Day weekend on the state's streets and highways unless drivers are especially cautious.

"Otherwise," said Colonel Jim Adams, "the 78 hour

period could be a repeat of the most recent holiday. Traffic accidents during the last July 4th weekend took a total of 60 lives, 16 more than had been estimated," he said.

Drunk driving and excessive speed were the major contributing factors in the fatal accidents recorded over the July 4th holiday, according to data furnished by the DPS Statistical Services Division.

None of the drivers or passengers killed during the July 4th holiday were wearing seatbelts. In addition, 35 percent of these fatalities resulted from the person being ejected from the vehicle.

Local DPS, Sargent Mathews, urges motorists to wear their seatbelts to

minimize the hazard posed by careless drivers. He said safety belts should be used during city driving as well as long distance trips.

"Last year in Texas, about 1200 lives would have been saved if all occupants of passenger vehicles had used safety belts," Mathews said.

The DPS Sargent said he is deeply concerned that 1981 may be another record year for motor vehicle deaths in the state.

"Unless more Texas motorists recognize the risks they face and take steps to protect themselves and others, this trend will surely continue," Mathews pointed out.

DPS Regional Commanders have been instructed to utilize additional

Troopers during the three-day holiday and "Operation Motorcade" would be placed into effect.

"DPS patrol officers will be enforcing the laws and assisting motorists by watching drivers who exceed the speed limit and those impaired by alcohol or drugs," Mathews said. They will also be on the lookout for vehicle defects.

Mathews said Operation Motorcade would be in effect from 6:00 p.m. Friday, September 4, through midnight Monday, September 7, 1981.

During the Fourth of July holiday, 73 per cent of the fatal accidents occurred between 8:00 p.m. and 4:00 a.m.

# CJC Wranglers Kick Off New Season Here Saturday

The Wranglers of Cisco Junior College were to kick off their 1981 season of football at Chesley Field in Cisco Saturday night as they took on the McMurry J.V. of Abilene. Kick-off was at 7:30 p.m.

The C.J.C.-McMurry clash was to be the first of only three home games the Wranglers will be playing this year. Following Saturday night's game the Wranglers are not scheduled to play in Cisco again until October 22 when they will face Ft. Hood. The following Saturday they will play their final scheduled game of the season in Cisco against New Mexico Military Institute on October 31.

One of the most important games of the season, due to rivalry, will be played September 26 in Breckenridge when the Wranglers will take on Ranger Junior College Rangers at 7:30 p.m.

The Wranglers finished their 1980 season with only one loss and eight wins. Their final game of the

season was lost to North Eastern Oklahoma A&M by the score of 35 to 20. Last year the Wranglers defeated McMurry by the score of 20 to 0.

The Wranglers scrimmaged Sul Ross last weekend and continued their third week of practice this week. Coach Bill Anderson said he believes they have a nice group of young men at C.J.C. this year. There are over 100 players on the team and about 44 of the members will probably see action Saturday night.

Coach Anderson said he is not sure how much natural ability this year's team will have but he thinks they "will come out pretty good." He said this year's squad "may not be a great team, but I believe they will represent themselves pretty well."

A good number of sophomores have returned for this year's team, according to Coach Anderson, and will help to give the team experience. Coach Anderson said the second team will probably see about as much action as the first team, since the players are pretty equal.

Several Cisco High School exes were to see action in Saturday night's game on speciality teams. Ronnie Eudy and Steve Hopson are special teams captains this year and Chuck Cannistraci and Kory Wallace also play on the speciality teams.

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## Cattle Brand Celebrates Birthday

Re-registration of cattle brands is a hot topic in Eastland County — as it is in every county in the state — as the result of recent legislation requiring that brands be re-registered every ten years.

One of the oldest cattle brands in this county celebrated its hundredth birthday this week.

It was on Sept. 2, 1881, that the late W.T. Boyd registered his brand, the half circle over B, and the family has actively used the brand for over 90 years.

F.J. Boyd, Rt. 1 Ranger, says that the original branding iron, now on display at Eastland Centennial Memorial Library, was made by Eastland blacksmith Charlie Dabbs in the early 1880's.

The branding iron may be seen at the Library 2 to 5 p.m. Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

Mr. Boyd, his family ranch and the history of the brand were written up in Early EHS Gusher by Students Jim Owen and Tom Crowder.

In part it said: "When Eastland County was first settled, it was noted for its good ranch land. Large and small ranches started to pop up all over the county. One of the oldest ranches is the ranch that is now owned by E.T. Boyd. Located four miles east of Morton Valley, this ranch has always been owned by the Boyd family. The original tract consisted of about 299 acres. This land was used for farming and ranching, and the produce from this land supplied food for the family and their animals. The original brand was made by Charlie Dabbs, an Eastland blacksmith. This is the fifth oldest cattle brand in Eastland County and is still being used today."

"Typical of much Eastland County ranch land of the 1920's, the Boyd ranch became very productive with gas wells. The ranch had 20 gas wells, six were very good ones. One gas well

is still in production today. Besides all the oil and gas that has been taken from this ranch, limestone was also an important product. Limestone from this ranch was used to build the highway from Morton Valley to Ranger in 1925. About 100 thousand cubic yards of limestone from the B Ranch was used to build the road from Cisco to the Gulf Terminal on the Breckenridge Highway.

"In 1910 Mr. Boyd had a framed wooden house that was built on a turn-key job. The house was very elegant and it only cost \$1,000. The house had three bedrooms, kitchen, dining room, pantry, hall, and a big front porch. The old house was destroyed by an explosion from a gas line.

"The ranch raised Red Poll Hereford Cattle. There was almost one hundred of these beautiful cattle. Along with these cattle, Mr. Boyd used Percheron horses to do the work on the farm. These Percheron teams would have been able to keep up with Budweiser's Clydesdales.

## Producers Urged To Enter Annual County Hay Show

Hay producers throughout Eastland County are urged to enter their hay in the ninth annual Eastland County Hay Show says County Agent DeMarquis Gordon. The hay show will be October 2 during the Fair.

The hay must be entered by September 16 since samples must be sent to the forage testing lab for protein analysis. One bale of each variety may be entered by leaving it at any farm supply store or vocational agriculture class room in Eastland County. The exhibitor should put a tag on his hay giving name, address and kind of hay. There is no entry fee required. All entries must be in bale form, either round or regular bales. They hay will be judged on

protein content and physical characteristics which indicate intake and digestibility as well as other factors that affect animal performance.

Ribbons will be given on all entries and plaques will be awarded to the owner of the champion bale in each class.

Classes include Alfalfa, Coastal bermuda and other bermudas, Sorghum and Sudan Hybrids, Other Perennials, Oats, Peanut and Legume mixture.

All entries will become the property of the hay show and the bales will be auctioned off to help defray the cost of the analysis and awards.

# GORDON SPOT

By DeMarquis Gordon

Eastland County farmers will have an opportunity to see first hand research being done on several crops next Thursday, September 10. That is the date of the Crops Field Day at the Texas A&M University Research and Extension Center at Stephenville.

The facilities will be open for inspection from 1 to 5 p.m. with riding tours of field research beginning at 2 p.m.

Joint sponsors of the field day and the tours are the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station and the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

The center is located at the junction of U.S. Highway 281 and FM 8, two miles north of the downtown area. The best way for Eastland County people to locate the center is to continue east on FM 8 until it joins 281. The center is on the left at this junction.

Guests on the riding tour will pass by major research sites and will hear research scientists discuss alternate crops, including cotton,

guar, sesame and pearl millet; peanut irrigation; planting patterns; and peanut varieties. Topics also will deal with soil-borne disease research on peanuts and new fungicides and application techniques for peanuts.

Other discussions on peanuts will include dry land, skip-row plantings and demonstrations of seeding rates for Spanish and runner varieties.

County Extension agents from surrounding areas will act as tour guides.

Research and Extension personnel will be cooperating in putting together displays on forage research for dairy and livestock production and on horticultural research and recommendations for this area of the state.

In view of some of the critical decisions presently facing peanut producers, we feel that they have put together facts that will help our people choose the best route for their operation.

A new insurance plan

authorized by Congress is now available to wheat and barley growers in Eastland County, according to Ardell M. Kalmbach, District Director of USDA's Federal Crop Insurance Corporation. A key feature of the insurance program, which is designed to replace the ASCS disaster payments program, is that the government pays up to 30% of the premium cost.

Another important feature, Kalmbach adds, is the opportunity it provides for wheat and barley growers to choose the amount of protection they want to carry. It is possible to purchase a policy that guarantees 50%, 65%, or 75% of the local average yield. Policyholders can also select the price per bushel they want to be paid in the event of a loss. The choices are \$2.50, \$3.50 and \$4.50.

Kalmbach offers this illustration of how the insurance works: In an area where the average yield has been 18.2 bushels per acre, farmers can elect to carry a policy that guarantees 9.2 bushels, 12.9 bushels or 14.0 bushels. If a wheat grower chooses the maximum guarantee of 14.0 bushels per acre and the maximum price

dollars, while the consumer received 14K gold jewelry worth much less than the \$3, \$5, or \$10 paid for the item.

The old saying, "You get what you pay for" is particularly true in this case. The promoters have led people to believe that the item they would receive in return for responding to a marketing survey was actually worth much more than the prices paid. In this case the old saying also means, a real bargain is hard to find.

Consumers who respond to the first advertisement receive more fantastic offers by return mail. Offers of additional jewelry at bargain prices, membership in a gem collectors organization and other bargains too good to miss are made in attractive ways to get you to continue purchasing gems, or more expensive items than the original offer. Claims of low monthly payments of fees hid the real cost of your purchase.

Super consumers should not get caught by this and other con schemes. Unbelievably low prices may sound inviting but don't let visions of instant wealth dim your common sense caution.

Six warnings signs to be aware of and watch for so that you don't become another consumer fraud statistic:

- \* Unbelievably low prices
  - \* Exaggerated claims or lavish guarantees
  - \* Just what you have been waiting for
  - \* Extra assurance of seller's honesty
  - \* Appeal for help
  - \* Pressure to 'act now'



**Texas Author  
Writes Local  
Ghosts Stories**

If you believe in ghosts and go hunting them, be prepared for surprises other than the shock of possible confrontation. So advises a Texas author who has searched out this state's spectres for two years.

Kerrville historian and novelist Ed Syers, whose latest work is "Ghost Stories of Texas," singles out both the haunted house and its resident apparition as sources of unexpected discovery. The house may look as normal as yours, and its ghost is not necessarily dangerous.

"Movies always show us something foreboding, like that grim house in 'Psycho,'" Syers says. "Many of those I found were quite innocent looking. And a lot of the old places that reeked of gloom—from West to East Texas, I could lead you to them—simply turned out un-haunted."

Some, he conceded, look haunted and are.

Their phantoms, he believes, possess very human motivation: the need to prove or disclose something, the drive to warn or protect, the refusal to accept a disagreeable eventually—a life suddenly cut short. Nostalgia, the yearning for places of treasured memory, seems to provide the largest group.

"Of course," Syers adds, "there are those who seek revenge for some great wrong. They're the ones to avoid. But mainly what we fear is the unknown that surrounds all this realm. And we don't talk about it because even more than we fear ghosts, most of us fear ridicule."

Author of a number of well-regarded books on Texas, Syers admits this work to be a departure from his usual field of heritage and history, but he defends his selection of what he considers the state's fifty major stories of the supernatural. "You can believe or disbelieve," he says. "I'm not selling superstition; I'm reporting what I think I found. And frankly, it was intriguing."

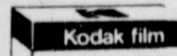

## Statewide War Declared On Oil Field Equipment Theft

A two-pronged, statewide war, designed to combat thieves of oil field equipment, was officially declared today.

The measures, increased penalties for stealing oil field equipment and detailed recordkeeping on the sale and exchange of equipment, will halt or at least slow down, it is hoped, the incidents of oil field thefts which amount to an estimated \$100 million annually across the country.

The new laws, conceived through the cooperation of the Texas Legislature and oil and gas officials, got an initial boost with

the establishment of an "Oil Field Theft Hotline" July 1 which enabled people witnessing or suspecting a theft to call (817) 723-1114 to report the incident. Authorities feel that promptness in reporting a theft increases the chances of recovery by tenfold.

Under the new laws, which went into effect today:

- Theft of Oil and Gas Equipment or Petroleum has been raised from a third degree felony to a second degree felony regardless of a amount involved. A second degree felony is punishable by 2-20

years in prison and a fine up to \$10,000. This portion of the new law gives prosecutors more discretion concerning the punishment they can seek and it also removes the need to establish the precise value of the equipment stolen.

- Recordkeeping Individuals whose business deals with obtaining used oil and gas equipment must keep accurate records of the transaction. They must record: name and address of the dealer; serial number (if any), kind, make, size, weight, length and quantity of the used materials purchased or acquired by exchange.

In addition, the records also must show: the date obtained; name and address of the seller or person who exchanged the materials; the location of the property at the time of the sale or exchange; license number of the vehicle used to transport the item to the dealer; and the driver's license number of the seller or person who exchanged the materials. The records must be kept for two years. Failure to comply with this law could result in a fine of

not less than \$500 for each violation.

The telephone hotline and the two laws were passed by the 67th Legislature and signed into law by Gov. Bill Clements.

The theft reporting system is based in Wichita Falls. After the information has been received there, law enforcement officials and the local news media will be notified of the particulars.

## New Methods To Raise Production

The addition of foam diverting agents and inert gasses in steam injection methods of obtaining oil is expected to increase the recovery of heavy oil from the present 40-55 percent up to 70 percent or more.

According to a report in the Aug. 31 issue of the *Oil and Gas Journal*, these advance methods, which will result in huge production breakthroughs, were spurred on by the decontrol of heavy oil two years ago.

Oil producers also stand at the brink of eliminating the long-standing barrier of bringing up oil from pay zones below the 2,000-foot level. In addition, the costly task of burning a barrel of lease crude to generate

the steam to produce three barrels of heavy oil may soon be left behind, according to the magazine.

Tests are also under way to find a variety of alternative fuels and methods of generating steam some of which, it is hoped, will avoid certain environmental constraints which have halted or slowed expansions of steamflood projects.

One industry consultant estimates that domestic oil production by steamflooding may increase from the 300,000 barrels of crude daily in 1980 to as much as 1.5 million barrels a day by 1991.

In the meantime, steamflood technology and practices are being applied in other resource areas, such as tar sands, diatomaceous earth,

oil shale and even residual light oil. However, the emphasis of steam recovery techniques will be toward the "big leap" in heavy oil production.

Although much of the oil production boost is expected to come from California fields which provide the majority of domestic thermal heavy oil output, other steam injection work is under way in Texas.

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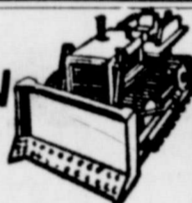
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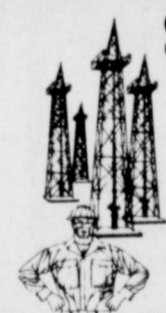
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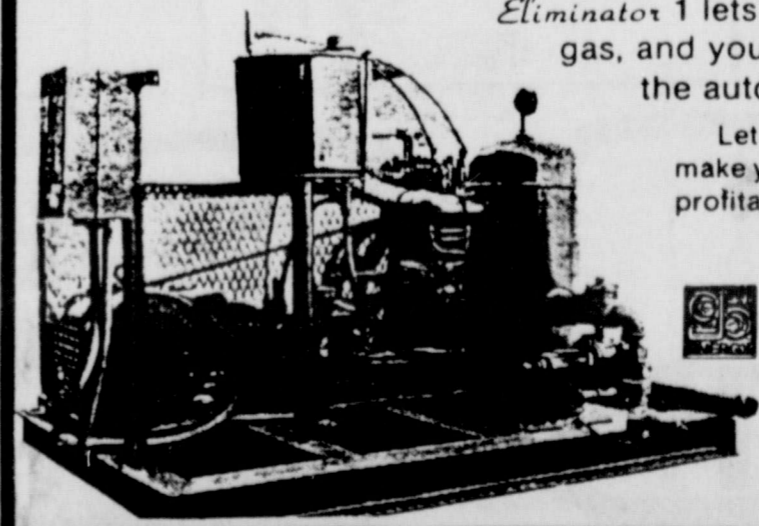

## Interior Designs For The Handicapped

If you are planning a new house which will be used by a wheelchair resident, careful planning and a little extra expense can make life much easier for that person. Entry ways should be 36 inches wide with interior doors of the sliding or pocket type with 32-inch openings.

Eliminate thresholds and increase hall widths to 3½ to four feet. The bathroom should permit a five-foot turning radius with the fixtures arranged for easy transfer to the toilet. Grab bars and lifting aids are a must, and make certain they are attached to a firm support. Set the vanity high enough so the wheelchair can go underneath. Finally, install automatic garage door openers and covered entries.

All these items make life at home easier for the handicapped, but independent, person.

## Cash In On Solar Energy

Energy from the sun is free, so why not "cash in" on it when building a home?

Positioning your home in relation to the sun's movement throughout all seasons can save money on utility bills. A house should be oriented along an east-west axis, with the longest walls and largest roof plane facing south to take advantage of winter sun and allow for easy shading in the summer. Family rooms, living rooms and similar areas used frequently in daylight hours, plus walls that have the greatest number of windows, should be located on the south side. Shade these windows from the summer sun by using overhangs, porches or

trellises. These ideas will help keep out the heat in summer, but will allow winter sunshine to enter windows and lower the heating bill.

**The Museum Of Science And History**

**Education The Easy Way**

The Museum of Science and History, off Lancaster Blvd. on the west side of Ft. Worth, is supposed to have perfect climate control in order to preserve its relics. Believing that this environment might also have benefits for something living, I paid it a visit this summer. On one of the most scorching afternoon imaginable - made still more scorching by the wide expanse of concrete between the Museum and the Will Rogers Coliseum - I stepped inside this sprawling brick complex.

It housed a collection of almost everything man or nature can devise. For the next four hours, until hounded by an electronic voice declaring that five o'clock was closing time, I wandered through one labyrinth after another. Since I did not wish to spend the night with laser beams, an animated plastic skeleton which talked, the carved fertility Gods of Africa, or a Doctor's blood-letting tools, I got out. Besides, how can you throw anything at a mysterious electronic voice and shut it up when you can't

see where it is coming from? I really wasn't ready to go, for my four hours of walking had barely skimmed the surface of the contents. The City of Ft. Worth deserves all sorts of credit for this mammoth collection, as well as the Art Museums and beautiful Botanic Garden nearby. Few cities have as much culture and beauty available to the public without charge. And the west side location of the various Museums give them easy accessibility for Eastland County people.

College groups from the area have made numerous trips to the Science and History Museum, and Public School children have gone. But adults, often consider themselves too busy. I lived here seven years, for example, before taking the time. New residents of the area, especially, may not be aware of the intensely interesting material in the place. And educationally, for any child, a visit to the Museum is probably worth more than weeks in a structured classroom situation.

With such a vast array of things under one roof, the Museum of Science and History could have become a wild hodge-podge - a flea market of relics. Sometimes, even now, the feeling hits that every unusual object ever given to the City of Ft. Worth ends up here. But the secret is in the arrangement, in which artifacts and antiques are placed in as natural an environment as possible, and separated into various classifications.

I found the Texas History portion to be a particular delight, for it contained a number of rooms - behind glass - furnished with antiques of various periods. From the simple homes of the pioneer settler to the elaborate Victorian town house each detail was authentic. There was also a blacksmith shop, a grocery store, a pioneer drug store, Barber Shop, Doctor's and Dentist's offices. There were a number of dioramas, including one of a frontier Campmeeting, and many early State artifacts. There were old letters, documents, and material pertaining to Indian and Spanish History. Priceless old guns - including Civil War weapons - were arranged in a number of cases.

Quite a bit of space was devoted to cattle raising, with collections of barbed wire and tools used on early ranches. There were buffalo skin gloves, old boots, and the X iron of the Reynolds ranches. There were maps of the cattle drive trails, such as the Shawnee and Chisholm.

Naturally a lot of attention was given to the town of Ft. Worth and its beginnings. There were marvelously detailed dioramas, and other material leading to the 20th Century. By the time of World War I machines, and the oil to run them, obviously became a dominant force.

Across the building came a plunge into Maya and Aztec art objects, as well as a fine collection of African Art. There were ceremonial objects, and relics from secret societies, and material used by Witch Doctors around the world. Somehow the devices and herbs used by native Doctors seemed less frightening than the instruments of Medieval physicians. (Or even some used today!)

There was only a quick step from medicine to an actual Apollo 12 Moon Suit - an object which must have been clumsy for the astronaut. And this suit, of course, was near a section of the Museum devoted to calculators and computers - which were flanked by children hovering about in fascination. Visitors may play games with these computers, and answer quizzes - which were punctuated by replies from an expressionless robot-voice. But few people fail to move out of a booth when "The Thing" informs you that "Your time is up!"

One sitting-down-place is in a small theatre with the stage dominated by an animated skeleton - embellished with organs and blood vessels. This object

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seems to be activated by the arrival of a human, for it begins explaining about its brains and liver. But this display is hardly as dazzling as the laser beams down another corridor. There various booths offer complete visual details about Laser information.

As I watched these magnetic explosions of color I felt a glimmer of hope about finally understanding the process.

The wild contrasts of the Museum were finally visible in one spot, where the largest stuffed polar bear I had ever seen stood near a pool inhabited by an ugly little live alligator. And word that a new Planetarium was being added to the Museum - a large dome-shaped one - meant there would be much more to see in the future.

But the mechanical voice was after me. One last glimpse at the room featuring geology, where a huge world globe was centered. This was spinning slowly in its proper orbital position. And I realize that, in just that fashion, time had spun past me during that afternoon, while my brain had recorded other things.

**A Crops Field Day To Be At Texas A&M Sept. 10**

Producers from North Central and Central Texas are invited to attend a Crops Field Day at the Texas A&M University Research and Extension Center here Sept. 10.

Shelby Newman, resident director of research at the Center, said facilities will be open for inspection from 1 to 5 p.m., with riding tours of field research beginning at 2 p.m.

Joint sponsors of the field day and tours are the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station and the Texas Agriculture Extension Service.

The center is located at the junction of U.S. Highway 281 and FM 8, two miles north of the downtown area.

Guests on the riding tour will pass by major research sites and will hear research scientists discuss alternate crops, including cotton, guar, sesame and pearl millet; peanut irrigation; planting patterns; and peanut varieties. Topics also will deal with soil-borne disease research on peanuts, and new fungicides and application techniques for peanuts.

Newman said other discussions on peanuts will include dry land, skip-row plantings and demonstrations of seeding rates for Spanish and runner varieties.

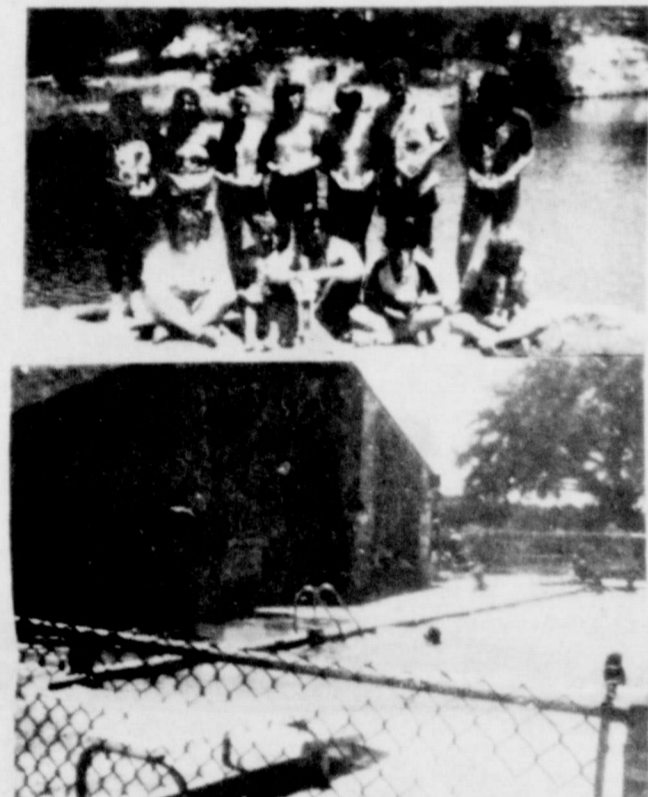


CISCO MINI BANDITS were second place runner-ups in league play with a 8-2 record. The team tied with Eastland. Winning first place in the league was Santo.
